

Race for Telangana's Top Cop Heats Up as State Government Shortlists Candidates for DGP Post

Hyderabad, Apr 30 : With the impending retirement of current Director General of Police (DGP) Dr. Jitender on September 6th, the Telangana state government has officially commenced the selection process for its new police chief. In a significant move, the names of eight senior Indian Police Service (IPS) officers have been forwarded to the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), setting the stage for a crucial decision that will shape the leadership of the state's police force for the coming years.

The UPSC will meticulously review the service records and qualifications of the shortlisted officers before recommending a panel of three suitable candidates to the state government. The final appointment will then be made by the state from this select group, marking a pivotal moment in Telangana's administrative landscape.

The list of contenders submitted to the UPSC comprises a distinguished group of senior officers, including: Ravi Gupta, C.V. Anand, the incumbent DGP Dr. Jitender, Apte Vinayak Prabhakar, Kothakota Srinivas Reddy, B. Shivdhar Reddy, Dr. Soumya Mishra, and Shikha Goel.

While all eight officers bring a wealth of experience to the table,



reliable sources within the police department suggest that three individuals are emerging as the front-runners in this high-stakes selection process: C.V. Anand, B. Shivdhar Reddy, and Dr. Soumya Mishra. Their relatively longer remaining service periods appear to be a significant factor. C.V. Anand is slated to retire in June 2028, followed by Dr. Soumya Mishra in December 2027, and B. Shivdhar Reddy in April 2026.

Interestingly, the current DGP, Dr. Jitender, is also included in the list submitted to the UPSC. However, with his retirement just months away, his chances of continuing in the top post are considered slim. Similarly, senior IPS officer Kothakota Srinivas Reddy, a former Hyderabad Police Commissioner who is due to retire on August 5th, faces a similar constraint of limited tenure. Ravi Gupta, with his retirement scheduled for December 2024, is also perceived as a less likely choice for the top job.

The potential appointment of Dr. Soumya Mishra would mark a historic milestone for Telangana, as she would become the first woman to hold the esteemed position of DGP in the state. This would not only be a significant step towards gender inclusivity in the higher echelons of the police force but also a powerful symbol of progress.

However, sources indicate that based on the current political and administrative dynamics, the scales might slightly tilt in favor of either C.V. Anand or B. Shivdhar Reddy. Both officers possess extensive experience in various key roles within the police department and are well-regarded within the force.

As the UPSC deliberates on the submitted names and prepares its recommendations, all eyes are on the state government's next move. The final decision is anticipated in the near future, as the administration gears up to welcome a new leader who will be entrusted with the crucial responsibility of maintaining law and order and steering the Telangana police force into a new chapter. The appointment will undoubtedly have a significant impact on the state's security apparatus and its approach to policing in the years to come.

Telangana Govt ready to spend over Rs 15,000 cr for paddy procurement : Minister

Hyderabad, Apr 30 : The Telangana Government is prepared to spend more than Rs 15,000 crore to ensure the smooth and timely procurement of paddy during this Rabi season, in what is being described as one of the largest procurement operations in the country's history.

Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister Capt. N Uttam Kumar Reddy along with Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageshwar Rao, who held a high-level video conference with all District Collectors here on Wednesday, termed the paddy procurement programme, the most important and prestigious initiative of the government, for the next 15 to 20 days.

With a record Rabi cultivation spread across 54.89 lakh acres and an estimated output of 127 lakh metric tonnes (LMTs), the state government has planned to procure nearly 70 LMTs of paddy through an extensive network of 8,381 procurement centres established across all districts, Uttam said.

"This is the government's most sensitive and high-stakes programme right now. Besides safeguarding the interest of farmers, it is also linked to the government's prestige," he said. "If you face any problem,



speaking to the Civil Supplies Commissioner. If unresolved, call me directly. We are ready to step in at any moment," the Minister told the officials.

He informed officials that more than Rs 15,000 crore is being allocated for procurement, including MSP and bonus payments.

"We must ensure that once the procurement data from PPCs is uploaded, the payment reaches the farmers within 48 hours. I will speak to the Finance Department to ensure immediate release of the bonus amount," Reddy added.

As of April 29, over 23 LMTs of paddy had arrived at procurement centres, and 19.60 LMTs were already purchased from around 2.55 lakh farmers. Pay-

ments worth ₹2,289.81 crore have already been credited to farmers' accounts against a total MSP value of ₹4,545.72 crore, with the remaining under process. A bonus amount of ₹444.20 crore is also being readied, he informed..

The Minister reiterated that payments must be prompt, seamless, and error-free.

Uttam instructed Collectors to take every precaution to protect harvested paddy from rain-fall and heat, ensuring zero spoilage and zero inconvenience to farmers.

In addressing logistics, Reddy said that in locations where godowns are not accessible, paddy must be shifted directly to mills with sufficient capacity.

He directed the Civil Supplies Commissioner to make advance allocations of 10 LMT worth of storage space and intermediate godowns in districts where needed.

The Minister asked Collectors to coordinate with SPs and RTOs to mobilise private lorries and ensure timely transportation of paddy from PPCs to mills.

Labour shortages must be managed locally, and harvester spacing and technical settings must be monitored to maintain quality. "Ensure blowers are active, RPM settings are proper, and the gear snouts are aligned as per guidelines," Uttam said.

Regarding gunny bags, he clarified that Telangana has already positioned 13.71 crore bags and is mobilising another 3.79 crore.

Reddy instructed that gunny bags must only be issued after verifying moisture levels at PPCs, and not handed over directly to farmers in the field to avoid artificial shortages.

Uttam also appreciated the proactive efforts of the Karimnagar Collector in purchasing dryers and urged other districts to adopt similar measures.

In addition to procurement, the Minister reviewed the distribution of free fine rice to ration card holders. (Cont. on Pg 2)

Permanent solution to land disputes through Bhu Bharati Act : Minister Jupally Krishna Rao

Nagarkurnool, Apr 30 : On Wednesday, as part of the awareness conference on the Bhu Bharati Act held at the Primary Agricultural Cooperative Society godown in Kodair mandal headquarters and Vasavi Kalyana Mandapam in Kollapur town, Excise, Tourism, and Cultural Affairs Minister Jupally Krishna Rao participated as the chief guest.

Speaking at the event, Minister Jupally Krishna Rao stated that to resolve land issues not addressed by Dharani, the government has implemented the Bhu Bharati ROR Act 2025 on April 14th, coinciding with Ambedkar Jayanti. He emphasized that the Bhu Bharati Act is aimed at offering a permanent solution to land problems and increasing accountability in land ownership, thereby avoiding confusion among farmers.

The minister noted that Dharani failed to resolve many public



land issues, which led the government to introduce the Bhu Bharati Act-2025 as a comprehensive solution. He explained that the new law will simplify services such as transactions, registrations, mutations, prohibited land identification, and changes to the ROR (Record of Rights). Unlike the cumbersome Dharani process, the new system is designed to be more user-friendly.

He elaborated that due to the Dharani system, registration processes used to drag on for months. Before the implementation of the Bhu Bharati Act, farmers and ordinary people faced many hardships due to unresolved land issues. He stressed that land ownership is a matter of pride, self-confidence, and courage. Because land purchases were not reflected in official

records, farmers were denied access to benefits like Rythu Bandhu and Rythu Bima. Cultivators were not considered rightful owners unless their names were in Dharani, forcing them to pay bribes for re-registration.

He added that unresolved land problems continue to drive people to government offices, and officials lacked authority under the Dharani system to amend land records. The Bhu Bharati Act now provides justice to farmers who suffered under Dharani. He assured that corrections in passbooks would be made within a stipulated time and that pending applications and sada bainama cases would be resolved under the new law.

The minister urged farmers in the constituency to submit their land-related applications at the Tehsildar offices and then forward the receipts to his WhatsApp number. He promised to take daily prints of the applications



and conduct review meetings with officials to resolve them. He also directed revenue officers to treat all citizens visiting government offices with respect and work diligently to address their issues. District Collector Badavath Santosh stated that the newly introduced Bhu Bharati Act by the state government would provide a permanent resolution to land disputes. He explained that to ad-

dress issues arising from the Dharani system, experts conducted studies in 17 states and, based on comprehensive inputs, framed the ROR Act focusing on the welfare of farmers.

He mentioned that awareness programs are being conducted in every mandal to educate the public about the new law, which replaces Dharani with Bhu Bharati (Land Rights Act).

The Act allows for corrections in land records, land registration, mutations, and resolves pending sada bainama cases. For inherited properties, a detailed inquiry will be held within a fixed time before updating the passbook and resolving land-related disputes. The Act includes a two-tier appeal system: if there are objections to mutations done by the Tehsildar or issued passbooks, one can appeal to the RDO; if unsatisfied with the RDO's decision, further appeal can be made to the District Collector. Beyond that, one can even approach the Land Tribunal.

The Collector stated that free legal aid will be provided to poor farmers during appeals—a unique provision not seen elsewhere in the country. Emphasizing decentralization of powers, he said the government has delegated mutation authority to Tehsildars and RDOs. For transactions like (Cont. on Pg 2)

No problems in procurement of Rabi Grain : Collector Ila Tripathi

Nalgonda bureau, Apr 30 : As per the orders of the state government, the procurement of grain in Nalgonda district is going on smoothly and there are no problems, District Collector Ila Tripathi told State Civil Supplies and Irrigation Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy.

On Wednesday, State Civil Supplies, Irrigation and Food Minister N Uttam Kumar Reddy held a video conference with the collectors of all districts, civil supplies and officials of the relevant departments from Hyderabad on the procurement of Rabi grain. When asked about the grain procurement undertaken so far in Nalgonda district and the problems faced in the procurement of grain, District Collector Ila Tripathi replied that no problems have arisen in the procurement of grain in Nalgonda district so far. She explained that two hundred percent allocations have been made to each mill so that the rice millers in the district can immediately take the grain on the road.

However, although the mills are unloading the grain to the capacity of the mills, it



would be better if they were given the opportunity to store the grain in the agricultural market godowns, and therefore she requested that permission be given to store the grain in the three agricultural market godowns near Devarakonda.

She revealed that steps will be taken to procure the Rabi grain in the coming days. She said that seven mills have been identified in the district that have not unloaded the grain on time due to various reasons, four of which have been identified as not having the proper capacity, and additional allocations are being given to the remaining three and all the grain is being collected.

The Collector also re-

vealed that they are coordinating with the police and transport departments to overcome the problem of lorries, and that they are coordinating with police officers on the national highway and ensuring that there is no problem. Earlier, State Civil Supplies Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy said that the Rabi grain procurement is one of the most important and prestigious schemes of the state government. He directed the district collectors, civil supplies and related department officials to attach utmost importance to the grain procurement for the next 15-20 days and complete the grain procurement without any difficulties.

He said that government



officials and staff at all levels should work hard for 15 days and complete the grain procurement process without any difficulties for the farmers. He said that every farmer should take complete steps to get the support price announced by the government, and also that steps should be taken so that no farmer faces any difficulties at the grain procurement centers, and that preventive measures should be taken to prevent the grain from getting wet, keeping in mind the untimely rains.

If possible, steps should be taken to store the grain in non-alcoholic godowns. He ordered that explanations be given immediately to the negative news appearing in vari-

ous newspapers on the grain procurement. He ordered that at least two grain drying machines be purchased in each district.

He reiterated that the movement of grain from grain procurement centers where there is a possibility of rain should be expedited. He ordered that any problems related to grain procurement should be brought to his attention immediately. He said that the government is ready to provide support price immediately if the tab is entered immediately after purchasing the grain. He instructed the District Collector to pay attention to this matter as there is a possibility of poor grain coming to Nalgonda district from Suryapet.

State Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao said that some millers are not unloading the grain at the mills on time due to various reasons, on the pretext of high prices of HNP, RNR and 1638 varieties of grain, and it has come to his attention that they are deducting five to six kg per quintal, and he instructed the millers not to deduct under any circumstances.

Principal Secretary and Commissioner of the State Civil Supplies Department DS Chauhan said that the most important period in grain procurement is till May 15, and the officials should be alert throughout this time and conduct the grain procurement program smoothly. Keeping in mind the temperatures, drinking water and ORS packets should be kept at all the grain purchasing centers.

In-charge Revenue Additional Collector Narayana Amit, Civil Supplies District Manager Harish, District Civil Supplies Officer Venkateshwarlu, District Cooperation Officer Fatya Nayak, Marketing Department AD Chayadevi, and others attended this video conference.

Former RAW chief to head National Security Advisory Board

New Delhi, Apr 30 (UNI) The government on Wednesday reconstituted the National Security Advisory Board and appointed former Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) chief Alok Joshi as its new chairman.

The revamped seven-member board includes several high-ranking military, Naval, Air Force officials, besides top Indian Police Service officials as its members.

This decision was taken at a high-level meeting convened by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to discuss the escalation of tensions between India and Pakistan and security situation in the country.

The reconstitution of the board is to strengthen security system as the board plays a critical role in providing long-term strategic analysis and policy recommendation to the government on national se-

curity and foreign affairs matters.

The new members of the board are Air Marshal PM Sinha, Lt General AK Singh, Rear Admiral Monty Khanna, and two former Indian Police Service officers -- Rajiv Ranjan Verma and Manmohan Singh. Moreover, B Venkatesh Varma, who served in the Indian Foreign Service, has also been appointed as the member of the seven-member board.

(Cont. from Pg 1) purchase, gift, mortgage, transfer, and partition of land, individuals can book a slot and visit the Tehsildar's office. After verifying that the land is not assigned, POT, or government land, registration will be completed within the deadline.

Tehsildars also have the power to conduct mutations based on inheritance wills, provided a thorough field investigation is conducted before registration. The Collector stated that revenue courts have been reinstated under Bhu Bharati for speedy resolution of land dis-



putes. Comprehensive details, including boundaries, will be linked to patta passbooks along with attached maps. Licensed surveyors will conduct land surveys, and their maps will be reviewed and included in the

official passbooks.

Officials including the RDO, Tehsildar, Agriculture Department personnel, revenue staff, local villagers, and farmers participated in this awareness conference.

CM Chandrababu Expresses Shock Over the Death of Seven Devotees in Simhachalam Wall Collapse

Amaravati, Apr 30 : Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu expressed deep shock over the tragic death of seven devotees due to a wall collapse at the Sri Varaha Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy temple in Simhachalam. A large number of devotees had gathered for the darshan of the deity's original form on Wednesday when a section of the queue line wall collapsed following heavy mid-night rains, leading to the

deaths. The Chief Minister described the incident as deeply saddening and directed officials to provide emergency medical treatment to the injured.

Upon learning of the incident, CM Chandrababu held a teleconference with district officials and ministers Anam Ramanarayana Reddy, Dola Bala Veeranjanya Swamy, Anita, Anagani Satya Prasad, MP Bharat, and Simhachalam Temple Trust Chairman Ashok Gajapathi Raju. Ex-

pressing deep sorrow, the CM inquired into the details of the incident and the medical aid being provided to the injured.

He ordered an inquiry by a three-member committee into the wall collapse. Extending heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families, the Chief Minister announced an ex gratia of Rs. 25 lakh each to the families of the deceased. He also directed that a member from each bereaved family be given an outsourcing job under the

Endowments Department. Further, he sanctioned financial assistance of Rs. 3 lakh for each of the injured.

CM Chandrababu assured that the government will stand by the affected families. He also instructed officials to promptly clear the debris at the site to avoid inconvenience to devotees. Noting that thousands of devotees are expected to arrive, he ordered precautionary measures to ensure safety and prevent panic among the public.

PM Modi to visit Maharashtra, Kerala and Andhra Pradesh

New Delhi, Apr 30 (UNI) Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Maharashtra, Kerala and Andhra Pradesh on Thursday and Friday.

On Thursday, the Prime Minister will inaugurate WAVES 2025, India's first-of-its-kind World Audio Visual and Entertainment Summit at the Jio World Centre in Mumbai. The four-day summit with tagline "Connecting Creators, Connecting Countries" is poised to position India as a global hub for media, entertainment, and digital innovation by bringing together creators, startups, industry leaders, and policymakers from across the world, an official statement said on Wednesday.

In line with Prime Minister's vision of leveraging creativity, technology, and talent to shape a brighter future, WAVES will integrate films, OTT, gaming, comics, digital media, AI, AVGC-XR, broadcasting, and emerging tech, making it a comprehensive showcase of India's media and entertainment prowess. WAVES aims to unlock a 50 billion US dollar market by 2029, expanding India's footprint in the global entertainment economy.

At WAVES 2025, India will also host the Global Media Dialogue (GMD) for the first time, with ministerial participation from 25 countries, marking a milestone in the country's engagement with the global media and entertainment landscape.

Modi will visit the Creatosphere and interact with creators, selected from the 32 Create in India Challenges launched nearly a year ago, which garnered over one lakh registrations. He will also visit the Bharat Pavilion.

WAVES 2025 will witness partici-



pation from over 90 countries, with more than 10,000 delegates, 1,000 creators, 300+ companies, and 350+ startups.

During his visit to Kerala on Friday, the Prime Minister will dedicate to the nation Vizhinjam International Deepwater Multipurpose Seaport worth Rs 8,900 crore.

Vizhinjam Port, having strategic importance, has been identified as a key priority project which will contribute in strengthening India's position in global trade, enhance logistics efficiency, and reduce reliance on foreign ports for cargo transshipment. Its natural deep draft of nearly 20 meters and location near one of the world's busiest sea trade routes further strengthens India's position in global trade.

During his visit to Andhra Pradesh on the same day, the Prime Minister will inaugurate, lay the foundation stone and dedicate to the nation multiple development projects worth over Rs 58,000 crore in Amaravati.

He will inaugurate seven National Highway projects in AP. These projects include widening of various sections of National Highways, construction of Road over Bridge and subway among others. These projects

will further enhance road safety; create employment opportunities; provide seamless connectivity to religious and tourist places like Tirupati, Srikalahasti, Malakonda and Udayagiri Fort among others.

He will also dedicate to the nation railway projects aimed at enhancing connectivity and boosting capacity.

The Prime Minister will also lay the foundation stone of six National Highway projects and one Railway project.

Modi will lay the foundation stone for multiple infrastructure projects that include the Legislative Assembly, High Court, Secretariat other administrative buildings and housing buildings for over 5,200 families, worth over Rs 11,240 crore.

It will also include trunk infrastructure and flood mitigation projects featuring a 320 km world-class transport network with underground utilities and advanced flood management systems, worth over Rs 17,400 crore. The Land Pooling Scheme Infrastructure projects will cover 1,281 km of roads equipped with central medians, cycle tracks, and integrated utilities across the capital city of Amaravati, worth over Rs 20,400 crore.

SC recognizes Right to Digital Access under Article 21

In a landmark judgment aimed at ensuring digital inclusion for the marginalised, the Supreme Court on Tuesday directed the Central Government and financial regulatory bodies to revise digital Know Your Customer (e-KYC) norms to make them accessible for persons with facial disfigurement due to acid attacks and individuals with visual impairments.

A Bench comprising Justice J.B. Pardiwala and Justice R. Mahadevan emphasized the constitutional obligation of the State to create a universally accessible digital ecosystem, especially given that welfare schemes, banking, education, and governance services are increasingly delivered through online platforms.

The Court traced this obligation to Article 21 of the Constitution, interpreting the right to life to include access to digital infrastructure.

Authoring the judgment, Justice Mahadevan stated, "The digital divide, characterised by unequal access to digital infrastructure, skills and content, continues to perpetuate systemic exclusion not only of persons with disabilities but also rural populations, senior citizens, economically weaker communities, and linguistic minorities... Bridging this divide is no longer a matter of policy discretion but a constitutional imperative to secure dignity, autonomy and equal participation in public life."

The judgment was delivered in response to two writ petitions, *Pragya Prasun v. Union of India* and *Amar Jain v. Union of India* highlighting the challenges acid attack survivors and visually impaired individuals face in complying with current e-KYC norms, such as mandatory live photographs, blinking, and head positioning during identity verification.

The Court held that such digital processes must comply with the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, and issued twenty directions (to be detailed upon formal uploading of the judgment) to make e-KYC accessible. These include alternative identification methods that ensure dignity and autonomy for those with disabilities.

Justice Mahadevan noted that persons with disabilities have a statutory right to demand accessibility and reasonable accommodation, and stated that the digital KYC guidelines must be amended to align with universal design principles and accessibility codes.

The Court has now made it clear that access to digital services is not a privilege but a constitutional right, extending the scope of Article 21 to ensure digital equity for all.

PM announces compensation for those killed, injured in Kolkata fire

Kolkata, Apr 30 (UNI) Prime Minister Narendra Modi condoled the loss of 14 lives in a fire at Burrabazar in Kolkata's central business district and announced an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh for the next of kin of each deceased and Rs 50,000 for the injured from the Prime Minister National Relief Fund.



"Anguished by the loss of lives due to a fire mishap in Kolkata. Condolences to those who lost their loved ones. May the injured recover soon," the Prime Minister wrote on his official X handle.

"An ex-gratia of Rs. 2 lakhs from PMNRF would be given to the next of kin of each deceased. The injured would be given Rs. 50,000," he added.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi also mourned the death of the people.

"The news of the death of many people in a terrible fire accident at a hotel in Kolkata is very sad. I express my

deepest condolences to all the bereaved families. Hoping for the injured recovery soon," Rahul wrote on his X handle.

Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, who is currently in Digha for the inauguration of the newly constructed Jagannath temple, called up Mayor Firhad Hakim and the Kolkata Police Commissioner on Wednesday morning to enquire about the devastating fire.

"My heart goes out to the victims of the fire incident that took place at a private hotel (Rituraj) in Burrabazar area," she wrote on her X handle.

"I monitored the rescue

and fire fight operations throughout the night and mobilised maximal fire brigade services in the area. 14 died eventually in total because there were combustible materials stored inside. Investigation has been ordered. My condolences to the victim families and solidarity for all affected," she wrote.

In one of the most devastating fires in recent memory, 14 people lost their lives on Tuesday night at a hotel near Falpatti Machhwa in Burrabazar, central Kolkata. Preliminary investigation has revealed that those killed

were not burned but were choked by the thick smoke within the building. Kolkata police formed a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to investigate the matter.

However, the state BJP president and Union Minister of State, Sukanta Majumdar, has criticised Mamata Banerjee for her indifferent attitude towards the people.

"Today, the Chief Minister is busy with a day-long inauguration programme of Jagannath Dham in Digha. Meanwhile, the death toll from this horrific fire in Kolkata continues to rise. This clearly reveals the insensitivity and failure of the Chief Minister. While the innocent and helpless people are burning and dying in unbearable pain, the Chief Minister is busy exploiting religion for political gains. Year-round appeasement and election-time religious posturing – this, once again, is the clear priority of Mamata Banerjee," Majumdar said.

Odisha sets target to provide irrigation to 15 Lakh hectares in next five years: CM Majhi

Bhubaneswar, Apr 30 (UNI) Odisha has set a target to provide irrigation to 15 lakh hectares of land over the next five years, Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi announced.

Addressing the State-level Farmers' Day celebrations organized on the occasion of Akshaya Tritiya, the Chief Minister said that Rs 1,025 crore has been disbursed as assistance under the CM Kisan Yojana.

In the name of bold writing, this society praises vulgarity in female writers and bestows them with big words. They do all this in the name of women's freedom.

Those confused women also consider opposing family, opposing culture, and supporting perverted sexuality as bold and modern and keep strutting like puppets in their hands. It is a pity that they do not know that they are puppets; they are made to write whatever they want, and that too by coating them in the syrup of modern, courageous, bold, independent, enlightened words. Writing of slimy literature, destruction, and negativity is what makes them called bold and enlightened.

The Hindi literature world still cannot digest the real independent and enlightened women. They want a female writer of the kind they want. She should write on soft issues, family, society, some psychology, and man-woman relationships. For them, the synonym of modernity or a modern woman is that she can write boldly. In the name of bold writing, this society praises vulgarity in female writers and bestows them with big words. They do all this in the name of women's freedom.

Even today, enlightened women with independent consciousness are an uncomfortable truth for the

Hindi literary world. Women who are masters of their independent intellect, who think, raise questions, and do not fit into the old mold of submissive female writers—they are still not acceptable to the literary community. Even today, they want such female writers who fit into their prescribed mold: those who write on 'soft' issues—family, society, a little psychology, and some light-hearted male-female relationships.

When 'modernity' is mentioned on the platforms of Hindi literature, it too has a set framework. For them, a "modern" female writer means one who is "bold"—that is, one who serves obscenity in the name of 'bold writin'g. One who is incited in the name of 'sexual' freedom"—opposition to the family, mockery of culture, and distortion of relationships—is said to be synonymous with modernity. And this entire trickery is wrapped up with such sweetness that the confused female writers themselves believe this lie to be true. They are filled with pride about how 'bold,' 'independent,' and 'modern' they have become—while they have become mere puppets



in the hands of those literary contractors who make them dance according to their convenience. Sadly, they never have the time to raise this question: whether the lesson of freedom that they are being taught, have those male writers taught the same lesson to the women of their homes as well?

The mindset of the literary society is that women's writing should be limited to a hidden realm of tender emotions, beauty, love, separation, or soft porn. If a woman dares to write seriously on geopolitics, religion, philosophy, spirituality, international relations, sociology, politics, education, economics, or policies, she makes them

uncomfortable. This unbearable thought gets embedded in their minds: "These are the fields of men." Women should only embellish words—they should not raise deep questions. Depth of thoughts, sharpness of analysis, and intellectual boldness—all these are still considered 'male bastions' in the Hindi literary scene.

A woman who neither bows down to the desire of any award nor compromises her ideas in the greed of any platform nor is hungry for the favor of any famous critic, a woman who is alert and firm about her thoughts, values, and character—she is still a dangerous presence for the Hindi literary world. Such a woman being the owner of her own conscience and her independence scares them, irritates them, and makes them uncomfortable. They start awarding her with titles like 'arrogant,' 'insensitive,' 'fanatic,' and 'over-intellectual' so that she can be pushed to the margins. But all their ridicule, all their criticism, is just a trivial noise for that woman, who knows that her war is not against the darkness outside but against the darkness within.

Look at this paradox: those who taught women

the lesson of 'modernity' in the name of sexuality still apply the same criteria of 'purity,' 'decency,' and 'tradition' to the women of their own homes. For them, 'boldness' is only for the women of the outside world. The women of the house should still remain veiled, should remain silent, and should remain modest.

Women who sell their freedom for obscenity, their modernity for self-deception, and their courage for the pseudo-support of patriarchy—they do not actually become a part of any revolution but rather become the new cherries of that patriarchal literary system.

The harsh truth is that "Women's Liberation" has also become a brand today. It is traded, displayed on stage, and distributed as awards.

In fact, the rebellion of a woman with an independent consciousness is very subtle and invisible. It is not expressed in vulgar language, not in negativity, not in outrageous boldness—but in the depth of thought, in the accurate analysis of issues, and in the honesty of her writing.

When she writes on love, she explains the complexity

of compassion. When she writes on politics, she draws a picture of the suffering of the people in the churning of power. When she writes on religion, she breaks the web of superstition and intolerance.

She knows that the true purpose of literature is to reveal the truth—not to become a pawn to power, greed, and the sexual market.

Hindi literature will now have to accept that women are not just symbols of "decoration" or "sensitivity." They now ask questions, analyze, break, and create. And most importantly, they no longer want to become pawns of anyone's agenda.

They have become the creators of their own thoughts, their own pens, and their own future. The sooner the literary society understands this change, the better it will be—otherwise only puppets will keep dancing in their world, and women with independent consciousness will keep making new paths for themselves in history.

"When a woman raises her voice, she does not just speak for herself; she challenges the silence of the entire society."



Pak should have been taught a lesson within 24 hours after Pahalgam : SS (UBT)

Mumbai Apr 30 (UNI) Shiv Sena (UBT) leader Sanjay Raut said here on Wednesday that Pakistan should have been taught a lesson within 24 hours after the Pahalgam attack. Raut said that after the terrorist attack in Pahalgam, it should have been given a reply within the first 24 hours like other countries who take revenge immediately. He said even if a soldier is killed, nations like America, Russia and Israel immediately retaliate. Raut said that the country was told that India has stopped the Indus water, but the water is not stopped like that. "For that, storage capacity will have to be built, Dams will have to be built and this will take 20 years," he said. He criticized the Central government over banning 27 Pakistani YouTube channels. "Is this called revenge", he questioned.

Pro-Pak slogans 'an act of treason': Ktk CM

Bengaluru, Apr 30 (UNI) Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Wednesday termed the raising of pro-Pakistan slogans in Kudupu near Mangaluru as "an act of treason" and said 15 people have been arrested in connection with the mob lynching incident, currently under investigation. "Whoever raises pro-Pakistan slogans, it is wrong – it is an act of treason. An investigation is underway, and 15 people have been arrested in connection with the lynching incident," the Chief Minister told reporters in Bengaluru, responding to questions on the violence that shook the coastal city earlier this week. The lynching incident, which reportedly occurred following allegations of celebratory sloganeering after a local cricket match, has triggered tension in the re-

gion and led to heavy police deployment to prevent any flareup. The police have registered multiple cases and are examining video footage and social media content as part of the



probe. The victim has been identified as Ashraf, a resident of Pulpalli village in Wayanad district, Kerala. According to police reports, the incident occurred near the Bhatra Kallurti Temple in Kudupu on April 27 during a local cricket match. An altercation between

Ashraf and an auto-rickshaw driver escalated, leading to a group assault involving over 25 individuals. Ashraf sustained multiple injuries and was declared dead at the hospital. Home Minister G Parameshwara also addressed the incident, urging the public to maintain peace and harmony. He emphasised that taking the law into one's own hands is unacceptable, regardless of any offensive slogans that may have been uttered. Police have registered a case under Section 103(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, which pertains to murders committed by groups of five or more individuals. Investigations are ongoing, with authorities analyzing CCTV footage and mobile data to identify additional suspects.



Deven Bharti appointed new police commissioner of Mumbai

Mumbai, Apr 30 (UNI) Devan Bharti will be the new police commissioner of Mumbai, said state home department here on Wednesday. Bharti will takes charge as Mumbai Police Commissioner Vivek Phansalkar is retiring on Wednesday. The Home Department has issued orders stating that the 1994 batch IPS officer Devan Bharti will take charge as Mumbai Police Commissioner.

Delhi govt decides to enact law to curb fee hike

New Delhi, Apr 30 (UNI) The Delhi government on Tuesday decided to enact a new law to curb school fee hike. The Delhi Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister Rekha Gupta, during the day approved the Delhi School Fee Fixation (Transparent and Regulation) Bill, 2025. Addressing a press conference after the meeting, Gupta and Education Minister Ashish Sood said that it was a historic decision for Delhi. For the first time, such a decision has been taken for the future of children and the convenience of parents. Now no school will be able to do whatever it wants. Till now, Delhi did not have any such Act to regulate the fees of private schools. Sood said there was no provision against fee hike in the 1973 Act. Criticising the preceding AAP Government, he said it did not take any decision on the vital matter. On the other hand, the future of children is the priority of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government. He said the bill will soon be passed by the Assembly. Gupta said the Delhi government has taken a historic and bold decision in which all 1677 private schools in Delhi will be given guidelines regarding fees. As per the new bill, along with the Directorate of Education, the school management as well as parents will also have a role in deciding the fees.



Free encroached land without delay, punish bullies : Yogi

Gorakhpur, Apr 30 (UNI) Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on Wednesday directed the officials to immediately clear encroachments on land belonging to the poor and take strict legal action against the culprits, warning that those who exploit the vulnerable will face consequences. Speaking at the Janata Darshan held outside the Mahant Digvijaynath Smriti Bhawan at Gorakhnath Temple, the CM reiterated the government's unwavering commitment to justice and prosperity for every citizen, urging officers to act with transparency, impartiality and sensitivity. During Janata Darshan, he heard the grievances of



around 200 people. Among them was a distressed woman who shared details of a long-standing land dispute. Assuring her, Yogi said, "Don't worry, your problem will be solved and we'll also take care of your journey

home." These compassionate words moved the woman seeking justice to tears. The CM immediately directed the officials to take swift action and assured her that justice would be delivered without

delay. As the woman expressed her gratitude, she also said she did not have the fare to return home. "Don't worry, you will be given the fare to return home," the CM said while directing the temple management to provide the necessary assistance. He directed the officials to ensure speedy and high-quality resolutions of each of the people's issues. As in previous sessions, several

individuals sought financial help for medical treatment. Yogi assured them of full government support. Handling their applications to officials, he directed that treatment cost estimates be prepared promptly and submitted for approval. Some attendees had brought their children, with whom he interacted warmly, blessing them, gifting chocolates and asking about their studies. He began his day with prayers at Guru Gorakhnath's shrine and the samadhi of his Guru, Mahant Avedyanath. He then visited the temple premises, performed Gauseva at the Gaushala and paused at Bhim Sarovar to hand-feed ducks.

Stick to CWC resolution on Pahalgam attack or face action: Cong warns leaders

New Delhi, Apr 30 (UNI) The Congress on Tuesday directed all its party leaders and functionaries to strictly adhere to CWC resolution adopted on the Pahalgam attack and warned that any deviation from the official line will "attract strict disciplinary action without exception". Congress General Secretary KC Venugopal in a letter said that the "Congress party is deeply anguished by the reprehensible terrorist attack in Pahalgam and stands in unwavering solidarity with the nation during this hour of grief. "At this critical juncture, when our collective resolve is being tested, the Indian National Congress must exemplify unity, maturity and responsibility -virtues that have defined our conduct through decades of national service, in government and in opposition alike," said the letter. He said the unanimous resolution that was passed



by the CWC, chaired by party president Mallikarjun Kharge on April 24 "must serve as the sole basis for all public expressions of the party's stance on the matter". "It is therefore, hereby directed that all comments, statements, and representations - whether by party leaders, spokespersons, media panelists or official handles of the Congress social media department must strictly adhere to the CWC resolution. Any deviation, misrepresentation, or off-the-cuff remark that diverges from the official

line shall be deemed a serious breach of party discipline," it read. The party also instructed all functionaries to "exercise utmost discipline, and consistency in public communication". Venugopal said, "Those authorised to speak on behalf of the party must confine themselves to the CWC's stated position in the resolution passed on April, 24. Any contravention of this directive will invite strict disciplinary action without exception".

BJP tears into Mamata Banerjee, accuses her of being insensitive

Kolkata, Apr 30 (UNI) The BJP, the main opposition in West Bengal, criticized Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee, currently in Digha for the inauguration of the Jagannath temple, accusing her of being insensitive and irresponsible after 14 people died in a devastating hotel fire in Burrabazaar, Kolkata's central business district. "Prime Minister Narendra Modi has already announced Rs 2 lakh for the families of the deceased and Rs 50,000 for the injured. In contrast, the state government remains silent. Twelve hours after the fire broke out, the words of condolences from Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee appear insincere and insensitive," BJP IT chief and co-in-charge for Bengal Amit Malviya wrote on his X handle. "It is unfortunate that such tragic incidents continue to recur in Kolkata due to lack of government maintenance, absence of fire safety equipment, poor urban planning,




and unchecked illegal activities by the promoter lobby," he added. State BJP president and union minister of state for DoNER, Sukanta Majumdar who cut short his stay in Delhi and came back to Kolkata, wrote on his X handle, "The Chief Minister supposedly stayed awake all night in Digha to supervise everything! Following such a horrific fire, the honourable Prime Minister of the country promptly announced financial aid from the Prime Minister's National Relief Fund. "But the real tragedy for

horrific incident, which must be probed thoroughly. However, what is most concerning is that the tragedy struck at the heart of Kolkata, yet the response wasn't adequate and prompt considering the location. Why?" leader of the Opposition, Suwendu Adhikari wrote on his X handle. "Is this because, the whole Administration and WB Govt is on a 3 day vacation in Digha and the People of WB are left to fend for themselves?" he added. "The hotel fire in Kolkata is unfortunate. I express my deep condolences for the deceased. The Chief Minister stayed up all night in Digha monitoring the situation. The police administration has given the necessary instructions to the fire department. Ministers Arup Biswas and Sujit Basu are actively involved. Mayor Firhad Hakim and Minister Shashi Panja have visited the scene in Kolkata," Trinamool Congress spokesperson Kunal Ghosh said.

Seven devotees killed as wall collapses on them

Visakhapatnam, Apr 30 (UNI) Seven devotees were killed and several others injured when a wall collapsed on them when they were standing in a queue to buy tickets at the famous hill shrine Simhachalam, near here, in the wee hours on Wednesday. Police said that a large number of devotees stood in the queue to buy the Rs 300 ticket to have the glimpse of deity Varaha Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy at the famous hill shrine on the devotional occasion Gandhamavasya. The deceased were identified as Patti Durga Swamy Naidu (32), Yedla Venkata Rao (48), Mummapatla Manikantha (28), Gujjari Mahalakshmi (65), Paila Venkata Ratnam (45) Pilla Umamaheshwara Rao (30)



and Pilla Sailaja (26). Four of the deceased belonged to one family and they were Pilla Umamaheshwar Rao, a software engineer, his wife Pilla Sailaja, his mother Pilla Paila Venkataratnam and his aunt G Mahalakshmi. Official sources said that thousands of people started reaching the hill shrine after

midnight and formed a long queue to buy special darshan tickets. Heavy rain accompanied by gales occurred at the temple resulting in a portion of a 20-foot-long wall caving on them. The injured were admitted to hospital where the condition of two of the injured is said to be critical. Home Minister V Anitha,

District Collector MN Harendhira Prasad, Commissioner of police Shankabratha Bagchi, MP M Sribharat visited the scene of the accident. An SDRF team extricated the victims from the rubble and shifted them to hospitals. Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu expressed grief and shock over the death of seven devotees. He announced Rs 25 lakh ex gratia to each of the families of the deceased and Rs 3 lakh for the injured. He held a teleconference with the officials concerned and instructed them to provide the best medical treatment to the injured. The Chief Minister set up a three-member committee to conduct an inquiry into the incident. Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed shock over

the incident. He said on social media: "Deeply saddened by the loss of lives due to the collapse of a wall in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. Condolences to those who have lost their loved ones. May the injured recover soon". Governor of Andhra Pradesh S. Abdul Nazeer has expressed anguish and profound grief on the loss of seven lives due to the collapse of a wall while they were waiting in the queue line to have darshan of Sri Varaha Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy on the occasion of Chandanotsavam in the early hours on Wednesday. The Governor offered his heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and directed the district administration to provide better medical care to the injured.

Two youths arrested for rape of minor girl in Mahoba

Mahoba (UP), Apr 30 (UNI) Two youths were arrested for sexually assaulting a 13-year-old girl in the Ajanar area of Mahoba district here in Uttar Pradesh, a police officer said here on Wednesday. Additional Superintendent of Police (ASP) Vandana Singh said that the incident took place late on Tuesday evening when the girl was returning home from the field late in the evening. "Two youths of the same village caught her near the cremation ground and raped her. After committing the crime, the accused fled, threatening to kill the victim along with her family if she complained to the police about the incident. The victim girl is a student of class 8," she said. She said that the girl reached home after a long time and informed her brother about the entire incident. "The victim was taken to the police station, and a complaint was lodged about the incident. The police have registered a case against two youths of the village, Pramod and Prince," she said. The ASP said that the police showed promptness and arrested both the accused and sent them to jail. "The case is being investigated by Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Harshita Gangwar," she said.

China issues orange alert for forest fires

Beijing, Apr 30 (UNI) Chinese authorities on Wednesday issued an orange alert, the second highest-level warning, for forest fires in parts of China from May 1 to 5.

The national forest and grassland fire-control command office and the Ministry of Emergency Management (MEM) issued the alert for forest fires in parts of Hebei, Shanxi, Henan and Shaanxi during the five-day May Day holiday.

The emergency management departments have been instructed to closely monitor changes in fire hazards, implement early warning and response measures, continuously reinforce fire source control, strengthen emergency preparedness, and effectively address the ongoing severe risk of forest fires.

Forest and grassland fires are among eight major



natural disasters. "Generally speaking, China's forest fires have shown an overall downward trend in recent years," said Yang Xudong, an official with the MEM, on March 21, the International Day of Forests.

Statistics show that, from 1950 to 1989, China averaged approximately 16,000 forest fire incidents annually. This number dropped to around 6,000 between 1990 and 2020, and since 2021, it

has further decreased to less than 1,000 cases per year.

The causes of forest and grassland fires are categorized into natural and human factors, with the latter accounting for over 90 percent of the causes of fire incidents, according to Yang.

China has a four-level warning system for forest fires, with red being the highest followed by orange, yellow and blue.

IMF Executive Board to meet with Pakistan on May 9 to discuss \$7 billion loan

Islamabad, Apr 30 (UNI) The International Monetary Fund (IMF) Executive Board will meet with Pakistani authorities on May 9 to discuss the country's staff-level agreement for a new \$1.3 billion arrangement under a climate resilience loan programme, along with the first review of Pakistan's ongoing \$7 billion bailout programme.

According to the global money lender, this will be the first "review under the Extended Arrangement Under the Extended Fund Facility", along with a request for an arrangement under the Resilience and Sustainability Facility (RSF), as reported by Dawn.

In an affirmation of the meeting, Pakistan's Finance Minister Muhammad Aurangzeb during his visit to Washington had also said that he expected the IMF Execu-



tive Board to approve the programme sometime in early May.

A Board approval would allow for the disbursement of a \$1 billion tranche under the programme secured by Pakistan in 2024. The IMF programme has been instrumental in stabilising Pakistan's fragile economy, offering vital external financing and bolstering market confidence.

The global money lender

and Islamabad had reached an accord in July 2024, under which Pakistan was approved for a three-year, \$7 billion aid package. The new programme was set to allow the country to "cement macroeconomic stability and create conditions for stronger, more inclusive and resilient growth".

The ongoing 37-month EFF programme consists of six reviews over the life of the bailout, and the release of the next tranche of approximately \$1 billion will be contingent on the success of the performance review.

In March, Pakistan and the IMF had concluded the first biannual review of the three-year-loan programme on a positive note, without im-

posing additional revenue measures.

In an end-of-mission statement, mission chief Nathan Porter said: "Programme implementation has been strong, and the discussions have made considerable progress in several areas, including the planned fiscal consolidation to durably reduce public debt, maintenance of sufficiently tight monetary policy to maintain low inflation, acceleration of cost-reducing reforms to improve energy sector viability."

For Pakistan, this is news of significant importance, as its economy is teetering on the verge of bankruptcy, its credit rating has gone down significantly (though there has been a slight improvement as well), private sector investments are next to zero, and public sector units are yielding little benefits.

High alert temporarily shuts down Islamabad airport's airfield

Islamabad, Apr 30 (UNI) The airfield at Islamabad International Airport (IAP) was briefly closed late Tuesday night after aviation authorities issued a high alert due to an unspecified reason, official sources said.

The alert began at 11:48 p.m. local time Tuesday (1848 GMT) on April 29 and lasted until 12:21 a.m. Wednesday (1921 GMT Tuesday) on April 30, leading to a temporary suspension of outbound flight operations for approximately 33 minutes, the sources told Xinhua on condition of anonymity.

During this period, board-

ing procedures for three international flights, PK-233 bound for Dubai, PK-287 for Doha, and PA-210 also heading to Dubai were not initiated, the

sources added.

Authorities have yet to release details about the nature of the high alert.

Despite the brief disruption,

all inbound flights operated according to schedule, and normal airfield operations resumed shortly after the alert was lifted.

Authorities assured passengers that safety protocols were followed to ensure the security of all travelers.

Islamabad International Airport serves as one of Pakistan's key aviation hubs, handling both domestic and international traffic.

The temporary suspension raised concerns among travelers, though services returned to normal shortly after midnight.



14 killed in suspected terrorist attack in north Nigeria

Abuja, Apr 30 (UNI) At least 14 people were killed in an attack by suspected terrorists who attacked a community in Borno, one of the restive states in Nigeria's northern region, local authorities said Tuesday.

The terrorists, suspected to be members of the outlawed Boko Haram group, stormed the Chibok community during a third-day prayer for a late district leader Monday evening, shooting indiscriminately and instantly killing seven mourners, Modu Mustapha,

head of the Chibok local government area of Borno, told reporters.



Seven more bodies were recovered Tuesday as local volunteers combed the surroundings in search of casualties. Many others sustained varying degrees of gunshot injuries during the violence, which, according to Mustapha, had the trappings

of Boko Haram attacks. Several houses were set ablaze during the attack.

The local government official said more casualties might be recovered, as volunteers continue to search for more bodies.

Boko Haram has been collaborating with its sister group, Islamic State West Africa Province, in an attempt to establish an Islamist state in northeast Nigeria. The terror groups have also extended their attacks to other countries in the Lake Chad Basin.

India, UK close to clinching trade deal as Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal wraps up talks in London

London/New Delhi, Apr 30 (UNI) India and the UK are close to clinching a free trade deal, following the talks held between the two sides during the London visit of Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal.

Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal told a business roundtable in London on Tuesday that "25 of 26 matters have been agreed" upon during the negotiations, Politico quoted him as saying.

Amanda Brooks, director general for Trade Negotiations at the Department for Business and Trade, told reporters that a trade deal with India is close.

However, Minister Goyal had raised outstanding issues in a meeting with UK Trade Secretary Jonathan Reynolds. These included India's calls for a carve-out from Britain's forthcoming tax

on high-emissions imports like steel and aluminium that the UK government has promised to roll out in 2027, Politico said.

Other issues include the description of Indian territory in the deal and the sunset clause in the pact's parallel investment treaty.

Both nations had begun talks on a bilateral trade deal in early 2022, however, the talks stalled.

After the Labour government came to power last year, Trade Secretary Reynolds travelled to Delhi in February this year to restart the negotiations. A breakthrough in the talks came after India accepted Britain would only offer minor changes to its visa regime, with the two sides closing the mobility chapter of the deal in recent weeks.

Politico quoted a UK offi-



cial as saying that the new rules will lead to "only 100 new visas for Indian workers per year".

A No. 10 spokesperson said on Tuesday afternoon that negotiations were "con-

structive and productive". They added: "We've been clear that we will only sign a deal in our best interest."

Meanwhile, Minister Goyal posted on X on his meetings in the UK.

"Wonderful to be joined by @DavidLammy, Secretary of State for

@FCDOGovUK at the joint India-UK business reception held at Lancaster House. "Addressed the gathering

along with UK Secretary of State for Business and Trade @JReynoldsMP and spoke about the bright future ahead for the India-Great Britain partnership.

"Immensely grateful for the warm and gracious hospitality extended by our UK partners. Looking forward to tangible outcomes of our shared vision.

A panic-stricken Pakistan peddles fake news, claims 'credible intel' of imminent Indian attack

Islamabad, Apr 30 (UNI) A panic-stricken Pakistan has once again resorted to peddling fake news, claiming it has "credible news that India plans to attack Pakistan within 24-36 hours".

The country's Information Minister Attaullah Tarar claimed that India will use the Pahalgam terror attack as a "false pretext" for launching a military offensive against Pakistan.

In a televised statement, the Pakistani Information Minister said: "Pakistan has credible intelligence that India intends to carry out military action against Pakistan in the next 24-36 hours on the pretext of baseless and concocted allegations of involvement in the Pahalgam incident."

Tensions between the two countries escalated on April 22 after terrorists gunned down 26 people in Kashmir's Pahalgam region. The responsibility for the attack was claimed by the Resistance Front, a group linked to the Pakistan-based Lashkar-e-Taiba terrorist organisation.

Repeating its tired old rhetoric, the Pakistani Information Minister said: "Pakistan has been the victim of terrorism itself and truly understands the pain of this scourge."



Calling Pakistan a "responsible state", Tarar added that Islamabad had openheartedly offered a credible, transparent and independent investigation of the attacks by a neutral commission of experts to ascertain the truth.

"Unfortunately, rather than pursuing the path of reason, India has apparently decided to tread the dangerous path of irrationality and confrontation, which will have catastrophic consequences for the complete region and beyond," he said.

Islamabad has entered panic mode as the Pakistan Army – already stretched thin and continuously under attack by BLA fighters in Balochistan and the TTP in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa – is reportedly seeing massive resignations from officers after the Indian forces were granted a free hand by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

In addition, PM Modi's statement on "hunting down the terrorists till the ends of the Earth" did not go down very well with Pakistan, whose analysts have come up with all kinds of fancy and far-fetched theories regarding "Indian aggression".

The attack was one of the deadliest attacks in J&K, and in response, India has scrapped the Indus Waters Treaty, closed the Attari border, expelled Pakistani nationals except diplomats, declared military advisors at Pakistan's High Commission in New Delhi persona non grata, recalled its own military advisors from the Indian High Commission in Islamabad, and thinned its diplomatic staff.

Bangladeshi Hindu monk Chinmoy Das granted bail by High Court in sedition case

Dhaka, Apr 30 (UNI) Prominent Bangladeshi Hindu leader and former ISKCON priest Chinmoy Das was granted bail by the High Court today, after spending five months in jail in a sedition case.

The bench of Justice Md Atoar Rahman and Justice Md Ali Reza passed the order after holding the hearing on a bail petition filed by Das, head of the Sammilito Sanatani Jagaran Jote.

The Hindu monk is expected to be released from jail following the HC order, unless the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court stays the HC verdict, Advocate Prahlad Debnath, a lawyer for Chinmoy, told The Daily Star.



On April 23, Chinmoy's lawyer Apurba Kumar Bhat-tacharjee prayed to the HC bench to grant bail to his client, saying that Chinmoy is ill and suffering in jail without trial.

Das was arrested without trial in Dhaka on November 25 after a case was filed against him on October 31 last year by BNP member Firoz Khan, accusing him of insulting the Bangladesh national flag at a

Hindu community rally. A court in Chattogram sent him to jail on November 26 and later denied him bail on December 11.

Chinmoy Das, head of the ISKCON-run Pundarik Dham Temple in Chattogram, had spoken out against attacks on minorities across the country since the Aug 5, 2024 overthrow of the Sheikh Hasina government.

The news of his arrest had sparked protests across several districts, including Dhaka, Chattogram, Cumilla, Khulna, Dinajpur, and Cox's Bazar. Protests had been held in ISKCON centres in

India and across the world.

The Hindu monk's arrest attracted considerable attention in international circles, with human rights organisations expressing great concern over the mistreatment of Hindus and other minorities in Bangladesh, the rise of Islamic fundamentalism, and the suppression of dissenting voices under the Mohammed Yunus regime.

In addition, the arrest of Das has also raised several concerns about the safety of legal professionals and the fairness of the judicial processes in Bangladesh, due to the courts' appeasement of Islamists, and the government's hold over the judiciary.

17 injured in residential area blast in north China city

Taiyuan, Apr 30 (UNI) Seventeen people were injured in a residential complex explosion on Wednesday afternoon in Taiyuan, capital of north China's Shanxi Province, with four in critical condition and three discharged after treatment, according to local authorities.

The blast occurred in the Beiyong



neighborhood of Xiaodian District at around 1 p.m. As of 3 p.m., the fire triggered by the blast had been extinguished.

Rescue teams are conducting door-to-door safety checks in the affected building, and an investigation into the cause of the blast is underway.

RBI approves formation of interim Committee of Executives for IndusInd Bank

Mumbai, Apr 30 (UNI) IndusInd Bank on Wednesday in a regulatory filing said that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has approved the formation of an interim Committee of Executives to oversee its operations.

The approval came in a situation where the bank is without a Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer (MD&CEO).

Notably, Sumant Kathpalia had resigned from the position of MD and CEO with effect from the close of working hours on April 29.

The committee, comprising Soumitra Sen (Head – Consumer Banking) and Anil Rao (Chief Administrative Officer), will manage the bank's day-to-day affairs under the supervision of an Oversight Committee of the Board, the bank said.



The Oversight Committee will be chaired by the Chairman of the Board and will include the chairs of the Audit Committee, the Compensation and Nomination & Remuneration Committee, and the Risk Management Committee.

"This interim arrangement has been approved by

the RBI via a letter dated April 29, 2025, and will remain in place until a new MD&CEO takes charge or for a period of three months from the date of the previous CEO's departure—whichever is earlier," the bank said in a statement.

The crisis-ridden bank has clarified that it had for-

mally approached the RBI seeking approval for such a transitional mechanism to ensure business continuity and governance standards following the end of the outgoing CEO's tenure.

"The Bank is taking all necessary steps to ensure stability and continuity of its operations while maintaining high standards of governance," the statement said.

Bank's deputy CEO Arun Khurana had also resigned due to the recent accounting discrepancies in the derivatives trading.

The bank has faced multiple headwinds that clouded its near-term outlook with the key concern being a 2.35% overstatement in its derivatives portfolio, stemming from long-standing internal trade accounting discrepancies.

SEBI cautions public against 'Opinion Trading Platforms'

Mumbai, Apr 30 (UNI) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has cautioned the public against engaging with so-called 'Opinion Trading Platforms', warning that these platforms are neither recognised nor regulated under the current securities market framework.

In a press release issued here on Tuesday, the capital markets regulator noted that several such platforms allow users to trade or enter into arrangements where payouts depend on the outcome of a 'yes/no' proposition, based on whether a certain event occurs or not.

SEBI stated that some of these platforms employ



financial market terminologies such as "profits", "stop loss", and "trading", which may mislead users into believing they are legitimate investment platforms. However, the regulator clarified that such opinion-based trades do not qualify as securities and, hence, fall outside SEBI's regulatory purview.

"Investors/participants should be aware that no investor protection mechanism under securities

market purview shall be available for such investment/participation," the regulator said.

Further, SEBI underlined that these platforms cannot be considered as recognised stock exchanges and are not registered with the regulator. Therefore, if any opinions traded on these platforms qualify as securities, such trading would be illegal and could attract penal action. Recognised stock exchanges have been advised to take appropriate action against such violations, SEBI said, reiterating that trades on these unauthorised platforms will not be entitled to any investor protection mechanisms.

82% of workers in India mull changing employers in 2025 : Aon's study

Mumbai, April 30 (UNI) As high as 82% of workers in India are considering changing employers in 2025, a survey of Aon PLC reveals. More than three-fourths of those surveyed in Aon's 2025 Employee Sentiment Study said that they would be willing to sacrifice existing benefits for a better choice of benefits according to a statement issued here on Wednesday.

Global professional services firm Aon surveyed over 9,000 employees spread across U.S., UK, China, India and Australia for the 2025 Employee Sentiment Study.

The study revealed that in India 7% of employees feel undervalued, less than the 13% global average. A startling 82% of Indian workers surveyed in India are either in the process of moving employers or might seek new employment in the next 12 months, compared to 60% across the globe.

"Until recently, very few companies considered how benefits, wellness and healthcare programs could shape their employer brand and employee value proposition. Post-Covid, we are seeing changes as employees increasingly value these programs, and companies are more actively branding and communicating their availability to current and future employees," said Nitin Sethi, head of Talent Solutions for India, at Aon.



Mental Health: A silent crisis demanding urgent action

Mental well-being can no longer be treated as secondary to physical health. As Government initiatives take shape and public awareness grows, the time has come for a collective, compassionate response to protect our nation's mental health and with it, our future

There is an old saying that a healthy mind leads to a healthy body — I could not agree with it more! Ever since the pandemic, we are witnessing a steep rise in mental health related conditions. It's a matter of grave concern that a large number of people are today suffering from what is termed as unmanageable stress, depression and anxiety. It is equally concerning to note that these ailments are impacting across the age spectrum, be it students, young adults or the elderly.

When we look at the data pertaining to mental health, it is like being hit by a ton of bricks. Such is the extent of this issue that one student is committing suicide every hour in India.

Taking note of the growing suicide deaths in higher educational institutions across the country, the Supreme Court recently formed a National Task Force for a mechanism to prevent student suicide deaths on campuses and address their mental health issues.

The bench said that the National Crime

Records Bureau (NCRB) data for 2021 highlights the grim reality that over 13,000 students lost their lives by committing suicide in the country.

According to the World Health Organisation, depression affects over 300 million people globally, and it is predicted to be the leading cause of disability by 2030.



In 2024, studies in India continue to reveal a significant burden of depression, with estimates indicating that over 56 million people are affected and research points to a rising trend, particularly in rural areas and among certain demographics.

Factors like rapid urbanisation, economic pressures, social isolation, and the pandemic have contributed to the increase. The Bipolar disorder landscape in India is also quite serious, about 1 in 150 persons in the country suffer from it, and quite disturbingly, 70 per cent remain untreated.

It is characterised by low mood, decreased energy, loss of interest,

sleep problems, thoughts or acts of self-harm, along with episodes of mania. Research is now shedding light on the fact that 60 per cent of the people who lose their life to suicide have had a mood ailment such as depression or bipolar disorder. This finding is significant as it points to a series of progressions before this most tragic final step.

When we look deeper into the mental health scenario in India, multiple issues that have a profound impact on mental health — come to the fore.

In the case of the students and the young, many are too busy searching for material things as the entire space for them has become extremely competitive, there is reduced focus on relaxation and unwinding, and as a result burn outs and depression encircle their lives.

In all this, the impact of the internet and social media in aggravating pressures and setting unattainable and overambitious goals — courtesy of peer pressure, is also creating a havoc in the lives of the youth.

In the case of the elderly, we are witnessing the rise in loneliness as their children are either not living with them, due to studies or jobs, or spending much less time because of preoccupations and inability to detach from their busy schedules. There is therefore, a fear of growing old,

along with increasing insecurities — about who will take care of them, when they reach their physical limits due to advancing age.

Since the pandemic, we are witnessing a renewed focus and much greater emphasis on mental health issues. They are now being increasingly considered as much of a priority as many physical issues.

The Indian Government has launched several initiatives to address mental health, including the National Tele Mental Health Programme (Tele MANAS) and the Ayushman Bharat, HWC Scheme.

Tele MANAS provides free, 24/7 mental health support through a toll-free helpline, while the Ayushman Bharat scheme integrates mental health services into primary healthcare. Additionally, the National Mental Health Programme (NMHP) and the District Mental Health Programme (DMHP) are key components of India's mental healthcare services. For the elderly, the Government has

launched the National Programme for Health Care of the Elderly (NPHCE) and the Atal Vayo Abhyuday Yojana (AVYAY).

The NPHCE provides comprehensive healthcare, including mental health services, to senior citizens. AVYAY supports various welfare initiatives for senior citizens, including grant-in-aid for mental health services and awareness programs. Additionally, the National Helpline for Senior Citizens (Elderline) offers support and guidance, including emotional support for those struggling with mental health issues.

It is extremely reassuring that the highest levels of our nation — are aware and alive, to the seriousness of the situation. In fact, our hon'ble Prime Minister has led from the front with his views and possible solutions that can go a long way in addressing this critical subject. In his popular monthly program 'Mann Ki Baat', he highlighted the importance of mental health, especially among the youth in the current era, and spoke

with crystal clarity about the role of physical activity, diet, yoga, along with the use of technology like artificial intelligence to elevate mental health.

This should be seen as a nudge, and it requires a collective approach that involves the families, academia and the community to create an enabling ecosystem that safeguards our students and the generations to follow. These guardrails should both protect and strengthen — protect against the perils of social media, the pressure that it can unleash on the young and innocent, strengthen the two-way communication (candid and unreserved) between the students and their parents/families, strengthen the role of the friends, peers and the community in creating a positive environment that accepts average performance as not the end of the world, and instills the spirit of optimism.

While factors that contribute to mental ailments will only increase in the coming times, it's our proactive and head-on engagement, that will ensure effective remedies.



Fires that will haunt people of Kolkata forever

Kolkata, Apr 30 (UNI) The massive fire at a hotel in Burrabazar, located in the city's central business district, has claimed 14 lives and left several others critically injured. However, this is not the first time the West Bengal capital has been ravaged by a deadly blaze. Over the past 15 years, the city has witnessed more than a dozen devastating fire incidents, resulting in deaths of dozens of people.

The deadliest fire incident in Kolkata's history occurred on December 9, 2011, when a blaze at AMRI Hospital in Dhakuria, allegedly caused by a short circuit in a basement illegally used to store flammable materials, claimed 90 lives, mostly patients trapped inside as smoke rapidly spread through the ventilation system.

The incident occurred just a few months after Mamata



Banerjee became the Chief Minister, following the Trinamool Congress's historic victory that ended 34 years of Left Front rule in the state.

The AMRI Hospital fire was not an isolated tragedy, but part of a recurring pattern that has, over time, turned the city into a metaphorical House of Lac. Just a year earlier, in March 2010, a devastating blaze at the Stephen Court building on Park Street

claimed 43 lives.

The colonial-era structure, which housed both residential apartments and offices, caught fire following a short circuit in one of its lifts. The flames quickly engulfed the fifth and sixth floors, trapping many occupants. In a desperate attempt to escape, several people climbed onto narrow ledges along the building's exterior, with many tragically losing

their lives as they jumped out.

Though the government pledged to curb fire incidents — primarily caused by short circuits from outdated electrical systems — and introduced hefty penalties and strict punishments for building owners who failed to install proper fire safety measures, the recurring blazes across the city showed little sign of abating.

In February 2013, a massive fire swept through an illegal, congested market on Surya Sen Street — lacking basic fire safety measures — claiming 19 lives and critically injuring 17 others, most of whom were shopkeepers and labourers who lived there overnight.

There was a brief decline in fire incidents in the city, but the threat resurfaced in March 2021, when a deadly blaze broke out on March 8

in a multi-storey office building on Strand Road in central Kolkata, killing nine people, including four firemen, a police officer, a Railways officer, and a security guard, with preliminary investigations revealing that five of the victims, found inside a charred elevator on the 13th floor, likely died from suffocation and severe burns as the fire tore through the upper levels.

"We have imposed strict rules and imposed heavy penalties on the people who have violated the fire safety norms. We have also strengthened our safety standards so that we can rescue them as early as possible. This incident is unfortunate. We will surely look into it and if anyone is found guilty, he will be punished," said Minister of State for Fire and Emergency Services Sujit Basu.

Pak violates ceasefire along LoC, Indian Army retaliates effectively

Jammu, Apr 30 (UNI) Pakistan Army resorted to small arms firing and violated the ceasefire along the Line of Control in Rajouri and Jammu sectors.

The defence spokesman here on Wednesday morning said that during the night of April 29-30, Pakistan Army posts initiated unprovoked small-arms fire across the Line of Control opposite the Naushera, Sunderbani and Akhnoor sectors in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

"Indian Army troops responded swiftly and proportionately," he said.

Earlier on Tuesday night, the Pakistan Army violated the truce in the Ramgarh and Pargwal areas of Jammu along the international border.

Official sources said that Pakistan fired small arms and violated the ceasefire in the Ramgarh sector of Samba district and Pargwal area of Akhnoor in Jammu.

The BSF troops effectively retaliated to the firing, they said. However, no injury was reported on their own side, they added.

Border tension escalated between India and Pakistan in the aftermath of the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack.



Stand with govt, don't indulge in politics on Pahalgam: Mayawati

Lucknow, April 30 (UNI) Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) supremo Mayawati on Wednesday said all political parties should stand with the government on Pahalgam terror act, and not indulge in petty politics as it creates confusion among people, which is not in national interest.

Taking to X, Mayawati wrote, "Regarding the Pahalgam terrorist attack, all parties should unite and stand with every step of the government, rather than engaging in petty politics through posturing and rhetoric, as this is creating confusion among people, which is not in the nation's interest."

She also warned Samajwadi Party (SP) and Con-

gress against insulting Baba Saheb Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar otherwise her party may take to streets.



The BSP supremo said, "Along with this, in this matter, the revered architect of the Indian Constitution, Baba Saheb Dr Bhimrao Ambedkar, should absolutely not be insulted. Especially, SP and

Congress should take special care of this, otherwise BSP may take to the streets against them."

On Tuesday a few hoardings were installed near the SP state headquarters in Lucknow and half of Dr BR Ambedkar's image was replaced with party chief Akhilesh Yadav.

The move resulted in a backlash with several senior BJP leaders, including Deputy CM Brajesh Pathak, strongly condemning the SP for replacing half of Dr Ambedkar's image with Akhilesh in a hoarding. Calling the act deeply shameful, they accused SP of insulting Baba Saheb and hurting the sentiments of his followers.

Himachal implements revised power tariffs with four slabs system

Shimla, Apr 30 (UNI) The state government has proposed a revised power tariff for households in Himachal Pradesh consuming over 300 units of domestic power connection.

In a new notification, the Electricity Regulatory Commission introduced a four-slab revised tariff structure for domestic consumers, effective immediately.

The new system maintains benefits for low-usage households while implementing higher rates for heavy consumers, as reflected in the latest tariff notification.

Under the revised structure, consumers using up to 60 units per month will be charged Rs 4.72 per unit, while those consuming up to 125 units would pay Rs 5.45 per unit. However, the first 125 units remain free for eligible households as part of



the state's ongoing subsidy scheme.

A significant change affects consumers exceeding 300 units monthly, who will now pay the full unsubsidised rate of Rs 5.90 per unit.

The tariff sheet reveals a detailed breakdown:

- For consumption be-

tween 126-300 units, the effective rate becomes Rs 5.90 with a subsidy component of Rs. 1.73, resulting in a net charge of Rs. 4.17 per unit

Consumption beyond 300 units loses all subsidy benefits, with the full Rsm 5.90 rate applying.

The three-phase com-

mercial consumers face similar adjustments, though specific rates for this category require further clarification from authorities.

Energy Secretary Rakesh Kanwar confirmed the changes would reflect in May's billing cycle.

"The tiered system ensures equitable distribution of subsidies while encouraging responsible energy use," he stated.

The move aligns with the state's dual objectives of supporting low-income households through the 125-unit free electricity scheme while reducing fiscal burdens from blanket subsidies.

The electricity board has begun updating its billing systems to implement the new structure, with officials available at local offices to address consumer queries regarding the revised tariffs.

UP: Three members of family killed, 3 injured in road accident

Mirwaiz urges people to trust Kashmiris, ensure locals' safety

Srinagar, Apr 30 (UNI) Kashmir's chief cleric and Hurriyat chairman Mirwaiz Umar Farooq on Wednesday urged the people of India not to fall prey to "hatred and media propaganda" creating mistrust of Kashmiris and reciprocate in ensuring their safety.

Mirwaiz was responding to a report which revealed that at least 16 shawl sellers from Kashmir left Mussoorie after two vendors were allegedly attacked by locals last week .

"The physical and verbal assault on Kashmiri shawl vendors in Mussoorie, who had to flee when police refused to guarantee their safety, is very disturbing," he said in a post on X.

"After large-scale detentions, demolition of homes, and crackdowns inside Kashmir, ordinary citizens, students, and small traders outside of J&K are being attacked and forced to return," Mirwaiz added.

The Kashmir's chief cleric said that Kashmiris were themselves at the receiving end of all forms of violence and subsequent suffering for decades.

"Kashmiris' condemnation, empathy, and grief for the victims of the Pahalgam bloodbath is straight from the heart, yet they are being vilified and targeted," he said.

"I appeal to the people of India not to fall prey to hatred and media propaganda creating mistrust of Kashmiris, and reciprocate in ensuring their safety, as they have always done in times of crisis towards all visitors and tourists. The collective punishment being meted out to them both inside and outside Jammu and Kashmir is unjust and inhuman," Mirwaiz added.

And how to turn Generative AI into your best writing ally

"Is AI going to replace us?"

Hyderabad, Apr 30 : It's a question echoing across copy rooms, editorial huddles, and LinkedIn feeds. Ever since Generative AI stepped onto the stage, writers — especially those who've made a career out of crafting stories, campaigns, and brand voices — have felt a tremor underfoot. And understandably so.


After all, these machines can now write articles, spin SEO copy, generate email scripts, and even draft poems in seconds. It's tempting to believe that the era of the professional copywriter or content creator is slipping away. But here's the truth that many miss: speed is not the same as soul. And language is not the same as meaning.

AI Can Write. But It Can't Want to Write.

Creativity — real, goosebump-giving, punch-in-the-gut kind of creativity — comes from a place no algorithm can touch. It draws from childhood memories, cultural context, joy, heartbreak, personal failures, existential questions, and the lived-in chaos of being human.

Think of it this way: if Shakespeare had Grammarly, he'd use it. If R.K. Narayan had Notion or Jasper AI, he'd probably never lose a great line again.

Today, I use AI tools not to replace my writing, but to elevate it.

- ChatGPT helps me break through writer's block when I'm staring at a blank screen and a fast-approaching deadline.
- Notion AI allows me to organize scattered

thoughts, notes, and content outlines faster than ever.

- Writesonic comes in handy for quick marketing copy ideas or A/B testing variations.
- Sudowrite (especially for fiction or long-form) offers suggestions I may not have considered — not better than mine, just different enough to spark something new.
- Grammarly polishes up the grammar so I can focus on the rhythm and tone.
- Perplexity gives me research summaries that help speed up ideation when time is tight.

The result? More speed, sharper drafts, and more time left to do the one thing AI can't — connect the dots in new, human, emotionally resonant ways.

Writers Will Evolve — As We Always Have

The printing press didn't kill the writer. Nor did radio,

television, blogs, or SEO. Each shift only forced writers to adapt — to learn new formats, new platforms, new consumer behaviors. Generative AI is no different.

What it is doing is separating the typists from the thinkers. The real writers — the ones who understand people, brands, behavior, and nuance — will thrive. Because while anyone can generate content today, not everyone can generate connection.

If you've spent years building a muscle for empathy, brevity, insight, and persuasion — congratulations. You're not obsolete. You're indispensable.

So, What Should Writers Do Now?

- Learn the tools. Use them to do the heavy lifting — first drafts, outlines, summaries.
- Focus your energy where it matters — storytelling, insight, originality.
- Stay human. The world

doesn't need more data. It needs more meaning.

- Build a hybrid writing process — half-AI, half-intuition. The future belongs to those who know how to wield both.

As someone who's spent over two decades in the writing business — from chasing political stories as a journalist to shaping brand narratives as the Copy/Content Writer — I can vouch for this: Generative AI isn't the end of our road. It's a new beginning.

One where writers will do less typing and more thinking. Less explaining and more inventing. And maybe, just maybe, more living — so we can bring the human back into every word we write.


Latest update on Sukumar-Ram Charan's next
