CM Revanth Reddy directs fast-tracking of Musi Rejuvenation Project

Hyderabad, Apr 11 : Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy has directed officials to expedite the works under the Musi River revitalization project.

As part of the initiative, the Chief Minister reviewed model designs for a proposed bridge over the Mir Alam Tank and the Gandhi Sarovar planned at Bapughat. He instructed officials to call for tenders by June for the

Control Center, with the participation of Government Advisors Vem Narender Reddy and Srinivasa Raju, Principal Secretary of the Municipal Administration Department Dana Kishore, Joint Managing Director of the Musi Riverfront Development Corporation Gauthami, and other senior officials. During the meeting, consultancies presented model designs for the bridge through a PowerPoint presentation, an of-

ficial statement said. The Chief Minister emphasised that the proposed 2.5-kilometer bridge across Mir Alam Tank should be constructed in a grand and aesthetically impressive manner, without compro-

miting on safety for visitors and commuters. He also approved plans to beautify three island-like areas within the tank, aiming to turn them into major tourist attractions. CM Revanth Reddy suggested that these islands be developed as scenic destinations featuring elements such as bird sanctuaries, artificial waterfalls reminiscent of Singapore's Gardens by the Bay, and public spaces including am-

CM directs metro rail expansion to Future City

Hyderabad, Apr 11 : In a major step toward enhancing urban infrastructure and connectivity, Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy has instructed officials to prepare final proposals for extending the Hyderabad Metro Rail to the proposed Future City.

The directive came during a high-level review meeting held at the Command Control Center on Friday.

During the review, the Chief Minister took stock of the progress related to the second phase of the Metro expansion project. Officials briefed him that approvals from the Central Government are still awaited, although discussions have already been held with officials in New Delhi.

The state government has submitted the Detailed Project Report (DPR) for Phase-II of the Metro project to the Centre. The proposed expansion spans a total of 76.4 kilometers at an estimated cost of Rs 24,269 crore.



The routes covered under this phase include Nagole to Shamshabad Airport (36.8 km), Rayadurgam to Kokapet Neopolis (11.6 km), MGBS to Chandrayangutta (7.5 km), Miyapur to Patancheru (13.4 km), and LB Nagar to Hayatnagar (7.1 km). The project is envisioned as a joint venture between the Centre and the State Government, with funding responsibilities shared between the two.

The Chief Minister stressed

the need for persistent efforts to secure the required approvals from the Centre and directed officials to be ready to commence work immediately once permissions are granted.

In addition to the existing plans, the Chief Minister proposed a new 40-kilometer Metro corridor connecting Shamshabad Airport to the Young India Skill Development University in Future City.

Rescue operations in full swing at SLBC tunnel, soil excavation underway

Nagarkurnool, Apr 11 : Rescue operations to locate those trapped in the Srisailem Left Bank Canal (SLBC) tunnel are progressing rapidly, with soil excavation and other key efforts underway, SLBC Tunnel Special Officer Shivshankar Loteti said on Friday.

The SLBC tunnel accident, which occurred on February 22, trapped eight workers. So far, the bodies of two victims have been recovered and handed over to their families. Authorities are making special efforts to expedite operations and rescue the remaining six workers.

Special Officer Loteti held a high-level review meeting with senior officials of various rescue teams at the SLBC Tunnel Inlet 1 office located in Domalapenta village, Amrabad mandal, under the Achampet constituency in Nagarkurnool district.

Speaking on the occasion, Loteti stated that a massive volume of soil is being removed from within the tunnel using a conveyor belt system. He noted that the rescue teams are relentlessly working inside the tunnel, engaged in activities such as cutting parts of the Tunnel Boring Machine (TBM), clearing steel debris, and managing spring water outflow - all as part of the ongoing efforts.

He added that the operations are being carried out using state-of-the-art technology, in close coordination with the government's disaster management department, tunnel experts, and multiple rescue teams.

Personnel from the Indian Army, National Disaster Response Force (NDRF), State Disaster Response Force (SDRF), South Central Railway, Singareni Mines, and Jaypee Company were present at the review meeting. SDRF Officer Giridhar Reddy, Singareni Mines Rescue General Manager Baidya, Hydra officials, and a representative of the Rat Hole Miners also took part in the discussions.

Loan waiver of one lakh rupees to weavers completed with 34 crores - Ministers launch another industrial unit in Apparel Park

Rajanna Siricilla, Apr 11 : State Handloom and Textile Minister Thummala Nageswara Rao said that the welfare of weavers and farmers will be the top priority of the state government. Ministers visited Siricilla on Friday. Handloom and Textile Minister Thummala Nageswara Rao inaugurated a 1.73 lakh square feet Punctuate World Private Limited (Texport) unit spread over 7.6 acres in the Apparel Park under Siricilla Municipal limits at a cost of 62 crores. Industries Minister Sridhar Babu, BC Transport Minister Ponnamp Prabhakar, Government Whip Adi Srinivas and District Collector Sandeep Kumar Jha inaugurated the plant. On this occasion, the stone plaque of the industry was unveiled. The production process in the unit was inspected. Later, they interacted with the employees of the unit.

Minister Thummala Nageswara Rao said that the government will implement many programs such as worker-to-owner and establishment of an apparel park on Siricilla land to provide livelihood to handloom weavers. He said that the welfare of farmers

and handloom weavers is the priority of the government, and keeping them in mind, the government will work towards providing opportunities to the youth of the state by providing infrastructure. The Telangana government is the only government that has waived off loans of Rs 20,600 crore to farmers at one time, and the minister said that the loan waiver of Rs 1 lakh has been completed for handloom weavers with Rs 34 crore on the occasion of Konda Laxman Babuji's Jayanti. He said that the pending dues of Rs 914 crore have been released to handloom weavers. He said that 290 crore



funds were deposited under various schemes in a single day,

and the government will implement the Handloom Bharosa and Handloom Insurance schemes.

He said that the necessary clothes in all departments in the state are being purchased from handloom weavers, and 900 workers have already been given. He said that the government has given orders worth crores of rupees. He said that the worker-to-owner program will be revived soon after discussing with the Chief Minister. He said that industries related to the handloom sector are being set up in various parts of Siricilla and

IJU slams move to weaken RTI Act through Data Protection Law

(Capital Information) Hyderabad/Chandigarh, Apr 11 : The Indian Journalists Union (IJU) has expressed serious concern over the government's attempt to curtail the public's right to information under the guise of protecting privacy.

In a statement issued on Friday, IJU President K. Sreenivas Reddy and Secretary General Balwinder Singh Jammu said that the proposed changes to the Right to Information (RTI) Act, as envisaged under the Digital Personal Data Protection (DPDP) Act, would effectively dilute the RTI Act and undermine citizens' empowerment.

The DPDP Act, which has already received Presidential assent, will come into force once the rules are notified. One provision in the Act modifies Section 8(1)(j) of the RTI Act, which previously allowed disclosure of personal information in the public interest. The revised provision removes that allowance.

Additionally, the DPDP Act eliminates a key safeguard in the RTI Act which stated that "information which cannot be denied to Parliament or a State Legislature cannot be denied to any person."

The IJU leaders emphasised that the existing RTI Act adequately safeguards individuals' privacy rights, and that altering Section 8(1)(j) would render the law ineffective by preventing access to information that can expose corruption.

Calling the move retrogressive, they urged the government to withdraw the proposed changes in the interest of transparency and accountability in public life.

When asked about the number of Out-Patient (OP) visits per day, staff responded that about 70 people visit daily, and 35 had already come by

the time of the inspection. The Collector examined the OP register and asked whether there was any shortage of medicines. The staff confirmed that there was no shortage.

She also inquired about the types of health issues the registered patients were facing and inspected the laboratory. The Collector directed that collected samples be regularly sent to T-Hub for testing.

DRDO successfully conducts release trials of 'Gaurav'

In a significant stride towards enhancing India's indigenous defence capabilities, the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has successfully conducted release trials of the Long Range Glide Bomb (LRGB) 'Gaurav' from the Sukhoi-30 MKI fighter aircraft. The trial was conducted between April 8-10, a Defence Ministry statement said on Friday.

During the trials, the weapon was integrated to multiple stations in different warhead configurations, with land target on Island. The trials successfully demonstrated range close to 100 km with pin-point accuracy.

LRGB 'Gaurav' is a 1,000 kg class glide bomb, designed and developed indigenously by Research Centre Imarat, Armament Research and Development Establishment and Integrated Test Range, Chandipur. Senior officials of DRDO and the Indian Air Force (IAF) participated in and reviewed these trials.

It is a precision-guided munition designed to strike high-value targets from long stand-off ranges. Unlike conventional bombs, it does not rely on an engine but uses aerodynamic surfaces to glide through the air after release.

Equipped with advanced navigation systems such as GPS and INS, the bomb ensures high accuracy against designated targets while allowing the launch aircraft to remain at a safe distance from enemy air defences.

The Ministry of Defence said the trials demonstrated the performance and reliability of the glide bomb under realistic operational conditions. Officials termed it a milestone in the development of advanced weapon systems tailored to Indian operational requirements.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh congratulated DRDO, the Indian Air Force (IAF), and Indian defence industry partners for the successful development trials. "The development of 'Gaurav' will further enhance the capabilities of the Armed Forces to a great extent," he said in a post on social media platform X.

With an expected range exceeding 100 km, the LRGB 'Gaurav' has been developed to deliver precision strikes on strategic assets such as radar installations, bunkers, airfields, and ammunition depots.

Further technical specifications of the bomb are likely to be revealed after the completion of all developmental and user trials.

The system has been realised with the support of Development-cum-Production Partners - Adani Defence Systems & Technologies, Bharat Forge and various MSMEs.

The Centre for Military Airworthiness & Certification and Directorate General of Aeronautical Quality Assurance contributed towards certification and quality assurance.

The trials would pave the way towards induction of the weapon into the Indian Air Force.

22 Maoists Surrender Before Mulugu SP Dr Shabarish

Mulugu, Apr 11 : In a major breakthrough for law enforcement, 22 members of the banned CPI Maoist party surrendered before Dr. Shabarish P., IPS, Superintendent of Police, Mulugu, on Thursday. Additionally, members of the Kothapalli-Rampur Sarkar Committee, including President Koram Paparao and 17 others, also surrendered. They were reportedly aiding Maoists with supplies and intelligence.

SP Dr. Shabarish urged remaining Maoists to follow suit, assuring full support from the government in providing livelihood and rehabilitation assistance.

The game of the private system: Attack on the common man's pocket

India is a country where education and health are considered basic rights. But when these rights take the form of a business, then these rights become a burden in the life of the common man. In today's era, private schools and private hospitals have created such a system in the name of facilities that directly attacks the pocket of the common man. This attack is not only economic but also mental and social.

Education or business?

Talking about private schools, these educational institutions now seem less like schools and more like five-star hotels. Lakhs of rupees are collected for admission in schools in the name of different items like donation, admission fees, annual charges, dress, books, shoes, bus fees, etc. Books have to be bought from the school's 'authorized vendor,' whose price is double the market rate because the school's commission is included in it. School uniforms also have to be bought from them, which are not available in the general market.

All this is not because parents demand these facilities but because schools have made it 'compulsory.' The thing called studies now happens less in the classroom and more in coaching institutes—and the interesting thing is that the owners of those coaching institutes are also often associated with the same school operators. The child goes to school all day, then coaching, then homework, and then tuition—no time for oneself, no thinking, no childhood.

The aim of all these is the same—"get" 99%." And when these marks are not achieved, the children suffer from an inferiority complex. Parents start comparing them with other children, and this whole process turns into mental harassment.

Health name, business work

Now if this is the situation in education, the health sector is even more horrific. The structure of private hospitals is now more focused on 'earnings' than treatment. As soon as you enter the hospital, a 'slip' is issued, then various tests, expensive medicines, ICU, and demand for 'advance payment'—and that too without telling you what the condition of the patient is.

Doctors treat even a common cold, cough, or fever as if life is in danger. By scaring people, they are advised to take long-term medicines and get admitted. Even if the patient recovers, the family gets sick after seeing the bill. The medicine, which is available outside for Rs. 10, costs Rs. 200 to 300 in the hospital bill.

Even after death, the body is kept for a day or two, and money is collected till the last breath in the name of 'mortuary charges,' 'freezer charges,' etc. This is a cruel joke on the family, which has already lost its loved ones.

Government's silence—why?

The saddest aspect of this loot is that no one has to do it secretly—everything happens openly. Newspapers, social media, and news channels—this issue is raised everywhere. Every year there is a hue and cry over the fee hike of private schools and hospital bills, but every time this hue and cry is slowly suppressed.

Why? Because most private schools, colleges, and hospitals—there is some politician behind all of these. Whether he is from the ruling party or the opposition, most of the people sitting in the system are somehow involved in this game. Rules and laws are made, but they are not implemented.

RTE (Right to Education Act), CGHS (Health Care Scheme), and National Medical Council—these are all mere names used for publicity and not for providing relief to the common man.

The tragedy of the middle class

The government sometimes makes plans for the poor; the rich have no worries, but the middle class suffers the most. They are neither willing to be sent to a government school nor to a government hospital. Out of helplessness, they choose the private option and then get caught in the same trap—a trap in which there is no control, no accountability.

The middle class neither takes to the streets nor protests. Every month it cuts its pocket to pay EMI, pays school fees, pays hospital bills, and thinks only this: "There is no other way."

Solution possibilities

If this problem is to be really tackled, some concrete steps will have to be taken. Transparency of private institutions—Schools and hospitals should publicly display information about their fees and services on websites and notice boards. There should be an independent regulatory body that monitors fees and quality of service. A system where common citizens can register their complaints and they are resolved in a timely manner. It should be ensured that the interests of any political person or their family are not linked to these institutions. Unless the general public unites and raises its voice, this chain of loot will continue.

Education and health are no longer a 'service'—it is now a 'service' whose price is determined by your pocket. This situation is shameful for any sensitive and democratic society. Unless we wake up, raise our voice, and demand accountability from the system, this private system will continue to rob us like this.

We have to understand that by joining the race of showing off, we are putting our children's childhood, our family's peace, and our future stability at stake. This is the time to ask questions, to show the mirror to the system—otherwise not only your pocket will be lost, but self-respect will also be lost.

In India, basic rights like education and health have become a source of profit for private institutions. Private schools charge arbitrary fees from parents in the name of facilities—dress, books, uniforms, coaching—everything has been made expensive and compulsory. On the other hand, private hospitals charge huge amounts from patients by creating an atmosphere of fear and confusion. By declaring a normal disease as serious, pressure is created for expensive tests, medicines, and admission. There is political patronage behind these institutions, due to which no strict action is taken. The middle class is in the greatest crisis, which neither trusts government services nor gets relief from the private system. This is a warning that if the public does not raise its voice even now, education and health will remain mere privileges.

Kanhaiya Kumar, did not approve of the name of RJD leader and former Deputy Chief Minister of the state Tejaswi Prasad Yadav's name as CM saying that the CM face will be decided after the elections.

Toeing the lines of Congress in charge of Bihar Krishna Allawaru, Pilot told news persons here on Friday that the GA would contest the election and the CM face would be decided only after the GA gets absolute majority. Nothing has been finalized as of now and any



decision would depend on the result of the elections, asserted Pilot.

Pilot said that if grand alliances were voted to power, Congress high command and senior leaders of opposition alliance partners would sit together to decide the name of chief minister.

Pilot, however, made it clear that alliance with RJD and Left parties would continue and Congress will contest the upcoming assembly elections in Bihar in alliance with RJD and Left parties. Earlier, AICC In-charge for

Bihar Krishna Allawaru too had stated that the CM's name would be decided after the assembly polls.

However RJD spokesperson Mrityunjay Tiwari said that no one should get confused on the CM face of the GA. He said RJD was the major Alliance partner of GA in Bihar and Tejaswi Yadav would naturally be in the driving seat.

RJD, being a major ally of grand alliance, wants to declare Tejaswi as CM candidate of opposition ahead of assembly elections.

While referring to other issues of Bihar, Pilot accused Chief Minister Nitish Kumar of forcing the youth to migrate to other states in search of employment. He said in lieu of supporting Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Kumar should have demanded at least 10 to 20 Lakh employment for the youth of Bihar.

Stressing the need to stop migration from Bihar, he said that due to poverty and non availability of the opportunity the people from here were migrating to other places.

He demanded from the double engine government to stop migration from Bihar immediately and provide jobs to youths. "The people have lost their faith in the present dispensation.

Before joining the "Palayan Roko Naukri Do Padyatra" of Congress leader Kanhaiya Kumar, Pilot

held BJP and Nitish Kumar responsible for the unemployment and migration. Even after being talented the youth of Bihar were migrating under miserable circumstances.

Pilot admitted that there was no dearth of talent in Bihar but these talents do not get the opportunity to grow. The Congress leader also expressed his concern over paper leak in competitive examinations and said that youths have lost faith in the system.

The people of this state have lost confidence in the government as even after taking degrees of BA and MA the youth were not confident of getting employment within the state.

He said the people of other states also migrate but only for better opportunity whereas the people from Bihar were migrating for their hapless situation.

Nadda launches Ayushman Bharat Scheme in Odisha

Cuttack, Apr 11 (UNI) Union Health Minister J P Nadda on Friday launched the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (ABPM-JAY), the Gopabandhu Arogya Yojana (GJAY), and the Ayushman Vay Vandana Yojana (AVVY) at the historic Bali Yatra ground.

The schemes are expected to benefit over 3.52 crore people in Odisha.

Launching the country's largest health scheme, Nadda said it was a historic day for the people of Odisha, as the promise made during the 2024 elections to implement the Ayushman Bharat Yojana in the state had been fulfilled by the newly formed BJP government.

Describing the initiative as one of the largest healthcare schemes in the world, Nadda clarified that it is an assurance scheme, not an insurance scheme.

Under this model, doctors in over 30,000 hospitals across the country will de-

cide the necessary treatment and medicines for patients, rather than insurance companies.

The Union Health Minister stated that approximately 61 crore people, including 36 lakh Anganwadi and ASHA workers, are covered under the scheme. He added that health coverage of Rs. 5 lakh has now been extended to individuals above the age of 70.

In Odisha, around 3.51 crore people out of a total 4.5 crore population are now enrolled in the scheme. Since its national launch by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in September 2018, the scheme has provided treatment to nearly 8.9 crore people across India.

Nadda remarked that the people of Odisha had previously been deprived of the benefits of the scheme because the Naveen Patnaik-led government was reluctant to implement it, fearing that the credit would



go to Prime Minister Modi.

Now, with the scheme's implementation in Odisha, many Odia individuals working in cities like Mumbai, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Bengaluru, and other states will also benefit, he said.

Nadda noted that only three states—Odisha, West Bengal, and Delhi—initially refused to implement the scheme when it was launched.

However, the people of Odisha and Delhi responded democratically by electing

"double engine" governments, enabling the scheme's implementation in both states, leaving only West Bengal.

He also issued a stern message to the Mamata Banerjee-led government in West Bengal, stating that "the time has come for the lotus to bloom" in the state, and that Ayushman Bharat will soon be implemented there as well.

Nadda further asserted that "single engine" governments that opposed the

scheme have since collapsed, referring to the cases of Odisha and Delhi, where "double engine" BJP governments have now taken over to implement the scheme.

Chief Minister Mohan Charan Majhi, Union Tribal Affairs Minister Jual Oram, Deputy Chief Ministers K.V. Singh Deo and Pravat Parida, and Odisha Health Minister Mukesh Mahaling were present at the event.

Approximately 3.51 crore people from 1.08 crore families in Odisha will be covered under the combined scheme, which offers a health cover of Rs.5 lakh per family per annum, with an additional Rs.5 lakh for women members.

Beneficiaries can avail of cashless treatment at more than 29,000 government and private empanelled hospitals across the country. As per the guidelines, each member of a beneficiary family will receive an individual health card.

Calcutta HC denies permission to hold Hanuman Jayanti on Red Road

Kolkata, Apr 11 (UNI) The Calcutta High Court on Friday refused permission to hold a 'Hanuman Chalisa paath' on the iconic Red Road in the city on Saturday.

A single judge bench of Justice Tirthankar Ghosh of Calcutta High Court, while adjudicating a petition of Sudip Kumar Ram, denied permission to hold a rally on Red Road on the occasion of Lord Hanuman Jayanti on Saturday.

The petitioner sought judicial intervention to hold the event with around 3000 participants after the Kolkata Police denied permission to hold a rally on Red Road on the occasion of Lord Hanuman Jayanti.

The petitioner stated that on the same venue, the annual Durga Puja carnival is allowed, and on March 31 last, and the Eid prayer congregation was held.

The court said the Eid prayer has been held on Red Road for a century. However, Kolkata Police allowed some organisations to hold Lord Hanuman Jayanti elsewhere in the city.

Final decision on caste survey report next Thursday: Siddaramaiah

Bengaluru, Apr 11 (UNI) Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Friday confirmed that the long-awaited caste survey report was formally tabled before the state Cabinet, adding that a final decision on its recommendations would be taken at a special Cabinet meeting scheduled for April 17.

Speaking to reporters, Siddaramaiah said, "It was tabled today. There are a few recommendations in it. Some ministers have said they need to examine those recommendations. After reviewing them, we will discuss it in the Cabinet meeting next Thursday and take a decision."

The report, prepared by the committee led by retired IAS officer Kantharaju Hegde, is based on parameters of social, educational, and economic backwardness. It was presented during the Cabinet meeting held earlier in the day, but a detailed discussion was deferred to a special session.

Law and Parliamentary Affairs Minister HK Patil, addressing the media after the Cabinet meeting, said the government had initiated the exercise to ensure that welfare policies and reservation frameworks reflect the realities of present-day Karnataka.

"The Cabinet discussed the report briefly and has now decided to convene a special meeting on April 17 to deliberate on all aspects in detail and arrive at a final decision," he said.

The caste survey report has emerged as a political flash-point in recent months, especially after Bihar made public its own caste census data. In Karnataka too, various communities and political groups have been demanding transparency and swift action, arguing that the report could pave the way for more equitable distribution of resources and representation.

The original socio-economic and educational survey was commissioned in 2015 during Siddaramaiah's earlier tenure. However, it remained shelved through successive administrations, with officials citing technical hurdles and the need for data verification.

The decision to place the report before the Cabinet marks a significant step forward in what many consider a politically sensitive and socially consequential issue. Analysts say that the government's stance on the report could influence not only the reservation policy but also the broader debate on social justice in Karnataka.

Similarly, when we talk about scientists, Stephen Hawking in our mind, IJACK Newton, A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, CV The same image of male scientists like Raman emerges and not of female scientists like Janki Ammal, Asima Chatterjee, Anna Mani. Yes, even though in the modern era women are walking step by step with men everywhere from earth to sky, but even today, from higher education to research institutions and workspace, their contribution to everywhere is not given as much importance as a man's contribution is given. Despite all kinds of challenges, be a Chandrayaan mission in ISRO or the success of the Mars mission, from NASA to the Nobel Prize in every field our female scientists have considered their iron. So let's know about some female scientists waving their flag in the magical world of science and about the challenges faced by women in the field-

In the century in which women were imprisoned in the boundary wall of the house, at the same time, the names of some female scientists who set up record in the world of science are as follows-

Janki Ammal: Janmi Janki Ammal was a scientist of botanology born in Kerala on 4 November 1897. He had researched the search and cross breeding of hybrid species of gunns which got recognition all over the world. In the year 1957, he was awarded the Padma Shri in view of the contribution to botany. He died on February 7, 1984. Anandibai Joshi: He was born on 31 March 1865 in the city of Pune. These were the first woman in India to have a doctor's degree abroad. After returning to India, he did a lot of work in the field of medical science and health. In 26 February 1887 at the age of just 22, he died due to illness. Asima Chatterjee: Famous Asima Chatterjee was born in Bengal on 23 September 1917 to develop cancer therapy, epilepsy and anti-malaria drugs. These were the first Indian woman who was given a doctorate of science degree by an Indian university. At the age of 90 in 2006, he said goodbye to the world. Anna Mani: Anna Mani, popularly known as the weather scien-

tist, was born on 23 August 1918 in Travancore, Kerala. They did remarkable work in the field of solar radiation, ozone layer and air energy. His life on 16 August 2001 ended. Kiran Mazumdar Sha: Kiran is not an idol of any identity in the world of science. Kiran Mazumdar, a key contributor to the field of biotechnology, established 'Biocon Limited', an integrated biological pharmaceutical company to manufacture enzymes along with research on diabetes, cancer, and self-resistant diseases. Our female scientists have only done incomparable works in the field of science and medicine, but also achieved great achievements in the field of mathematics, space and astronomy. You must know about these women performing powerful in the world of space-

Muthaiya Vanita: These were the project director of the second Chandrayaan mission in India. Muthaiya is the first female scientist to do this level of work in ISRO. These have played an important role in the first Indian remote sensing satellite Cartosat-1 and the second ocean application satellite OceanSat-2 mission used for mapping. In the year 2006, these were awarded the award of the best women scientist.

Ritu Karidhal: Ritu Karidhal, who was the deputy oper-



ations director in Chandrayaan-1 mission, was the mission director of Chandrayaan-2, India's most ambitious mission. In the year 2007, he was awarded the Young Scientist Oward of ISRO.

Tessy Thomas: Tessy Thomas, popularly known as India's missile woman and Agniputri, caught everyone's attention from his work at DRDO. They have contributed immensely to strengthening India's defence system.

Kalpana Chawla: Everybody knows about Indian-origin American astronaut Kalpana Chawla from the little kid to the elderly. Kalpana was the first woman of Indian origin to go into space. She stayed in space for 376 hours 34 minutes. During this time he had made 252 rounds of

earth. Sates astronauts, including Kalpana Chawla, died in a wretched crash in space history that took place on 1 February 2003.

Sunita Williams: Sunita Williams is the second woman of Indian origin to go into space through the American space agency NASA. Sunita Williams established a world record of living in space for 195 days as an astronaut.

What say stats?

Take a look at statistics in the Indian perspective, a survey conducted in the year 2020 showed that out of 1,044 members of the Indian National Academy of Science, there are only 89 women who are 9 per cent of the total number. At the same time, his representation in the year 2015 saw a further decrease that included only 6 per cent of female scientists among 864 members. Similarly, Insa's governing body had only 7 women out of a total of 31 members in the year 2020, while no female members were involved in it in 2015.

At the same time, speaking globally, a study jointly conducted by the Gender in Science, Innovation, Technology and Engineering, Inter Academy Partnership and the International Science Council saw a slight increase in the elected membership of women in higher academics. These numbers were 13 per

cent in the year 2015 to become 16 per cent by buffering in the year 2020. What is the reason for less participation of women in the scientific world

After seeing the above mentioned stats, we may be happy to think that the number of women is increasing year by year against the previous years, but should also look at that its raftaar is very slow. Some of the major reasons that reduce the participation of women are as follows-

A major reason for women's deficiency in the field of science is conservative gender perception. The recognition among the people is rampant that men can do more diligence and more knowledge work better. Women are made for household tasks and therefore they should do household tasks or choose a business that can be handled easily along with household tasks. Women are given on patriarchal approach in hiring or giving fellowship and grants etc. Lack of female role models Not being an assistant to institutional framework during pregnancy and safety-related problems in the workplace make women labour out of this area. In these fields, for a low number of women, there is not only social norms but also quality education. Initiated initiative to encourage women

To encourage women to

pursue a career in the fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics in the country, 'Vigyan Jyoti Yojanas' is being run since 2019 by the Department of Science and Technology (DST). At the same time, 'Kiran Yojanas' was introduced in the year 2014-15 with the aim of providing opportunities to women scientists at the academic and administrative level. The 'Gender Advancement for Transforming Institutions programme was launched to assess gender equality in the field of stem. Overall it wouldn't be wrong to say that over time women have made a different identity of themselves by hard work and perseverance in the field of science; their inventions and experiments have made four moons in the advancement of science and technology but their speed wheel in this science world running gallop is still slow. So to make rapid changes in the status quo, our family, educational institutions, companies and governments, all have to work together. Also, the success stories of women who leave their indelible mark in the scientific world will have to reach the masses to bring a change in the thinking of narrow minded section and the daughters of the country can ensure their participation in the field of increased science.

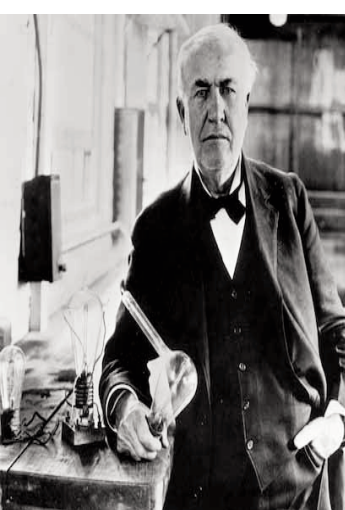
Edison's life was not easy. The teacher had fired from the schoolmates from the primary soccer and the boys themselves did not know that. Edison's mother was edu-

Police detain Congress leader Kanhaiya while marching towards CM's house

Patna, Apr 11 (UNI) The police personnel detained Congress leader Kanhaiya Kumar when he, along with other young leaders of the party, was marching towards the Chief Minister's residence to gherao it.

Kanhaiya, along with Congress National General Secretary Sachin Pilot, took out the "Palayan Roko Naukri Do Padyatra" (stop migration providing job march) from the party headquarters, Sadakat Ashram here on Friday. When the march, which Pilot had joined symbolically as he had some prior engagements, reached near Rajapurpul in the state capital, the police stopped the marching youth through heavy barricading.

The SDPO Krishan Murari Prasad said that the Congress leader Kanhaiya and others did not heed the police warnings and continued



their march. He said initially police personnel resorted to mild force upon them, but when they went berserk and became violent during their protest, the security personnel opened water cannons to disperse the agitated mob. He said that nearly 15 to 20 youth Congress leaders, including Kanhaiya were detained.

Meanwhile, Kanhaiya while leading the march, said

that the migration of youth in search of employment was a burning issue which needed serious political discussion, but neither was there any discussion or debate on the issue, nor was there any policy to address the burning problems.

He said that when the parliament is silent on such grave issues, the political parties should come onto the streets, as they have no op-

tion other than to take the matters to the streets.

Providing employment to youths of Bihar to check migration to other states in search of their livelihood was a serious issue in Bihar, along with the wretched law and order condition, poor education, and health Services. Attempts should be made for redressal of the serious issues, he demanded.

Replying to a query regarding the absence of the leaders of the alliance partners of the Grand Alliance (GA), Kanhaiya said that the GA is an electoral Alliance. He said that " Palayan Roko, Naukari Do Padyatra " is a programme of the youth wing of the Congress, and if any other constituent units of the GA join it, their move would be welcomed. He said the Congress also supports the events of other constituent units of the GA.

Kanhaiya had embarked on "Palayan Roko, Naukari Do Padyatra " from Bihiharwa on March 16 and, after passing through various districts, including Begusarai where he was defeated by the Union Minister and prominent Hindu leader Giriraj Singh in the last Lok Sabha election, was taking out the March in the state capital. He was scheduled to reach the CM's residence in the form of a procession to hand over

a memorandum to the Chief Minister Nitish Kumar requesting him to take urgent steps for the redressal of grievances of youths relating to their migration to other states in search of their livelihood.

He said that Bihari youth were frustrated due to poor educational quality within the state, where law and order had also totally collapsed.

Another Hurriyat constituent announce disassociation from separatist ideology

Srinagar, Apr 11 (UNI) Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday announced that one more affiliate organization of Hurriyat Conference has disassociated itself from separatist ideology.

In a post on X, Shah said till now as many as 12 Hurriyat-linked organizations have broken off from secessionism, resting trust in the Constitution of India.

"Under the Modi govt the spirit of unity rules J&K. Another Hurriyat affiliate organization, Jammu and Kashmir Mass Movement, has rejected separatism, declaring complete commitment to the unity of Bharat. I sincerely welcome their move. Till now as many as 12 Hurriyat-linked organizations have broken off from secessionism, resting trust in the Constitution of India," Shah said.

"This is a victory of PM Shri @narendramodi Ji's vision for Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat."

The Jammu and Kashmir Mass Movement is headed by Fareeda Dar alias Fareeda Behanji.

After the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019, the Hurriyat Conference has been rendered virtually defunct. While almost the entire top- and middle-rung leadership of the hardline faction of Hurriyat is in jail, the moderate faction last month saw two of its constituents banned by the Centre.



BJP slams Karnataka Congress govt for 'diverting' Rs 38,000 cr Dalit-Adivasi funds

Yellapur (Karnataka), Apr 11 (UNI) The BJP on Friday accused the Congress government in Karnataka of "diverting" Rs 38,000 crore earmarked for the socio-economic upliftment of Scheduled Castes and Adivasis, saying the Siddaramaiah-led government has "turned welfare into wholesale loot".

At a rally held here as part of the BJP's Janakrosh Yatra, Karnataka BJP President Vijayendra Yediyurappa claimed that the Congress government, led by Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, had "betrayed the Dalits and tribals" by misappropriating the funds under the Scheduled Caste Sub-Plan (SCSP) and Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP), meant for their socio-economic upliftment.

"This is not just corruption. This is constitutional sacrilege," Vijayendra said. "These funds are protected under

law, designed to empower historically oppressed communities. But Siddaramaiah has diverted Rs 38,000 crore, turning welfare into wholesale loot," he charged, triggering loud applause from a gathering that braved the summer sun.

Vijayendra said the BJP will not allow the issue to fade away. "We will take this to every village, every doorstep. The Congress party has stolen from the most marginalised sections of society — Dalits and Adivasis. This is unforgivable," he declared.

Taking a dig at the internal contradictions within the Congress party, Vijayendra remarked that the BJP need not even level corruption charges. "One of their own — Basavaraj Rayareddy, a Congress MLA and Chief Minister's advisor, has already admitted publicly that this



government is corrupt. What more proof do the people need?" he asked.

The BJP leader also lashed out at Siddaramaiah for what he termed "appeasement politics" under the guise of inclusion. "The Chief Minister has given 4 per cent reservation in government contracts exclusively for Mus-

lims. This is a backdoor attempt to communalise the administration. It's an insult to Hindus and unconstitutional," he said.

Accusing the Congress of pushing the state into an inflationary spiral, Vijayendra said the government had failed even in managing basic economic stability. "In the last 20

months, prices of more than 50 essential commodities have gone up. Instead of reducing them, Siddaramaiah has formed a 'price recommendation committee' — not to control inflation, but to decide by how much prices can be raised," he quipped.

Farmers, he said, have been particularly hit. "The

government has increased diesel prices by Rs 7.50 in less than two years. Tractors, pump sets, generators — everything runs on diesel in rural Karnataka. What is the plight of our farmers now?"

Vijayendra reminded the public of the Congress party's dramatic gestures before the elections. "Siddaramaiah walked towards the Krishna river to promise action on irrigation. DK Shivakumar gave fiery speeches. But after coming to power, not a single rupee has been given to any Krishna basin irrigation project. It was all theatre for votes," he said.

The BJP also accused the state government of financially crippling the Karnataka State Road Transport Corporation (KSRTC) by failing to reimburse it for the electricity subsidy schemes. "KSRTC is owed Rs 6,500 crore. Thou-

sands of buses that serve rural routes have stopped running. School and college students have been stranded. What kind of welfare model is this?" Vijayendra asked.

He further slammed the increase in milk prices, arguing that it had affected the poorest of the poor. "Nutritious food is slipping out of reach for poor families. You can't call yourself a pro-people government when even milk becomes unaffordable," he added. "The Congress gives freebies with one hand and takes away essentials with the other.

Vijayendra concluded his address by calling for a "people's movement" against what he called the Congress party's "loot raj." "This is no longer about politics. This is about accountability, justice and the soul of Karnataka," he said.

Nainar Nagendran files papers for TN BJP Prez's post, set to be elected unopposed

Chennai, Apr11 (UNI) BJP Legislature Party leader Nainar Nagendran on Friday filed his papers for the election to the post of Party Tamil Nadu Unit President.

His candidature was proposed by top BJP leaders including incumbent President K Annamalai, senior leaders like Union Minister L Murugan, former Union Minister Pon Radhakrishnn, BJP MLA Ms Vanathi Srinivasan, H Raja and others.

He filed his papers before BJP State Vice-President and Election Officer M Chakravarthy at the party headquarters 'Kamalayalam', where a large number of party cadres were present and greeted him.

Greeting started pouring to Mr Nagendran even before he filed his papers.

Mr Nainar Nagendran, who was elected from the southern Tirunelveli to the State Assembly in 2021, is the

only candidate to have filed his papers and he was all set to be elected unopposed.

His election as the 13th BJP President of TN was expected to be announced by the BJP High Command.

He emerged as the front runner after Mr Annamalai categorically stated that he was not in the race in the elections for next BJP TN Unit Chief post and would serve the party

as an ordinary cadre.

He said those candidates who had served as a primary member of the party for a minimum period of ten years alone would qualify to contest for the post of President's elections and they should be proposed by 10 State General Council members in writing.

The BJP was expected to amend the rules to clear the path for Mr Nainar Nagendran, who had

been with the party since 2016, after being in the AIADMK for a long period.

They said BJP Tirunelveli MLA and Floor Leader in the State Assembly Nainar Nagendran has emerged as the front runner for the post of BJP TN Chief and this was said to have been almost decided after his visit to New Delhi a few days back where he met the top party leadership.

Ex J&K Cooperative Housing Corporation Ltd MDs, others booked by ACB for financial irregularities

Jammu, Apr 11 (UNI) The Jammu and Kashmir Anti Corruption Bureau has registered a case against the then Managing Director (MD) of J&K Cooperative Housing Corporation Ltd and others for financial irregularities.

The official spokesman here on Friday said that the former MD, Brij Bhushan Sharma along with Sewa Ram, then In-charge Accounts Section J&K Cooperative Housing Corporation Ltd and Bharat Bhushan, then MD, J&K Cooperative Housing Corporation Ltd and others.

The instant case was registered on the basis of a verification conducted by the ACB that revealed that the then MD of J&K Housing Corporation namely Brij Bhushan Sharma, who was superannuated from services on 30.06.2006, obtained total loan of Rs. 23 lakhs from J&K Cooperative Housing Corporation, without following specified procedure, approval and without any further mortgage and any supplementary deeds thereby abused their official positions.

Verification further revealed that as per Board of Directors decision dated 01.03.2006 for extending pension benefit to said Brij Bhushan Sharma Ex. MD, it was decided that Rs. 15 lakhs will be deposited with the post office as pension fund out of which 50 per cent contribution will be made by J&K Cooperative Housing Corporation and 50 per cent contribution by him.

The 50 percent share (i.e., Rs. 7.50 lakhs) to be paid by him was to be released in his favour by the Corporation which was to be refunded by him from his retirement dues.

Only Rs. 1.50 lakhs stands recovered/deposited by him during the year 2022-23 and apart from, no effective steps have been taken by present Managing Director of Corporation to recover the balance amount from his monthly pension dues, he said.

As per housing loan of Rs 23 lakhs drawn from time to time and repayment made by Brij Bhushan Sharma, Ex. MD, an amount of Rs 36,40,375.50 alongwith interest as on 31.03.2023 is still outstanding against him, he added. Further, he said that regarding the Advance of Rs 7.50 lakhs drawn by him against pension scheme, an amount of Rs 18,99,266 alongwith interest as on 31.03.2023 is still outstanding against him.

The probe conducted further revealed that Bharat Bhushan, present Managing Director of J&K Cooperative Housing Corporation Ltd. who took charge after retirement of Brij Bhushan, Ex. Managing Director in the year 2006 did not take any effective steps or legal action to recover the amount drawn by Brij Bhushan, thereby shown criminal silence on his part.

KGs of Hashish Oil which is contained three packets in one college bag worth of Rs. 80 Lakhs (as per market value), two Mobile Phones from their possession. The main Sellers (Ganja Durga) is absconding. Efforts are in progress to apprehend the absconding accused.

It is learnt that approximate 40 to 50 KG Ganja is used for making 1 KG of Hashish Oil, thus the total 4.0 KGs Hashish Oil consumed approximate 200 KGs of Ganja.

There is a fair bit of action left for the rest of 2025 with multiple notable films. In the lineup. We have to see how many of these will actually be able to impress the audience.

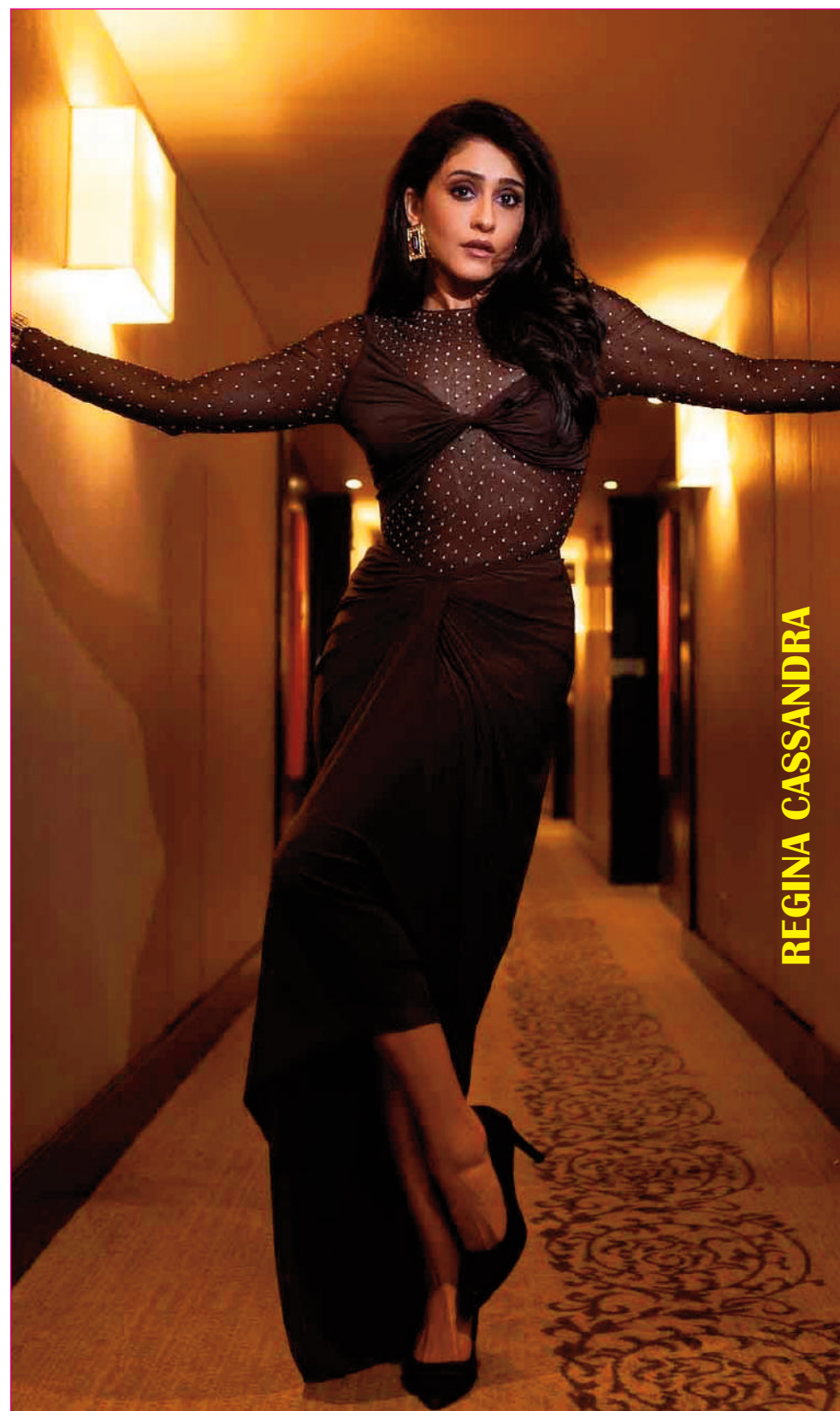
Ravi Teja's Mass Jathara to hit the big screens on July 18 ?

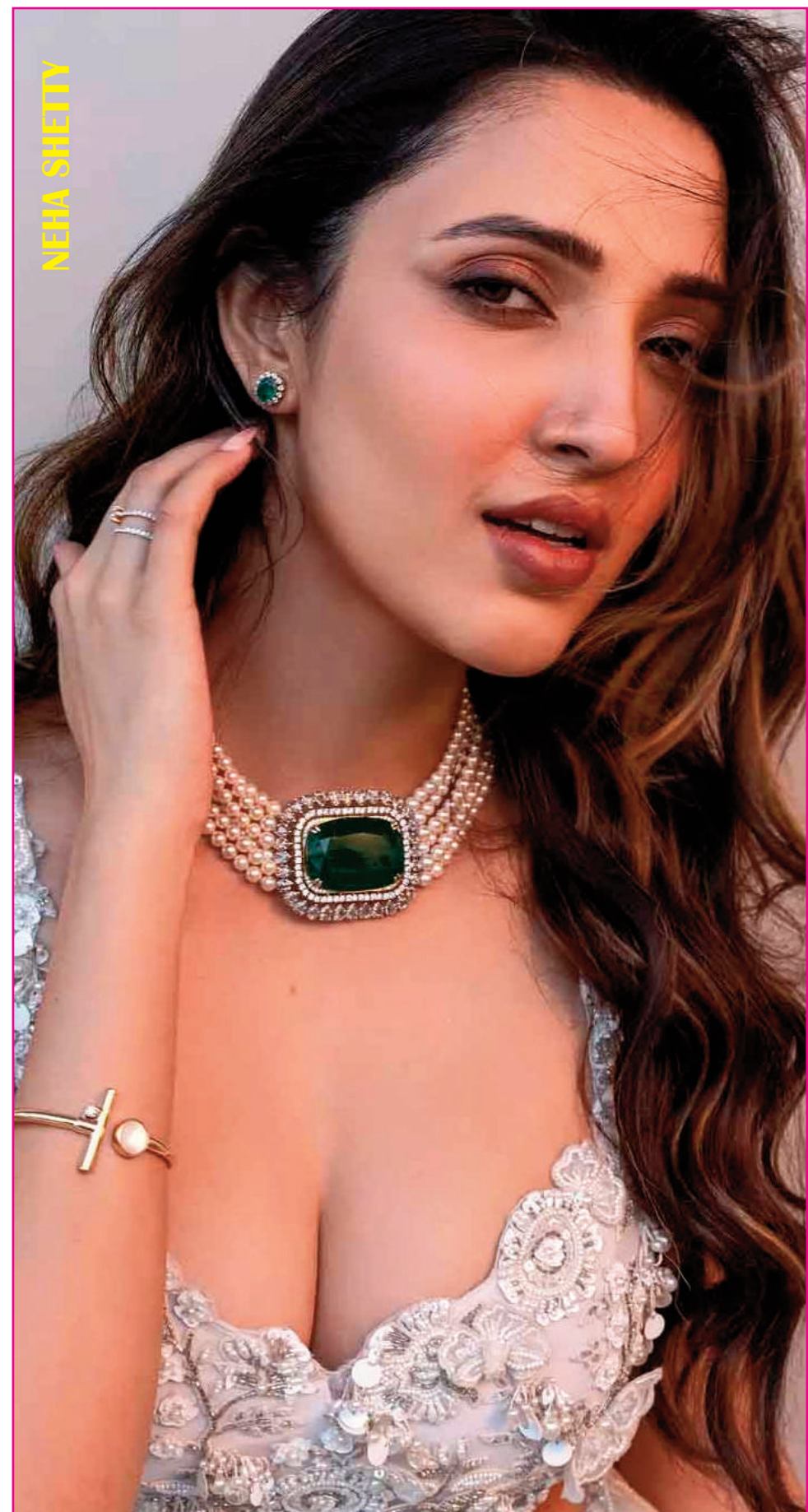
Jr NTR to grace Arjun S/o Vyjayanthi trailer launch & pre-release event

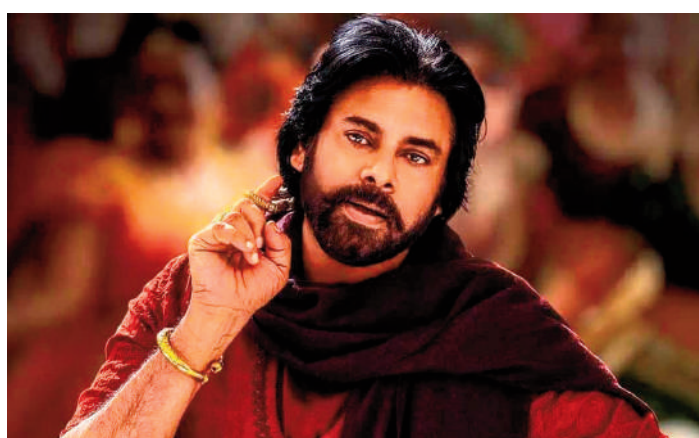
