Telangana leads nation with Rs 5 lakh grant for poor under Indiramma housing scheme

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, May 3: Telangana has emerged as the only state in India offering Rs 5 lakh financial assistance per beneficiary for housing under the ambitious Indiramma Scheme, announced Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy.

Speaking at a certificate distribution ceremony held at the National Academy of Construction (NAAC) in Hyderabad on Saturday, the Minister said the state government, under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, is set to construct 4.5 lakh Indiramma houses this year with a total outlay of Rs 22,000 crore. The initiative aims to fulfill the longstanding aspiration of the poor to own dignified housing.

He said that Telangana stood out in offering such a high



level of direct support to housing beneficiaries, unlike other states that rely primarily on Central funds. The new homes, each not less than 400 square feet, are being built directly by the beneficiaries using the ?5 lakh grant.

Construction has already begun in pilot villages, and the beneficiary selection process

will be finalized in the coming days. The Minister also handed over training certificates to 350 assistant engineers who recently completed a six-day program at NAAC. Notably, 45 per cent of the newly trained engineers are women, and selec-

sistant engineers to uphold integrity, avoid corruption, and ensure that only eligible applicants receive the housing benefits. He also stressed the use of advanced technology to eliminate middlemen from the payment process, stating that stage-wise payments to beneficiaries are being processed every Monday.

In a related development, the Minister presented promotion certificates to 21 employees of the Stamps & Registration Department. This included 10 Grade-2 Sub-Registrars promoted to Grade-1 and 11 Senior Assistants elevated to Grade-2.

The Minister encouraged young engineers to adopt costeffective and quality-focused construction practices and to spread awareness among beneficiaries for efficient implementation of the housing program.

Centre prioritising infra boom across India: Kishan Reddy

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, May 3: Union Minister and Telangana BJP president G Kishan Reddy said on Saturday that the Centre is giving top priority to infrastructure development in 90 per cent of districts across the country, with Telangana receiving special attention under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership.

Speaking to the media at the BJP state headquarters in Nampally, Reddy stated that comprehensive development in sectors such as roads, railways, airways, ports, and telecommunications is essential for driving economic growth and creating employment opportunities.

He noted that over the past decade, the Modi government



has invested lakhs of crores of rupees to strengthen connectivity across the nation.

Reddy highlighted the transformation of Telangana's infrastructure, stating that the national highway network in the state has more than doubled from 2,500 km in 2014 to 5,200 km now - with an investment of Rs 1.25 lakh crore.

He said that Union Road Transport and Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari will visit Telangana on May 5 to inaugurate and lay the foundation stones for 26 projects worth Rs 5,416 crore, covering a total distance

He said these projects include completed works as well as new developments involving road widening, flyovers, underpasses, and service roads in districts such as Hyderabad, Adilabad, Nizamabad, Kamareddy, and Medak

He also pointed to major infrastructure initiatives such as the Surat-Solapur-Chennai Economic Corridor, the Hyderabad-Visakhapatnam corridor, and the Nagpur-Vijayawada which will significantly improve Telangana's connectivity with other regions. These projects form part of a broader Rs 1 lakh crore investment into infrastructure development linked to Telangana. (Cont. on Pg 2)

The flag-off ceremony took place at Raj Bhavan, Hyderabad on Saturday, a Raj Bhavan communique said.

With ₹15 lakh in support from the Hon'ble Governor allocated for the Nagarkurnool district, the program is designed to help these youth gain meaningful employment while enabling tourists to experience the Nallamala forest's cultural richness and biodiversity.

Despite a supportive environment fostered by government initiatives such as Startup India, a staggering number of startups fail to survive beyond their initial years. Industry data reveals that nearly 80-90% of Indian startups shut down within the first five years, and only 8% survive beyond a decade.

A recent deep-dive into the root causes of these failures uncovers a pattern of critical missteps and overlooked fundamentals. Lack of Product-Market Fit, Many startups fail to align their offerings with real market needs. Innovative ideas

often miss the mark by being either too ahead of their time or irrelevant to the target demographic.

Poor Financial Planning, Ineffective cash flow management and over-optimism in early-stage revenue projections lead to unsustainable operations. Ineffective Leadership and Team Conflicts, Founders often struggle with vision alignment and decision-making, weakening the core of the startup. Inadequate or Misdirected Funding, Startups either raise insufficient capital or misuse the funds, leading to premature scaling or operational breakdowns.

Weak Marketing and Customer Acquisition StrategiesWithout strong branding and targeted outreach, many startups fail to gain traction in competitive markets. Regulatory and Compliance Challenges, Navigating India's complex legal landscape without expert guidance frequently results in compliance failures. Technology and Product Development Issues, Lack of technical expertise and poor scalability often undermine product reliability and user satisfaction. Improper Scaling Strategies, Scaling too fast or too slow, without stable operational groundwork, leads to missed opportunities or financial distress

Neglecting Customer Feedback, Ignoring user input and failing to iterate based on feedback leads to disengagement and churn. Fierce Market Competition, Startups that cannot differentiate themselves lose out to well-funded or more innovative competitors. Poor Hiring and Team Building, Weak team dynamics and unclear roles lead to low morale and inefficiency. Misjudging Market Potential, Entering oversaturated or low-demand markets without thorough research results in underperformance and exit.

While India continues to produce unicorns and success stories like Flipkart, Zomato, and Paytm, the high failure rate highlights the urgent need for realistic planning, disciplined execution, and continuous market engagement. The message to aspiring entrepreneurs is clear, innovation must be grounded in market realities, supported by strong leadership, and built on solid financial and operational strategies.

IP House, the conversation reflected the growing consensus that piracy is no longer a fringe concern but a mainstream threat demanding coormulti-dimensional dinated, responses.

Vivek Couto, Managing & Executive Director of Media Partners Asia, underlined the economic cost of unchecked piracy. "Online piracy is expected to cost the industry over 10% in lost revenue between 2025 and 2029," he said. "But

Mumbai, May 3: At WAVES effective anti-piracy enforcement could drive a 25% increase in legal video service users and unlock a US\$ 0.5 bil-



lion boost in content investment, raising the total value to US\$ 3.8 billion by 2029." He urged stakeholders to reframe the piracy discussion from protection to potential, especially as India's digital video economy scales.

Dr. Shruti Mantri, Associate Director at ISB Institute of Data Science, highlighted the intersection of digital piracy and cy-"Piracy bercrime. often involves malicious tools like

trojans, ransomware, and spyware. Users between 18-24 years old are particularly vulnerable," she said. She called

for comprehensive public awareness campaigns and **III** educational initiatives, noting that prevention must begin with informed consumers. She also announced a Digital Piracy Summit being organized by ISB in collaboration with CBI and Interpol on July 9-10.

Speaking on anti-piracy operations in the sports sector, Anurag Kashyap, Head of Anti-Piracy Operations at DAZN, explained the preventive approach. "Our strategy is built around the three Ds: detection, disruption, and deterrence. We start enforcement even before the event goes live," he said. Invisible watermarking, he added, plays a pivotal role in tracking leaks.



High Court Orders Compensation for Munneru **Land Evictees**

Shabbir Ali vows to fulfil lifelong dream of completing Pranahita Chevella Project

Congress government's revival of original design to benefit 1.3 lakh acres in Kamareddy, Banswada, Yellareddy, Ramayampet

(Capital Information) Nizamabad bureau, May 3: Telangana Government Advi-

sor Mohammed Ali Shabbir on Saturday reiterated his lifelong commitment to the completion of Pranahita-Chevella project, declaring that he would not rest until irrigation water permanently reaches farmers in Kamareddy district. Chairing a meeting

Pranahita-Chevella RWS officials at the R&B Guest House in Kamareddy, Shabbir Ali said, "It is my dream of a lifetime, and even if it takes my last breath, I will fight to see this project completed. I want to see joy in the eyes of Kamareddy farmers before I die. Shabbir Ali thanked Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar

Reddy, and Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka for sanctioning Rs 23 crore for the revival of the project. He strongly criticised the previous BRS government, accusing it of conspiring to cancel original Pranahita-Chevella project by merging it into the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Scheme. "This move deprived poor farmers of 3.5 TMC of irrigation water, affecting hundreds of acres," he



said.During ten years of BRS rule, not even Rs 10 crore was allocated.

Now, the Congress government has revived the original design, which will provide 15 TMC of irrigation water. Farmers too are coming forward to give land for the project," he stated.Shabbir Ali directed officials to expedite land acquisition and other pending issues to resume works immediately. So far, 80% of compensation has been distributed, and the remaining will be completed using the sanctioned Rs 23.15 crore. "We will begin construction within 15 days," he assured. The project is expected to irrigate 80,000 acres in Kamareddy, 10,000 acres in Banswada, 30,000 acres in Yellareddy, and 12,000 acres in Ramayampet of Medak district.

He also pledged to ensure uninterrupted drinking water supply for the next 20 years by repairing old pipelines and laying a new pipeline to fully utilise Godavari waters. "As summer peaks, every effort must be made to avoid water shortage." he instructed.Addressing administrative issues, he reminded officials that with the term of public representatives ending in municipalities and panchayats, government officers must now act as local guardians. "Coordinate with senior officials to resolve problems.

Any negligence in duties or inaccessibility to citizens will invite strict action,he warned.in a separate meeting with Mission Bhagiratha officials, Shabbir Ali reviewed works taken up under the Amrut Kaal scheme. Of the 104-km-long second pipeline being laid to supply Godavari water, 24 km has been completed so far.

The remaining works will be completed in the next two months. He asked officials to immediately clear any forest clearance hurdles by coordinating with higher authorities and secure approvals within a week. Under Mission Bhagiratha, 7,200 new free tap connections will be provided within the Kamareddy municipal limits, especially in slum areas, starting this week.Currently, Kamareddy municipality, surrounding villages need 11 MLD of water.

Supply is being managed with 6 MLD from Sriram Sagar Project, 1 MLD from Burra Mathadi, and 2.5 MLD from Pedda Cheruvu. Once the second pipeline is completed, all shortages will be resolved, he assured. Reviewing with municipal officials, Shabbir Ali also directed arrangements for deploying water tankers in urban areas to prevent any water crisis

during the summer.

Sand Ramp Owners Must Not Tarnish Government's Image: Surya

(Capital Information) Mulugu, May 3: Mulugu, May 3State Congress leader Surya, son of Minister Seethakka, issued a stern warning to sand ramp owners across Mulugu district, urging them to operate strictly within the boundaries of legal regulations. He emphasized that any actions leading to public inconvenience or damaging the government's reputation would not be tolerated.

Speaking to the media, Surya stated that several



complaints have been received from villagers across the district about illegal and unregulated operations at various sand ramps. "Ramp owners are parking lorries indiscriminately, causing severe traffic disruptions and making life difficult for ordinary citizens," he said.

Reaffirming the commitment of Minister Seethakka to public welfare, Surya concluded, "The government will not allow its image to be tarnished by the irresponsible actions of a few ramp operators. Necessary action will be taken to protect the public."

Introduce BC Bill, ensure 50 pc reservation in legislative bodies: R Krishnaiah urges PM Modi

(Capital Information) **Hyderabad**, May 3 : Rajya Sabha Member and President of the National BC Welfare Association, R Krishnaiah, has uraed Prime Minister Narendra Modi to introduce a BC Bill in Parliament to ensure 50 per cent political reservation for Backward Classes (BCs) in the legislative bodies.

In line with SC/ST welfare frameworks, he demanded the introduction of a BC Act to provide social protection and security to Backward Classes

Highlighting the effects of globalisation and privatisation, Krishnaiah sought reservations for SC/ST/BCs

in private sector employment as well as appointments to the Supreme Court and High He further appealed for

the allocation of Rs 2 lakh crore in the Union Budget for BC welfare, the implementation of a nationwide post-matric scholarship and fee reimbursement program, and a 60 per cent central matching grant for state-initiated schemes.

He also pressed for subsidised loans through the National BC Corporation to support traditional BC professions and demanded that the central government fill 16 lakh job vacancies in its departments and public sector undertakings.

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N Chandrababu Naidu praised Krishnaiah's long standing dedication to the BC cause, stating that he has been a tireless advocate for the community for over four decades.

She also served as a member of the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister and Convener of the Advisory Council of the 16th Finance Commission.

Prior to joining NCAER, Dr. Gupta held senior positions at the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and the World Bank for nearly two decades. Dr. Gupta also taught at the Delhi School of Economics, University of Maryland (USA) and also served as a visiting faculty at the Indian Statistical Institute (ISI), Delhi. She has been an RBI Chair Professor at the National Institute of Public Finance and Policy (NIPFP) and a Professor at the Indian Council for Research on International Economic Relations (ICRIER).

Dr. Gupta has published several research papers and authored an edited book 'Emerging Giants: China and India in the World Economy'. She holds a Master's degree and PhD in Economics from the University of Maryland, USA. and a Master's degree in Economics from the Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi.

CBI busts child sexual abuse networks as part of Op Hawk

Kolkata, May 3 (UNI) The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has busted cybercrime networks in parts of India allegedly involving online child sexual exploitation with international linkages after the federal agency received inputs from the USA, official sources said.

" On the basis of inputs received from the USA, the CBI launched Operation Hawk and successfully dismantled the cybercrime networks involving online child sexual exploitation with international linkages," the CBI said.

The International Operations Division of CBI registered a case against one Sheik Muizz Ahmed under section 506 of Indian Penal Code as well as section 66D of Information Technology Act, 2000 and section 12 read with section 11 of POCSO Act, 2012 and launched investigation to detect the cybercrime network involving online sexual ex-



ploitation.

During March, 2024, accused Sheikh Muizz Ahmed, a resident of Mangalore, operated through social media platform "Discord" under the username "heisenberg7343" and engaged in online chats with " a minor girl from the

During chats, the accused induced the minor girl to engage in sexualized chats with him and he further enticed her to share her obscene images/videos with

him over the said platform, the CBI said.

"The accused also intimidated the minor victim to engage in obscene sexual activities online," the federal agency stated.

Following registration of the case, the CBI conducted extensive searches at various locations in Mumbai and Mangalore linked to the accused leading to recovery of electronic devices viz mobile phone and laptop which contained CSAM obtained by the victim by way of inducement. Accused Sheikh Muizz Ahmed was arrested by the CBI and sent to judicial cus-

The International Operations Division of CBI registered another case against Mukul Saini under section 506 of Indian Penal Code as well as section 67 of Information Technology Act, 2000 and section 12 read with sections 11 and 15 of POCSO Act, 2012 and launched investigation.

During the period 2023-2024, accused Mukul Saini, resident of Delhi operated through social media platform "Discord" vide IDs "Izumi#9412", "Izumi#7070", "Deadddd#6873" and "Arisu" and engaged in online chats

with a minor girl from USA. During chats, the accused induced the minor girl to engage in sexualized chats with him and share her obscene images/videos with him over the said platform,

accused from the minor girl the federal agency said.

The accused also intimidated the minor victim to continue sharing her obscene images/videos, otherwise he will make her obscene images/videos viral on the inter-

The investigation agency then conducted extensive searches at various locations in Delhi linked to the accused leading to recovery of electronic devices via mobile phones and computer hard disks containing incriminating digital evidence relating to the case.

Earlier, the CBI had launched Operation CAR-BON in 2021 and Operation Megh Chakra in 2022 as part of its efforts for rapid response to online child sexual exploitation cases with international linkages and trace accused, suspects and conspirators, located across international jurisdictions, requiring a globally coordinated law enforcement re-
