# KCR appears before Kaleshwaram Commission, submits documents during 50-minute inquiry



(Capital Information) Hyderabad, June 11: Former Telangana Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) appeared before the Kaleshwaram Commission of inquiry on Wednesday at BRK Bhavan in Hyderabad on Wednes-

The inquiry, which lasted approximately 50 minutes, was conducted by Commission Chairman P C Ghosh, who questioned the former CM regarding the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project. During the gans of "Jai KCR" and "Jai

session, KCR submitted several documents to support his statements.

He became the 115th person to be examined by the Commission, which has so far interrogated 114 individuals as part of its ongoing investigation into the multi-crore irrigation

Following the inquiry, KCR exited the premises and directly got into his car. He greeted party supporters gathered outside, who raised sloTelangana." Former Minister T Harish Rao also accompanied KCR in the same vehicle.

KCR departed from his farmhouse in Erravalli at 0930 hours and reached BRK Bhavan by 1100 hours.

He was accompanied by a group of party leaders, including MLC Madhusudan Achari, MLAs Harish Rao, Vemula Prashanth Reddy, Padma Rao Goud, Bandari Laxma Reddy, MP Vaddiraju Ravichandra, and leaders RS Praveen Kumar and Mohammed.

## CM Revanth Reddy may reassign portfolios held by him to new Ministers, rules out Cabinet reshuffle

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, June 11: Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Wednesday indicated that the newly inducted Ministers in the State Cabinet may be allotted portfolios currently held by him, with no changes planned for the existing Ministers. However, any redistribution of departments would be based on consultations with party leaders and requests to reduce his workload.

"There was no discussion in Delhi regarding a fresh Cabinet expansion or portfolio allocation," he said.

The Chief Minister currently holds around 11 portfolios, including Home, Municipal Administration, Sports, and Education, some of which may be handed over to the new Ministers. Of the 18 sanctioned Cabinet berths, 15 have been filled, leaving three positions vacant.

In an informal interaction with the media in Delhi before concluding his three-day visit, Revanth Reddy said he was there to brief the party leadership on the

successful completion of the caste census and Scheduled Caste categorisation in Telangana, which he suggested could be replicated in Karnataka and other States

On the political front, Revanth Reddy alleged that BRS president and former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao and his family were "enemies of Telangana." He asserted that as long as he remained in the Congress. none of them would be allowed to join the party. Referring to Chandrashekhar Rao's deposition before the Justice P.C. Ghose Commission, he hinted that he would soon release documents related to the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation

He also launched a broadside at Union Minister G Kishan Reddy, alleging that he had done nothing for Telangana and had obstructed key infrastructure proj-

"Unlike other BJP Ministers who took Metro Rail and other infrastructure projects to Chennai and Bengaluru, he brought nothing to Telangana," he added.

# KTR slams CM Reddy, defends KCR's legacy on Kaleshwaram and Telangana's progress

Working President K T Rama Rao (KTR) on Wednesday launched a scathing attack on Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy and the Congress government.

Speaking to the media at BRK Bhavan, where the Kaleshwaram Commission enquired about former Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao, he strongly defended KCR's role in transforming Telangana, especially through the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project.

KTR questioned whether the government would issue notices to KCR for increasing Telangana's paddy cultivation to over one crore acres-surpassing Punjab and Haryana-and for building the world's largest lift irrigation project in just four years. KTR declared, "No matter how many conspiracies are hatched, the truth will prevail. KCR's name will be etched in golden letters in Telangana's history-as the architect of the state's prosperity."


#### Singer Mangli booked after police raid birthday party at a resorts in Chevella

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, June 11: A surprise police raid was conducted at a resorts in Chevella, Rangareddy district, around midnight on Tuesday, where popular folk singer Mangli was celebrating her birthday.

According to reports, Mangli had hosted a party for around 50 guests, including family, friends, and some members from the film industry, at a resort located on the outskirts of Irlapalli village in Chevella mandal. The Special Operations Team (SOT) of the police conducted a raid around 1400 hours.

Following the raid, police registered cases against singer Mangli, the event organizer, the resort manager, and one individual who reportedly tested positive for drug use (Ganja). Charges include organizing a party without prior permission and causing public nuisance.

In a tweet, the police stated that the Chevella police raided the resort where "anti-social activities" were reportedly taking place. "If laws are not followed, we will be forced to take action. regardless of their fame. Strict measures will be taken against those involved in drug use,"

# Telangana HC grants bail to Gali Janardhan Reddy, 3 in illegal mining case

Hyderabad, June 11: The Telangana High Court on Wednesday granted bail to four convicts in the Obulapuram illegal mining case, providing a temporary reprieve from the seven-year prison sentence handed down by the CBI Court.

The High Court suspended the sentence awarded by the Nampally CBI Court on May 6 and granted conditional bail to former Karnataka Minister Gali Janardhan Reddy, his personal assistant Mefaz Ali Khan, BV Srinivas Reddy, and V D Ra-

As per the High Court order, each convict must furnish two sureties of Rs 10 lakh. The court also directed Gali Janardhan Reddy to surrender his passport and barred all the accused from leaving the country.

The CBI Court had earlier sentenced all four accused to seven years of imprisonment and imposed a fine of Rs 20,000 each in connection with the 15-year-old illegal mining case involving Obulapuram Mining Company.

Additionally, Rajagopal, a former government official, received an extra four years of imprisonment and another Rs 20,000 fine due to his official misconduct.

The latest verdict of the Telangana High Court offers interim relief to the convicts as their appeals proceed.

#### sion concludes public hearing on inclusion of 26 omitted castes

(Capital Information) Hyderabad, June 11: The Telangana Backward Classes Commission on Wednesday concluded its three-day public hearing on the inclusion of 26 castes that were excluded from the state's BC list following the formation of Telangana.

The final day of the hearing was held from 1100 hours to 1700 hours at the Commission's office. The session was presided over by BC Commission Chairman G. Niranjan, along with members Rapolu Jayaprakash, Ms Bala Lakshmi Rangu, Deputy Director U Srinivasa Rao, Special Officer G Satish Kumar, and Research Officer G Lakshminarayana.

On the concluding day, the Commission reviewed 64 representations, bringing the total number of representations examined during the three-day hearing to 133. Community leaders from Pondara, Settibalija, Koppulavelama, Polnativelama, and Kalinga castes personally appeared before the Commission, urging for their inclusion in the Telangana BC

Notably, Andhra Pradesh MLA from Amudalavalasa constituency, Kuna Ravi Kumar, attended the hearing and made a representation on behalf of the Kalinga caste.

However, several representatives from castes currently listed under the Telangana BC 'A' category appealed to the Commission not to reinstate the 26 omitted castes, citing concerns over existing reservations and representation.

#### **ACB** raids on former irrigation SE Noone Sridhar's premises in DA Case (Capital Information)

Hyderabad, June 11: In a major crackdown, the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) officials conducted simultaneous raids at 12 locations across Telangana on Wednesday.

The searches are part of an ongoing investigation into a Disproportionate Assets (DA) case registered against Noone Sridhar, a former Superintending Engineer (SE) in the Irrigation Department.

ACB officials carried out intensive inspections at Sridhar's residence and other related premises. He has been detained and is currently being interrogated by ACB authorities.

The BBA has been sharing information against child trafficking with RPF and assisting in rescue of trafficked victims mostly children along with arrest of traffickers.

RPF initiative has lead to the arrest of 649 HUMAN TRAFFICKERS across PAN INDIA with rescue of 2719 persons from being trafficked for various reasons in last 5 years (2021 to April 2025)

with 2456 children, 263 male traffickers and rehabilitation - female adults.

To safeguard vulnerable children nationwide, RAIL-WAY PROTECTION FORCE has set up more than 750 Anti-Human Trafficking Units and 135 Child Help Desks across the country.

Anti Human trafficking units are playing the crucial role in identification of children being trafficked and their subsequent rescue from Human traffickers.

# 'Ouality Education in Government Schools Is Our Priority": DEO Ramesh Kumar

#### Academic Year Will Have 230 Working Days Syllabus to Be Implemented in a Planned Manner

(Capital Information) Nagarkurnool, June 11: With schools reopening today, Nagarkurnool District Educational Officer (DEO) A. Ramesh Kumar stated that the focus this academic year is on creating a joyful and conlearning ducive environment for students and ensuring quality education across all government schools.

Speaking to the media, the DEO said that all necessary arrangements have been made for the reopening of schools from Thursday. Efforts have been taken to ensure that students are welcomed into a pleasant atmosphere on the very first day of school.

Following the directives of District Collector Badavath Santosh, all government schools across the district have been cleaned and arranged to provide a hygienic and vibrant envi-



ronment. Necessary provisions such as furniture and classroom sanitation have been made so that students face no incon-He emphasized that

for the 2025-26 academic year, steps are already being taken from the outset to improve educational standards. As part of these ef-

forts, training sessions for subject teachers across the district were conducted in two phases last month.The DEO added that during these training programs, teachers were briefed on subject-wise teaching strategies, necessary precautions, and

best practices to follow from the first day of school.

A special campaign titled "Badi Bata" was launched in villages from June 6 to enroll students in government schools. Teachers have been actively involved in this campaign throughout the week. Children from Anganwadi centers are also being enrolled into gov-

ernment schools. The DEO said that teachers are highlighting the facilities and quality education provided by the government to ensure a higher enrollment than last year.

He stated that respon-

sibilities will be assigned to subject teachers right from the beginning of the academic year to imand achieve better SSC (Class 10) results compared to the previous year. Plans are in place to conduct additional study hours and subject-wise tests after each lesson is completed.

According to the academic calendar for the new school year, the state education department has designated 230 working days for students.

Investigation revealed that Krishna, S/o Mallanna, Age:30 years, Occ: Private Job, R/o Guntaseema (vil), Dumbriguda (M), Alluri Sita Ramaraju (Dist), AP (currently source and a childhood friend of Pangi Keshava Rao, introduced him to the illicit drug trade, with a promise of huge profits. Jairam Khemundu later became acquainted with Krishna and joined the illegal activity. The accused Keshava Rao had been previously arrested in a NDPS case by Anakapally Town Police, Andhra Pradesh.

The accused were purchasing Hashish Oil at a low price and selling it to buyers in Bangalore for huge profits, nearly 10 times to the procurement rate. Two days prior to the arrest, a buyer from Bengaluru placed an order for 20 KGs of Hash Oil to the accused. Accordingly, both the accused persons procured the 20 KGs of Hashish Oil from Krishna at Hukumpeta, Alluri Sita Ramaraju District of Andhra Pradesh and reached to the outskirts of Hyderabad to sell the Hashish Oil to a Bangalore based party.

On credible information, today i.e., on 11.06.2025 morning hours, while both the accused were waiting for the receiver at Sampoorna Hotel, Near ORR, Peddamberpet, they were apprehended by SOT LB Nagar team and Ab-



dullapurmet Police and seized Hashish Oil (Hash Oil) - 20 KGs, Mobile phones – 03 and net cash Rs. 870/- from their possession.

Efforts are underway to trace and apprehend the main source Krishna and the Bangalore-based receiver, who are currently absconding. The past criminal history of the arrested individuals is also being verified.

It is learnt that approximately 35 to 40 KG of Ganja is used for making of 1 KG Hashish Oil.

# Sri Lankan Army commander in India to boost defence ties

# India's social security coverage at 64%, gets ILO pat

New Delhi, June 11 (UNI) India's social security coverage has surged from 19% in 2015 to 64.3% in 2025, a 45percentage point increase, the Government said on Wednesday.

"This progress has earned official recognition from the International Labour Organization (ILO), which now ranks India second globally in terms of the number of beneficiaries," as per a statement from the Union Labour and Employment Ministry here.

Approximately 94 crore (940 million) citizens are now covered by at least one social protection benefit, according to the statement.

India has also become the first nation to update its 2025 social protection data on the ILOSTAT database, underscoring its commitment to transparency and digital governance.

expected to strengthen India's position in global negotiations, including social security agreements



(SSAs) with developed nations, ensuring Indian professionals can access benefits while working abroad.

In a bilateral discussion with ILO Director-General Gilbert F. Houngbo at the 110th International Labour Conference (ILC) in Geneva, Union Minister of Labour and Employment Mansukh Mandaviya highlighted the government's pro-poor and labour welfare initiatives.

"Our 'Antyodaya' approach, focusing on empowering the last mile, has been central to this success," Mandaviya said. "This achievement is a testament to our commitment to leaving no one behind. #### **US administration will cut Ukraine military** budget: Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth


Washington, June 11 (UNI) The current lenges." US administration will cut its military

budget for Ukraine next year, said US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth.

Hegseth shared the surprising info during a hearing before the U.S. House of Representatives Defence Subcommittee, which sparked discussions among many experts and analysts.

"It is a reduction in this (upcoming defence) budget," Hegseth told lawmakers, "This administration takes a very different view of that conflict," reports Politico.

"The budget includes cuts. This administration has a completely different perspective on this conflict. We believe that a peaceful resolution through negotiations will be in the interest of both sides and in the interest of our country, especially given the numerous global chal-



ful settlement is in the best interest of both parties and our nation's interests, especially with all the competing interests around the globe," he said.

So far, the United States has provided Ukraine more than \$66 billion in aid since the conflict between Russia and Ukraine broke out in February 2022, according to

U.S. media reports, as per Xinhua.

While the officials in Washington have continued to provide Ukraine with arsenal - as was approved under the previous Joe Biden administration and cleared by Congress - the Trump administration has not announced any fresh assistance, with the US President making no secret his disdain for Ukrainian leader Volodymyr Zelensky, whom he has blamed for the war.

#### People who burn US flag should go to Jail for 1 year:

Trump
Washington, June 11 (UNI) People, who burn US flags during protests, should be sentenced to 1 year in jail and the US authorities are working to introduce this measure, US President Donald Trump said on Tuesday.

"People that burn the American flag should go to jail for one year. What they should be doing. We'll see. We can get that done. Try and get that done. We're working with some of your senators," Trump said in a speech at Fort Bragg.

The statement was made amid the violent protests in California where some protesters carried Mexican flags and burned US ones.

#### Kremlin wants peace but Ukraine must stop being western proxy: Russian Presidential aide

Moscow, June 11 (UNI) Russian Presidential aide Vladimir Medinsky has said that Moscow wants peace, but Ukraine must stop playing the role of 'Western proxy', if it wants the same.

Medinsky had previously underscored that a mutually acceptable agreement between Russia and Ukraine could be reached quickly - if the Ukrainian side were to prioritise national interests over external guidance.

Russia wants peace, but if Ukraine "keeps being driven by the national interests of others, then we will be simply forced to respond," Medinsky told The Wall Street Journal.

Long wars with Russia end in inevitable defeat for its enemies, warned the chief negotia-



tor in peace talks with Ukraine, citing a 21-year war with Sweden in the 18th century.

Stating that the West has made a bad mistake by treating the Ukraine conflict as something similar to the ones that occurred between England and France.

He noted that while the latter two have their own distinct histories and cultures, same was not the case with Russia and Ukraine, as the two have long shared strong cultural and linguistic ties something that the ongoing war won't change.

"This is like a conflict between two brothers-one older and one youngerabout who is smarter and more important," he said, adding: "This conflict sadly deepens our differences, and that's why we want it to end as soon as possible.'

Earlier, in an interview on The Rick Sanchez Effect RT show, Medinsky noted that the Ukrainian delegation in 2022 appeared more autonomous and willing to engage.

However, by 2025 the Ukrainians seemed more constrained, he noted, suggesting this indicated growing external influence over the Zelensky regime's positions.

## Austria observes 3-day national mourning after mass school shooting

Vienna, June 11 (UNI) A three-day national mourning began on Tuesday in Austria after the country was "stricken at the heart" by a mass school shooting earlier in the morning.

At least 11 people were killed, including the shooter, in the school shooting that happened in Austria's secondlargest city of Graz, according to local media reports. Another 11 were hospitalised with serious injuries.

The school shooting is considered one of the most serious shootings in the history of Austria, the country's largest newspaper, Kronen Zeitung, said.

Austrian President Alexander Van der Bellen on Tuesday announced a threeday national mourning and



the lowering of the country's flag to half-staff, saying that "what happened today in a school in Graz strikes our country at the heart."

Government leaders, including Austrian Chancellor Christian Stocker, Vice-Chancellor Andreas Babler and Foreign Minister Beate Meinl-Reisinger, gathered in Graz on Tuesday evening at an event in memory of the victims.

"Schools are symbols of


# Business Suformation xiom-04 launch postponed after LOX leak

Bengaluru, June 11 (UNI) The much anticipated Axiom-04 mission, with the scheduled lift-off on June 11, carrying the first Indian Gaganyatri to the International Space Station (ISS), has been postponed following the detection of a technical anomaly during launch preparations, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) said on Wednesday.

As part of pre-launch protocols, a seven-second hot test of the Falcon 9 launch vehicle's booster stage was carried out on the launch pad to validate its performance. During this critical test, engineers detected a leakage of Liquid Oxygen (LOX) in the propulsion bay of the rocket.

Following a detailed review involving ISRO engineers and experts from mission partners Axiom Space and SpaceX, it was unanimously decided to rectify the leak and carry out necessary validation tests before granting clearance for launch.

Dr V Narayanan, secretary of the Department of Space, chairman ISRO and chairman of the Space Commission, said: "Based on deliberations between ISRO, Axiom and SpaceX experts, it has been decided to address



the LOX leak and carry out additional validation before proceeding with the launch."

He added that the new date for the mission will be announced after successful

completion of the rectification process.

The Axiom-04 mission

carries historic significance as it marks India's first-ever human spaceflight mission to the ISS through an internapartnership. Gaganyatri, Group Captain Prashanth Shukla, an experienced Indian Air Force pilot, has been undergoing intensive training in Houston over

the past year. Shukla, who was selected for the mission following a rigorous selection and evaluation process conducted jointly by ISRO and the Indian Air Force, was slated to spend around two weeks aboard the ISS, conducting scientific experiments and technology

demonstrations of Indian ori-

A decorated test pilot with over 3,000 hours of flying experience across multiple aircraft platforms, Shukla was also part of the initial Gaganyaan astronaut training cohort and represents the next chapter in India's growing human spaceflight ambi-

Though the delay is a temporary setback, ISRO officials reaffirmed their commitment to ensuring the highest levels of safety and mission assurance, especially given the mission's symbolic and strategic importance.



#### RCB, BCCI invited fans without nod: Ktk govt tells HC ing in a stampede that security, and gate manage-

Bengaluru, June 11 (UNI) The Karnataka government on Wednesday held the Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) and the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) squarely responsible for the deadly stampede outside M Chinnaswamy Stadium that claimed 11 lives, stating before the High Court that the organisers "invited the whole world" via social media without obtaining official permission.

During a hearing on petitions challenging the arrest of four individuals — including RCB marketing head Nikhil Sosale — Advocate General Shashi Kiran Shetty, appearing for the state, said the franchise had submitted only a "representation" on June 3, just an hour before a match, stating they shall conduct a victory parade. "This was not a permission request — it



was merely an intimation," Shetty told the bench.

He pointed out that despite not receiving formal approval, RCB and BCCI went ahead with widespread social media promotions late at night on June 3 and into the early hours of June 4, calling on fans to join the celebration.

"They simply said all fans are welcome to cheer. It was as if they invited the whole world," Shetty stated.

According to the government, this reckless promotion led to an unmanageable crowd of 3.5 to 4 lakh people gathering at the venue, which has a seating capacity of only 33,000. The absence of clear communication on entry protocols further aggravated the situation, culminat-

The government's counsel further alleged that RCB attempted to present the parade as a government-supported function, while it was, in reality, entirely private. "They have approached this court with unclean hands and attempted to mislead it," Shetty added.

A key document submitted to the court revealed that under an agreement between RCB and BCCI, full responsibility for ticketing,

In response to the tragedy, the state has handed over the investigation to the Criminal Investigation Department (CID). Several police officers were suspended, and a new police commissioner has since been appointed. Shetty noted that the timing of the CID takeover was immaterial, as the High Court was notified in due course.

The court is now reviewing documents related to the administrative changes, as well as the legal responsibility of the organisers in light of the disaster.
