Harish Rao slams CM Revanth Reddy over worm-infested rice served to schoolchildren

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad : Decrying the failure of the Congress government to provide proper food to the school children in the welfare hostels, BRS senior leader and former Minister T Harish Rao on Friday lambasted Chief Minister Revanth Reddy over worsening conditions of school kitchens in the State.

Reacting to the reports that children at a government school in Kumram Bheem Asifabad district were served rice infested with worms, he accused the Congress government of failing to ensure even basic hygienic food for students despite tall claims of international standards.

He said the government which was boasting of setting up Young India International



Schools with international standards must ensure that the children in government schools get rice without worms. He reminded that the Chief Minister had declared that he would personally conduct reviews and those serving substandard food to students would be sent to jail. Taking to social media plat-

form 'X', he wanted to know how many review meetings were held so far in the last 23 months and how many people had been jailed for serving substandard food. "Your words have no value, your actions have no direction," the BRS leader charged. "What is the government doing when chil-

dren are forced to take to the streets? What exactly are you doing as the Minister for Education and as the Chief Minister?" he asked. The Siddipet MLA accused the Congress government of indulging in "cheap politics" and "scams in every sector," alleging that the administration was more focused on commissions and kickbacks than delivering governance. "What is the use of a Chief Minister who cannot even provide proper food to schoolchildren?" Harish Rao asked.

Demanding immediate action from the State government, the BRS leader sought immediate response from the government on the incident of worm-infested rice being served in Kumram Bheem Asifabad district.

CM Revanth Reddy to tour Telangana districts from Dec 1

Hyderabad : After the nomination filing for Gram Panchayat elections commenced, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's district tour from December 1 has triggered debates in political circles.

As part of the 'Praja Palana Vijayotsavalu', the Chief Minister is likely to tour Mahabubnagar (Makthal) on December 1, Khammam (Kothagudem) on December 2, Karimnagar (Husnabad) on December 3, Adilabad on December 4, Narsampet on December 5 and Nalgonda (Devarakonda) on December 6. During the tour, the Chief Minister is expected to address public meetings and participate in several developmental programmes. This tour bears political significance as the panchayat election notification is already issued.

However, the Congress party leaders are defending the Chief Minister's tour stating that it has nothing to do with the panchayat elections. During the tour, all the programmes would be conducted in urban areas and confined to ULBs, they added.



Telangana Rising Global Summit: Over 2,500 cops and 1,000 plus cameras for security grid

Hyderabad : Over 2,500 police personnel and more than 1,000 surveillance cameras will secure the Telangana Rising Global Summit scheduled to take place at Maheshwaram and Mirkanpet on December 8 and 9.

The Rachakonda Police have laid out an extensive, multi-layered security plan for the high-profile international event.

Rachakonda Police Commissioner, G Sudheer Babu on Friday held a review meeting with the Summit Organising Committee and other department officers with a focus on inter-departmental coordination, logistical support, and on-ground requirements.



The summit is expected to feature nearly 600 delegates, including international investment groups, global CEOs, do-

mentary industrial leaders, and entrepreneurs, accompanied by about 3,000 support staff. Accordingly, all VVIPs will

be protected with three-tier security, backed by Law and Order, Traffic, Special Branch, Intelligence, OCTOPUS, Greyhounds, Dog Squad and Bomb Squad teams.

Officials said all CCTV cameras will be integrated into a central police command and control room for continuous monitoring. For traffic regulation, around 1,000 traffic personnel and marshals will manage diversions, barricading, route planning and parking arrangements.

Also, a dedicated Women's Wing and She Teams unit will ensure the safety of women speakers, entrepreneurs and investors attending the summit.

Electric vehicles to replace old vehicles : Additional EO

Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy Inspects Redevelopment Works at Hi-Tech City Railway Station

Hyderabad : G. Kishan Reddy, Minister of Coals and Mines, Govt of India inspected the progress of on-going redevelopment works at Hi-Tech City Railway station today i.e., 28th November, 2025. He was accompanied by Konda Vishweshwar Reddy, Member of Parliament, Chevella; Sanjay Kumar Srivastava, General Manager, South Central Railway; Dr. R. Gopalakrishnan, Divisional Railway Manager, Secunderabad Division; Sandeep Jain, Chief Administrative Officer/RSP, SCR; A. Sridhar, Chief Public Relations Officer, SCR and other senior officials.

The Union Minister visited the construction sites at the Station and took stock of the progress of re-developmental works. He inspected the new station building, 12 meter FoB, platform and circulating area. He also reviewed the safety measures being undertaken at the work site.

Later, addressing the media personnel at the station, G. Kishan Reddy, Union Minister stated that the Rail Infrastructure development in Telangana State is progressing at a fast pace under the leadership of Narendra Modi, Prime Minister. He stated that 40 Railway stations in Telangana are being redeveloped



with modern facilities. In addition to the 40 stations, Charlapalli new Railway Terminal was recently inaugurated by Prime Minister to facilitate the passengers, he said. He informed that the redevelopment of Secunderabad Railway station has been undertaken at cost of Rs. 720 crores and the works are progressing well. Hyderabad station is also being developed with Rs. 350 crores, while Kacheguda re-

development plan is in the approval stage, he added. Various Railway stations under Hyderabad urban like Hafeezpet, Hi-Tech City, Malakpet stations are also being redeveloped and are targeted to be completed next year, he explained.

G. Kishan Reddy stated that Hi-Tech city Railway station is being redeveloped with a cost of Rs. 25.93 crores as part of Phase-I, with state-of-the-art architecture and passenger amenities. He stated that as part of Phase - II, the old station building renovation and other works will be taken up with a cost of Rs. 10 crores. He informed that everyday around 62 sub-urban trains ply from this station to Secunderabad, Hyderabad, Umdanagar, Falaknuma, Medchal and Ghatkesar. The footfall of the station is around 5400 passengers per day and is expected

to increase further, he said. The Union Minister stated that as part of redevelopment works, 12 Meter Foot Over Bridge, two additional lifts, two escalators, waiting room, additional ticket counters, extension of platform cover, Divyangjan facilities etc., are being provided at the station.

The Union Minister stated that 16 Mail/Express trains going towards Bidar, Visakhapatnam, Mumbai, Kakinada, Shirdi, Narsapur etc., were provided stoppage at Hi-Tech city stations during Dussehra and Diwali festival season for the convenience of passengers especially those residing in western Hyderabad.

Konda Vishweshwar Reddy, MP expressed happiness that four Railway stations in Chevella constituency viz. Hi-Tech City, Tandur, Vikarabad, Hafeezpet stations are being modernized as Amrit stations. He appreciated the Railways for taking measures proactively to improve the passenger experience. He also appreciated Railways for providing stoppage for 16 Mail/Express trains at Hi-Tech City station during festival season.

Earlier, Sanjay Kumar Srivastava, General Manager, SCR presented the welcome address. Sandeep Jain, Chief Administrative Officer/RSP briefed the media on the salient features of the project.



Collector Viziendira Boyi Stresses Transparent Conduct of Panchayat Elections

Mahabubnagar : District Collector Viziendira Boyi emphasised that ensuring complete transparency and impartiality in the conduct of Panchayat elections is the primary responsibility of every election officer. She addressed the Stage-2 training programme for Returning Officers held on Friday at the Collectorate conference hall.

Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that every election brings new challenges, and officials must stay vigilant and strictly adhere to procedural guidelines. She reiterated that there should be no favouritism towards any political party or candidate and that elections must be conducted in a fair and unbiased manner.

She instructed officials to visit their allotted Gram Panchayats, inspect polling stations, and ensure thorough training for all designated polling staff. She also directed them to properly receive election material from the mandal-level distribution centres, verify it, and distribute it appropriately to polling personnel.

The Collector added that polling arrangements, station management, and monitoring of the polling process in every ward must be carried out efficiently. After the polling, counting of votes for Sarpanch and Ward Members should be done strictly as per norms, followed by timely announcement of results. The election of the Upa-Sarpanch should then be completed in a special meeting of the Gram Panchayat.

She also instructed officials to issue election certificates to the winning candidates without delay. District ZP CEO Venkata Reddy, Trainee District Panchayat Officer Nikita, DLPO Rammohan, Master Trainers Balu Yadav, Ratangapani Reddy, Panduranga, Srikant and others participated in the programme.

Ensuring Free, Fair & Transparent Elections : General Election Observer Khartade Kalicharan Sudam Rao

Every Complaint Must Be Registered and Acted Upon - Zero Tolerance on MCC Violations

Khammam Bureau : General Election Observer Khartade Kalicharan Sudam Rao emphasized that all officials must ensure the conduct of free, fair and transparent panchayat elections in the district. He inspected the Control Room, MCMC Cell and Media Centre set up at the Khammam Collectorate, accompanied by District Collector Anudeep Durishetty and Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt.

The Observer stated that the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) issued by the Election Commission of India must be strictly implemented to guarantee equal rights to every voter. He instructed officials to immediately forward complaints received through the toll-free number 1077, social media platforms and electronic media monitoring systems to field-level flying squads and static surveillance teams.



Details of the teams working at each mandal should be displayed clearly on notice boards for public awareness, he added.

He stressed the need for continuous monitoring of social media, especially during the election period. Any content violating election norms or misleading voters must face legal action. "To protect the integrity of elections, every officer must work impartially and responsibly," he said. The Observer also

warned that candidates may attempt to lure voters in innovative ways and instructed officials to remain alert and proactive.

District Collector Anudeep Durishetty stated that a dedicated grievance redressal system has been established under the supervision of the DRO. "After the nomination phase, inducements and misinformation may increase. Field teams must stay vigilant and take immediate action in case of any MCC violations,"



he said. He also directed tahsildars and RDOs to monitor campaign activities regularly, and report any misleading content on social media to the concerned Returning Officer.

Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt stated that considering the competitive nature of elections, robust security arrangements have been put in place. "Any attempts to create communal or caste-based tensions will be dealt with firmly. Additional security

will be provided at critical polling stations," he assured.

Applicant Seeks Clarification on 1/3 Share Allotment; Submits Plea to Mulugu District Collector

Mulugu : An applicant has submitted a representation to the District Collector of Mulugu, requesting clarification and necessary action regarding the allotment of a 1/3 share in connection with a pending Legal Heir matter, originally dated 24 October 2024.

In the petition, the applicant stated that despite earlier instructions and the Legal Heir Certificate, as well as the Endowment Decree of H.C.A.P 1967, the concerned Endowment Officer (EO) has not taken appropriate steps to effect the rightful 1/3

share. According to the representation, this inaction has led to hardship and prolonged delay in completing the process.

The applicant further mentioned that earlier orders dated 25 October 2024 directed the EO to process the file related to the share allotment without obstruction. However, the petitioner alleged that the file is still pending and no progress has been made. The representation also highlights concerns that third parties may interfere or attempt to

influence the proceedings if the delay continues.

The applicant appealed to the District Collector to intervene and instruct the concerned EO to complete the verification, ensure transparency, and implement the rightful distribution of the 1/3 share as per rules.

The representation was formally acknowledged on 27 November at the Collectorate Inward section.

Officials pointed out delays from banks in providing account statements, KYC documents, freeze confirmations and defreeze responses. Banks were reminded that frozen accounts must not allow debit transactions and that any activity should be reported immediately.

Banks were further instructed to furnish complete account statements in Excel format, ensure accurate beneficiary details, improve handling of multiple freeze orders, strengthen KYC checks, and actively identify mule accounts.

and advised staff to ensure nutritious food is provided regularly to pregnant women and children.

Collector Inspects Paddy and Maize Procurement Centres

She instructed staff to immediately check the moisture levels of the paddy brought in by farmers and to weigh and purchase the grain only after proper verification. Editorial Self-Reliance is at the centre of India's Economic Strategy

Union Minister of Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal, said that India has concluded balanced and equitable trade agreements with Australia, the UAE, Mauritius, the United Kingdom and the four-nation EFTA bloc and is currently engaged in discussions with 14 countries or groups representing nearly 50 nations, including the United States, the European Union, GCC countries, New Zealand, Israel, Eurasia, Canada, South Africa and the Mercosur group. Goyal said this while addressing the 98th Annual General Meeting of the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) in New Delhi today.

Goyal said that the idea of

self-reliance is central in India's civilisational ethos, recalling references from the Bhagavad Gita and Mahatma Gandhi's emphasis on Swadeshi. He said that self-reliance has historically guided India's progress and continues to remain central to the country's economic strategy. He added that this vision has been strengthened through the focus on Atma Nirbhar Bharat under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Referring to the recent EFTA agreement, the Minister noted that the bloc has committed to invest USD 100 billion in India across innovation and precision manufacturing. He highlighted India's cost competitiveness in research and innovation, stating

that high-quality innovation undertaken in India can be achieved at a fraction of the cost compared to Europe or the United States. He emphasised the need for Indian industry to move beyond legacy mindset and adopt a forward-looking and globally competitive approach.

The Minister highlighted India's strengths in innovation and technology, supported by a young demographic, increasing digital adoption and a growing talent pool. He said that India's large number of STEM graduates and widespread internet access create strong potential in emerging areas such as applied artificial intelligence, automation, robotics and deep-tech innovation. He noted that the recently

announced USD 12 billion Research, Development and Innovation (RDI) fund, along with ongoing support to startups and deep-tech industries, will further accelerate India's innovation ecosystem.

Goyal emphasised the importance of strengthening skilling to prepare India's youth for future opportunities. He said that unlike many developed economies facing ageing populations, India's youthful demographic is quick to adapt to emerging technologies and has already demonstrated high engagement with digital platforms. He added that this readiness positions India to play a major role in the global technology landscape.

Highlighting broader global

developments, the Minister said that recent geopolitical and economic challenges have underscored the need for trusted partners and resilient supply chains. He stated that India's expanding network of FTAs and economic partnerships is aimed at building long-term cooperation anchored in fairness, transparency and mutual benefit.

In the technology sector, Goyal pointed to initiatives aimed at reducing external dependence, including the Semiconductor Mission (₹76,000 crore) and the ₹7,000 crore programme for permanent magnet production, which strengthen domestic manufacturing and supply chain security. In the legal domain, he referred to ongoing reforms, in-

cluding progress toward Jan Vishwas 3.0, designed to enhance ease of doing business. He further noted that the Atomic Energy Bill 2025 marks a historic shift by opening up the nuclear sector to strengthen energy sovereignty.

The Minister urged FICCI to adopt a mission-driven approach to promoting innovation, deepening research and development, strengthening industry-academia linkages and supporting India's journey towards becoming a developed nation by 2047. He said that the collective efforts of industry, government and citizens will be vital in enabling India to emerge as a resilient, competitive and self-reliant global economic power.

He urged researchers and scientists to leverage India's

diverse agro-climatic strengths to develop innovative varieties and high-value products that can unlock new export opportunities. Such innovation-driven value addition, he said, would not only enhance India's global footprint but also enable farmers—particularly small growers—to secure better returns. The Minister stressed that sustained research, experimentation, and product development will be key to ensuring that Indian tea remains competitive, distinctive, and future-ready in an increasingly dynamic global tea industry.

Goyal noted that India is among the world's largest tea producers and exporters, with nearly 255 million tonnes exported annually. He underscored the importance of safeguarding this key industry, which plays an integral role in India's hospitality and trade culture, and added that deliberations held during the



conference would provide valuable inputs to the Ministry and the Tea Board to further strengthen the sector.

rience merges with strategic thinking to shape future-ready policies. He noted that the reforms are a strategic necessity amid shifting global power centres, blurred boundaries between peace and conflict and expanding domains of warfare including cyber, space, information and cognitive influence. He underlined India's growing global role, driven by economic strength, technological capability and principled foreign policy. Reforms, resilience and modernisation, he said, must strengthen defence, economy and society, with the armed forces as the strongest pillar of national security and stability. Stressing the government's focus on capability enhancement, infrastructure, technology, Atmanirbhar Bharat and welfare of soldiers and veterans, he added that a strong, secure and developed India contributes to global stability, ethical use of emerging technologies and humanitarian values. He commended

the Dialogue's rich deliberations and affirmed that such platforms deepen strategic foresight and guide India's journey towards a confident and future-ready Bharat.

Ambassador DB Venkatesh Verma, Member of the National Security Advisory Board, delivered a special address on Resilient National Security @2047. He stressed that strategic autonomy is meaningful only when India has the will and capability to think, act and fight independently, without allowing external engagements to turn into vulnerabilities. He emphasised the need for an operationally sound military doctrine that can be executed without external interference, supported by a resilient defence-industrial base, secure technology choices and reduced economic dependencies. He emphasised that India must build on this foundation, learn from past decades and adopt new approaches. Ac-

knowledging the professionalism of the armed forces and the rising stature of the Chanakya Defence Dialogue, he underlined the need for continued integration of technology, institutional reform and forward-looking thinking to strengthen India's preparedness for future challenges.

Today's sessions dwell upon Battlefield Equalisers, where global experts discussed disruptive technologies such as AI, autonomous systems, hypersonics and cyber capability, highlighting how these are reshaping the character of warfare. The sessions also examined the transformation required for India's forces to become integrated, agile and modern. Distinguished military leaders and experts spoke on jointness, adaptive structures, island security perspectives and the growing role of information and cognitive security in modern conflict.

Lt Gen Pushpendra Pal

Singh, Vice Chief of the Army Staff, delivered the Closing Address of the Dialogue, emphasising that India's security environment demands forces that are agile, technologically empowered and operationally integrated. He noted that the insights generated during the two days, ranging from emerging technologies and battlefield equalisation to jointness, innovation and defence reforms, would serve as actionable inputs for the Army's transformation roadmap. Underscoring the importance of self-reliance, future-ready structures and mission-driven capability development, he reiterated the Indian Army's commitment to accelerating reform and strengthening India's preparedness across all domains of warfare. He thanked the President, Raksha Mantri, distinguished speakers, global partners and participants for contributing to a substantive and forward-looking deliberation.

This shift is driven by the quest for more communal, flexible living arrangements that cater to the needs of modern urbanites, particularly Gen-z and digital nomads. Co-living spaces are ideal for young professionals, digital nomads, and students who want a hassle free living experience without compromising on comfort or community.

Spider of Disease Resistant Drugs

Antibiotics are considered to be very effective for any disease, which is why they sell the most on the market. However, their blind use has led to dangerous conditions such as 'superbugs' in the country where drugs become useless and normal illness cannot be cured quickly. The concern is that antibodies are also being overused in poultry farming and animal husbandry. As a result, even if we take less anti-inflammatory drugs ourselves, the problem will still surround us.

Therefore, detailed guidelines on the use of these drugs have been issued by the Government. In 1928, the Scottish scientist Alexander Fleming, working at a medical institute in London, discovered antibiotic penicillin while researching bacteria. Penicillin proved a boon when millions of wounded soldiers were dying from infection in World War II. It saved countless soldiers. Penicillin changed the direction of medical science and is considered to be the begin-

ning of the modern antibiotic age. However, since 1945, Fleming himself has been warning that overuse of disease-resistant drugs will lead to resistance and this is what happened. Now the problem is getting bigger, as it has become common in countries like India to take anti-disease drugs without a doctor's advice, taking incomplete medications and even use them for minor illnesses.

Overuse of these drugs develops resistance to bacteria or viruses in our bodies and this condition emerges as 'superbugs'. That is, a condition in which strong bacteria or viruses do not die from drugs and simple antibiotics don't work on them. Not only does this increase the cost of medication for patients, but it also makes it difficult to treat infections such as coughs, fever or wounds in the future. Diseases that used to be treated with common and inexpensive drugs now have to take expensive medications or injections, as they are also ineffective on com-

mon 18 diseases and require a variety of tests and new types of treatments. Repeated antibiotics also cause problems such as allergies and damage to the skin, and have long-term effects on the kidneys, liver and stomach.

The biggest thing is that these drugs kill harmful bacteria as well as good ones. According to the Indian Council of Medical Research, about seven lakh people in the country are affected by antibiotic resistance-related diseases every year. The World Health Organization estimates that if the problem is not stopped, about a million people worldwide including India could die from it by 2050. "This condition invites many other diseases and common seem to be The market for anti-inflammatory drugs in India is huge, because infectious diseases are common here. The market in the country was estimated at around Rs 49,000 crore in 2023 and is expected to grow by about 6-7 per cent annually, reaching Rs 83,000

crore. India is known as the world's third largest producer of antimicrobials. According to a 2022 report by The Lancet, antibiotics per capita in India consumption is the highest in the world. It is estimated that over 1,300 crore doses of these drugs are taken every year in the country.

The Government has implemented 'Schedule A', under which many disease resistant drugs can be found only on the advice of a physician. The 'Antibiotic Stewardship' programme is being

implemented in collaboration with the Indian Council of Medical Research and the World Health Organisation to reduce the misuse of these drugs, but the problem remains. 1 In India, more than 30-35 million people are affected by diseases such as colds, fever and diarrhea every year. By 2024, the total number of registered physicians in the country is about 13 lakhs, out of which 10.4 lakh are allopathic and 4.5 lakh Ayush doctors (Ayurveda, Homeopathy), are Greek). According to the World Health Organization standard, a thousand only 0.2 per population

There should be at least one doctor in the population. While there are only 0.7 doctors available in India per thousand population. This proportion is even higher in rural areas, with a population of 1,000 doctors in many states. According to the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Rural Health Statistics, there are 1.55 lakh sub-health centres, 25,000 primary health centers and 5,600 community

health centres in the country. About 65 - 70 per cent of these health centres are located in rural areas.

Even though about a million. More health centers in rural areas in, but there is still a huge shortage of doctors and health centers here. and drugs It is worth noting that the World Health Organization has classified antibiotics into three categories. Oh, First, they which of the normal transition are safe and do not have much negative effect on the body. The second category is those drugs that should be used in a limited way and require monitoring, which of the normal transition are safe and do not have much negative effect on the body. The second category is those drugs that should be used in a limited way and require monitoring. In the third category, drugs that should only be used in life-saving situations. But these guidelines are not being fully implemented.

The problem is also growing because there has been blind use of antibiotics in agri-

culture and animal husbandry as well, especially poultry. According to reports by the Food and Agriculture Organization (UN), Indian Council of Medical Research, Food Safety and Standards Authority of India and World Health Organisation, more than fifty percent of total consumption of disease-resistant drugs in India is used for animal husbandry. These are used repeatedly in dairy cattle to prevent infection and increase milk production. of the year 2022 A survey found that 10-12 percent of milk samples contained residues of these drugs (It is estimated that about 70-75 percent of chickens in the country are used for feeding.

The Government's new guidelines are aimed at ensuring the prudent use of disease-resistant drugs and maintaining their effectiveness for future treatment of serious infections. If the patients, doctors, hospitals and farmers all follow these rules together, there can be some control over this problem.

COURT CONFIRMS GREEN BELT LAND AS MUNICIPAL PROPERTY

- Khammam Municipal Corporation Wins Key Legal Verdict

(Capital Information) Khammam Bureau, November 28 : The land located beside the Vinayoga Darulu Forum, designated as a Green Belt area, has officially been declared as property of the Khammam Municipal Corporation. The judgment was delivered on Friday by the First Addl Senior Civil Judge, Hon'ble Justice Shivaranjani. The case began in 2010, when Bijjala Janardhan and his family members filed a suit claiming ownership of the land, then under Khana puram Haveli Gram Panchayat. Following the Panchayat's merger into the Municipal Corporation, the property came under municipal jurisdiction.

Representing the Corporation, Government advocates Swarna Govinda Rao, Potla Srikanth, GP Aitham Ravindra and AGP Khandapaneni Ratnakar Rao argued strongly that the land is public property and must remain under the Corporation's control. After hearing both parties, the court confirmed the land as government-owned and belonging to Khammam Municipal Corporation, marking a significant legal triumph for the protection of public assets and urban development.

The legislation aims to ensure strict regulation of the quality of seeds and nursery plants, providing farmers with reliable and certified seed varieties on a large scale.

She stated that the proposed Bill intends to curb the menace of spurious and sub-standard seeds, simplify seed import procedures, and safe-

guard farmers' rights comprehensively. To ensure accountability, stringent provisions have also been included to penalise those involved in violations related to seed quality and trade, she added.

The Collector noted that before the Bill is placed in Parliament for approval, consultations are being held with all stakeholders—farmers, NGOs, farmers' organisations, and beneficiaries—to incorporate their inputs. The draft comprises ten chapters and 48 sections, addressing various aspects of seed regulation.

She further explained that the new draft has been prepared after identifying and rectifying the shortcomings in the 1966 Seed Act, and urged participants to submit their views in detail. All the suggestions received will be compiled and forwarded to the Government, she assured.

District Agriculture Officer B. Venkatesh, representatives from Professor Jayashankar Telangana State Agricultural University, and several farmers participated in the meeting.

Dr. Jitendra Singh Reviews ANRF; Emphasises culture of co-funding through engagement of non-government sector

India Moving Toward Whole-of-Government, Whole-of-Society R&D Model: Dr. Jitendra Singh

New Delhi : Union Minister of State for Science and Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Earth Sciences; and MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Department of Atomic Energy and Department of Space, Dr. Jitendra Singh today conducted a comprehensive review of the Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF) at Technology Bhawan, New Delhi.

The highlight of the meeting was the Minister's stress on promoting a culture of co-funding through engagement of non-government sector and change of mindset accordingly.

Opening the meeting, Dr. Jitendra Singh emphasised that ANRF is emerging as a pivotal institution for India's rise as a global research and innovation powerhouse and called for accelerating mission-mode research, expanding co-funding partnerships with industry, and simplifying processes to give researchers greater

operational flexibility. He underlined that India is steadily transitioning towards a whole-of-government and whole-of-society R&D model, where ministries, industry, startups, philanthropic foundations, and academia jointly shape the national innovation landscape.

The Minister noted that ANRF's early achievements signal a clear shift from fragmented, siloed funding mechanisms to an integrated, outcome-driven national approach to research.

The Minister also stressed the need for a common mechanism enabling cross-ministerial scientific initiatives rather than isolated schemes, and instructed officials to fast-track collaboration with the Health Ministry to ensure rapid progress in indigenous medical technologies. He referred to the significance of accelerating breakthroughs in MedTech, e-health and hydrogen mobility, improving preparedness for deep-tech missions, and compiling a comprehensive national list of potential co-funders across sectors.



Dr Jitendra Singh further observed that certain procedural relaxations must be allowed in research projects, especially where delays are driven by global scientific procurement cycles. He added that the Department of Atomic Energy is already in the process of modifying enabling provisions of the Atomic Energy laws to support smoother technology transfer and greater private-sector participation, an important step as ANRF expands its deep-tech portfolio.

During the meeting, ANRF

CEO Dr. Shivkumar Kalyanaram presented a detailed overview of the Foundation's progress and mission pipeline. He informed the Minister that ANRF's operational architecture is now fully functional, covering foundational research, mission-mode programmes, i n d u s t r y - a c a d e m i c partnerships, and the RDI Fund, which provides patient capital and private co-funding for translation, validation, and scale-up.

He explained that mission-mode programmes in priority areas such as electric mobility, MedTech, advanced materials and hydrogen are progressing rapidly.

He also briefed that the

Governing Board has approved the Prime Minister Early Career Research Grant, which has already supported 718 young researchers with progressive, research-friendly norms. In addition, the Advanced Research Grant platform has expanded frontier research across science, engineering, humanities, and social sciences, while the newly established Convergence Research Centres of Excellence integrate social sciences with S&T to address challenges spanning sustainability, urbanisation, climate, ethics, and public policy.

The Foundation's rapid expansion of its co-funding ecosystem was also reviewed, with major private and philanthropic partners such as the Gates Foundation, Wadhvani Foundation, and several industry bodies already onboard. Discussions are progressing with CSR entities and various family offices. Appreciating this trend, Dr. Jitendra Singh said the emerging culture of co-

funding reflects a maturing national outlook where stakeholders "develop the habit not only of receiving but also contributing to India's research ecosystem."

Concluding the meeting, Dr. Jitendra Singh said ANRF's progress reaffirms the government's commitment to strengthening India's R&D ecosystem at scale—aligning foundational research, mission-driven innovation, and private-sector co-investment. He said ANRF will serve as the feeder pipeline to the RDI Fund, bridging technologies from TRL-2 to TRL-6 and preparing them for higher readiness levels and industry partnerships.

The Minister urged ANRF to intensify collaboration pipelines in hydrogen, MedTech, EVs and e-health; expand outreach to prospective co-founders across sectors; ensure timely utilisation of assignments through sustained sensitisation; and maintain strong momentum as India advances toward the goals of Viksit Bharat @2047.
