Harish Rao cites Pranab Mukherjee to defend KCR, attacks Revanth Reddy and TPCC

Siddipet : Quoting former President Pranab Mukherjee's books 'The Coalition Years' and 'The Presidential Years', former Minister T Harish Rao said Pranab had hailed former Chief Minister K Chandrashekhar Rao as a leader who realised his dream of statehood by leading the Telangana movement for 14 years.

Addressing the Deeksha Diwas programme in Siddipet on Saturday, Harish Rao attacked Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy and TPCC president Mahesh Kumar Goud for criticising Chandrashekhar Rao, and advised them to read the passage in Pranab's books that praised him.



He said he had faced 370 cases during the Telangana movement, while no case had been filed against Revanth Reddy as he had never taken part in the agitation.

He said Revanth Reddy

had even refused to resign from his post when BRS elected representatives tendered their resignations. He said it was surprising that former TJAC Chairman M Kodandaram was now supporting Revanth Reddy

despite Reddy not contributing to the Statehood movement.

Harish Rao added that Chandrashekhar Rao had made every effort to secure the state's rightful share of water and funds during his 10-year tenure.

Earlier, BRS cadres took out a bike rally from the rural police station to the MLA's camp office at Ponnala. Harish Rao garlanded the Telangana Thalli statue at Kotilingala Temple, as the town echoed with Jai Telangana slogans. BRS leaders also felicitated activists who took part in the 1969 movement. Dubbak MLA Kotha Prabhakar Reddy, MLC Deshapathi Srinivas, MLC Dr V Yadava Reddy and others were present.

Minister Tummala Announces 24-Hour Drinking Water Supply Plan

Khammam Bureau : Telangana Minister for Agriculture, Marketing, Cooperation, Handlooms & Textiles Tummala Nageswara Rao announced that the Government has initiated a comprehensive plan to ensure 24-hour drinking water supply across Khammam city. During his visit to the 35th Division, the Minister laid the foundation stone for CC road works worth Rs 50.25 lakhs and highlighted that all development works must be built with long-term sustainability and benefit future generations.

The Minister stated that Rs 220 crores have been sanctioned under the AMRUT scheme for improving water supply and urban infrastructure. He directed officials to prepare the Detailed Project Report (DPR) and begin tender procedures in December, with a tar-

Ashwini Vaishnaw and Gajendra Singh Shekhawat Flag Off New Jaisalmer-Delhi (Shakur Basti) Rail Service; New Rail Service to be Operated Under the Name 'Swarn Nagari Express'

Redevelopment Work of 85 stations in Rajasthan, Involving an Investment of About ₹4,000 crore, is Underway: Ashwini Vaishnaw

New Delhi : Union Minister for Railways, Information & Broadcasting, and Electronics & Information Technology, Ashwini Vaishnaw, and Union Minister of Culture & Tourism, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat flagged off the inaugural special train of the new Jaisalmer-Delhi (Shakur Basti) rail service from Jaisalmer station today.

In view of public sentiment, Vaishnaw announced that the Jaisalmer-Delhi (Shakur Basti) Express will be named Swarn Nagari Express.

The introduction of the Jaisalmer-Delhi (Shakur Basti) Jaisalmer Express will significantly enhance rail connectivity between the national capital and the western region of Rajasthan. Cities such as Ramdevra, Jodhpur, Makrana, Jaipur, and Alwar will now be connected to the national capital with greater ease and convenience.

The new service will provide easier access to advanced medical and educational facilities, improve connectivity to major tourist destinations, and support economic growth in the surrounding regions. By offering a reliable and convenient travel



option, the train will benefit residents, tourists, students, and businesses alike, strengthening regional mobility and development. In his address, Vaishnaw, said that Indian Railways is progressing rapidly and is establishing new milestones every day. He said that under the guidance of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Indian Railways is committed to taking its developmental journey to new heights. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw stated that unprecedented work is being undertaken for railway

development in Rajasthan, with projects worth about ₹55,000 crore currently in progress. As part of expanding the railway network in border areas, the proposal for a new line from Anupgarh to Khajuwala, Bikaner, Jaisalmer, Barmer and up to Bhabhar is progressing through various stages. The construction of these lines will not only benefit the general public but will also play an important role in strategic support for the armed forces. Vaishnaw informed that prior to 2014, the annual budget allocation for Rajasthan was only around ₹680 crore, which

Mahbubnagar Collector Directs Officials to Issue PO, APO Appointment Orders

Mahbubnagar : District Collector Viziendira Boyi instructed officials to ensure that appointment orders for Presiding Officers (POs) and Assistant Presiding Officers (APOs) assigned for the Gram Panchayat elections are distributed promptly and that proper acknowledgements are collected from them.

Speaking at a review meeting, the Collector said that the appointment orders for POs and APOs have been generated through the first phase of randomization. She directed officials to attach Form-14 (Postal Ballot Application) along with the orders and hand them over to the designated staff without delay.

The Collector further instructed that the duly filled Form-14 applications should be submitted to the District Panchayat Office (DPO) for processing of postal ballots.

Additional Collector (Revenue) Madhusudhan Naik, ZP CEO and in-charge DPO Venkata Reddy, RDO Naveen, and other officials participated in the meeting.

Speaking about the redevelopment of Jaisalmer station, Vaishnaw said that its transformation has been completed at a cost of ₹140 crore. He added that redevelopment work of 85 stations in Rajasthan, with an investment of about ₹4,000 crore, is underway. Vaishnaw said that due to the strengthening of railway infrastructure in Rajasthan, six pairs of Vande Bharat trains and one pair of Amrit Bharat train, along with other services, are being operated, and in the last six months, including this train, eight new trains have been introduced. He also directed that the track renewal work between Jaisalmer and Jodhpur be taken up on priority. During the programme, Gajendra Singh Shekhawat, expressed gratitude to Ashwini Vaishnaw. In their addresses, Ummeda Ram Beniwal, Member of Parliament, Kailash Choudhary, former Union Minister of State, and Chhotu Singh, MLA, also expressed their gratitude to Ashwini Vaishnaw for the new rail service and railway development works.

He stated that the Prime Minister, Narendra Modi had laid the foundation stone for construction of Railway Manufacturing Unit at Kazipet in 2023 and the works are progressing at a rapid pace. He informed that Rail Vikas Nigam Limited (RVNL) is executing the project with a cost of Rs. 521 Crores. He stated that Main Shop, Test Shop, Paint shop, Store Ward, Admin block, Rest house, canteen, security, Toilet blocks, boundary wall, RUB, internal railway track, roads, electric substation and canteen are being constructed at the RMU. Further, 1 MWp roof solar plant, provision of natural day lighting and natural ventilation, LED lighting, sewage treatment plant, waste water recycling plant, Rain water harvesting etc are also being done, he added.

The Union Minister informed that 75% of the works are completed and the project is targeted to be completed by next year. It is proposed to manufacture 16 coach MEMU rakes at the RMU, he added. He stated that the upcoming Railway Manufacturing Unit will be equipped with latest technology. He stated that project will also facilitate direct and indirect employment for the youth in the region. The Union Minister stated that under the leadership of Prime Minister, the Railway infrastructure in Telangana state is witnessing unprecedented development, be it, Vande Bharat trains, electrification, new trains, Amrit stations, KAVACH etc.

Earlier, Sanjay Kumar Srivastava, General Manager, SCR presented the welcome address. P.V Saiprasad, Chief Project Manager, RVNL briefed the media on the salient features of the project.

Fight for Journalists' Rights Intensifies - State-wide Maha Dharna on December 3

(Capital Information) Hyderabad : Amid growing concerns over the declining welfare of journalists in Telangana, leaders of the Telangana Union of Working Journalists (TUWJ) and the Small and Medium Newspapers Association have expressed deep anguish, stating that a united struggle has become the only path left to secure their rights.

TUWJ State Executive Member Rajesh, Small Newspapers Association State President Yusuf Babu and General Secretary Ashok unveiled the poster for the Maha Dharna to be held at the Information Department office. Speaking on the occasion, they said the welfare schemes that existed in the

erstwhile united Andhra Pradesh have completely vanished in Telangana, with government apathy worsening year after year.

The leaders criticised the State Government for failing to revive essential welfare measures such as health security, accreditation, welfare funds and protection committees for journalists. They lamented that despite repeated representations, there has been no response regarding long-pending issues like accreditation upgrades and the delay of over 16 months in clearing advertisement bills, leaving many small newspapers in dire straits.

They further pointed out that the long-promised allo-



cation of house sites for journalists has not yet been implemented, causing immense disappointment among thousands of media professionals. In view of these unresolved issues, they announced that a massive dharna will be staged on December 3 at the Information Department office in Masab Tank.

Calling for large-scale participation, the leaders urged editors and journalists from small publications across the State to join the protest and voice their just demands. They warned that the agitation would be intensified if the issues continue to remain unaddressed.

TUWJ State President Vi-

rahata Ali has extended full support to the agitation, with the Small and Medium Newspapers Association an affiliated body also declaring its complete backing. The leaders said this Maha Dharna would serve as a major platform to highlight the long-standing problems faced by small publications.

IJU member Matangi Das, Small Newspapers Association State Treasurer Azaam Khan, and State leaders Iqbal, Usman Rasheed, Balakrishna, Ahmed Ali, Murali, Venkatayya, Afroz, Aman, Mohsin Ali, Gaus, Riyasath, Illyas, Anjad, Anwar, Srinivas, Jan Shahid, Khaseem, Prakash and Asad, along with editors of Urdu, English and Telugu newspapers, were present.

There is a need to increase the number of students getting pre-matric and post-matric scholarships in the district, and for this, MEOs should immediately convene a meeting with headmasters, and headmasters should convene a meeting with parents to inform them about the scholarships and take steps to submit the necessary documents such as Aadhaar, bank account, caste, and

(Capital Information) Jugulamba Gadwala : District Collector BM Santhosh said in a statement on Saturday that the district election officials are touring the villages and creating awareness among the people to prevent unethically by auctioning the posts of sarpanch in the elections of gram panchayat bodies. In the context of the Gram Panchayat elections, it is a legal crime to tempt the candidates who come forward for nomination in some Gram Panchayats and try to force them to elect them contrary to democracy. He said that there were reports in the media that auctions were being held for the posts of Sarpanchi in some villages in the respective mandals where the first phase of elections would be held. In this context, the Collector said that under the Election Act and the Indian Penal Code, such acts are considered election crimes and appropriate mechanisms are appointed to pre-

vent unethical acts and the people in the respective villages are made aware. The Collector said that the MPDOs, MMARs and police department officials have formed teams in the respective mandals across the district to prevent unethical unethically. The Collector stated that the selection of Sarpanchi posts through auctions is a serious act as some people have already made a mockery of the election process for their own interests in many villages in Gadwala, Dharur, KT Doddi and Maldakal mandals where the first round of elections will be held. The District Election Commission said that the incidents of giving bribes and using their influence by prominent candidates or their election agents in the respective Gram Panchayats are being taken seriously. Keeping in mind the allegations that the posts of Sarpanchs were sold to Gram Panchayats through auctions, the election officers of the respective mandals visited various villages. The villages told the election officers that they did not intimidate the candidates and elect the posts through auctions in their Gram Panchayats. Those who encourage unanimity in the bidding of sarpanch posts can be fined, imprisoned up to one year or both.

He was addressing the valedictory ceremony of the 100th Common Foundation Course at the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA) in Mussoorie, Uttarakhand on November 29, 2025.

Raksha Mantri asserted that,

during Operation Sindoor, the Armed Forces destroyed the terror camps in Pakistan and PoK in a balanced & non-escalatory response, but it was the misbehavior of the neighboring country which did not allow the situation along the border to return to normal. Our schemes will increasingly prioritize green-fuel-based technologies. I would urge our Italian industry counterparts to collaborate in this area," he said during his inaugural address.

Terming women farmers vital for achieving the Vision 2047, the Secretary drew attention of industry towards

gender budgeting and exhorted them to focus on production of gender-friendly equipment.

He further stated that the United Nations has declared 2026 as the International Year of Women Farmers. Therefore, equipment must be designed to reduce the drudgery of women. "Often policy makers assume that 'gender budgeting' simply means giving ownership of machinery to women but that alone does not reduce drudgery. "Most difficult agricultural

tasks are performed by women, and hence we need more gender-friendly equipment, whether manual or motorized, that genuinely reduces their workload," emphasized Dr Chaturvedi.

National Lok Adalat on December 21st

Sangareddy : As per the directions of the State Legal Services Authority, the Chairman of the District Legal Services Authority, District Chief Justice Smt. G. Bhawanichandra, held a special meeting with the police officers at the District Court Conference Hall on Saturday.

The arrangements for the National Lok Adalat to be held on December 21-22-2025, coordination measures and awareness were created on the identification of cases. The meeting was presided over by the Principal District and Sessions Judge-cum-Chairperson, District Legal Services Authority Smt. G. Bhawanichandra, while the Secretary of the District Legal Services Authority Smt. B. Soujanya participated. Representatives of the District Police Office, Circle Inspectors, Court Liaison Officers and District Legal Services Authority staff participated in the meeting.

The Chairperson said that Lok Adalat is a platform for providing justice to the people in a speedy, low-cost and



conciliatory manner. She said that the main purpose of Lok Adalat is to reduce the burden of pending cases in the courts and to provide peaceful resolution to the people. With the cooperation of the police department, legal awareness in the society will increase and disputes will be resolved through conciliation.

The Chairperson told the police officers that cases that can be reconciled should be identified in advance at each police station level and their lists should be prepared, and compoundable criminal cases, cheque bounce cases, minor disputes, family-related motor accident

claim cases should be identified as a priority. It was suggested that steps should be taken to ensure that settlement is possible through mediation in cases of women, family, neighbourhood or social disputes first.

Every Circle Inspector, SI and Liaison Officer should act as a coordination point and immediately inform the Court Legal Service Officer about the details of the cases, information of the parties and the status of the case. She reminded that it is the responsibility of the police department to make the people aware of the facilities of Lok Adalat, the benefits of

justice available through conciliation. Public awareness programs should be organized at every police station level and people should be encouraged to resolve their cases in Lok Adalat.

The Chairperson made it clear that Lok Adalat will not be successful without the cooperation of the Police Department. It is imperative to work in the interest of public interest with coordination, discipline at all levels and said that priority will be given to resolving cheque bounce cases, compoundable criminal cases, pending civil suits, family matrimonial disputes, motor accident claim cases,

bank recovery and other cases where reconciliation is possible in the Special Lok Adalat.

Addressing the police officers, the Honorable Chairperson said that if every case is resolved through reconciliation, it will be beneficial for both parties and that the faith in justice in the society will be strengthened by resolving the legal problems of the people in a peaceful manner without reaching the court. She called on the Police Department to provide full cooperation to make the Special Lok Adalat a success.

The police officers who participated in the meeting assured full cooperation in identifying maximum conciliable cases and sending them to Lok Adalat. Thanking the police department, the District Legal Services Authority said that it would provide all possible cooperation. If people want to resolve their cases through conciliation in Lok Adalat, they can contact the District Legal Services Authority, Sangareddy office or the concerned court legal service center.

It narrates " if the whole Vedantic philosophy is a cow, then the milk is the Holy Gita. Those people , who are really thirsty & seekers of truth, drink this nectar & become immortal."
 The message of Gita came to humanity because of Arjun's unwillingness to do his duty as a warrior. Its entire 700-shlokas (verses) are immortal discourse between the Supreme Bhagwan Krishna and his devotee-friend



Arjun and it occurred not in a temple, a secluded forest, or on a mountain top, but in the middle of a battlefield on the eve of Kurukshetra Dharma Yuddha of Mahabharat. Arjun's dilemma is, in reality, universal dilemma. Every human being faces dilemma, big or small, in their daily life when performing their duties. Arjun's dilemma was the biggest one, as he has to make a choice between fighting the war and killing his

mayoga), the path of knowledge (Gyanyoga), the path of love & devotion (Bhaktiyoga), and the path of concentration & self-control (Rajyoga). Besides these, there is description of Yagya (Sacrifice), Dan (Charity), Tap (penance), Dhyanyoga (Yoga of meditation), Pranayam (Control of breath), Hathyoga (austere discipline of body etc.), Layayoga (Yoga of rhythmic unison) etc.
 The Gita is called Brah-mavidya, the science of Absolute and Mokshashashtra, the scripture dealing with liberation. The aim of Krishna's teaching is to remove the doubts and delusions that overpower man in everything, great or small; but these can be removed only through a realization of Truth. In the Gita, Shri Krishna emphasizes Swadharna, once own Dharma. Actually, the word "Dharma" is untranslatable and 'Religion', 'duty', 'righteousness' or other equivalents give only a partial meaning . It signifies the attitude behind a man's action or duty that sustains him in his present stage of evolution. If a man performs his duties, surrendering the fruits to God and discarding all selfish motives, he gains purity of heart and achieves ultimate liberation.

The ultimate aim of Gita is, in a word, the attainment of the Highest good, characterized by the complete cessation of relative existence and its cause. One must learn to give up lust, anger, greed & establish mastery over the six senses (hearing, touch, sight, taste, smell & mind) ; and also keep in mind that all works are done by energy of nature and he/she is not the doer but only an instrument. One must strive for excellence in all undertakings but maintain equanimity in success & failure, gain & loss, and pain & pleasure. Even if success does not come to our life, a little attempt will lead us one- step further towards the divine life.
 The Bhagwad Gita is universally renowned as jewel of world's spiritual wisdom. It has ignited a spiritual revolution for thousands of years which is still burning. The Gita is not originated with any specific "ism" or belief, in view e.g. Dvaita, Advaita, Vishishtadvaita, Dvaitadvaita, Vishuddhadvaita, Achintya-Bhedabheda, nor any cult, creed or doctrine. Its supreme objective is; that man's salvation must be ensured in any circumstances.

The Vital Weave : Why Inclusive Feminism Is the Future

Feminism, at its core, is the simple but radical belief in the social, political, and economic equality of the sexes. For generations, this movement has been the driving force behind monumental achievements, from securing the right to vote to challenging economic disparities. However, as the movement has evolved, it has faced a crucial and necessary internal critique: can we, or should we, speak of "women" as a single, unified group with one set of shared experiences? The answer, in short, is no. This is where an inclusive approach, often called intersectionality, becomes not just a modern buzzword, but the essential and vital framework for the future of feminism.

The term "intersectionality" was coined in 1989 by legal scholar and critical race theorist Kimberlé Crenshaw. She developed the concept to explain a specific legal blind spot. In a famous case, *DeGraffenreid v. General Motors*, a group of Black women sued the company for discrimination. Their case was dismissed because the court found that while GM hired women (in secretarial roles) and hired Black people (in factory floor roles), they did not hire Black women for any roles. The court argued that the women could not combine sex and race discrimination—they had to choose one.

Crenshaw used the metaphor of an intersection:

just as a car crash at an intersection can be caused by traffic from multiple directions, the oppression experienced by Black women was not just sexism plus racism. It was the unique, compounded, and interlocking product of both systems. An inclusive, or intersectional, framework is therefore the only way to see and address the "weave" of these combined oppressions.

Historically, mainstream feminism often prioritized the struggles of white, middle-class, cisgender women. The "second wave" of feminism in the 1960s and 70s, for example, made incredible strides in workplace and reproductive rights. However, it was often critiqued by women of color and working-class women for assuming their experiences were universal.

A white suburban housewife's desire to "break free" from the home and enter the workforce (as described in Betty Friedan's *The Feminine Mystique*) was a world away from the reality of Black and brown women who had always worked, often in low-wage, domestic, or agricultural jobs, yet were still excluded from power.

They faced not only the "problem with no name" but also the very named problems of systemic racism and economic exploitation.

A feminism that is not inclusive and does not acknowledge these different, overlapping systems of

power is a feminism that fails. If the goal is to achieve equality, we cannot leave anyone behind. A "one-size-fits-all" approach risks solving problems only for the most privileged women, while ignoring or even worsening the oppression of the most marginalized.

For example, a corporate "lean in" policy designed to get more women into the boardroom does very little for the woman working two minimum-wage jobs to feed her family. In fact, it can create a narrative that her failure to "succeed" is a personal one, not the result of a system stacked against her. An inclusive approach, by contrast, demands that we center the voices of those who are most affected by multiple forms of injustice.

This framework fundamentally broadens our understanding of what constitutes a feminist issue.

Fighting for racial justice is a feminist issue, because women of color are disproportionately affected by police violence and systemic racism. Fighting for economic justice and raising the minimum wage is a feminist issue, because women (and particularly women of color) are vastly overrepresented in low-wage service jobs. Fighting for disability rights is a feminist issue, because women with disabilities face unique barriers to healthcare, employment, and safety. Fighting for LGBTQ+

rights is a feminist issue, because our transgender sisters, in particular, face epidemic levels of violence and discrimination.

The goal of inclusive feminism is not to divide the movement into smaller, competing factions. On the contrary, it is to build a stronger, more resilient, and more effective coalition by acknowledging the full, complex reality of our lives. It understands that true equality cannot be achieved for any woman until it is achieved for all women, in all of their diverse and intersecting identities.

Beyond the Pay Gap : Feminism and the Modern Workplace

For decades, the workplace has been a central battleground for the feminist movement. The initial fight was for access—the right to be hired, to have a career, and to achieve a measure of financial independence. While significant progress has been made, the fight has evolved. Today's workplace feminism looks beyond sim-

ple access and confronts the complex, often invisible, systems that continue to hinder true equality. The most commonly cited symptom is the gender pay gap, but this is just one piece of a much larger, more intricate puzzle.

The fact that women, on average, are still paid less than men for comparable work is a stark indicator of persistent inequality. This gap is not a simple matter of women "choosing" lower-paying jobs. It is a complex issue fueled by several factors. One is "occupational segregation," where fields traditionally dominated by women (like caregiving, education, and administration) are systematically undervalued and underpaid compared to male-dominated fields like technology and trades.

This gap is then compounded by the "motherhood penalty," where women's earnings and career progression often stagnate after having children, an effect not seen for men. Furthermore, this pay gap is a chasm for women of color; in the U.S., for every dollar a white man earns, a Black woman or a Latina woman earns significantly less than a white woman.

No discussion of workplace inequality is complete without addressing the disproportionate burden of unpaid labor that women shoulder. Coined by sociologist Arlie Hochschild, the "second shift" refers to the do-

mestic work, childcare, and family organization that women are expected to perform after completing their full-time paid job.

This "mental load"—the invisible, unending task of managing a household and family—is not just tiring; it is a profound professional disadvantage. It directly competes with the time and energy available for career advancement, networking, or even necessary rest, creating a structural barrier that flexible work policies alone cannot solve.

Feminism also confronts the "glass ceiling"—the invisible barrier that prevents qualified women from rising to senior leadership positions. Globally, women are still starkly underrepresented in C-suite roles and on corporate boards. This is often due to unconscious bias in hiring, a lack of access to the same high-level mentorship and sponsorship network as men, and work cultures that reward a 24/7 availability that is incompatible with a woman's "second shift."

A more insidious and recently identified phenomenon is the "glass cliff." This is the tendency for women to be promoted to positions of power only when an organization is in deep crisis and the risk of failure is highest. They are set up on a "cliff" where they are more likely to fail, and can then be blamed for the negative outcome.

Tackling these deep-

rooted issues requires more than just individual women "leaning in." It demands a multi-faceted, structural, and cultural overhaul.

Structural Changes: This includes mandating full pay transparency to expose and correct wage gaps. It means robust, government-subsidized childcare and, crucially, equally paid and encouraged parental leave for all parents, not just "maternity" leave for mothers. This helps normalize caregiving as a shared responsibility.

Ultimately, feminism in the workplace is not a zero-sum game. Creating a more equitable environment is not just a moral imperative; it is a business one. Workplaces that are diverse, equitable, and flexible are proven to be more innovative, more productive, and more humane for all employees.

IIT Delhi made 'Smart' anti-Mosquito Detergent: Chikungunya and Dengue, in Defense of Malaria

A team of researchers from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi has developed an innovative mosquito deterrent. This 'smart detergent' combines the washing of clothes as well as keeping them away from mosquitoes, which is an important step towards providing protection against mosquito-borne diseases like dengue, malaria and chikungunya. Main development and research team This research has been conducted under the leadership of Professor Javed Nabibaksha Sheikh of IIT Delhi's Department of Textiles and Fiber En-

gineering. The team focused on developing a solution that provides more consistent and comprehensive protection, given the limitations of traditional mosquito control products—.

Detergent specifications Availability in two formats: This detergent has been developed in both powder and liquid forms. No compromise on washing quality: It maintains the same cleaning and washing properties of clothes as normal detergent. Constant Safety: Since the fabrics are washed frequently, anti-mosquito properties are reproduced after each wash,



ensuring its effectiveness and durability. Affordable solution: The team aims to make it an affordable and accessible

product that can be easily used by every household, especially those in the low and middle income class. How

does it work? Making clothes unpleasant: The active components of detergent act with the fibers (fibers) of clothing during the washing process. Mosquito distraction: These components make the surface of clothes less attractive to mosquitoes.

According to Professor Sheikh, the active ingredients work on the smell and taste sensors of mosquitoes, so that mosquitoes do not like to sit (landing). Preventing bites: Since mosquito stings (prob-

sis) can reach the skin through fabrics, it is necessary to prevent them from landing on the cloth itself. This detergent reduces the possibility of bite by keeping mosquitoes away. A test of effectiveness The effectiveness of the product has been tested using a "hand-in-case" method in a commercial laboratory. In this test, volunteers covered their hands with a cloth washed with detergent and put them in a box filled with hungry mosquitoes. The results showed that the number of mosquitoes sitting on these clothes was significantly reduced, which is proof

that detergent is effective in keeping away mosquitoes.

Current status and future plan The research team has filed a patent application for this new technology. This product is currently in the stage of technical transfer (. If all goes according to plan, this mosquito deterrent may be available for commercialization in the market in the next few months. This innovative development can prove to be a 'game changer' in the fight against mosquito-borne diseases, which will provide people with an easy and effective safety shield through their everyday clothes.

In addition, the project incorporates several sustainability features such as a 1 MW rooftop solar plant, LED lighting, provisions for natural ventilation and daylight, a sewage treatment plant, wastewater recycling facility, and rainwater harvesting ponds.

The Minister stated that the unit is proposed to manufacture MEMU rakes with 16 coaches, equipped with state-of-the-art technology. He added that the project will generate substantial direct and indirect employment opportunities for the youth of the region.

In a statement released on Saturday, the Collector emphasised that the elections must be conducted in a free, fair, transparent, and democratic manner as mandated by the State Election Commission (SEC).

He said that any unethical practices—such as threats during nomination, bribery, forced unanimous elections, or interference with candidates—are a direct violation of democratic principles. The Collector urged citizens and political leaders to cooperate in ensuring impartial elections.

Legal Consequences Highlighted
Collector Diwakar explained that Section 171-A of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) defines illegal electoral conduct, Section 171-B deals with bribery, and Section 171-C pertains to undue influence or intimidation of voters.

Violations may attract punishments under Sections 171-E and 171-F, including up to one year imprisonment, fines, or both. Individuals involved in such offences may also face disqualification from contesting elections for six years, he said.

Strict Vigilance and Public Cooperation Urged
The Collector instructed election officials to maintain strict vigilance and act immediately against any complaints of bribery, coercion, or auctioning of posts. He appealed to citizens to report any such incidents promptly to the police.

Assuring complete support to voters, he said the district administration is taking all measures to ensure that every voter can exercise their franchise freely, without fear, pressure, or inducement.

Adding to the crowd, Anaganaga Oka Raju is releasing a day after BMW, making this Sankranthi one of the most packed and competitive seasons in recent years.

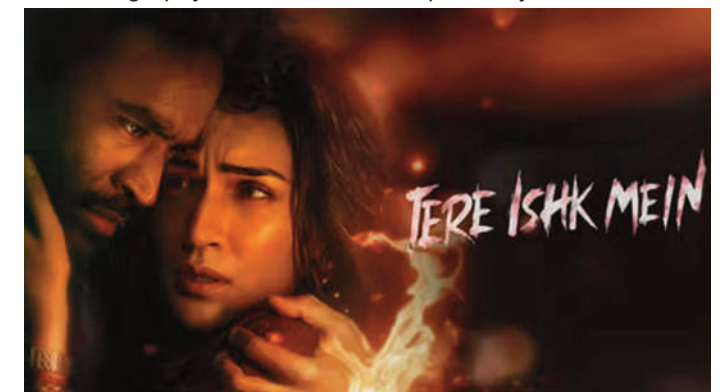


Swayambhu's overseas rights sold for a solid price; Highest in Nikhil's career
