Telangana Governor's residence Raj Bhavan renamed Lok Bhavan

Hyderabad: The Telangana Governor's official residence will henceforth be called as 'Lok Bhavan, Telangana'.

Following recommendations made during the conference of Governors last year and a Ministry of Home Affairs communication, the name of 'Raj Bhavan' has been officially changed to 'Lok Bhavan'.

"The official residence of the Governor of Telangana, hitherto known as 'Raj Bhavan, Telangana', will henceforth be called as 'Lok Bhavan, Telangana', an official statement from the Lok Bhavan said on Tuesday.

The new nomenclature 'Lok Bhavan, Telangana' comes into immediate effect for all official purposes, references, and records, the statement added.

Telangana Media Delegation Meets Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma

Economy Strengthening, Crime Rates Drop Sharply; Assam Govt Focus on Women Empowerment, Infrastructure

GUWAHATI : As part of the ongoing PIB Telangana Media Delegation tour to Assam, journalists interacted with Assam Chief Minister Dr. Himanta Biswa Sarma on Tuesday. In a candid briefing, the Chief Minister highlighted the state's rapid economic progress, social reforms, and development priorities.

Dr. Sarma said that Assam's economy has shown significant improvement, registering nearly 14% growth, a positive sign of the state's financial stability and expanding opportunities. He emphasised that women empowerment remains at the core of governance, with several new welfare and livelihood schemes making strong impact at the grassroots level.



Speaking about infrastructure development, the Chief Minister said that road expansion works from North Guwahati to West Guwahati are progressing with special focus, easing mobility and supporting long-term urban development. "We are paying priority attention to strengthening connectivity across the region," he noted.

Dr. Sarma also highlighted a remarkable improvement in law and order. "Crime rate has gone down from 30,000 cases to nearly 4,000 in recent years. Cybercrimes and drug-related offences are being tightly monitored. Violence against women has seen a notable decline over the last five years," he said, crediting strong policing and technology-driven surveillance.

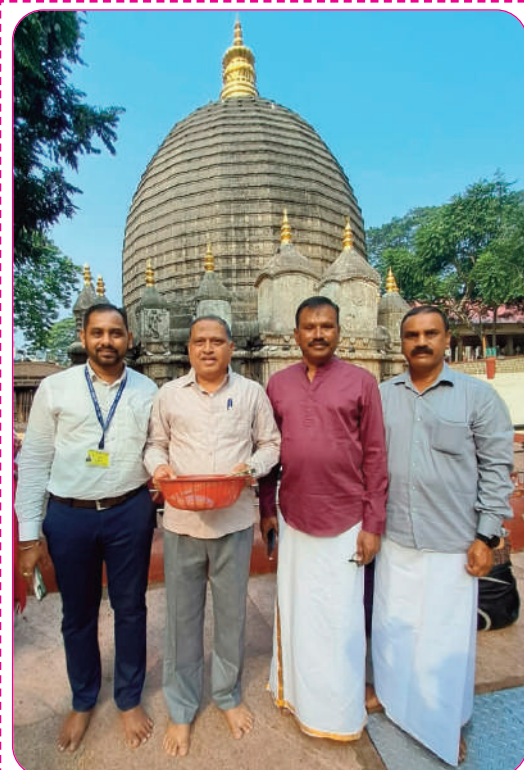
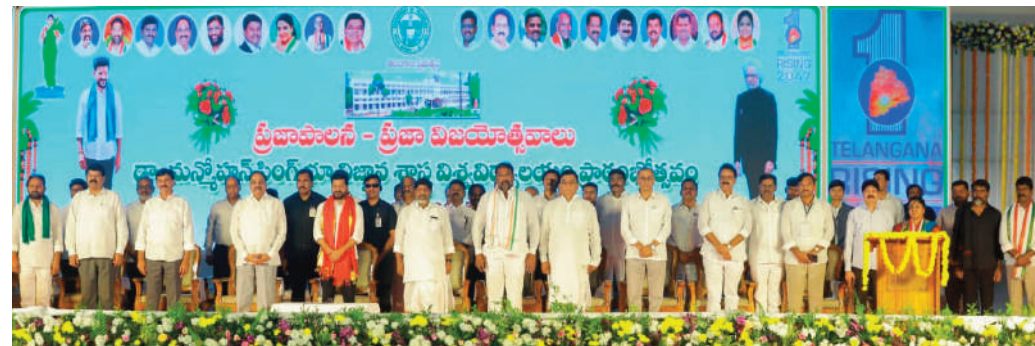

Minister Anagani Satya Prasad Calls for Collective Effort to Form Greater Tirupati Municipal Corporation

Settipalli Land Issue Resolved; Pattas to be Distributed by December 22

Tirupati : Minister for Revenue, Stamps and Registration, and District In-charge Minister, Anagani Satya Prasad, has called upon all elected representatives to extend their full cooperation for the formation of the Greater Tirupati Municipal Corporation. Presiding over the District Development Review Committee meeting at the Collectorate on Tuesday, the Minister emphasized the State Government's special focus on the development of the Tirupati district. Addressing the officials and representatives, the Minister noted that the Tirupati Municipal Corporation currently spans 30.174 sq km. To cater to future needs and achieve the status of a Greater Corporation with a target population of 10 lakhs, there is a proposal to expand the limits by an ad-

ditional 270.23 sq km. This expansion involves merging 63 Gram Panchayats from Tirupati Rural, Chandragiri, Renigunta, Yerpedu, and RC Puram mandals into the corporation. However, only 13 panchayats have approved the proposal so far. The Minister urged representatives to support this initiative for the region's long-term growth. **Shettipalli Land Issue Resolved**
 The Minister announced a breakthrough in the long-pending Shettipalli land issue. A detailed action plan has been formulated to develop Shettipalli into a model township. Officials have been directed to complete all necessary formalities and distribute land titles (pattas) to the beneficiaries by December 22. **Disaster Management and Relief**
 Reviewing the recent



natural calamities, District Collector Dr. S. Venkateswar briefed the committee on the relief measures taken during Cyclone Montha. The administration set up 36 relief camps and distributed essential commodities to affected families, including fisherfolk and weavers. The Minister specifically commended the police and revenue departments for their spontaneous response during the Rayala Cheruvu breach in KVB

Puram on November 6. The swift evacuation of residents amidst 9-foot water flows prevented any loss of life. Compensation of Rs 3.50 crore has been disbursed for the damages, and measures are being taken to prevent such incidents in the future. **Infrastructure and Tourism**
 The committee discussed the beautification of the Swarnamukhi River and the removal of encroachments in Thondavada. Highlighting the tourism po-

tential, the Minister stated that while revenue industries contribute 40% to the district's economy, tourism contributes 60%. Significant focus was placed on railway infrastructure. The Minister highlighted that projects worth Rs 6,666.35 crore—including the Gudur-Renigunta third line, Tirupati-Katpadi doubling, and the Yerpedu-Pudi bypass line—are underway. The administration aims to complete land acquisition for these projects by March 31, 2026. **Gudur Division and Law & Order**
 Addressing the inclusion of Gudur into the Tirupati district, the Minister explained that despite its geographic proximity to Nellore, Gudur is integral to the Chennai-Bengaluru Industrial Corridor and the development of the

Dugarajapatnam Port. The Minister also directed officials to organize the Flamingo Festival on a grand scale in January 2026 to promote ecotourism. On the law and order front, he praised the District SP for the stringent crackdown on marijuana (Ganja) trafficking and the maintenance of peace in the district. The meeting was attended by District Collector Dr. S. Venkateswar, MLAs Balli Kalyana Chakravarthy and Sipayi Subramanyam, MLAs Puliparthi Nani, Arani Srinivasulu, Bojjala Sudheer Reddy, Nelavala Vijayasree, Koneti Adimulam, Ramakrishna, and Pasham Sunil Kumar. TUDA Chairman Divakar Reddy, Corporation Chairpersons, SP L. Subbarayudu, Municipal Commissioner N. Maurya, and other district officials were also present.

Finance company overturned its board; Victims protest in front of the director's house

Nalgonda town : 12 Capital Finance, which collected about 300 crore rupees through directors and overturned its board in the surrounding areas of Hyderabad and Nalgonda by charging high interest rates, held a protest in front of the house of

Director Rapolu Prakash, located opposite the Anjaneya Swamy Temple on Hyderabad Road in Nalgonda, on Monday.
Due to the traffic jam, the police are detaining the director and calling the protesters to the police station for talks. According to the victims' ex-

planation, 12 capital finance companies were set up in Miyapur, Hyderabad, and 12 directors were appointed for them, claiming to be doing real estate business, and collecting Rs 300 crore through the directors at an interest rate of Rs 4 per 100.

The victims alleged that they were given an agreement to pay the actual interest after 25 months, but the board was turned over within six months and the victims did not pay them a single rupee.
Rachala Lalitha from Ramanthapur, Hyderabad, said that she had given her plots and gold worth Rs 1 crore and six lakh, but she has not given a single rupee so far, and that she is desperate because her husband has fallen ill, so she is pleading for her money to be returned to her.

No matter how many times the police have told the government not to pay money due to the high interest rate, there is no change in the people.

Editorial India is the host for the 18th Global Forum Plenary

Union Minister for Finance and Corporate Affairs Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman inaugurated the 18th plenary meeting of the Global Forum on Transparency and Exchange of Information for Tax Purposes, in New Delhi, today.

India is hosting the 18th Plenary Meeting of the Global Forum on Transparency and Exchange of Information for Tax Purposes in New Delhi from 2nd to 5th December 2025, under the theme "Tax Transparency: Delivering a Shared Vision Through International Cooperation".

The Global Forum, with 172 member jurisdictions, is the world's leading body for the implementation of international

standards on tax transparency — namely the Exchange of Information on Request (EOIR) and the Automatic Exchange of Financial Account Information (AEOI), including all G20 countries. Its work plays a central role in combating tax evasion and illicit financial flows globally.

The opening ceremony was also attended by Pankaj Chaudhary, Union Minister of State for Finance, Arvind Vas-tava, Secretary, D/o Revenue, Ministry of Finance, Mr. Gaël Perraud, Chair of the Global Forum.

In her inaugural address, Union Finance Minister Smt. Nirmala Sitharaman welcomed the delegates and dignitaries to India for the Plenary Meeting

and highlighted the major shift in the global financial landscape from a world constrained by secrecy to one where transparency is recognized as essential to fairness and responsible governance.

The Union Finance Minister emphasised that for India, transparency touches upon the deeper principle that economic governance must rest on fairness and responsibility, and noted that transparency is not merely a compliance tool but a foundation for sustainable development, observing that when national wealth escapes legitimate taxation, it creates both a revenue and a development gap.

Smt. Sitharaman stressed that voluntary compliance has

improved in India not just through enforcement, but through clarity, simplification, and a consistent effort to build trust. While acknowledging the potential of technology and AI in analyzing information, she cautioned that innovation must be balanced with judgment and unwavering respect for procedure. She concluded by asserting that trust between jurisdictions has tangible economic value and called for continued cooperation to manage emerging challenges like the digitalization of the economy and evolving structures of beneficial ownership.

Addressing the Plenary, Union Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary described the gathering as a

reminder of the progress made in building a rules-based and cooperative approach to tax administration. He remarked that obtaining relevant information across borders in a timely manner has evolved from a difficulty to a practical reality, which has strengthened enforcement and improved taxpayer confidence.

He advocated for a balanced approach where transparency and facilitation move forward together so that compliance becomes easier and more natural. Emphasizing that inclusivity is an operating principle rather than just a slogan, he called for continued capacity building and technical guidance for developing countries. He further noted that standards must evolve to

address the digitalization of commerce and new asset classes while maintaining confidentiality and fairness.

India will reaffirm its strong commitment to tax transparency and international cooperation. During its G20 Presidency in 2023, India promoted an inclusive vision for global tax transparency that led to substantive work on the wider use of exchanged information for compliance and risk assessment, and increased participation of developing jurisdictions in AEOI under the Common Reporting Standard (CRS). These initiatives have since matured into ongoing work programmes under the Global Forum and the OECD.



Appeals received against nominations rejected by returning officers in Nalgonda Revenue Division : Collector Ila Tripathi

Meanwhile, RDO Sridevi of Chandur said that out of 3 appeals received regarding nominations in Chandur division, two were rejected and one was accepted. Nalgonda RDO Y. Ashok Reddy, returning officers, election deputy tehsildars, and others were present.

Telangana Media Delegation Interacts with Assam CM; State Showcases Decade of Peace, Growth and Industrial Revival

(PIB Hyderabad delegation)

Guwahati : A media delegation from Telangana, currently on a seven-day media exposure tour to Assam organised by the Press Information Bureau, today interacted with the Chief Minister of Assam. The Chief Minister welcomed the visiting journalists and engaged in an open discussion on governance, development and Assam's evolving socio-economic landscape.

During the interaction, the Chief Minister briefly touched upon Assam's recent history, noting that although the State had witnessed prolonged periods of militant movements in the past, it has now remained peaceful for nearly a decade. He highlighted that around 8,000 former militants have been brought into the mainstream in the last few years. This sustained stability has enabled a sharp decline in violence across tribal and rural regions and created a



conducive atmosphere for investment, infrastructure expansion and public welfare initiatives.

The Chief Minister informed the delegation that Assam is today counted among the high-performing states in several national indices. The State is witnessing a strong phase of industrial revival, with major projects—including fertilizer units, ethanol production fa-

cilities and an upcoming semiconductor plant—attracting investment estimated between ₹4-5 lakh crore. He noted that the State has recorded a 36% growth in capital investment over the last year, reflecting a decisive shift toward asset creation and long-term economic strengthening. Over the past five years, the Government has also provided two lakh government jobs to the youth.

Speaking on healthcare, the Chief Minister stated that nearly 6% of the State budget is allocated to the health sector. Assam is progressing towards the vision of "one district, one medical college," with more than 15 medical colleges completed and 10 currently under construction. He added that the State is introducing India's first proton-beam therapy machine in a government

hospital. Further, 17 cancer hospitals are being established in partnership with the Tata Trust, significantly expanding advanced treatment access for the region.

Responding to questions from journalists, the Chief Minister stressed the State's commitment to women's welfare. Initiatives to increase girls' enrolment in higher education, targeted support for anaemic pregnant women among tea tribes and multiple scholarship programmes have shown measurable impact. He informed that crime against women has reduced substantially—from around 30,000 cases earlier to 5,173 cases in the last three years—reflecting improved systems of protection, monitoring and redressal.

The Chief Minister urged the Telangana media team to discover the culture and ethos of Assam over the next few days and witness the development journey first hand.

Vice-Chancellor and Registrar Holds Review Meeting with Non-Teaching Staff

The Supreme Court's New Listing Policy-A Historic Step Towards Ending "Date After Date"

The Court now believes that justice is only justice when delivered on time, and this principle is clearly evident at the core of the entire policy

There is a possibility of relief from the "date after date" issues that have plagued the country for years, including the constant backlog of cases, delays in hearings, and unnecessary mentionings of cases : Advocate Kishan Sanmukhdas Bhawani

(Capital Information) **Gondia** : has become a significant date in India's judicial history globally. The new rules implemented are not just administrative changes, but a sign of comprehensive judicial reform. The new policy centers on the same old question: By what authority can a person be kept waiting for years in a process? The Supreme Court asked itself this question and presented its solution in the form of a "Restructured Listing System." The Court now believes that justice is justice only when it is delivered on time, and this principle is clearly evident at the core of its entire policy. The Supreme Court has simplified the filing and listing process and implemented a system to limit unnecessary mentionings, baseless urgent demands, and unnecessary adjournments. For years, Supreme Court mornings began with a deluge of mentionings, a crowd that often drowned out the voices of cases with genuine urgency. The new system has virtually eliminated this chaos. The Court's energy will now be focused on hearings, not on procedure, and this in itself marks the beginning of a major change. For years, issues like the constant adjournment of cases, delays in hearings, and unnecessary mentioning of cases have burdened the Indian judicial system. Judicial delays not only prolong litigation but also adversely affect the personal liberty, property rights, and fundamental right to justice of ordinary people. To address this problem, the Supreme Court has made major changes to the listing, mentioning, and adjournment systems. These changes aim to make justice faster, more reliable, and more technologically efficient. These reforms are not merely administrative changes, but also foster a

new mindset and a new culture within the judiciary. Friends, if we consider the four major circulars issued in simple terms, the Supreme Court has issued four important circulars to implement these reforms. Their purpose is to streamline court administration, technical procedures, and judicial work. In simple terms, these four circulars are as follows: (1) Circular on Controlling Mentioning - This circular states that from now on, oral mentioning of cases will not be made directly before the CJI's bench. Only those cases for which special permission has been granted will be permitted for oral mentioning before the CJI's bench. This step will control the crowd of lawyers who used to line up daily to request mentioning before the CJI. (2) Circular on Automation of Case Listing - The Court has implemented a new technological system that automatically sorts, scrutinizes, and lists cases upon filing. Lawyers will no longer need to manually request early dates for their cases through filing or mentioning. The system will automatically prioritize urgent matters. (3) Circular on Auto-Listing of Urgent Matters within 48 Hours - This important provision provides that all new matters related to personal liberty and urgent interim relief will be automatically listed for hearing within two working days, i.e., 48 hours. (4) Circular on Adjournment Control - This circular states that unnecessary adjournments, the practice of repeatedly seeking dates, and the postponement of hearings without valid reasons should be curbed. The Court wants lawyers to be prepared when the hearing date is set, ensuring that hearings are not unnecessarily prolonged. The collective goal of these four circulars is to accelerate the pace of litigation and elimi-

nate the problem of adjournments.

Friends, if we simply explain the new structure of oral mentioning, urgent listing, and adjournment, the system of hearing, listing, and mentioning cases in the Supreme Court was often considered complex and slow. Lawyers would make a large number of "oral mentionings" daily, i.e., standing in court and requesting an early listing of their case. This consumed a significant amount of the bench's time just hearing the mentionings. Sometimes, it was difficult to distinguish truly urgent cases from this multitude. Recognizing this situation, the Court implemented a restructured system effective December 1, 2025.

Friends, if we understand its purpose, the energy, time, and effort required by lawyers for oral mentionings has been reduced. The system has been made more digital, more transparent, and priority-based. (1) Simplifying filing (2) Eliminating unnecessary mentionings before the bench (3) Speeding up hearings for



matters involving personal liberty (4) Automatically prioritizing matters seeking urgent interim relief (5) Preventing unnecessary congestion of lawyers and unnecessary wastage of court time. These changes are considered to be a major step towards making the judiciary more justice-centric and less procedurally burdensome.

Friends, let's discuss the ban on oral mentioning, the new policy, and the promotion of junior lawyers. To put it simply, the oral mentioning time in the Supreme Court, early every morning, was consid-

ered the noisiest. Every lawyer wanted their case to be heard quickly, whether urgent or not. This was a waste of valuable court time, and often the truly urgent matters were not prioritized. According to the new policy, (1) senior lawyers will no longer be able to make oral mentionings before the CJI's bench. This will reduce the crowdedness of mentionings, allowing the CJI's bench to devote more time to actual judicial work. (2) Only matters requiring special leave will be mentioned before the CJI. Previously, every lawyer could make a mention; now only those who truly needed it will do so. (3) Junior lawyers have been promoted; this is a historic change. Previously, the mentioning platform was always held by senior lawyers, leaving junior lawyers in the shadows. Now, they will have the opportunity to come forward and present their views.

This will boost their confidence and strengthen the spirit of equal opportunity in the judiciary. This move reflects the Supreme Court's new approach to empowering future generations of lawyers. (4) Automatic Listing within 48 Hours A revolutionary reform in cases involving people's liberty. The new circular states that all the following types of cases will be listed within 48 hours. This change is based on the idea that if the case involves a person's liberty, every minute of delay is tantamount to injustice.

Friends, what are the cases covered in this? To put it simply, (1) Regular bail, when a person is in jail due to a lengthy investigation or trial and seeks permanent bail. (2) Anticipatory bail, when someone fears arrest and seeks anticipatory bail. (3) Cancellation of bail, when a person's bail is sought due to their behavior. (4) Death

penalty cases, delay in such cases can make the difference between life and death, so they are given top priority. (5) Habeas corpus petitions, when a person is in wrongful or illegal custody, such cases must be heard immediately. (6) Eviction, dis-possession, or demolition cases, because delays sometimes result in the loss of a person's property or home. (7) Any case requiring immediate interim relief. Whether it's a matter of women's safety, a student's future, a doctor's immediate suspension of medical registration, or a company's livelihood disrupted due to the freezing of its bank account, all such cases will be heard within two days. This system reflects the judiciary's sensitivity, which puts the individual first and the process second.

Friends, if we consider the broader impact of the new policy, a major step towards justice, transparency, and speed, these reforms will have several profound and positive effects. (1) The date-for-date culture will be broken. The courts are now preventing unnecessary adjournments, preventing cases from dragging on for years. This will positively impact millions of pending cases. (2) People's freedom will be given top priority. The justice system of any civilized country becomes credible only when it prioritizes individual freedom. This reform will strengthen India's global judicial image. (3) The unnecessary rush of lawyers will end - Lawyers used to rush for mentionings every morning; this will now stop. Court time will be saved, and hearings will be streamlined. (4) More opportunities for junior lawyers in the judicial system. This is a kind of democratization of the Indian

legal profession. Now, not only the voices of senior lawyers will reach the court, but young lawyers will also be able to present their cases. (5) The digital capabilities of the judiciary will be strengthened - Automatic scrutiny, digital listing, and priority selection will make the Supreme Court one of the world's leading courts technologically. (6) Public confidence will increase. The fundamental purpose of law is to instill public confidence, and when hearings are expedited, people have more faith in the justice system.

Therefore, if we study and analyze the above details, we will find that the Listing and Mentioning Policy, implemented from December 1, 2025, marks the beginning of a new era of judicial reforms. The Supreme Court of India is establishing itself globally as a modern, transparent, and responsive judicial institution. With the implementation of these reforms, it is hoped that the old shadow of "date after date" will gradually disappear, and Indian courts will truly emerge as accessible, speedy, and effective platforms for the common citizen.

Increasing Pollution and Decreasing Sunshine in India, why is our India losing Bright Sky, what will be the effect of this?

Our country is now slowly losing its shining sunshine. The study found that sunshine hours have been steadily decreasing in India during the last 30 years. Weather scientists are also troubled by this changing attitude. So let's know what is the reason for sunlight and what can affect our life.

India was once called the land of golden sunshine and blue sky. A country where the long shining sun was considered not only a symbol of its beauty, but also the basis of agriculture, lifestyle and energy. But now things are changing. The country, which was once identified with bright, clean and open sunlight, has now started spreading layers of fog on the sky. Slowly our earth is losing its light. Why is the sun falling in India, where is the shining sky, what will happen Our country is now slowly losing its shining sunshine. This change has been confirmed in a recent scientific study.

Scientists from Banaras Hindu University, Pune-based Indian Tropical Meteorology Institute and India Meteorological Department have conducted a study in which shocking facts have come out. This study, called Long-Term Trends in Sunshine Duration Across India (1988) showed that the hours of sunlight are constantly decreasing in India over the last three decades.

According to the study, the duration of sunlight is decreasing fastest in the plains of North India. It has recorded a shortage of about 13 hours annually. At the same time, the Himalayan region, western coast and Dakkan plateau areas are also not untouched by this decline.

The most effect in North India According to the study, sunshine hours have decreased in almost every part of India between 1988 and 2018. There was a decrease of about 13 hours every year in the plains of North India,

9.5 hours in the Himalayas, 8.6 hours on the west coast, 4.7 hours in Central India and around 3 hours in Dakkan Plateau. In contrast, the change in northeastern states was very modest, probably due to their low industrial pollution and specific climate.

According to monthly data, most parts of the country get more sunshine between October and May, while it decreases in monsoon months. At the same time, its reverse trend was seen due to height and winds patterns in the Himalayas and northern areas.

Why is this sunshine? The conclusion of this study clarifies that the air pollution in India is mainly due to increasing air pollution. Aerosols formed by fumes from industries, vehicle emissions and paralyzing burn the sun's rays before reaching the earth. Along with this, growing clouds during the monsoon have also reduced India's total sunshine time. Scientists

say that if this trend continues, it will seriously affect solar energy production, crop yield and environmental balance.

The two main reasons behind the decrease in sunshine hours are air pollution and clouds. Industrial activities, urbanization and pollutants released from vehicles are increasing the amount of micro particles in the air. These particles prevent sunlight from reaching the earth

by spreading or absorbing. Over time, this process is reducing the duration of sunlight every day. Pollution not only affects visibility and temperature, but also local weather and health.

The second reason is dense and long-lasting clouds, especially during the monsoon. These clouds block the sun's rays and further increase the effects of pollution. Due to the millisecond effect of these two reasons, there is a long-term trend of continuous decrease in sunlight.

What is the effect of sunlight? The biggest impact of this decline may be on India's solar energy policy. The country has set big targets for solar energy production in the coming years, but decreasing sunlight can affect the capacity and energy production of solar panels. Experts say that even a slight decline in solar radiation can make a huge difference to energy production, especially in states where solar projects are rap-

idly expanding.

The agricultural sector will also not be untouched by this change. The growth and productivity of crops largely depends on the sun's rays. If the lack of sunlight continues for a long time, it can affect the process of photosynthesis (light synthesis) and reduce crop yields.

It will also have a deep impact on the environment. Low solar energy can cause changes in local temperature, humidity and rainfall patterns, which will affect regional ecology and water resources.

What do scientists say? Scientists believe that the study of sunlight period is not only a meteorological figure, but it is an indicator of air quality, energy capacity and environmental health. Therefore, it is necessary that the government increase regular monitoring, expand the weather station network and strengthen the satellite-based sun measurement system.

Politically, it is a warning

that decreasing sunlight is actually a sign of increasing pollution. The sky can be cleaned again by controlling the emissions from industry, transport and paralyzing. Solar projects can also be made more sustainable by including sunlight period data in the energy plan.

How to bring back the sun? The findings of the study show that India's sky is constantly blurred and cannot be ignored. From solar energy to agriculture, the effects of this change can be far-reaching. Scientists have warned that if steps are not taken soon in the direction of control over air pollution and sustainable urban development, India's light may fade even more.

The challenge for the country now is to recover its lost sunshine through clean air, better land use and continuous research and protect that bright future on which India's energy and environmental sustainability depends.

Protection of Life and Dignity by Technology

There is a bitter truth behind the schemes of India's shining roads, high buildings and 'smart' cities. In many parts of the country, thousands of people are still forced to go down in sewers and drains and clean with their hands. In such a situation, many times due to poisonous gas, cleaning personnel have to wash their hands with their lives. It is not a profession, but a living symbol of inequality and discrimination in society. In the country, sometimes cleaning employees are honored at a government ceremony twice a year. Doing so shows that the government recognizes the importance of their hard work and contribution, but the reality is that this honor for a few minutes does not guarantee permanent security, dignity or better life for them. True dignity will come when their way of working changes, they will have the opportunity to work and live in a safe and respectable man-

ner, not under dangerous and inhuman conditions. The use of artificial intelligence i.e. 'Artificial Intelligence' technology can play an important role in this. Every year, hundreds of cleaning workers in the country lose their lives due to suffocation, poisonous gas or current. According to the Ministry of Social Justice and Authority, from 2018 to 2023 More than four hundred people died during the sewer cleaning. The National Cleanup Staff Commission believes that the number is much lower than reality, as many deaths are not recorded. These dead usually have Dalit community people. Those who have been in this business for centuries. This situation makes us wonder if we are really living in India, which promised equality and dignity in its constitution. The Constitution of India gives every citizen the right to equality, freedom and dignity. Article 14 does not say that all civil laws are equal in view. Article-

17 abolished untouchability and has been declared a crime to apply or consider it in any form. Article 21 gives every person the right to life and personal freedom, which means not only living but also living a dignified life. This is the moral basis of the Constitution. Has gone In 2013, the central government implemented the Employment Restriction and Rehabilitation of Handloom Workers Act. The law was intended to end the practice of hand-carrying dirt and give those involved alternative employment, education and a dignified life. But it is sad that despite the law, this inhumane practice still continues. The reason for this is not only administrative negligence, but deep roots of social mentality, which connects the work of cleaning to a certain class. Whenever the sewer drain is jammed in an area, a cleaning worker is sent down instead of machines. That too without safety equipment without train-

ing and without guarantee of life. It is time to make efforts to end this problem not only with the help of law or morality, but also with the aid of science and technology. Today is the era of artificial intelligence. This is the technology that gives machines human-like understanding, judgment and ability to learn. Its correct use can play a revolutionary role in eliminating the inhumane practice like hand cleaning. In India too, robots based on artificial meth have now been developed, which can get down in the sewer drains and clean.

This robot detects dirt and obstruction with the help of camera and sensor and cleanses by machine hands. This technology is now being used in cities like Tiruvanthapuram, Chennai, Lucknow and Patna. This not only saves people's lives, but also proves that cleaning can be done with dignity. In fact, the artificial intelligence based monitoring

system collects information about water flow, gas level and pressure through sensors installed in sewer drains. These data are analyzed by machine learning system. The use of artificial intelligence is not limited to cleaning, but through it can also get training and rehabilitation opportunities for cleaning employees. They can be trained in tasks such as machine operation, data analysis and technical management to make their life safe and respectable. Many countries around the world have proven that it is possible to clean sewage without risking human life. In Japan, robots called 'Pipe Rover' and 'Crobos' go deep into the pipeline and clean with the help of cameras and sensors. In South Korea, a technology called Sewer Bat 'monitors the status of sewer system through artificial intelligence and warns danger time. The sewage system in Singapore is controlled by smart sen-

sors and automated machines, so that a human does not have to descend into drains or pits. In cities like London and Amsterdam, drones and cameras regularly inspect the pipeline. These countries have shown that if there is willpower and a working plan, then cleaning can also be done in the way. Can be done in a safe and humane way. Even in India, if the government and municipalities adopt such technical solutions, the practice of cleaning dirt by hand can be abolished forever. Robotic cleaning system should be mandatory in each municipal body.

Robotic cleaning system should be mandatory in every municipal body. The government should give cooperation and economic support to innovation centers and private institutions doing research in this direction. The next phase of the 'Swachh Bharat Mission' should be not limited to cleanliness, where the purpose is to

protect the dignity of the cleaner Too yes. Hand cleaning dirt is not only of labor, but human rights and There is also a question of social justice. | End our moral and There is a constitutional responsibility. Artificial intelligence gives us the opportunity to imagine an India where no one is forced to clean dirt by hand only because of their special class or caste. When machines clean up, humans will be freed from the humiliation, fear and inequality that has been chasing them for generations. It is necessary to free humiliation, restore dignity and realize the promise of the Constitution, which says that every person is equal. Every one has the right to live with respect when any citizen will be recognized not because of his particular class or caste, but on the basis of his merit and dignity, then it can also be said that India is literally a sensitive nation in terms of hygiene and honor.

Srinivas Reddy, reviewed compensation details and addressed farmers' objections.

He said farmers will also receive separate compensation for agricultural pump sets, Subabul plantations, pipelines, drip systems, trees and any other structures present on their land. The administration, he said, is committed to ensuring timely and transparent disbursement.

Farmers expressed concerns that losing their lands would affect their livelihood, especially with standing Subabul crops nearing harvest. He advised the public not to trust social media IPO offers, to avoid any advance payment or registration fee, and to immediately disconnect and report if anyone pressures them through calls or messages to invest money.

temple, where the sacred Palli Kuruppu ceremony was performed, with devotees participating in the holy resting ritual.

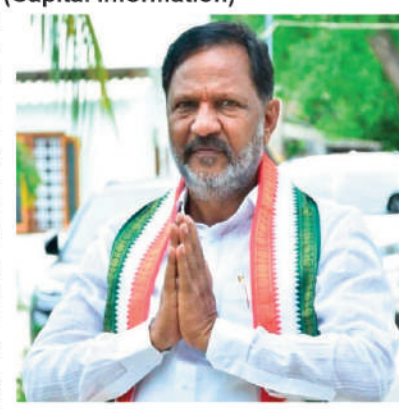

Winters are more prone to heart diseases

- Proper precautions should be taken, noted cardiologist, Medicover Hospitals Nizamabad Dr. Jagadish Chandra Bose

Nizamabad Beareu, December 02 : During the winters, people, young and old, are more prone to heart diseases, said Cardiologist Dr. Jagadish Chandra Bose of Medicover Hospitals Nizamabad. He said that problems like increased blood pressure and increased pressure on the heart due to constriction of blood vessels when the weather changes in cold intensity are the main reasons. He said that the chances of a heart attack are especially high in the early morning when the cold intensity is high. He said that during low temperatures, the heart has to work harder to maintain body heat, and people who are elderly, those with pre-existing heart diseases, and those with sugar, BP and cholesterol are more likely to suffer from stress. Many people ignore these symptoms, considering them to be normal cold fatigue, which can lead

to serious problems, he warned. He informed everyone about the precautions to be taken during winter. They should reduce going out in extreme cold in the early morning and at night. They should wear appropriate clothing to keep the body warm. They also said that sugar, BP, and cholesterol should be checked regularly. If symptoms like chest heaviness, difficulty breathing, sudden sweating, and pain in the hands and elbows are observed, they should immediately consult a doctor and get appropriate treatment. He advised them to completely stop smoking and drinking alcohol. He said that warm water, nutrition, and light exercise are protective for the heart during winter. Since the symptoms of heart diseases can worsen very quickly during winter, Dr. Jagadish Chandra Bose suggested that they should immediately contact hospitals and doctors providing emergency medical services without ignoring any small change.

Officials explained that the process of treating a total of 3,51,500 metric tons of garbage will be completed soon. Currently, 2 machines are working, and 2 more machines will be



required, which will be available soon. With these measures, the area will be cleaned and the problem of the Nagaram dumping yard will be solved permanently. A clean and healthy Indore is my goal, and work is progressing rapidly towards that end.

Postal ballot District Election Commission on the process of issuing postal ballots in the second general elections of gram panchayats. Postal ballot papers will be issued from the first series allotted for Gram Panchayat elections. For Sarpanch and ward member elections, Stage-2 RO: Polling staff on election duty must send postal ballot to service voters within 24 hours of the expiry of the deadline for withdrawal of candidature. ROs should prepare Forms XVII, XVIII, XIX, XX, covers, facsimile stamp, marked copy of service voters in advance. RO facsimile must be printed in two places on the back of the postal ballot, on the counterfoil. The names of the contesting candidates should be entered in Form-XX in the order of their marks, and the date & time for the postal ballot to be returned should be clearly mentioned. Officials should act dutifully so that there is no delay in the process of issuing postal ballot. The protection of the voting rights of service voters is of utmost importance. The Collector said.

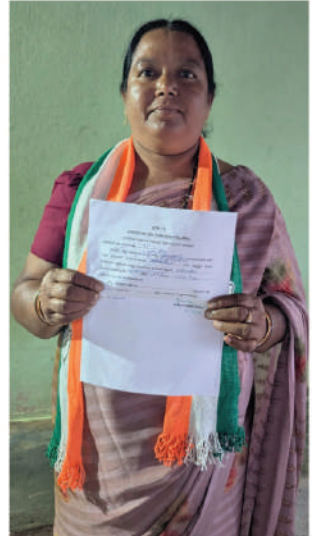

The emergence of three contestants from the same party has surprised not only Congress cadre and mandal leaders but also opposition parties TRS and BJP, who see an opportunity in the internal split. According to reliable party sources, Minister Danasari Anasuya @ Seethakka, reportedly given mandate to Sudhakar Rao's wife Rama. It is believed to have extended her support to Devaraneni Sudhakar Rao's (wife , Rama) Ahmad Pasha had previously won the Sarpanch seat with Congress support in 2018 and held the post until 2023. Earlier, from 2013 to 2018, Chand Pasha served as Sarpanch.

Party insiders state that Minister Sithakka favoured supporting a General-category candidate this time to maintain political balance, especially since Devaraneni Sudhakar Rao's family shares close ties with her son, Kunja Surya. This proximity reportedly influenced the minister's endorsement.

However, driven by political ambition, Md. Pasha went ahead and filed his nomination despite appeals from within the party ranks. Observing this, Chand Pasha also entered the fray by filing his wife's nomination, intensifying the contest.

With the withdrawal deadline set for December 6, senior Congress leadership is expected to initiate negotiations among the three contenders to arrive at a consensus candidate. Party sources indicate that efforts are underway to field a single official nominee to prevent vote division, as a split could directly benefit the TRS candidate.

The transportation Lifeline of Assam: The Brahmaputra Waterway

GUWAHATI : The Brahmaputra waterways have been central for the development of trade in South Asia from time immemorial. The Brahmaputra river is about 2,900 km long, originates in the Angsi glacier of the Himalayas in China and flows through Assam and joins the Ganges in Bangladesh. It is the only river named after a male deity. The Brahmaputra waterway, designated as

National Waterway 2 (NW-2), is a 891 km stretch of the Brahmaputra River in Assam, designated as a national waterway in 1988. It is used for cargo and passenger transport and is maintained by the Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI) to ensure seamless travel during the day and night. IWAI is working on providing the necessary navigational aids. It has set up terminal facilities for loading and unloading at strategic locations like

Dhubri, Pandu, and temporary facilities at Jogighopa, Silghat, Neamati, and Dibrugarh. Pandu (Guwahati) is being developed as a multi modal transport hub which can serve the entire North East region.

The potential cargo movements through NW2 include coal from Meghalaya, fly ash from Farakka to various destinations in the Northeast, limestone for cement plants, petroleum products from Numaligarh refinery, bi-

tumen from Haldia, food grains from Kolkata, fertilisers, building materials, and bamboo. There is a push to develop the waterway further through projects focused on improved infrastructure, cargo and passenger movement, and integration with other transportation modes.

The waterway is also being integrated with other national waterways, such as the Ganga (NW-1), to create a more extensive network. The inland water transport

departments of both the state and central governments of India are very keen to realize NW2's full potential for cargo and passenger transportation. This can be achieved only by greater private participation. There is a huge investment opportunity for public-private partnership (PPP) in areas like dredging, construction, operation, and maintenance of barges, terminals, storage facilities, and navigation, as well as tourism.
