Husnabad/Hyderabad : Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy announced that the People's Government would fill 40,000 jobs in the next 30 months (2 years 6 months) . The government has already recruited 60,000 posts in the first year after coming to power in the state.

Addressing the public meeting in Husnabad, the Chief minister said that today is a significant day for two reasons. The first one is Telangana Martyr Srikantha Chary sacrificed his life by setting ablaze himself to the cause of Telangana state and the other is people dethroned the 'dictatorial' BRS rule in the state. "Our government is fulfilling the aspirations of the Telangana martyr by filling the jobs and providing employment opportunities to the youth.

In a scathing attack on the previous RBS government, the CM said that the Kaleshwaram project constructed at the cost of Rs one lakh crore collapsed in just three years. The Congress government has built many projects in the state and

the structures remained strong for decades. Revanth Reddy also took a swipe at the previous BRS government for neglecting the Husnabad assembly constituency. The BRS rulers focused only on the development of Gajwel, Siddipet and Sircilla . No double bed room houses were allotted to the poor in Husnabad during the 10 year BRS rule. The projects mainly Gadipelli and Gaurelli were not completed. The BRS leaders exploited Husnabad as a sentiment dur-

ing the launch of political campaigns, the CM charged. CM Revanth Reddy remembered the struggle by Sardar Sarvai Pannana for the empowerment of the backward community in Husnabad. The people of Karimnagar had also played a key role in the achievement of Telangana state. Sonia Gandhi made the promise of statehood for Telangana in Karimnagar and fulfilled the same. "I came directly to Husnabad from Delhi after inviting Sonia Gandhi , Mallikar-

juna Kharge, Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi and Prime Minister Modi to the Global Summit".

Announcing huge funds for the development of Husnabad, the Chief minister said that the government waived farm loans up to Rs 2 lakh each and relieved them from mounting debt burden. After the Congress came to power, we have spent Rs 1.40 lakh crores for farmers welfare. Rs. 8,000 crores were spent on free RTC travel for women. Self-help groups were promoted as the owners of the RTC buses, issued new ration cards to the beneficiaries and distributed fine rice. The People's government was also providing 200 units of free electricity to almost 50 lakh families.

The people's government will be in power for 10 years and build 20 lakh houses, the CM said appealing to people to elect good candidates as Sarpanches who should work in coordination with the ministers and MLAs to develop the villages.

Tata's Assam Semiconductor Project Set to Power India's Tech Future

Guwahati : As part of the Telangana Media Delegation's North East tour, journalists and PIB officials today visited the upcoming Tata Semiconductor Assembly and Test Pvt. Ltd. (TSAT) facility in Morigaon, Assam a project widely seen as a game-changer for India's semiconductor ambitions. The delegation received an in-depth briefing on the scale, technology, and national significance of the plant, along with insights into Assam's rapid emergence as a tech-manufacturing hub.

With an investment of ₹27,000 crore, the Morigaon unit is set to become one of India's premier semiconductor manufacturing sites. Expected to be completed by mid-2025, the facility will produce up to 48 million chips per day using advanced packaging technologies such as flip-chip and Integrated System-in-Package (ISIP). These chips will support critical sectors like electric vehicles, automotive systems, telecom, aerospace, and consumer electronics.



During the visit, Telangana media representatives observed the high-precision infrastructure coming up at the site and interacted with project officials on India's growing semiconductor roadmap. Delegates noted that the project not only advances national technology goals but also strengthens regional development in the Northeast.

The plant is poised to generate 15,000 direct and 11,000-13,000 indirect jobs,

promising a substantial socio-economic boost for Morigaon and surrounding districts. Its large-scale output will cater to both domestic and global markets, consolidating India's position in the international chip supply chain.

The project is part of the larger India Semiconductor Mission (ISM) and the ₹76,000-crore Semicon India programme, which aim to build a robust domestic ecosystem spanning fabrication, ATMP/OSAT, display

fabs, sensors, and chip design. Similar projects approved in Gujarat and upgrades to the Mohali Semiconductor Lab underline the Centre's aggressive push toward semiconductor self-reliance.

The Telangana Media Delegation's visit highlighted how developments in Assam are shaping India's technological future a future driven by innovation, global competitiveness, and a confident stride toward semiconductor independence.

Major Push for Tirupati Rail Infra: MPs Demand Balaji Division, New FOBs, and Express Stoppages

Tirupati : YSRCP Lok Sabha MP Maddila Gurumoorthy and Rajya Sabha MP Meda Raghunatha Reddy met with Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnav today to discuss key developmental initiatives for the railway sector in the Tirupati district. The MPs submitted a formal representation outlining several critical demands, primarily focusing on strengthening the railway infrastructure in the region.

Demand for Balaji Railway Division
The delegation urged the Union Minister to take immediate steps towards establishing the long-pending Balaji Railway Division with Tirupati as its headquarters. Highlighting Tirupati's status as one of the busiest pilgrimage destinations in the country, the MPs explained that the current railway lines in the region fall under multiple divisions. This fragmentation has led to administrative chal-



lenges and delays in project approvals, impacting the quality of services. They emphasized that with the Tirupati Railway Station currently undergoing a major upgradation worth ₹300 crore, the establishment of a dedicated Balaji Division is both logical and necessary. MP Gurumoorthy noted that he has previously raised this issue twice in Parliament.

Infrastructure Development Requested
The MPs also stressed the urgent need to approve

the construction of a Foot Over Bridge (FOB) at Tirupati West Railway Station. They informed the Minister that the closure of the southern pathway has caused severe inconvenience to students and residents of MR Palli, Padmavati Nagar, SV Nagar, and Ullipatteda areas. An FOB is crucial to ensure their safe passage.

Additionally, based on a request from Nagari Constituency YSRCP Coordinator and former Minister Roja, the MPs appealed for the construction of an FOB and a

ramp at Puttur Yard (Km 111/800-900) opposite the local Dharmarajula Swamy Temple to resolve long-standing crossing issues.

Train Stoppages and Restoration of Services

Responding to public demand, the MPs requested the Minister to provide stoppages for express trains at Vendodu and Naidupeta railway stations. Specifically, they sought halts for the Navajivan Express, Bhagat Ki Kothi, and Ernakulam Express at Naidupeta.

Furthermore, the delegation requested the restoration of several key train services, including the Krishna Express, Tirupati-Puri Express, and Tirumala Express, as well as the Tirupati-Gudur passenger trains.

The MPs urged Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav to examine these proposals favorably and take swift action to enhance connectivity and passenger amenities in the Tirupati region.

Journalists' Maha Dharna in Hyderabad Demands Basic Rights, Welfare Measures

Hyderabad : Protesting against what they termed as 12 years of continuous discrimination, journalists from small and medium newspapers in Telangana staged a massive dharna in Hyderabad on Tuesday, which turned out to be a grand success. The protest highlighted long-pending demands related to welfare, accreditation, advertisements, and basic facilities.

Addressing the gathering, Small Newspapers Association State General Secretary Dr Ashok expressed deep anguish over the government's continued neglect of journalists. He said while several other states provide adequate welfare measures for media personnel, journalists in Telangana were still deprived of even basic rights. **Discrimination in Advertisements, Bills and Facilities**

Dr Ashok alleged that small and medium newspapers have suffered injustice under two successive governments. "Publishers are forced to knock on the doors of political leaders throughout the year for government advertisements. Advertisement bills are not cleared on time, and only assurances are given. Looking down upon small newspapers is highly unfair," he said. **'Journalists Are Not Asking for Privileges, Only the Right to Survive'**

marked, "If journalists stop working even for a single day, the impact on governance would be clearly visible. Despite the sacrifices made by journalists during the Telangana movement, they have not received due recognition even today."

(TSAT) facility at Jagiroad, Assam — the nation's first indigenous semiconductor assembly and test unit designed to serve both domestic and global markets. The project marks a major milestone in India's pursuit of a self-reliant and robust semiconductor ecosystem, aligned with the vision of the India Semiconductor Mission.

On commissioning, it is expected to achieve a production capacity of up to 48 million semiconductor chips per day, significantly boosting India's advanced manufacturing capabilities. Mishra highlighted that the project is poised to generate over 27,000 direct and indirect employment opportunities, contributing substantially to the economic development of the region and positioning Assam as a key hub in India's emerging semiconductor landscape. The TSAT facility will focus on three core platform

technologies: Wire Bond, Flip Chip, and a differentiated packaging solution known as Integrated Systems Packaging (ISP). He further added that the roadmap includes future expansion into advanced semiconductor packaging technologies, essential for high-performance applications across automotive (especially electric vehicles), communications, and network infrastructure. Semiconductor assembly and test constitute a critical segment of the semiconductor value chain, where wafers fabricated at semiconductor fabs are assem-

bled, packaged, and rigorously tested before being integrated into end-use products. Innovations in packaging and testing are pivotal for enhancing chip performance, reducing form factor, and lowering costs. This project is being developed under the Government of India's comprehensive semiconductor policy, driven by the India Semiconductor Mission, in collaboration with the Government of Assam's Electronics Policy. Together, these initiatives aim to establish India as a globally competitive semiconductor manufacturing and R&D destination.

The Collector instructed officials to exercise utmost diligence while scrutinising nomination papers. "No nomination should be rejected without valid and lawful grounds. Only in cases where there is a clear and justifiable reason should rejection be considered," she cautioned.

She clarified that withdrawal of candidature must be accepted only when submitted



personally by the candidate or through an authorised representative with written approval. Withdrawals will be permitted only until 3 PM on the seventh day, and once withdrawn, the decision cannot be revoked, he added.

After the withdrawal deadline, officials must prepare the final list of contesting candidates strictly as per Form-9. The Collector reminded officers that names of candidates should be listed in Telugu alphabetical order, as mandated. He urged

them to carefully study and understand the guidelines provided in the Returning Officers' manual. Calling for absolute neutrality and openness in the election process, Vijeyendra Boi said all officials must work with commitment to uphold fairness.

Innovation and Efficiency Key to Strengthening India's Manufacturing Sector

The Union Minister of Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal highlighted the importance of innovation, quality, design, sustainability and efficiency as key drivers of India's manufacturing competitiveness while addressing the IndiaEdge event organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) in New Delhi today.

Goyal said that the Government, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, is working with a clear vision to support

the country's economic progress. He referred to recent growth trends across agriculture, services and manufacturing, and pointed out that India's manufacturing output has diversified into newer areas such as electronics, white goods, chemicals and petrochemicals.

The Minister highlighted the need for industry to remain competitive and responsive to global developments. He said that recent disruptions have underscored the importance of

resilient supply chains and cautioned against overdependence on specific geographies. He emphasised the need to identify areas where domestic capacity and greater control over supply chains are essential.

Goyal stated that industry collaboration is vital for expanding manufacturing output and noted that growth in manufacturing will further accelerate growth in services. He added that as India strengthens its presence in global markets, it must simul-

taneously remain open to competitive practices within the domestic economy.

The Minister observed that several States, including Uttar Pradesh and Odisha, have recorded rapid progress in recent years, resulting in increased local opportunities and reduced migration. He encouraged industry to provide suggestions on simplifying procedures, improving regulatory systems and strengthening the manufacturing environment. He noted ongoing Govern-

ment efforts to ease compliance, remove obsolete provisions and modernise legal frameworks, including the introduction of the four Labour Codes. He said that 23 States have framed corresponding rules and that the Codes will enhance formalisation, ensure minimum wages and strengthen social security and workplace safety.

would significantly ease cash flow constraints and support MSME productivity and growth.

"A fingertip question and the truth about preparing future administrators"

Located in the serene, disciplined, and cultured environment of Uttarakhand, Mussoorie's renowned administrative academy campus—the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration—is a focal point for the creation of the country's top civil servants. Even today, more than 600 officer trainees are preparing to shape the future of Indian administration. Recently, the valedictory ceremony of the 100th Foundation Course was held, a moment of pride for any institution. The presence of Defense Minister Rajnath Singh on this occasion further enhanced the grandeur of the event.

During the ceremony, the Defense Minister asked a simple mathematical question—"A man had some money. He gave half to A, a third to B, and the remaining 100 rupees to C. What was the total amount?"

This simple question,

often used in everyday life, proved unexpected for the trainees. Many trainee officers became confused, even though the solution was readily available. Later, Rajnath Singh himself explained it in a simple way. While this incident may seem trivial, it offers a very important insight into the true direction of administrative training and leadership skills.

The essence of administrative work is not merely knowledge of laws and regulations, but rather the ability to quickly understand, apply logic, and find practical solutions. Sometimes, in the most difficult situations, the simplest solution is the best—but this requires open-mindedness and practical thinking. This quality is what sets a capable administrator apart from the crowd.

This incident also serves as a reminder that civil service is not merely an exercise in academic intellect; it also de-

The goal of training is not just knowledge acquisition but also the development of practical intelligence. A simple question reminds trainees that real administration is what happens in fields, markets, police stations, panchayat buildings, and

offices—where simplicity is more useful than complexity.

The question asked by Rajnath Singh highlights two important aspects of administrative thinking—

First, the officer's attention should be directed to the root of the problem, not its superficial complexity.

Secondly, do not panic in any challenge, rather divide it and solve it in a simple way.

There are many occasions in the civil service when an officer must provide relief, direction, and security to the public

based on impromptu decisions. If an officer is adept at maintaining common sense even under momentary pressure, he or she can become a better administrator.

This context also raises the broader question: Has modern training become too technical, theoretical, or formal? Are we losing sight of the fundamentals of administration—simplicity, sensitivity, and common sense?

The history of the civil service shows that the country's best officers have been

those who possessed high intelligence, combined with simple thinking, public relations skills, and intuitive decision-making. Today, as the country faces new challenges—technology, complex administrative systems, a growing population, and rapid change—the role of an administrator has become even more expansive and multifaceted.

At such a time, it is essential that training not be limited to examinations and bookish knowledge, but also include practical mathematics, reasoning, common sense, psychological balance, and situational analysis.

This casual question posed by Rajnath Singh sends a message to the administrative machinery that the true test of leadership sometimes lies in small moments. The basis for major decisions lies in the officer who does not lose sight of basic understanding.

This incident also makes it clear that such unexpected questions arising during training sharpen the mind of the officer, provide him the ability to think under pressure and prepare him mentally for the real administrative world.

Over time, it has become essential that civil service training academies further enhance these types of interactions, question-based tests, and practical exercises. This will not only better prepare officers for public service but also develop their ability to resolve administrative complexities with ease.

In conclusion, this small incident in Mussoorie symbolizes that the power of leadership lies not only in grand speeches or lofty wisdom, but also in simple logic and fundamental understanding. This is a memorable message for the trainees shaping the future of the civil service—the greatness of administration lies in simplicity, not complexity.

Will BJP Realign With Its Deserted Partner -SAD In Punjab?

Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD), a long-time political partner, alienated from Bhartiya Janta Party (BJP) during 13-month long farmers' agitation in 2020-21. SAD MP and Food Processing Minister Harjinder Kaur Badal resigned from the Union Cabinet in protest of the anti-farmer acts. Her party was one of the ruling Bhartiya Janata Party's oldest allies, and Ms. Badal was its sole representative in the Modi government.

Tweeting from her verified account, Ms. Badal then said she had resigned from the Cabinet "in protest against anti-farmer ordinances and legislation. Proud to stand with farmers as their daughter and sister".

Led primarily by farmers from Punjab and Haryana, the protest began in November 2020 and is considered one of the largest challenges to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government. The key demands were the repeal of the three agricultural acts and the guarantee of a legal minimum support price (MSP) for crops. The government repealed the laws in November 2021, though the protest continued until December 2021 to secure other commitments.

Seeing the 2027 assembly elections at stone's throw, the Punjab political parties have started to gird up their loins for the forthcoming political battle. The present ruling party Aam Adami Party (AAP) is anxious about retaining the throne,

whereas the main opposition party congress is trying hard to regain its lost power. Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) is hoping to revive its roots in the rural constituencies and the BJP counts its base on urban and Hindu votes, but the ground reality smells that the urban party won't get even a penny of power, if it fights the election alone.

The Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP) has now come to this sobering realisation: establishing an independent foothold in Punjab capable of dislodging the Aam Adami Party (AAP) is no longer merely difficult—it is impossible. An equally grim concern looms larger: even if AAP were to be defeated, the principal beneficiary would be the Congress, leaving the BJP exactly where it started—marginalised and irrelevant.

Having exhausted every conceivable strategy to expand its influence, the BJP pinned its hopes on high-profile defections, enticing former Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh and ex-Congress state president Sunil Jakhar to serve as the nucleus of a self-sustaining organisation free from alliance crutches. The gamble failed spectacularly. These ageing, battle-worn veterans—long past their political prime—proved rootless and incapable of galvanising support.

Now, in a damning admission, Captain Amarinder himself has conceded the bitter truth: without a formidable local

ally, the BJP has no realistic prospect of ever winning the electoral contest in Punjab.

Will BJP make a re-alliance with its old partner- SAD?

Speaking with a media house, Captain clearly stated that the BJP would not be able to win the coming 2027 Assembly elections on its own and would need to resuscitate its partnership with the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) if it aimed to return to power.

Indian Express in its 1st December Print edition, quotes Captain that the party "doesn't understand the state" well enough to build a strong organisational base independently. Captain stated that only an alliance with the SAD could provide the necessary cadre and grassroots network, a process that he said would otherwise require "two to three elections" for the BJP to develop on its own.

"There is no other way to form the Government than by having an alliance with the Akali Dal," Captain said.

Punjab Congress president Amarinder Singh Raja Warring, on December 01, said that he agreed with the former Chief Minister Amarinder Singh that the BJP on its own did not have any future in Punjab. The PCC president remarked, "the BJP can never form a government in Punjab, with Akalis or without Akalis".

"It does not have any future at all, with or without allies as the party has completely alienated and antagonised Punjabis



with its anti-Punjab policies", he added.

Raja Warring said, both the parties have already been wiped and washed out from Punjab and they had no hope or scope of revival or redemption.

"But one thing I must appreciate and agree with Capt. Sahab is that he has become wiser in hindsight and has shown the mirror to his own party", he noted, while adding, "even if the Akalis and the BJP align together they will not make any difference as zero plus zero is always a zero".

The Aam Adami Party (AAP) has also reacted sharply on Captain's theory of BJP's alliance with SAD and launched a scathing attack on former Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh and the Badal family, holding them behind the two-decade-long conspiracy to plunder the state's resources.

Addressing a press conference at party's head office, on 1st December, Punjab Finance Minister and Senior AAP leader, Advocate Harpal Singh Cheema, said that the leaders

rejected by the people of Punjab, including two-time former Congress CM Captain Amarinder Singh, his relative Simranjeet Singh Mann, and former Deputy CM Sukhbir Singh Badal, are once again dreaming of returning to power. Cheema asserted that Punjab will no longer tolerate the politics of loot dominated by these two families.

Commenting over the statement of AAP leader Cheema, Former Chairman National Commission for Scheduled Castes and Former State President BJP Punjab, Vijay Sampla, while addressing a press conference, said – "BJP is fully prepared to contest all 117 assembly seats on its own. From the 2022 Assembly elections to the 2024 Lok Sabha polls, the BJP has contested elections solo in Punjab and will also be contesting the upcoming Zila Parishad and Panchayat Samiti elections and the 2027 elections on its own strength."

But doesn't the statement of Vijay Sampla undermine the theory of BJP's once strong hold leader Captain Amarinder Singh? Has Captain lost his weight up to such an extent in the party that his views and suggestions are turned down by even a second liner in the party? Doesn't Vijay Sampla know that giving tickets to party's candidates on all seats is not winning all the seats? Doesn't he remember the results of BJP in the 2022 assembly elections and 2024 Lok

Sabha elections?

How did BJP and SAD fare in 2022 assembly elections and 2024 Lok Sabha elections, when they fought separately?

In 2022 assembly elections for all the 113 seats AAP won 92 seats getting 42 % votes, Congress got 18 seats with 23% vote share, SAD got only 3 seats and a vote share of 18.38% and the BJP, despite a ruling party status in the centre, had to satisfy with only 2 seats and a 6.6% vote share. If BJP and SAD had aligned in this election, they jointly would have got many more seats as their joint vote share was 35% (18.38 + 6.60), 12% more than congress' share.

In the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the results of all the 13 seats in Punjab were also alarming for BJP and SAD, which they fought separately.

Congress got 7 seats out of 13 seats with a vote share of 26.39%, AAP, despite a ruling party in the state, could win 3 seats with vote share of 26%, Shiromani Akali Dal had to satisfy on only one seat getting 13.42% vote share and BJP lost the ground completely (won zero seat), even it got 18.56 vote share. The others got 2 seats. If we consider the total vote share of both SAD and BJP, the alliance got 32% (13.42 + 18.56), which is the highest. The joint fight of SAD and BJP could have changed the position.

So, the data of vote share in both the elections of 2022 and

2024 shows that if BJP and SAD had remained the partner, as earlier, they wouldn't have to see the shameful defeat and might have got the ruling command. Perhaps this analysis has forced Captain Amarinder Singh to think about the need for alliance between the two parties.

But here arises the question, whether the same data will repeat itself in 2027 assembly elections? Will BJP use SAD Manure to spread its roots in Punjab and succeed in getting the bumper crop?

What does the ground report say?

As the farmers of the Punjab still do not seem happy with the BJP due to not fulfilling their various demands of guaranteed MSP and others by the central government, so the farmers will vote for the alliance, which has BJP as the partner, does not reflect a positive note.

Angrej Singh Bhadour, a farmer leader from Punjab, interacting with this author, says, "My personal opinion is that if the Shiromani Akali Dal and the BJP come together, the general public will not vote for them and it is difficult for them to succeed. Let alone the farmer organizations, the general public will not accept this alliance.

But this will have one advantage. It will become clear to the people that all the looters, no matter which political party they belong to, are all one in looting the people."

Candidates should not be subjected to any pressure or inducement in withdrawing nominations : Collector Tejas Nand Lal Pawar

The details of the total budgetary allocation for railway projects in Telangana for the fiscal years 2023-24 and 2024-25

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad/New Delhi : Railway Infrastructure Projects falling fully/partly in the State of Telangana are covered under East Coast Railway (ECoR), South Central Railway (SCR) and South Western Railway (SWR) Zones of Indian Railways. Zonal Railway wise details of Railway projects including cost, expenditure and outlay are made available in public domain.

(31km) section out of 151 km is pending since January 2025 is targeted for commissioning in FY 2025-26. However, for Forest land diversion in 2.1 km near Siricilla, Rs 10.10 Cr was demanded in Jan-25 but money required has not yet been deposited by Telangana Govt. till date. Commissioning of Siddipet – Siricilla (31km) is held up due to this account.

04 projects in Telangana have been sanctioned on cost sharing basis at a cost of Rs 4,704 Cr Share of Telangana Government in these projects is Rs.2,181 Cr. Telangana had to deposit Rs 1,708 Cr to Ministry of Railways for these cost sharing projects. However they have deposited only Rs 894 Cr. Thus there is a shortfall of Rs 814 Cr which is adversely affecting progress of works.

Sanction of any railway project depends upon many parameters/factors which include the following:

- Anticipated traffic projections and remunerativeness of the proposed route
- First and last mile connectivity provided by the project
- Connection of missing links and providing additional route
- Augmentation of congested/saturated lines
- Demands raised by State Governments/Central Ministries/Public representatives,

- Railway's own operational requirements
- Socio-economic considerations
- Overall availability of funds
- Completion of Railway project/s depends on various factors which include the following:

- Land acquisition by State Government
- Forest clearance
- Shifting of infringing utilities
- Statutory clearances from various authorities
- Geological and topographical conditions of area
- Law and order situation in the area of project site
- Number of working months in a year for particular project site etc.

All these factors affect the completion time and cost of the project/s.

Station Re-development
 Ministry of Railways has launched Amrit Bharat Station Scheme for redevelopment of stations with a long-term approach.

The scheme involves preparation of master plans and their implementation in phases to improve the stations. The master planning includes:

- Improvement of access to station and circulating areas
- Integration of station with both sides of city
- Improvement of station building
- Improvement of waiting halls, toilets, sitting arrangement, water

- booths
- Provision of wider foot over bridge/air concourse commensurate with passenger traffic
- Provision of lift/escalators/ramp
- Improvement /Provision of platform surface and cover over platforms
- Provision of kiosks for local products through schemes like

'One Station One Product'

- Parking areas, Multimodal integration
- Amenities for Divyangjans
- Better passenger information systems
- Provision of executive lounges, nominated spaces for business meetings, landscaping, etc. keeping in view the necessity at each station.

The scheme also envisages sustainable and environment friendly solutions, provision of ballastless tracks etc. as per necessity, phasing and feasibility and creation of city centre at the station in the long term.

So far, 1337 stations, including 40 stations located in the state of Telangana have been identified for development under Amrit Bharat Station Scheme. The name of stations identified for development under Amrit Bharat Station Scheme in the state of Telangana are as following:

Development works at railway stations under Amrit Bharat Station Scheme in the state of Telangana have been

taken up at a good pace. Till now, phase-I works of 3 stations (Begumpet, Karimnagar and Warangal) in the state of Telangana have been completed under this scheme. The works at other stations have also been taken up at good pace and progress of some of the stations is as given below:

- Basar station: The works of improvement of platform surfacing and platform wall have been completed. The works of improvement of circulating area, platform shelter and waiting hall have been taken up.
- Khammam station: The works of platform shelter, general waiting hall, retiring room and improvement to AC lounge have been completed. The works of Foot Over Bridge, lifts, escalator, station building and circulating area have been taken up.
- Sri Bala Brahmewara Jogulamba station: The works of platform raising, platform extension, improvement of station building, circulating area, platform shelters and Divyangjan facilities have been completed. The finishing works have been taken up.
- Hafizpeta station: The works of station building, booking office, waiting hall, and toilet have been completed. The works of platform shelter, platform

surfacing, circulating area, signages, lift, escalator, 12 m Foot Over Bridge and Divyangjan facilities have been taken up.

- Kazipet Junction station: The works of platform shelters, improvement of existing general waiting hall, toilet, lift and escalator have been completed. The works of improvement of station building, AC waiting hall, circulating area, parking area and Foot OverBridge have been taken up.

Further development / redevelopment / upgradation / modernisation of stations on Indian Railways is a continuous and ongoing process and works in this regard are undertaken as per requirement, subject to inter-se priority and availability of funds.

The priority for development / redevelopment / upgradation / modernisation of stations is accorded to higher category of station over lower category of station while sanctioning and executing the works.

Development / Upgradation of railway stations is complex in nature involving safety of passengers & trains and requires various statutory clearances such as fire clearance, heritage, tree cutting, air-port clearance etc. The progress also gets affected due to brownfield related challenges such as shifting of utilities (involving water/sewage lines, optical fibre cables, gas pipe

lines, power/signal cables, etc.), infringements, operation of trains without hindering passenger movement, speed restrictions due to works carried out in close proximity of tracks and high voltage power lines, etc. and these factors affect the completion time. Therefore, no time frame can be indicated at this stage.

Development / upgradation / modernisation of stations including under Amrit Bharat Station Scheme is generally funded under Plan Head-53 'Customer Amenities'. The details of allocation and expenditure under Plan Head-53 are maintained Zonal Railwaywise and not work-wise, or station-wise or state-wise. The state of Telangana is covered under the jurisdiction of South Central Railway and for this zone, an allocation of ₹ 863crore has been made for the financial year 2025-26, out of which an expenditure (up to October, 2025) of ₹ 664.27 crore has been incurred so far.

Manufacturing unit at Kazipet

Indian Railways has planned to develop a Railway Manufacturing Unit at Kazipet, Telangana at a cost of Rs.521.36 crore which will be capable of manufacturing and maintaining a variety of modern Rolling Stocks. Significant progress has been made, with the civil and electrical infrastructure nearing completion and the majority of the machinery and plants delivered.

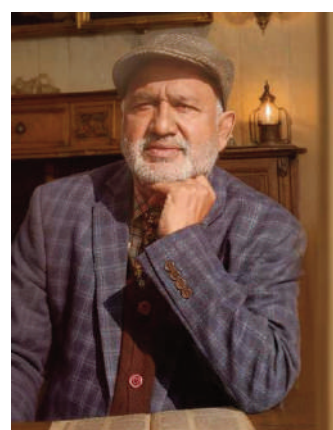

According to the Red List of International Nature Conservation Association, many wildlife species in India are listed in 'seriously threatened' category. According to some estimates, 133 species of wild animals, reptiles and birds in India are on the verge of extinction. Special threat to amphibians: Amphibians, which live on both water and soil, are extremely sensitive to environmental changes and therefore considered "bio-indicators". According to a report, 136 of the 426 amphibious species found

in India are on the verge of extinction, which is particularly worrying in areas such as Western Ghats. New ray of hope: 13 new amphibian species discovered Among these concerns, the recent discovery of thirteen new species of amphibians in India's western ghats and northeast region has brought a pleasant hope. This discovery is not just a scientific achievement, but proof that there is still diversity hidden in the womb of nature, which needs to be understood and preserved. The identification of new species suggests that many mysteries are still undiscovered in our forests and if conservation is done correctly, biodiversity can be saved. This discovery is the result

of hard work of India's scientific teams, modern DNA techniques, and continuous regional surveys. It also sends a message that if research is promoted and wilderness areas are pre-

served, concrete steps can be taken towards saving the species at risk.

But this news of relief also increases our responsibility. The discovery of new species is not only a matter of enthusiasm, but also a warning that current conservation policies and efforts must be further strengthened. If forests are protected, pollution is controlled and local communities are connected to conservation schemes then India's biodiversity can be saved. In this dark period, a news from Northeast India has awakened hope towards biodiversity. Researchers from the Indian Wildlife Institute have recently discovered 13 new species of amphibians. Location of search: These species

are mainly found in the states of Northeast India such as Arunachal Pradesh (6 species), Meghalaya (3 species), Assam, Mizoram, Nagaland and Manipur. Importance: All these new species belong to the genus 'Ravorchestas', which are called bush frogs. This latest discovery has increased the number of known bush frog species in India from 82 to 95. Biodiversity Hotspot: This discovery exposes the hidden biodiversity of Northeast India, which is part of the global biodiversity hotspot. Discoveries like this suggest that nature has not yet fully opened up its treasures, and the existence of many more unknown species could be revealed if conservation efforts

are made. Conclusion: Resolution of conservation The crisis of endangered species is an alarm that prompts us to protect our natural habitats

There is a need to take strict steps. However, the discovery of 13 new species also makes it clear that we still have an opportunity to save and document unknown biodiversity. This finding emphasizes that conservation efforts should not be limited to saving endangered species, but also focus on protecting areas that still harbor nature's secrets. India will have to work at war level to strengthen its wildlife conservation policies, protect habitats and mitigate the effects of climate change so that hope can win in this dual story of crisis and hope.

The Daughter will not get Freedom to Decide her Life, till then all the Slogans of Women's Empowerment will Remain Incomplete

Steps are being taken towards women empowerment through campaigns like 'Betty Bachao Beti Padhao', on the other hand some practices and narrow mentality still exist in society today, which deprive girls from becoming educated and self-sufficient. Recently, a girl's touching story came out in Bharatpur district of Rajasthan. That Every morning she would go to the door of school and from there to Lat and returned from there. A mother says that Girls that girls When asked the reason, he told that it is not for mother. It is decided by generations in his house Do not read, rather no, but help run the house. From the outside, it seems to help dance-singing, but in fact it is a 'baby practice' prevalent in a particular social class. It is a social system where the lives of daughters are crushed under the burden of family tradition. Another girl from Jhalawar district also faced a similar situation. She was thirteen years old when she started being sent to dance-singing programs under the pretext of teaching art.

Slowly he realized that this is not an art, but a chain of compulsion. In 2018, with the help of a non-governmental organization, he was enrolled in a residential school. In fact, the class in which this practice is prevalent is believed to be

basically nomadic or semi-nomadic. There was a presence in states like Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Jharkhand Is. Its central India Is. of the Bedia community. History has been associated with folk dance and singing. In the community used to dance and sing in fairs, royal bars and social events, but the social structure started changing and economic opportunities were limited, then this profession became a medium of poverty. Illiteracy and social contempt brought this community to such a position that the black shadow of exploitation and body trade fell on their dance-singing profession. Now it has been established as a generation -to-generation tradition, where daughters are exploited to bear the economic responsibility of their families.

Represents a social system where women and daughters are deprived of their rights and dignity in the name of tradition, poverty and compulsion. There is a perverse tendency in this practice, where many families start seeing their daughters as an economic means and later they were pushed into the body trade. Is. Thus, the education, health, dignity and equal opportunities of daughters are all left behind. A direct social effect of this practice is that women from the Bedia community are neither fully



accepted in society nor do they get permanent livelihood opportunities. Because of this, it is still alive in a very terrible way. Girls from the Bedia community are usually deprived of education and are plunged into this practice at a young age. This is a serious violation of social and human rights. According to a United Nations report, the most victimized class in cases of women trafficking and sexual abuse in India are those who traditionally come from such communities. This situation challenges the efforts towards gender equality and women empowerment in India. Gives. If we talk about Rajasthan, then the situation of Bedia community is a wicket. Bharatpur, Dholpur, Kota, Bundi, Jhalawar and Sawai Madhopur In the districts, families of this community are found in large numbers.

According to a study, out of

about 70 Bedia families in a village in Bharatpur district, 58 families have thrown their daughters into the practice. Similarly, 27 cases were registered in Nagla village of Panchi between the year 2004 and 2012,

where girls were traditionally pushed into this. A report by the Rajasthan Women's Commission and Rural Education Institute found that the female rate in Bedia community is only twenty-one percent and most girls leave school at 14-16 years. At the same time, according to the 2023 report of National Record Bureau (NCRB), a total of 363 human trafficking cases were found in Rajasthan, out of which 198 percent were children. A large number of those equal crime Literacy rate The number comes from communities where practices like the Bedia community are socially present. Similarly national Woman of the Commission The year 2024 shows that about 8,000 in Rajasthan 10,000 girls are directly or indirectly associated with such a profession. Most of these are from Dalit or roaming tribal community, including Bedia. In Kota and Bundi of Ra-

asthan, Morena and Shyampur of Madhya Pradesh and Jhansi districts of Uttar Pradesh, this practice is very low than the national average. Tribal Farmers Accuse Revenue Officials of Forcibly Destroying Paddy Crop in Medaram

Medaram) Mulugu, December 03 : A tribal family from Medaram village in SS Tadvai mandal has lodged a serious complaint alleging that revenue officials forcibly harvested their immature paddy crop without issuing any notice or following legal procedures. The complaint, submitted to the District Collector's office on Tuesday, seeks strict departmental and legal action against the officials involved.

According to the petition, Smt. Sidda Boyina Lakshmi (57) and her son Anand Rao (32), belonging to the ST Koya community, stated that they have been cultivating their patta land in Survey No. 190, measuring 1.37 acres (1 acre 37 guntas). The paddy crop on this land was reportedly still at an early stage and required 10-15 more days to reach harvest readiness.

The family alleged that on December 2 at around 9:30 AM, SS Tadvai Tahsildar Suresh Babu and RDO N. Venkatesh, accompanied by staff, entered their field and claimed they were acting under the instructions of the District Collector. The

complainants stated that the officials intimidated them, issued threats, and did not allow them to resist.

The petition says that without providing any prior notice, notification, or intimation required under land-related laws, the officials allegedly deployed harvesters and tractors to cut down the standing crop. This resulted in a financial loss amounting to lakhs of rupees, according to the family. The complainants further alleged that when they tried to stop the officials, they were subjected to threats and verbal abuse. They have demanded that authorities initiate action against the officials for what they describe as an unlawful and forceful act. The family submitted pattadar passbook/Dharani/Webland copies, along with video and photo evidence of the crop destruction. Witness details were also attached. The complaint bears the official Inward Stamp of the Mulugu District Collector's Office dated 03 December 2025. The petitioners urged the administration to ensure that an FIR is registered immediately and justice is rendered without delay.

HMDA nets Rs 3,708 crore revenue from Neopolis auctions

The revised average pricing for the Neopolis auctions now stands at Rs 137.36 crore per acre, representing an increase of approximately 87 per cent over the previous Neopolis auction cycle in 2023.

The Indian Rupee's international position has always been deeply influenced by India's economic structure, growth rate, export-import balance, and global economic events

The INR's role in the dollar-dependent global trading system is growing, but it has not yet become strong enough to be included among the primary currencies in world trade : Advocate Kishan Sanmukhdas Bhawnani

Gondia : Globally, there are more than 195 countries, and each country uses its own currency. The most popular currencies in the world are the dollar, euro, pound, dinar, riyal, yen, etc. When traveling from one country to another, currency exchange is required to conduct transactions within that country. The government issues currency; it is also called legal tender. The value of currency is not stable and changes daily. The value of currencies varies across countries. Over the past week, the exchange rate between the US dollar and the Indian rupee fluctuated between a high of 89.755 on December 2, 2025, and a low of 89.0625 on November 25, 2025. The largest 24-hour price change occurred on December 1, 2025, with a 0.235 percent increase. The international position of the Indian rupee (INR) has always been deeply influenced by India's economic structure, growth rate,



export-import balance, and global economic events. In the current global economic environment, where economies like the US and Europe are continuously tightening their monetary policies, the currencies of emerging countries like India are directly affected by dollar fluctuations. In this situation, the Indian rupee stands at a transitional stage. On the one hand, it is the currency of the world's fifth largest economy, while on the other hand, its international acceptance and valuation remain limited. The role of the INR is growing in the dollar-dependent global trading system, but it is still not strong enough to be included among the primary currencies of world trade. I, Advocate Kishan San-

mukhdas Bhawnani, Gondia, Maharashtra, believe that the Indian rupee is currently viewed internationally as a currency that is both stable and challenging. Stable because India's financial system is strong, foreign exchange reserves are among the world's top, and economic growth rates are among the fastest in the world. But challenging because the rupee's exchange rate is still highly dependent on external factors, especially the US dollar. A strengthening dollar automatically puts pressure on currencies like India, and this pressure is further exacerbated by increasing foreign investment outflows, volatile global markets, and fluctuations in oil prices. Therefore, the international strength of the Indian rupee is often determined by global conditions, not solely by India's domestic economic strength.

Friends, if we now compare the Indian rupee with international currencies, especially major currencies of developed and developing countries, the current situation emerges as follows: the INR is weak against most international currencies. A value of around 89-90 rupees against the US dollar indi-

nomally, but its real competitiveness is not as bad as the USD/INR rate suggests. One reason for this is that India's export base is expanding, the service sector is globally prominent, and the stability of the domestic market somewhat offsets external pressures.

Kaziranga's Wild Majesty Stuns Telangana Media Delegation

PIB Team Takes Part in Special Jeep Safari, Forest Dept Briefs on Rhino Protection Efforts

(PIB Hyderabad delegation) Kaziranga National Park, Assam : As part of the Telangana Media Delegation's tour to Assam organised by the Press Information Bureau (PIB), journalists were today taken on an exclusive jeep safari deep inside the Kaziranga National Park, offering a first-hand experience of Assam's rich wildlife heritage.

During the post-tour media interaction, Arun Vignesh, IFS, Deputy Director, Forest Department, delivered a detailed briefing on conservation measures and the park's ecological significance.

He revealed that Kaziranga is home to 2,613 one-horned rhinoceroses, as per the 2022 Census, reaffirm-



ing its global status as the world's largest habitat for the species. "The life span of rhinos in captivity goes up to 30 years," he noted. Kaziranga attracts nearly 10 lakh tourists every year, making it one of India's most visited wildlife destinations. The park also boasts: 4 species of deer, including swamp deer, hog deer and sambar 42 species of reptiles, such as pythons, cobras

and tortoises A vast range of migratory and endemic birds that make Kaziranga a biodiversity hotspot

To curb poaching and strengthen conservation, the park operates 250 anti-poaching camps manned by nearly 1,500 staff. Additionally, two specialised forces the Special Rhino Protection Force and the Assam Forest Protection Force work round the clock to secure the

park's wildlife.

The PIB-led Telangana delegation, comprising journalists from leading print and electronic media, commended the Assam government for the robust protection mechanisms and scientific conservation practices in place. PIB officials highlighted that the visit was aimed at helping media from Telangana understand Assam's environmental management, eco-tourism initiatives and successful wildlife protection models.

The day-long safari offered panoramic views of Kaziranga's famed grasslands, rhino herds, elephants, wild buffalos and deer species giving the delegation a rare glimpse into the heart of Assam's natural treasure.
