Telangana Sets Sights on Leadership in Oil Palm Cultivation



Water Security Boost to Khammam - Manchukonda Lift Irrigation Scheme & 33/11 KV Sub-Station Dedicated to Farmers

(Capital Information)
Khammam Bureau : Reaffirming the state government's commitment to farmers and regional development, Agriculture, Marketing, Cooperation, Handlooms & Textiles Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao said Telangana aims to emerge as a national leader in oil palm cultivation within three years, while ensuring assured irrigation and infrastructure across rural areas.

The Minister inaugurated the 33/11 KV power sub-station and the Manchukonda Lift Irrigation Scheme at V.

Venkatayapalem village, Raghunathapalem Mandal, and dedicated the projects to the public. The facilities are expected to significantly strengthen irrigation reliability and power supply for agriculture in the region.

Addressing a public meeting after offering floral tributes to Krishna waters at the project's delivery system, the Minister recalled that a promise made during the foundation-laying ceremony last year—to release irrigation water within one year—has been fulfilled. He noted that the mandal, home to a

large number of tribal families and small & marginal farmers, has finally received long-pending irrigation through a lift installed on the Nagarjuna Sagar Left Canal.

Stating that the Manchukonda lift is the final lift on the NSP system, the Minister said the arrangement is a temporary but critical solution until the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Project brings abundant Godavari waters. He added that completion of the Buggavagu Project will enable gravity-based filling of tanks, while next year the tanks presently filled with Krishna waters will

be replenished with Godavari waters. Highlighting parallel development, the Minister said investments in education and healthcare—including Swaminarayan educational institutions, a Young India Integrated Gurukul, and a medical college—are underway in the mandal. He assured farmers that there is no shortage of urea, that paddy procurement, power supply, and irrigation are running smoothly, and urged farmers to adopt profitable oil palm cultivation, noting that the huge expenditure on edible oil imports should instead benefit Indian farmers.

Telangana forms SIT to probe morphed CM images, IAS defamation cases

Hyderabad : The State government on Tuesday constituted a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe two 'sensitive' cases registered at Maddur police station of Narayanpet district and the Central Crime Station (CCS) Hyderabad.

The first case pertains to the circulation of morphed and derogatory images of Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy. A Congress leader, Golla Narasimha, had made

a complaint at Maddur police station, following which a case was registered by the police on January 11 against some persons.

The other case is related to circulation of defamatory content allegedly targeting a woman IAS officer. The CCS had registered a case after IAS officers

made a complaint against two Telugu news channels and seven YouTube channels under sections 75, 78, 79, 351(1), and 351(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS).

The SIT is formed under the supervision of Hyderabad Police Commissioner VC Sajjanar, following orders issued by Telangana Director-General of Police B Shivadhar Reddy.

The eight-member team will investigate cases registered at CCS, Hyderabad, and Maddur in Narayanpet district. The members of the SIT include N Swetha (Joint CP North Range), Yogesh Gautham (DCP Chevella), K Venkata Lakshmi (DCP Admin Hyderabad City), V Aravinda Babu (DCP Cyber-crimes), B Pratap Kumar (Addl SP Vigilance & Enforcement), G Guru Raghavendra (ACP CCS Hyderabad), C Shankar Reddy (Inspector CI Cell) and P Harish (SI SHE Cyber Cell).



Relentless Chalan Drive Sparks Public Anger Across City Roads

Hyderabad : The unchecked enforcement of traffic challans has triggered widespread resentment among commuters, with citizens alleging that revenue collection has overtaken regulation as the primary objective of traffic authorities.

Across the city, enforcement teams are seen constantly moving on two-wheelers, clicking photographs from all angles and issuing challans indiscriminately. Commuters complain that there is hardly any clarity on where to stop, park, or even slow down, as "no-parking" zones appear to be everywhere, with little or no provision for sufficient parking spaces.

Adding to the chaos, cranes have become a common sight on major roads, allegedly operating round-the-clock to tow vehicles. Many motorists say vehicles are lifted within minutes of being parked, leaving owners scrambling to locate towing yards and pay hefty fines.

"There seems to be a single duty, single target, and a single agenda challans, fines, and revenue," said an aggrieved commuter. "People are living in constant fear. Even stopping briefly feels risky."

Citizens allege that thousands of vehicle photographs are taken daily, turning roads into what they describe as a "24/7 photo-shooting zone." Instead of easing traffic flow or improving road safety, the drive is being perceived as a "hunt" for violations, they claim.

Public voices are growing louder, demanding a balanced approach that prioritises traffic management, clear signage, and adequate parking infrastructure over aggressive enforcement. Many have urged authorities to introspect, warning that continued excesses could erode public trust and cooperation in traffic regulation.

As frustration mounts, the question remains whether the administration will recalibrate its strategy from revenue-driven enforcement to citizen-centric traffic governance.

KTR slams Congress government's selective action on channels, digital media

Hyderabad : Lashing out at the Congress government for constituting a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe and initiate action against a few channels and digital media, BRS working president KT Rama Rao said this was yet another diversionary tactic to divert people's attention from the failures of the government.

He came down heavily on the Revanth Reddy government for sparing the news channel, which had broadcast a news story on a Minister's misconduct and affairs. It was strange that the Congress government had not taken any action against the news channel. But, it constituted a SIT to initiate action against other channels and digital media for quoting and referring to the same news report broadcast on the channel, which favours the ruling party, he said.

"Why is this drama being enacted by the Congress government? Who are being spared and who are being targeted?" Rama Rao asked, also warning that the people were observing the government's misdeeds and would teach a fitting lesson to the ruling party.

Strangely, despite many complaints and allegations over the irregularities in the Congress government, no SIT was constituted. If the Congress government was really committed, an SIT should be constituted and a



probe should be conducted, he demanded. "A Minister's Personal Assistant along with a close aide of Revanth Reddy threatened an industrialist at gunpoint and demanded Rs 300 crore. Yet, no SIT is constituted to investigate the case," Rama Rao pointed out.

Similarly, in Mulugu district, another Minister's PA was making crores in sand scams, but no case or action was being taken against such offenders. The Revenue Minister's son along with 70 goons was involved in land grabbing on Hyderabad's outskirts. No SIT or no action was taken and ironically, the police officer, who registered the case was transferred, Rama Rao said.

Listing out the irregularities in the Congress government, the BRS working president charged that AICC Secretary and Revanth Reddy's close friend Sampath Kumar threatened a contractor with dire consequences and de-

manded Rs 8 crore, but no action was taken.

Why was no SIT constituted to probe into the Rs 100 crore scam in procurement of bunker beds in Kasturba Gandhi schools? Why was no probe conducted into the liquor bottle hologram tender scam in which an IAS officer was blamed and made a scapegoat, he asked.

"The Supreme Court's Committee observed that there was a major fraud in the sale of 400 acres of university land. Why was an SIT not constituted in this scam?" Rama Rao asked.

The SITs and Commissions were being formed to waste time in the guise of inquiry. The SITs were being set up only to harass and suppress the media and digital media voice and to cover up the internal squabbling in the party, besides corruption and irregularities in the government, he added.



Auto debit of traffic challans is unconstitutional, assault on fundamental rights: BRS MLC Sravan

 "Governments are meant to protect citizens' wealth and not target their bank accounts as revenue sources," Sravan said. A traffic challan was not a conviction; it was merely a Notice of Allegation. Every citizen has the legal right to offer an explanation, file an appeal, or approach a court of law. The auto-debit mechanism strips citizens of these rights and effectively imposes a punishment without trial, he stressed. Furthermore, RBI regulations and banking laws categorically prohibit debiting a bank account without the account holder's explicit consent or a judicial directive. Banking is a subject under the Union List, and a state government has no legal authority to unilaterally impose such a system, the BRS MLC added. "On behalf of Telangana people, we strongly demand that this auto-debit proposal be withdrawn immediately," Sravan said.

Newborn Baby Girl Sold for ₹3 Lakhs

Anganwadi Teacher Exposes the Incident - Case Registered by Shadnagar Town CI Vijay Kumar

Shadnagar : In a shocking incident, parents sold their newborn baby girl simply because their third child was also a girl. A buyer allegedly paid ₹3 lakhs to purchase the infant. The incident came to light through an Anganwadi teacher, following which the police intervened and handed over the baby girl to ICDS officials. According to details, Renuka and Vinod, a couple from Lal Singh Thanda village in Ferozganagar Mandal, were blessed with a baby girl on November 9 at a government maternity hospital in Hyderabad. The couple already has two daughters. Expecting a male child for the third time, they were deeply disappointed when another girl child was born. As a result, they de-

cid to get rid of the baby girl at any cost. They allegedly put a price on the infant. Govindu, a resident of Vemula Narva village in Kothur Mandal, reportedly came forward to buy the baby. It is learned that the baby girl was sold for ₹3 lakhs. However, during a routine visit to monitor children's health, Anganwadi teacher Chintu sensed something suspicious and informed the ICDS authorities. Acting promptly, ICDS officials contacted the police. On Tuesday, ICDS officer Udaya, along with Anganwadi staff and Supervisor Vijayalakshmi, reached the police station and presented the facts. Shadnagar Town CI Vijay Kumar personally conducted the inquiry and confirmed that the baby had indeed been sold. Govindu was taken into custody, the baby girl was rescued, and she was handed over to ICDS officials. The officials later shifted the infant to a Shishu Vihar (child care home). CI Vijay Kumar stated that the case is still under investigation and that complete details will be revealed soon. Who Are the Accused and Who Are the Masterminds? The sale of the newborn has created a sensation across the Shadnagar Assembly constituency. Police have stated that they are investigating who was directly involved and who orchestrated the crime behind the scenes. It is noteworthy that about three decades ago, baby-selling rackets under the name "Children for Social Development" had

caused statewide outrage in the then undivided Andhra Pradesh. With this incident resurfacing in the same region, it has once again stirred pain and concern among tribal communities. Police are probing questions such as: Who is behind the sale of infants? Since when has this racket been operating? How many children have been sold from this area so far? These facts are yet to be uncovered. The identities of both the sellers and buyers have currently been kept confidential by the police. Their details are expected to be disclosed to the media soon. If the truth behind this organized racket of infant trafficking is exposed, many more shocking revelations are likely to come to light.

The Lost Art of Clinical Thinking: Rediscovering the Biology Behind the Guidelines

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad : Modern medicine stands at a paradoxical crossroads. Never before has clinical science been so data-driven, protocolized, and guideline oriented, yet never has the art of true medical thinking been more endangered. Amid the convenience of readymade pathways and evidence hierarchies, a subtle erosion of analytical reasoning and biological insight has taken hold, reshaping how physicians interpret disease and decide treatment.

A generation ago, clinical mastery meant understanding the natural history of disease the cellular and physiological underpinnings that connected symptoms, signs, and progression. Physicians cultivated diagnostic intuition through pattern recognition grounded in biology. Guidelines were aids, not commands.

Today, that balance has reversed. The algorithm dictates decisions. Doctors often practice medicine by checklist, less from the bedside and more from the flowcharts of consensus

documents. The reasoning once based on understanding mechanisms of action, molecular behavior, or host tumor interactions has been replaced with adherence to recommendations labeled "Category 1 evidence," often drawn from studies funded by the same industry that benefits from their adoption.

The Pharmaceutical Influence on Evidence

Pharmaceutical innovation has undeniably advanced outcomes in oncology, cardiology, and infectious disease. But the evidence pipelines feeding guideline panels are seldom immune from bias. Industry sponsorship skews study design, endpoint selection, and comparator arms. Small absolute benefits get inflated into new standards of care, guided by statistical rather than biological significance. The clinician's interpretative sovereignty the ability to question whether an intervention truly serves the patient's biology is quietly undermined.

Even post marketing surveillance seldom revisits these assumptions. The

pressure to align with "best practice" is reinforced by institutional audits, medico legal risk aversion, and a compliance-driven health-care model. Few pause to ask a fundamental question: does this drug, this regimen, or this schedule make biological sense for this particular patient?

The Death of "Why" in Medicine

Guideline-driven medicine often rewards "what" and "when," but neglects "why." Residents memorize protocols before they learn physiology. Multidisciplinary boards debate sequencing rather than tumor kinetics.

The course of a disease becomes a box-ticking exercise. As AI-driven decision tools enter practice, this detachment risks becoming complete: physicians might soon treat outputs rather than patients.

Yet every clinical anomaly an unexpected remission, an outlier toxicity, a paradoxical response points to what algorithms overlook: the chaotic individuality of biology. The interplay between host factors, microenvironment, and molecular heterogeneity cannot be standardized. The art of analysis, of revisiting reports and correlating radiology with pathology, of reading between patterns, remains the only way to translate population data into personal medicine.

Reclaiming the Analytical Mind

Reviving the clinician-thinker means re-centering biology at the core of practice. That requires an educational shift: cultivating curiosity about mechanisms, not just memorization of management. It means critical appraisal of evidence, awareness of financial con-

flicts, and the courage to deviate from the norm when the biology demands it.

Academic institutions and guideline bodies could encourage "biological reasoning statements" alongside evidence grades, integrating pathophysiology into recommendations. Case-based conferences should highlight exceptions, not just adherence. Most importantly, physicians must see guidelines not as laws, but as scaffolds useful for structure, but never a substitute for thought.

The Way Forward

Medicine is both science and art; the precision of data must coexist with the intuition of understanding. Guidelines are essential, but they cannot be the spine of clinical reasoning. The spirit of inquiry that once defined medicine must be rekindled, reminding every clinician that beneath the protocols lies a patient whose illness follows biology, not bureaucracy.

In reclaiming the lost art of analysis, physicians can restore balance: the humility to respect evidence, and the wisdom to question it.

There is a belief among the doctors and psychologists that such group and fun activities can aid in alleviating stress.

With time, Chinese manjha and nylon string have caused a number of severe accidents. This has not only been deadly to the human race, but birds and other animals have also perished. Road crashes, throat cuts, and deaths of birds all of it is evidence of the deformed character of this tradition.

This has been done through regulations set by the government and administration which are not sufficient. It is imperative to ensure that people are aware of it and develop a feeling of accountability. Kites can be made safe with the help of cotton string, safe and open areas, child supervision, and time attention all these measures can ensure the safety of kite flying. The most important thing is that the happiness of the festival does not turn into the reason of suffering to anyone.

Kite flying also requires to be re-evaluated with the environmental eye. Kite wastes also get into trees, power lines and roads posing environmental challenges. The plastic and nylon kites cannot break down in the long term and they are hazardous to the wildlife. The use of eco-friendly kites and natural dyes, therefore, is what is required at the moment.

These positive efforts are being made by most social organizations and volunteer groups. They are motivating children and young people towards safe and environmental sensitive kite flying. Sensitization is being spread in schools and social forums so that there is a balance between tradition and nature.

The kite flying is also changing with the changing times. It is no longer restricted to rooftops. Digital and social media has provided it with international outreach. The videos and photos of kites festivals are going around the globe. The way, Indian communities residing overseas re-

main in touch with their native culture by also holding kite festivals on Makar Sankranti.

This transformation shows that not all traditions remain the same but they change with the times. One such change is kite flying, where modernity, tradition, entertainment, and health fly. This festival makes us understand that there is no opposition between joy and responsibility but they complement each other.

Finally, Makar Sankranti and kite flying which comes along with it is not merely a festival, but also a celebration of life. It is a lesson to us of the meaning of collectivity, balance and joy. Tradition when taken in the right way and with responsibility is not only a reminder of the past but also a source of inspiration to the present and the future. The kites flying in the sky bring the idea that there are always limits only on the ground and the sky is open to dreams, all you need to do is to know how to hold the string and to know how to keep balance.

activities.

CSPOC brings together Speakers and Presiding Officers of 53 national parliaments (list enclosed) of sovereign states of the Commonwealth.

CSPOC is an independent group with no formal affiliation with the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA), the Commonwealth Secretariat or the Commonwealth Heads of

Government (CHOGM). However, its membership is the same as that of CPA.

The stated aims of this Conference are to:

Maintain, foster, and encourage impartiality and fairness on the part of Speakers and Presiding Officers of Parliaments. Promote knowledge and understanding of parliamentary democracy in its various forms; and Develop parliamentary institutions.

CSPOC operates on a two-year cycle, holding a conference of the full membership every two years, usually early in January, and a meeting of the Standing Committee at the same time the intervening year.

The public should be provided with even better medical services through the Nalgonda Government General Hospital : Collector B. Chandrasekhar

Nalgonda : District Collector B. Chandrasekhar said that the public should be provided with even better medical services through the Nalgonda Government General Hospital. He said that the hospital premises, both inside and outside, should always be kept clean, and that doctors and staff should adhere to punctuality.

On Tuesday, he inspected the Nalgonda Government General Hospital. He inspected the OP (Outpatient), scanning, and attendance registers of doctors and staff at the Mother and Child Care Center. He spoke directly with patients who had come to the hospital for various treatments. He inspected the scanning center and inquired about the number of people receiving scans daily, and asked for details of inpatients and outpatients.

Later, he inspected the disability certificate issuance center and the waiting room for patients' attendants. He

instructed the sanitation in-charge to ensure that the waiting hall is cleaned regularly, the toilets are cleaned daily, and a sign board is installed for the waiting hall. He spoke with Saidamma from Narketpally and Nagaraju from Thummadam village, who had come to the UDID center for certificates, and inquired about when they had come and on which day they were given a slot, and asked about the certificate issuance process at the UDID center.

When the UDID in-charge informed him that although scans had been conducted for 823 people, tests were still being conducted and certificates were yet to be issued, he instructed them to ensure that there are no pending cases, to expedite the work, and to reduce the pendency.

DRDO's Shekhar Reddy explained to the District Collector about the issuance of certificates for persons with disabilities. The Collector inspected the toilets and in-



structed the management to make them available to patients at all times and to clean them twice a day.

Later, the Collector visited the critical care unit and inspected the skin, outpatient, and physiotherapy departments. He also spoke to Nagayya from Kalvapalli near Huzurnagar, who had come

for physiotherapy. When Nagayya said that he had come to the hospital because of high blood pressure and symptoms of paralysis, the Collector advised him to monitor his blood pressure regularly, take precautionary measures to prevent conditions like paralysis, quit drinking alcohol, and eat nutritious

food. Subsequently, the District Collector inspected the hospital canteen and examined the attendance register of the employees and staff, as well as the attendance of the outsourcing staff. He inquired about the food being provided to patients and doctors through the canteen.
