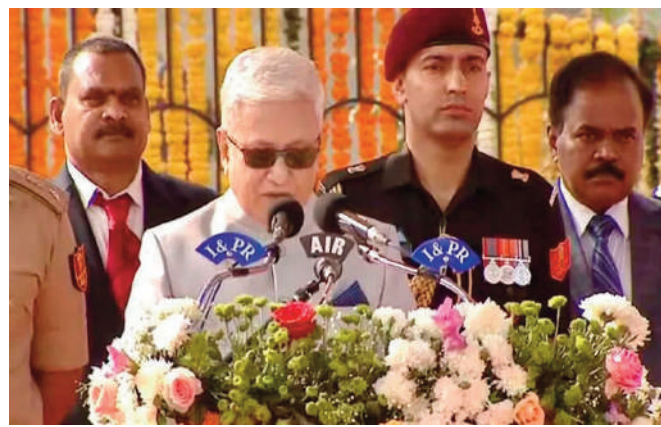

## Telangana targets three trillion dollar economy by 2047: Governor

**(Capital Information)**  
**Hyderabad** : Governor Jishnu Dev Varma on Monday said Telangana has set an ambitious goal of becoming a three trillion dollar economy by 2047.

Addressing the Republic Day celebrations at the Parade Grounds here, he said the Telangana Rising - Vision 2047 document, unveiled during the Global Summit last month, laid out a roadmap to achieve the long-term economic target.

Referring to key urban and environmental initiatives, the Governor said the Musi Riverfront Development Corporation Limited has prepared a Master Plan for a 55 km stretch of the Musi river from Osman Sagar



to Gowrelli (ORR East) and from Himayath Sagar up to Gandhi Sarovar at Babu Ghat. "The Aggregate Master Plan, which is under develop-

ment, includes Blue, Green, Land Use, Infrastructure and Financial Master Plans along with a revenue generation model, aimed at sustainable river restoration and urban renewal," he said.

He also said the Hyderabad Industrial Land Transformation policy was introduced to relocate polluting industries outside the ORR, while allowing industrial unit owners to convert their lands for multi-use purposes.

With an emphasis on planned urban growth, the Government expanded the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation by merging 27 municipalities within the CURE area, increasing its jurisdiction from 650 square kilometres to 2,053 square kilometres. The GHMC has since been reorganised into 300 wards, 60 circles and 12 zones, he added.



## KTR targets Congress for abandoning election manifesto

**Hyderabad** : BRS working president KT Rama Rao targeted the Congress government for abandoning its election manifesto and deceiving every section of society within two years of coming to power. He said the Congress came to power by making atrocious promises only to sideline public welfare and governance.

He was addressing the party leaders after BJP leader and former Chevella MPP Vijay Bhaskar Reddy joined the BRS along with his followers at Telangana Bhavan on Monday. Former Minister P Sabitha Indra Reddy led the induction programme, with Rama Rao welcoming the new entrants by draping them with the party scarf.

Speaking on the occasion, Rama Rao said farmers, women, students, the elderly and government employees were all facing hardship under the Congress regime, in contrast to stability during the previous BRS government. He reminded that the party had warned voters about the Congress false promises before the elections.

The BRS working president also criticised Assembly Speaker Gadham Prasad Kumar, likening him to Dhritrashtra for allegedly ignoring political realities. He accused the Speaker of failing to acknowledge that Chevella MLA Kale Yadaiah had defected to the Congress and continuing to treat him as a BRS member. He demanded that the Congress initiate action against Yadaiah if it dared to face bye-elections.

Calling for a united front in the upcoming municipal polls, he urged voters to teach the Congress a lesson, as continued support for the party would only result in continued betrayal. He asserted that only with the return of K Chandrababhan Rao as the Chief Minister, the State would progress.

## SIT summons former MP Santosh Kumar in phone-tapping case

The notice, served under Section 160 of the Criminal Procedure Code, asked Santosh Kumar to appear before SIT officials at the Jubilee Hills Assistant Commissioner of Police's office. The police said he may be acquainted with facts relevant to the investigation in Crime No.



243/2024, registered at Panjagutta police station. Reacting to the notices, Santosh Kumar announced that he would appear before the SIT and cooperate with the investigating authorities. He expressed immense faith and respect for the law and stated that he was prepared for questioning as he had nothing to hide.

## GHMC's significant efforts towards women empowerment : Commissioner R.V. Karnan

**Hyderabad** : The 77th Republic Day celebrations were held in a grand manner on Monday at the GHMC Head Office.

After receiving the Police guard of honour, GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan unfurled the National Flag.

GHMC Mayor Gadwal Vijayalakshmi and Deputy Mayor Sri-latha Shobhan Reddy were present on the occasion.

Addressing the gathering, the GHMC Commissioner delivered his Republic Day message. Later, the Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Commissioner distributed hearing aids, walking sticks and wheelchairs to nine persons with disabilities.

They also handed over cheques amounting to ₹855 crore to 7,127 Self Help Groups during the current financial year. As part of this, loans worth ₹19.5 lakh were sanctioned to four transgender Self Help Groups.



Under self-employment initiatives, financial assistance of ₹3.07 crore was provided to 47 women, including six transgender persons.

Financial assistance of ₹6 lakh was also provided to the Prem Leela Transgender Group for self-employment. The group, engaged in jute bag manufacturing, is providing livelihood to five transgender persons.

Extending Republic Day

greetings, Mr. Karnan conveyed his best wishes to freedom fighters, the Mayor, Deputy Mayor, corporators, public representatives, GHMC officers and staff, media representatives and the citizens of Hyderabad.

Recalling that the Constitution came into force on January 26, 1950, he paid tributes to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, Jawaharlal Nehru and other leaders for their role in

drafting a strong Constitution suited to the needs of the country.

He stated that it was his duty to place before the public the progress made by GHMC in the development of Greater Hyderabad.

**Greater Hyderabad as a Mega City** : He said that 2025 marked a significant milestone in GHMC's journey, with the merger of 27 municipalities, expanding GHMC's area from 650 sq km to 2,053 sq km, and increasing the population to 1.34 crore. With this expansion, Greater Hyderabad has emerged as the largest municipal body in the country in terms of area.

For administrative convenience, the number of wards was increased from 150 to 300, circles from 10 to 60, and zones from six to 12. He said this large-scale reorganisation was com-



pleted successfully in a short time with the cooperation of the government, public representatives and citizens.

**Sanitation and Public Health** : He said cleanliness was the foundation of urban health. In 2025, GHMC secured 6th rank at the national level in Swachh Survekshan, achieved 7-Star Garbage Free City status, and received Water+ and ODF Re-certification.

He said the commissioning of Waste-to-Energy, RDF, Bio-CNG and C&D waste processing plants had strengthened solid waste management. A mega sanitation drive was undertaken to remove legacy waste, bulky garbage and abandoned vehicles across the city.

A special e-waste drive was also conducted, resulting in the collection of 87 metric tonnes of e-waste.

He stressed that while the government accords highest priority to sanitation, a clean Hyderabad can be achieved only with active citizen participation.

**Reduction in Dengue Cases** : He said dengue cases were reduced by 30% (from 2,806 to 1,976) through GIS-based monitoring and the VBD app, and that GHMC received appreciation from the Government of India. The Metropolitan Surveillance Unit is functioning to effectively prevent and control diseases.

## Press' Sticker Rule Insulting to Journalists: Mamidi Somaiah

**Hyderabad** : Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) State Convener Mamidi Somaiah has strongly opposed the circular issued by the State Information and Public Relations Commissioner directing that only journalists holding government accreditation cards are permitted to display "Press" stickers on their vehicles. Terming the move an insult to journalists and the profession itself, he demanded that the government immediately withdraw the circular.



genuine journalists is unacceptable. Somaiah noted that many journalists without accreditation cards are already facing hardships, and the new circular has only worsened their situation. He likened the move to "adding insult to injury."

Somaiah said the accreditation card is meant only as an identity for availing government welfare schemes and not as a certificate to decide who is or is not a journalist.

He pointed out that there are around 50,000 journalists across the state, of whom only about half have been issued government accreditation cards. The remaining journalists, he said, are working in media organisations

and newspapers registered with the central government's RNI (now PRGI) and are functioning with identity cards issued by their respective organisations.

"Just because a journalist does not possess a government accreditation card, it does not mean he or she is not a journalist," Somaiah asserted. He said imposing restrictions on the use of the 'Press' sticker on this basis is unjust and discriminatory. While there is no objection to framing separate rules to curb fake journalists, he said, using that pretext to humiliate

He also expressed concern that several small and medium newspapers, despite being recognised by the central government and run with investments of lakhs of rupees, are struggling due to the lack of state government empanelment and accreditation cards. Journalists working in such publications, he said, are being unfairly treated as if they are not journalists at all.

Demanding immediate withdrawal of the circular issued by the State Information Department Commissioner, Somaiah urged the government to reconsider the rule and ensure that the dignity and professional freedom of journalists are protected.

# 'Sashakt, Samriddha Bharat'

**U**nion Minister for Labour & Employment and Youth Affairs & Sports, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya, today interacted with beneficiaries of the Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maandhan (PM-SYM) Scheme on the occasion of the 77th Republic Day. Over 100 beneficiaries and their family members from across the country had been invited as special guests in recognition of their contribution to the unorganised sector and their association with the flagship social security scheme.

Welcoming the beneficiaries on behalf of the Government of India, the Minister said that the invitation had been extended at the initiative of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, reflecting the Government's firm commitment to citizen-centric governance and inclusive development. Addressing the gathering, the Minister reiterated the Government's resolve to ensure social security for unorganised workers. He said that governance must remain close to the people in order to understand their

problems and aspirations.

Referring to the Republic Day celebrations, the Minister spoke about the symbolic significance of the transformation from Rajpath to Kartavya Path, reflecting India's evolving democratic ethos and collective sense of duty. that these measures are laying the foundation for a 'Sashakt, Samriddha Bharat'.

The Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maandhan (PM-SYM) Scheme, launched in 2019, is a voluntary and contributory pension scheme for unorganised workers with a monthly income of up to ₹15,000 who are not covered under EPFO, ESIC or the National Pension Scheme.

Eligible workers in the age group of 18 to 40 years can enrol by making a small monthly contribution, with an equal matching contribution by the

Central Government. On attaining the age of 60 years, the beneficiary is entitled to an assured minimum pension of ₹3,000 per month. The scheme also provides family pension benefits, including 50 per cent of the pension to the spouse in the event of the subscriber's death.

PM-SYM is implemented through the Maandhan portal and Common Service Centres (CSCs), with free enrolment, reflecting the Government's commitment to social security and income security for the unorganised workforce.

## GO 252 Amendment Welcome, But Falls Short : TWJ

### Cable Channels, Constituency-Level Reporters Ignored Again, Says Mamidi Somaiah

**Hyderabad** : Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) founder president and state convener Mamidi Somaiah on Sunday said the state government's move to amend Media Accreditation GO 252, which was issued last month with several flaws, was "welcome" but "not a comprehensive correction."

Stating that the amendment was "like digging a mountain and finding a mouse," Somaiah said the original GO 252 was opposed by journalist unions on the very day it was released, as it was riddled with errors and was detrimental to journalists. "We demanded immediate revision and even warned of a statewide agitation if the government failed to act,"

he recalled.

He said a round-table meeting was later held by the Journalists' Joint Action Committee, following which a representation was submitted to the Information Minister and the Commissioner. Subsequently, Information Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy convened a meeting with journalist associations at the Secretariat on January 10, in which TWJF also participated.

"Out of the many demands we placed, the government has considered only two or three points while issuing the revised GO 252," Somaiah said. He welcomed the decision to issue accreditation cards to desk journalists, to provide ad-



ditional cards at the mandal level where the population exceeds 1.5 lakh, and to grant separate accreditation cards for cultural, sports and film journalists. "For these corrections, TWJF thanks the government," he said.

However, Somaiah expressed doubts over whether the revised GO would result in the same number of accreditation cards as in the past.

"There is a strong possibility that the total number of cards will drastically come down. We urge the government to rethink and ensure that the number of cards issued earlier under GO 239 is not reduced," he said. Cable Channels, Constituency Reporters Get a Raw Deal

Somaiah alleged that full justice had not been done to journalists even in the amended GO 252 and that cable channels and constituency-level reporters had once again been given a raw deal.

"In the past, cable channels were given 12 state-level and four district-level accreditation cards through the I&PR Department. We requested the minister to

continue at least the same pattern, but the amended GO makes no mention of cable channels at all. This is deeply worrying," he said.

He also pointed out that there was no clarity on issuing accreditation cards at the constituency level. "Despite strongly putting forth our union's stand, the government has not responded on accreditation for cable channel reporters and constituency-level reporters. This is unfair," Somaiah said.

He announced that TWJF would soon meet the Special Commissioner of the Information Department to discuss the issue again. "If there is still no response, we will announce our future course of action," he warned.

## WAMAN: A Community-Driven Wave Buoy Network from INCOIS sets a Global Example

(Capital Information)

**Hyderabad** : Along India's long and diverse coastline, the sea is both a source of livelihood and a persistent risk. For decades, the absence of sustained wave observations limited accurate sea state forecasting, leaving coastal communities, mariners, and planners vulnerable to high waves, wave surges, and swell events. Addressing this critical gap required not just technology, but a rethinking of how ocean observations are built and sustained.

That rethink led to the Wave Monitoring Along Nearshore (WAMAN) buoy network, established by the Earth System Science Organisation-Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (ESSO-INCOIS). What began as an effort to strengthen operational wave forecasting has evolved into a globally recognized example of how community ownership



can transform ocean observing systems.

Reflecting on the early days of the initiative, Dr. T. M. Balakrishnan Nair, who conceptualized and led the WAMAN programme and is now Director of INCOIS, notes that the challenge was never only scientific. "We realized very early that nearshore observations would not survive unless coastal communities saw value in them," he says. "Sustained observations require sustained trust."

**Rethinking Coastal Observations**

Deploying and maintaining wave buoys in nearshore waters is notoriously difficult, particularly along coastlines marked by cultural, linguistic, and socioeconomic diversity. Traditional top-down approaches struggled, often hampered by vandalism, limited local engagement, and logistical constraints. INCOIS recognized early that technical solutions alone would not be enough.

Instead, the institute adopted a community-driven approach, translating scientific goals into practical services that coastal users could directly relate to. Fishers, harbor authorities, and local stakeholders were engaged not as passive beneficiaries, but as partners. By understanding how wave forecasts improve safety at sea and daily decision-making, communities began to see the buoys as shared assets rather than external installations.

## National Consultation Calls for Rights-Based Reassessment of Treating Children as Adults under Juvenile Justice Law

**Hyderabad** : A two-day National Consultation on "The Treatment of Children in Conflict with the Law as Adults: Rights Implications" was held at NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad, marking ten years of the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. The consultation brought together judges, members of the judiciary, lawyers, Juvenile Justice Board (JJB) members, probation officers, mental health professionals, researchers, civil society organisations, media professionals, and persons with lived experience to critically examine the transfer of children to the adult criminal justice system. The consultation was organised collaboratively by NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad, Ashiyana Foundation, Counsel to Secure Justice, Enfold Proactive



Health Trust, India Justice Report, iProbono India, Juvenile Justice Clinic-NLSIU.

In the inaugural address, Justice B. V. Nagarathna, Judge and Chairperson of the Juvenile Justice Committee, Supreme Court of India, underscored that the juvenile justice system at its core reflects the reformative and rehabilitative spirit of the law. She emphasised that the Juvenile Justice Boards need to sit on a regular basis and not just occasionally. She underlined the importance of progressive judicial interpretation by giving examples of

several Supreme Court judgements. The fact that public outrage cannot dictate judicial proceedings which should be guided by discipline, humility and fidelity was also reinforced.

Hon'ble Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh, in his address, highlighted the intricacies of the Juvenile Justice Act including Preliminary Assessment and Transfer System. He especially pointed that the 2015 Act is a significant departure from the Restorative and Rehabilitative philosophies of the Juvenile Justice Act, 2000.

Prof. Srikrishna Deva Rao, Vice-Chancellor, NALSAR University of Law, in his welcome address highlighted the importance of due process in the juvenile justice system. He reiterated the fact that procedure is as important as the principles laid down in the legislation. He said that juvenile justice is 'tender justice' and there is a moral commitment of the law towards care and protection of the children in conflict with the law. He also stressed on the significance of the principle of diversion and how that should guide various functionaries in the system.

Across multiple panels and dialogues, participants highlighted serious legal, procedural, psychological, and rights-based concerns arising from the practice of treating children as adults, particularly through preliminary assessments under Section 15 of the JJ Act.

"Fairy Se Samvad" contains 60 children's poems woven into dialogues between fairies. Each poem answers a child's daily life questions—friendship, honesty, love for nature, etc. "Bachchon Ki Duniya" contains 70 short poems, each of

16 lines, focusing on childhood games, festivals, and innocent questions. Both collections are written in simple Hindi. Available on Pothi.com, these books are ideal for children aged 5 to 12. The fairy tales, based on local folklore, connect them with the rural children of Haryana. Overall, these poetry collections are a beautiful bridge between reality and imagination.

**Language style and presentation**

The language is extremely simple, rhythmic, and musical. Short sentences easily appeal to children. The fairy tales' dialogue is lively, such as "O little child, fairies flee from lies." The use of rhyme and figures of speech makes the poems lyrical. Political concepts are simplified in fairy tales—democracy is described as "the collective decision of all fairies." The word

images are so powerful that the need for illustrations is minimal. Books of 50-60 lines can be read in a single sitting. This style strengthens the excellent tradition of Hindi children's poetry. The grammar is accurate and the pronunciation is easy.

**Educational and moral values**

As an officer of the Haryana Education Depart-

ment, Dr. Priyanka has woven curriculum values into these poems. Environmental awareness—"Nature is Mother, Love Her"—gender equality and social harmony are key. Children learn participation and leadership. Useful for moral education or bedtime stories in schools. These poems develop emotional intelligence and spark curiosity. Her expertise in political science is evident in messages like "Politics is service, not self-interest." These books are ideal for Haryana's government school campaigns. They help children become responsible citizens.

**Interest, attraction and impact**

These poems score high marks for their engaging nature. Children are captivated by the fairy tale's magic, while adults are influenced by its moral messages. Children ask questions after reading, sparking dialogue. These are

rare works that connect readers to books in the digital age. Haryana references like "Kites flying in the fields" provide a local touch. The impact is long-lasting—it awakens children's imagination and sense of values. Parents and classroom teachers can use them confidently. The only drawback: the language is a bit formal in some places, but natural in children's literature.

**Overall Assessment and Recommendation**

These children's poetry books by Dr. Priyanka Saurabh are a treasure trove of Hindi literature. A unique blend of education, politics, science, and literature. 10/10 points. Therefore, blindly using herbal or considering it without any kind of side effects is a mistake. Many people start using herbal because if it doesn't help, it won't hurt. Because there is no side effect of some kind in herbal. But it is not so. Herbal medicines can also not only cause harm but side effects are possible from them. Therefore, it is necessary to seek the advice of experts even while using herbal. Don't make assumptions on your own. Do not believe in miracles.

The problem arises as soon as we take the herbal to be a miracle or magical. Many people when there is no immediate relief in allopathy, they come to the treatment of herbs thinking that it may not bring any benefit immediately



but there will be some harm and eventually some good. That is, there will be no side effects. But these assumptions are wrong. Actually the formation of such a perception is amazing marketing of herbs. Many companies say that these herbs are a hundred percent natural and there is no side effect, as well as the sure cure with them. All of these things don't stand up to scientific scrutiny. These are straight-up propaganda

hoops. In such a case it is not right to expect hundred percent advantages from any herb. This also makes things difficult in and of itself, when we assume that if this herb has benefited this person in this merge, it will benefit me as well. That doesn't make sense. Just as allopathic medicines do not necessarily have to affect everyone, herbal medicine does not have to impact every person. Many times many people re-

sort to the refuge of herbal treatments in order to avoid the hefty fees of doctors and the expensive tests they perform. But these can be your own problem, herbal medicines are not responsible for this. So don't expect miracles from Herbal.

**Not the same cure for every disease**

There are some diseases in which herbal medicine can only be helpful but the main cure is not from them. Such

as heart attacks, brain strokes or brain hemorrhages and other serious illnesses, herbal does not have a cure for these troubles. They have to stay in the hospital, surgery and monitoring. Similarly, the severe infection of typhoid, TB, is also not cured by herbal medicines. Yet when people put an unnecessary burden on herbs as a miracle cure for all sorts of troubles, not only do hopes crumble but many feel that it is wrong to trust herbal.

**Limit of risk taking**

Neither would it have been right to believe in herbs more than necessary, nor distrust. Herbs do not have a cure for diseases such as diabetes, high blood pressure, cancer. Herbs can only improve your lifestyle, digestive health, sleep better, immune support and these effects you cannot risk in the diseases of life and death. This has to be understood.

**Say no to arbitrary use**

Even in the use of herbs,

it is necessary to pay serious attention to scientific monitoring, their purity and dosage. It can't be that an herb is eaten arbitrarily by you assuming which one it is a chemical. They also have a standardization and just like the product must guarantee purity, they need to be pure for them to be useful.

**Take these precautions**

Get a diagnosis before using any herbal medicine. Whenever you buy an herbal product from the market, do not rely on its no side effect sentence. Never take any herbal medicine without advice in pregnancy, kidney, liver, heart stroke. At the same time, taking a saponin herb many herbal medicines is also harmful. One more thing to note is don't mix herbal with blood thinner, sugar and BP medications. If you don't see benefits in two weeks, you must meet a doctor, it is better to not treat yourself for several months without any benefit.

# The government's objective is to provide welfare benefits to every eligible person : Collector Adarsh Surabhi

**(Capital Information)**  
**Wanaparthy :** On Monday, marking the 77th Republic Day celebrations, District Collector Adarsh Surabhi attended the Republic Day festivities held at the local Government Polytechnic College grounds as the chief guest. He unfurled the national flag along with District SP Sunitha Reddy, local MLA Tudi Megha Reddy, and State Sports Authority Chairman Kothakapu Shiv Sena Reddy. Later, after receiving the police guard of honor, he addressed the people of the district, speaking about the welfare and development programs being implemented in the district through various departments and the progress achieved. The Collector stated that the "Mahalakshmi Scheme" is a program undertaken with the intention of empowering the women of Telangana. Through this scheme, women and transgender individuals can travel free of charge on RTC Palle Velugu and Express buses to any part of the state by showing any government-issued identity card, effective from December 9, 2023.

He further added that since the launch of the Mahalakshmi scheme in wanaparthy district, approximately 2.97 crore women have traveled, benefiting to the tune of Rs. 126.34 crore. He also mentioned that the state government is implementing a program under the Mahalakshmi scheme to supply cooking gas for just Rs. 500. He stated that 85,237 people in Wanaparthy district are benefiting under this scheme. He said that under the Women's Empowerment scheme, 10 RTC buses have been purchased through Mandal Women's Federations, and through these, each Mandal Women's Federation is earning an income of approximately Rs. 69,000 per month, totaling Rs. 6.94,000. He also mentioned that under the "Kusum Project," two 2-megawatt solar power plants have been sanctioned, one for each of the Amara-chintla and Wanaparthy mandals in the district. He added that the government has allocated one acre of land for the establishment of a petrol bunk by women's self-help groups in Miraspalli village, Kothakota mandal. He said that Rs. 5 crore has

been sanctioned for the construction of the District Women's Federation building, and the work is progressing rapidly. He stated that with the intention of providing a quality saree to every woman self-help group member, Indira Mahila Shakti sarees have been distributed to 1,22,472 women self-help group members in Wanaparthy district.

**Improved Medical Services with Rajiv Aarogyasri :** He said that the government is firmly committed to providing better medical services and facilities to the poor, and that the "Rajiv Aarogyasri" scheme, which was launched earlier, has been revamped to meet current needs, increasing the medical coverage and services to provide free treatment up to ten lakh rupees. He said that this provides great assistance to the poor and middle-class people, and that under this scheme, free medical treatment was provided to 22,051 people in Wanaparthy district, incurring an expenditure of Rs. 57.37 crore.

**Farmer Loan Waiver :** Regarding the loan waiver, the Collector said that crop loans taken by farmers up to Rs. 2 lakh have been waived in a single installment. He stated that so far, under the farmer loan waiver scheme in Wanaparthy district, a total of Rs. 480.91 crore in loans has been waived for 60,545 farmers. With the intention of providing insurance to farmers, he said that if farmers aged between 18 and 59 years die, their heirs will be given Rs. 5 lakh under the Rythu Bima (Farmer Insurance) scheme.

He added that so far, Rs. 12.25 crore has been deposited into the accounts of the nominees of 245 farmers in Wanaparthy district. Similarly, under the Rythu Bharosa scheme, investment assistance of Rs. 12,000 per acre per year is being provided to every farmer. Under the Rythu Bharosa scheme, for the Kharif 2025 season in the district, Rs. 205.93 crore has been deposited into the accounts of 1.75 lakh farmers at the rate of Rs. 6,000 per acre.

He also stated that a support price will be given for fine variety paddy, along with a bonus of Rs. 500 per quintal. He stated that a bonus of ₹76.18 crore was paid



to 30,000 farmers in Wanaparthy district during the 2025-26 rainy season. He added that 2.86 lakh metric tons of paddy were procured through 395 procurement centers in the district during this rainy season. He further stated that with the intention of providing sufficient food to the poor, fine quality rice is being distributed to every ration card holder in Wanaparthy district through 1,80,857 ration cards. He also mentioned that 10,847 new ration cards have been issued in the district, and 66,929 additional family members have been added to the existing cards.

**Indiramma Houses Scheme :** Under the Indiramma Houses scheme, 3,500 houses will be constructed in each constituency, and the government will provide financial assistance of Rs. 5 lakhs to eligible poor people to build houses on their own land. In our district, 6,047 houses have been sanctioned. Construction has started on 73% of these houses, and I am happy to say that the construction of 51 houses has been completed, and previously homeless poor people have moved in as owners. For this purpose, Rs. 81 crore 71 lakhs have been spent in our district under this scheme so far. Gruha Jyothi Scheme Under the Gruha Jyothi scheme, the government is providing free electricity to consumers using less than 200 units. In Wanaparthy district, zero bills have been issued to 83,882 people so far. Under this scheme, the government has provided a subsidy of Rs. 41 crore 7 lakhs so far. Through the "Cheyutha" scheme, pensions are being given every month to disabled people, the elderly, widows, and other eligible poor people. In Wanaparthy district, Rs. 17 crore 61 lakhs is being given as pen-

sion to 70,909 people every month. Due to the provision of all basic facilities in all government hospitals in Wanaparthy district, on par with private hospitals, the number of deliveries in all government hospitals in the district has increased, thereby building trust among the people towards government hospitals. The State Chief Minister laid the foundation stone for the construction of a hospital in Wanaparthy district at an estimated cost of Rs. 203.95 crores, and for the construction of a 50-bed Community Health Centre (CHC) in Pebber at an estimated cost of Rs. 11.20 crores. He stated that these works are progressing rapidly.

In Wanaparthy district, 19,643 diabetes patients were identified last year through Mission Madhumeha. Currently, another program called Mission Madhumeha Drishti has been launched with a 100-day plan as its objective. Under this program, three teams conducted tests on 26,472 people using Artificial Intelligence (AI) screening equipment, and 406 people were identified with retinopathy and referred to an eye hospital for treatment. Funds amounting to Rs. 13.50 crores have been sanctioned for the construction of hostels and administrative blocks at the Government Polytechnic College in Wanaparthy.

Health check-ups were conducted for children aged 0-6 years in Anganwadi schools. Out of 498 children, 385 were identified with SAM (Severe Acute Malnutrition) and 113 with MAM (Moderate Acute Malnutrition). All of them were sent to the Nutritional Rehabilitation Centre in Wanaparthy for treatment, where their weakness was addressed and they were brought back to a normal state of health. The goal

is to make the district TB-free

As part of the Intensified TB-Free India Campaign (from December 7, 2024, to March 17, 2025), 170,000 suspected TB cases were identified using Artificial Intelligence technology, and 339 of them have been notified. Nutritional kits and financial assistance are being provided to these individuals through CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) initiatives.

**Young India Integrated Residential School for Every Constituency :** With the intention that every child born in society should grow to a level where they can compete with the world through government support, I am happy to announce that a Young India Residential School has been sanctioned for every constituency, and as part of this, a school has been sanctioned in our district with an estimated cost of Rs. 200 crores. Similarly, funds of Rs. 47.50 crores have been sanctioned for brand new buildings for the Zilla Parishad High School (Boys) in Wanaparthy and the junior colleges. He said that these works are progressing rapidly.

He stated that funds of Rs. 10.93 lakhs have been sanctioned for cooking mid-day meals using LPG gas in 497 schools in the district, along with providing health care for the school children. He expressed his happiness in informing that our district has secured the first position in the state in the PMSHRI ranking for the year 2025-26.

Similarly, he expressed his happiness in announcing that a new Kendriya Vidyalaya has been sanctioned in our district, and classes will commence in this Kendriya Vidyalaya from the next academic year. He said that to increase the pass percentage

in the 10th class, special classes will be conducted for an additional hour in the morning and evening in all the high schools in the district. He stated that through the Amma Adarsha School Committee, Rs. 13.18 crore has been allocated for providing basic infrastructure (Drinking Water, Toilets, Minor Repairs, Electrification & Sanitation) in 333 schools in Wanaparthy district. Similarly, with the aim of providing quality food and facilities to students residing in Gurukul hostels, this government has increased the diet charges by 50 percent and cosmetic charges by 215 percent. He mentioned that Rs. 1 crore has been sanctioned from MPLADS funds for the construction of the Social Welfare Girls' College hostel in Wanaparthy town, and the works are in progress. He also stated that Wanaparthy, Amara-chintla, and Gopalapet Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBVs) have been selected to provide IIT and NEET coaching to students after their intermediate education.

**Bhoobharathi :** With a firm resolve to permanently resolve the land issues of farmers, this people's government has brought the Bhoobharathi Act into effect. He said that so far, 2114 applications have been received in the district, and the problems of the people have been resolved by approving 1450 applications. He added that Rs. 96 lakhs have been sanctioned for the construction of new Tahsildar offices in Revally, Yedula, and Srirangapur mandals of the district, and the works have started and are in the final stages. As part of improving law and order in the district, a command control room has been established at the district police office, and CCTV cameras have been installed and are being monitored in all mandals (2049) of the district. SHE Teams are providing assurance for the safety of women. A Cyber Crime unit has been established to create awareness among the public in the district to prevent them from falling victim to cybercrimes, and measures are being taken to curb cybercrimes. With the aim of ensuring the safety of women through SHE Teams, a total of 95 awareness programs were conducted, educating 15,500 stu-

dents. To curb illegal sand transportation in the district, special teams have been formed, and so far, a total of 73 cases have been registered, and 113 people have been arrested. Through this, measures have been taken to protect the environment and prevent loss of government revenue.

Fines were imposed on the parents of 1560 children who were driving vehicles while under-age, and counseling was conducted. These measures were undertaken with the aim of ensuring the safety of children and increasing a sense of responsibility among parents through awareness programs.

**Special efforts for the eradication of child marriages :** To curb child marriages, awareness programs were conducted at the village level, educating people about the ill effects of child marriages. The police department played a key role in stopping many child marriages. More than 5,000 cases were resolved through the Lok Adalat conducted in Wanaparthy district. He stated that this program has been crucial in delivering justice, increasing public trust in the judicial system, and reducing the burden on the courts. The patriotic dance and cultural programs presented by students from various schools on this occasion captivated everyone. Similarly, the stalls set up by various departments were visited and appreciated by the chief guests. Certificates of appreciation were presented to the officers and staff who rendered excellent services in the discharge of their government duties, by the Collector, Additional Collectors, and Members of the Legislative Assembly. On this occasion, a bank linkage check of Rs. 23.14 crore was handed over to the MEPMA groups. Nutritional kits were distributed to TB patients in the district. As part of the distribution of assistive devices to eligible persons with disabilities, five three-wheeled scooters, four laptops, and two 5G smartphones were distributed. Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Yadhiah, RDO Subramanyam, district officials from various departments, public representatives, citizens, students, and others participated in the program.
