

Telangana Media Delegation Meets Governor of Odisha

Odisha's Progressive Growth is Shaping a Distinct State Identity: Governor Dr. Hari Babu Kambhampati

(Capital Information) **Hyderabad** : A media delegation from Telangana, led by PIB called on the Governor of Odisha, Dr. Hari Babu Kambhampati, at Lok Bhavan today. Welcoming the delegation, the Governor shared insights into Odisha's development journey and its growing contribution to national progress.



Addressing the media representatives, the Governor said that Odisha has maintained consistent growth over the past few years and continues to strengthen its economic fundamentals. He noted that the State has achieved recognition as a revenue-surplus state and has carved out a distinct identity at the national level. The Governor also acknowledged the sustained support of the Central Government in Odisha's development efforts.

Dr. Kambhampati highlighted major infrastructure initiatives underway in the State. He said that steps are being taken to provide rail-

way connectivity to all districts, while several important National Highways pass through Odisha. Infrastructure projects related to highways and railways, with a total investment exceeding ₹1.30 lakh crore, are currently under implementation. He added that the recently announced semiconductor project and National Waterway-5 will further accelerate the State's development.

Referring to Odisha's natural advantages, the Governor said the State has a long

coastline and key ports such as Paradip, Dhamra and Gopalpur, supported by strong connectivity networks. Odisha is also rich in mineral resources including coal, iron ore, bauxite, manganese and chromite, which has contributed to rapid industrial growth. "Revenue generated from mining and industrial activities is being effectively utilised for development works", he added.

The Governor also highlighted progress in the agriculture sector, stating that

Odisha has emerged as one of the leading states in the production and consumption of millets. He said several innovative initiatives have been undertaken to strengthen agricultural growth and farmers' livelihoods.

Appreciating the State's rich cultural heritage, Dr. Kambhampati said that Odisha's handicrafts and handloom products reflect its unique identity. Sambalpuri sarees, Maniabandha and Ganjam handlooms, Kotpad fabrics, brass and bell-metal

works, Cuttack filigree, Pipili applique and Raghurajpur Pattachitra enjoy wide recognition and demand both in India and abroad.

The Governor further noted that Bhubaneswar is fast emerging as a major centre for education and skill development. Institutions such as IIT, AIIMS, NISER and the World Skill Center have been established in and around the capital, creating a conducive ecosystem for the State's overall growth.

The Telangana media delegation led by Varganti Gayathri Media Communication Officer of PIB Hyderabad expressed appreciation for Odisha's development and shared their experiences of visiting the State.

Assistant Director of PIB Bhubaneswar, Mahendra Prasad Jena, Media and Communication Officer Swadhini Shakti Prasad were present during the interaction along with Senior officials of Lok Bhavan.

Key files reportedly gutted in fire at Telangana Forensic Science Lab

(Capital Information) **Hyderabad** : A fire accident at the Telangana Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) on Saturday reportedly destroyed several crucial files, including records said to be linked to the cash-for-vote case, triggering concern over the loss of key evidence.

According to officials, the laboratory houses sensitive file evidence related to criminal investigations and serves as a central hub for forensic operations. Authorities said it is not yet clear which specific files were damaged in the blaze.

Preliminary investigation suggests that the fire may have been caused by a short circuit. The first floor of the building, where computers and digital records are stored, was affected in the incident.

Central Zone DCP Shilpavalli said that five fire engines were pressed into service and the flames were brought completely under control. At the time of the incident, four employees were inside the building. They noticed the fire in time and managed to come out safely, she said.

Officials are assessing the extent of damage and verifying whether any critical evidence has been permanently lost. Further inquiry into the incident is underway.

Collector orders special camps to fast-track Aadhaar biometric updates in schools

(Capital Information) **Mahabubnagar** : District Collector Vijayendra Boyi has directed school education officials to conduct special camps in all government and private schools to quickly complete free Aadhaar biometric updates for students.

Chairing the District Level Aadhaar Monitoring Committee (DLAMC) meeting at the Collectorate on Saturday, the Collector reviewed pending Aadhaar enrolment and biometric updation across the district. She conducted a special review on Aadhaar coverage of students and Mandatory Biometric Updates (MBU) in the school education department.

The Collector instructed officials to complete Aadhaar enrolment for every child living in orphanages and shelter homes through a special drive. It was noted that enrolment of children aged 0-6 years was largely pending



due to the absence of birth certificates. The meeting decided that departments issuing birth certificates should expedite the process and facilitate Aadhaar enrolment simultaneously at the time of certificate issuance.

Observing that Aadhaar verification cases of persons above 18 years were pending with the revenue department, the Collector directed tahsilars to clear them

within the stipulated timeline through the state verification portal.

The meeting also discussed Aadhaar-related issues in social welfare and minority scholarships, enrolment of PVTG communities, new registrations and gender updates for transgender persons, and verification of Aadhaar for centenarians.

Appealing to the public, the Collector urged citizens

to complete Aadhaar enrolment and updates to avoid inconvenience while availing government schemes, examinations and services. She asked people to utilise the special camps and nearby Aadhaar centres being organised across the district.

Officials informed that 118 Aadhaar enrolment and update centres are currently functioning through Mee-Seva, CSCs, postal, bank

and school education departments in various mandals. The functioning of permanent enrolment centres at tahsildar offices, MPDO offices, PHCs and government offices was also reviewed. The Collector ordered immediate revival of non-functional centres.

Proposals have been sent for establishing new permanent Aadhaar centres in Addakal, Bhoothpur, Moosapet, Mahabubnagar Rural, Mohammadabad and Koukuntla mandals.

Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Shivendra Pratap, Additional Collector (Revenue) Madhusudan Naik, Telangana Aadhaar project officer Nares, district education officer Praveen Kumar, district women and child welfare officer Zarina Begum, CPO Ravinder, lead district manager Chandrasekar and officials from police, postal and SC/ST welfare departments attended the meeting.

Harish Rao slams CM Revanth Reddy at Jinnaram poll rally, invokes KCR legacy

(Capital Information) **Sangareddy** : BRS senior leader and former minister T. Harish Rao launched a sharp attack on Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy during a municipal election campaign meeting in Jinnaram, Patancheru constituency, accusing him of political betrayal, administrative failure and using "divisive language" in public speeches.



Addressing party workers and supporters, Harish Rao contrasted what he described as K. Chandrasekar Rao's "movement history" with Revanth Reddy's "political past", alleging that the Chief Minister was resorting to personal attacks instead of speaking about governance and development during campaign rallies.

He criticised the tone of the Chief Minister's recent speeches, saying public discourse should not be reduced to

insults. Harish Rao questioned Revanth Reddy's remarks about KCR and accused him of spreading misinformation regarding irrigation projects and water sharing. He alleged that

pension hikes, financial assistance schemes for women, farm support measures and job creation. He alleged that several welfare programmes introduced during the BRS regime had either been diluted or discontinued.

Highlighting the BRS government's tenure, Harish Rao credited KCR with strengthening irrigation infrastructure, expanding welfare pensions, supporting farmers through Rythu Bandhu, and improving drinking water access. He urged voters to judge parties based on development and welfare delivery rather than campaign rhetoric.

Calling on supporters to ensure a BRS victory in the municipal elections, Harish Rao said the party would continue to challenge the government on unfulfilled assurances and raise issues in the public domain.

The Congress has not yet responded to the remarks.

Increased Budget Allocation Strengthens Railway Infrastructure Development in Andhra Pradesh

- Two High Speed Rail Corridors sanctioned for Andhra Pradesh state in the current budget - An amount of Rs10,134 Crores budget allocated to Andhra Pradesh state

(Capital Information) Hyderabad/Vijayawada : Following the bifurcation of Andhra Pradesh, there is a steep increase in the Railway budgeting for Andhra Pradesh. During the period from 2009 to 2014, the state received an average of ₹886 crore per year which was the combined budget of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. This allocation has risen sharply to ₹10,134 crore in the 2026-27 financial year, marking an over eleven-fold increase. The enhanced budgetary support has enabled faster execution of projects, creation of new assets and long-term infrastructure planning across the state. Railway investment shifted from routine maintenance to sustained and targeted development, focusing on expanding connectivity, modernising infrastructure,

strengthening safety systems and upgrading passenger amenities. Improved budget allocation after 2014, has directly contributed to faster expansion of the Railway network in Andhra Pradesh making it to 1700 kilometres. Enhanced funding has helped extend rail connectivity to more regions, supporting industrial activity, agricultural movement and regional development. Electrification has emerged as a major focus area of Railway development in the state with 1,949 Kms of rail lines electrified since 2014, with this Andhra Pradesh has now achieved 100% electrification. This transition has reduced fuel costs, improved operational efficiency and supported cleaner and environmentally friendly rail operations.

Passenger-centric development has been strengthened through focused budgetary support for station redevelopment. 73 stations in Andhra Pradesh are being upgraded under the Amrit Station scheme with substantial investment of Rs. 3,418 crores. Redevelopment work at major stations across the state is progressing in phases, with budgetary support facilitating tender finalisation, structural construction and finishing works. Railway safety has received dedicated attention through investment in advanced protection systems. In



Andhra Pradesh, the indigenous automatic train protection system - Kavach is deployed on 130 Kms. Further, Kavach 4.0 has been sanctioned for 3,137 Kms, while work/tender is in progress for 2,507 Kms. These measures significantly

strengthen safety standards and reduce the risk of accidents. Modern train services have further transformed rail travel in Andhra Pradesh with the introduction of 8 pairs of Vande Bharat Express trains which covers 16 districts and

23 unique stoppages. These trains offer faster, comfortable, and technologically advanced travel and play an important role in improving connectivity to key destinations. Enhanced rail connectivity has also supported tourism, including travel to prominent pilgrimage and cultural centres such as Tirupati, making journeys more convenient for devotees and tourists. Affordable long-distance travel has been strengthened with the operation of the 8 pairs of Amrit Bharat Express trains, covering 12 districts and 30 stoppages across Andhra Pradesh. Designed with the needs of middle-class families in mind, this service improves connectivity while keeping fares affordable, ensuring that long-distance rail travel remains accessible to a

wider section of society. Around 805 flyovers and underpasses have been constructed since 2014, significantly reducing Railway crossings and improving safety for both Rail passengers and road users. Apart from higher budgetary allocations, Andhra Pradesh state is going to witness the high speed rail corridors passing through the state connecting the capital cities of Telangana, Tamilnadu and Karnataka. This will help for the socio-economic growth of the region besides sharing of Knowledge, Culture and Commerce. Continued focus on investment in major projects ensures that the rail budget will remain a key driver of infrastructure growth and improved connectivity in Andhra Pradesh in the years ahead.

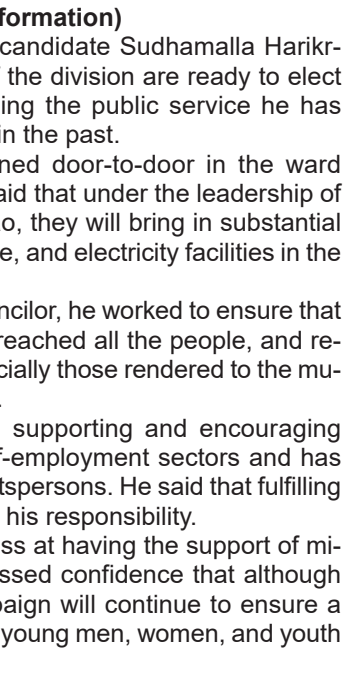
standing performance, Tejashree Yadav has been selected to represent India in the upcoming international powerlifting championship to

The election process must be completed according to the plan...Arrangements for polling and counting must be foolproof: In-charge Collector and District Election Officer Garima Agarwal

Rajanna Sircilla Bureau : Rajanna Sircilla District In-charge Collector and District Election Officer Garima Agrawal instructed that the entire municipal election process must be completed according to the plan. In view of the municipal elections polling on the 11th of this month and counting on the 13th, the In-charge Collector and District Election Officer Garima Agrawal held a lengthy review meeting with RDOs, nodal officers, and election department officials at the district integrated offices complex on Saturday.



On this occasion, the In-charge Collector and District Election Officer stated that campaigning should be stopped 48 hours before the elections. She suggested that voter slips be distributed. She instructed that distribution centers be set up on the 10th of this

month at the Geetanagar Zilla Parishad High School premises in Sircilla district headquarters and at the Government Junior College premises in Vemulawada. She ordered that nodal officers be appointed for tasks such as checking the attendance of election officers and staff, vehicle parking, and distribution of election materials. The officials instructed that breakfast and lunch

arrangements should be made for the officers and staff. They clarified that the election officials and staff should travel only in the vehicles allocated to them. They stated that webcasting would be available at all polling stations and that there should be one CCTV camera outside each polling station. They instructed that ramps should be provided for disabled persons at the polling sta-

tions, and that basic amenities should be provided for the polling officers and staff.

They explained that after the polling concludes, the equipment, ballot papers, PO diary, and other materials should be handed over at the reception center set up at the C. Narayana Reddy Kala Mandir in Sircilla and Vemulawada. They clarified that mobile phones are not allowed at the polling stations.

In-charge Collector and District Election Officer Garima Agrawal instructed that polling details should be reported every two hours. She ordered that the ballot paper boxes be secured in the strong room and that police security be provided. She clarified that CCTV

cameras should be installed at the counting center and that no one except the officials, staff, and agents with identity cards would be allowed inside. She suggested that a media center be set up. She stated that the postal ballots should be counted first, followed by the remaining votes. In-charge Collector and District Election Officer Garima Agrawal clarified that the Model Code of Conduct will remain in effect until the entire election process is completed.

Rama Rao (KTR) launched an offensive against Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, characterizing him as a "Trojan Horse" for the BJP within the Congress ranks. Addressing a massive roadshow in the Jukkal, Bannawada, Yellareddy constituencies on Saturday, KTR exhorted the electorate—particularly minorities—to "peel back the Congress mask" to reveal the saffron identity underneath. "Revanth was never a Congressman at heart; he remains a BJP man through and through. He is merely the younger brother to the 'Bade Bhai' in Delhi," KTR asserted, suggesting a clandestine tactical understanding between the



CM and the BJP top brass. **'LAGULA THONDALA REDDY: KTR DERIDES CM'S RHETORIC'** Taking a sharp dig at the Chief Minister's increasingly combative and often coarse political vocabulary, KTR rechristened him "Lagula Thondala Reddy" (Lizard-in-the-trousers Reddy). He slammed the CM for substituting governance with profanity, noting that whenever the opposition demands accountability for the "420 failed promises," the CM resorts to

"street-level threats" about "pulling out guts" and "playing marbles with eyes." "For two years, his administration has been a single-point agenda of KCR-bashing. He chants KCR's name more than a devotee writes 'Rama Koti.' The irony is that KCR doesn't even acknowledge his existence, and it is this lack of recognition that drives Revanth into a state of perpetual frustration," KTR remarked amidst cheers from the crowd.

'POCHARAM'S DEFECTION: JUMP INTO A WELL,' SAYS KTR The BRS leader reserved his most stinging barbs for former Speaker Pocharam Srinivas Reddy, who recently switched loyalties to the Congress. In a move that electrified the gathering, KTR played archival clips of Revanth Reddy previously branding Pocharam an "ox" and his sons "buffaloes" involved in sand smuggling. "Pocharam once invoked Lord Venkateswara to pledge his lifelong loyalty to KCR. Today, for a few 'scraps' from Revanth's table, he has sold his soul. If he has an iota of self-respect left, he should resign and seek a fresh mandate. Otherwise, he should follow Revanth's own past advice: tie a stone to his neck and jump into a well," KTR challenged. **'DANDU PALAYAM' GOVERNANCE**

Drawing a parallel with the notorious Dandu Palayam and Stuartpuram gangs, KTR warned that the Congress "loot-and-scoot" model was now targeting the municipal level. He alleged that the local Jukkal MLA was acting as a "collection agent," extorting commissions from the business community to fund the Congress's "cash-for-votes" election strategy. "They promised ₹4,000 pensions, ₹2,500 for women, and 'Thulam' gold. Where are they? This is a government of deception," KTR said. Fire at Telangana Forensic Lab Raises Fears Over Damage to Crucial Case Evidence

Hyderabad : A fire accident at the Telangana State Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) in Nampally has triggered serious concerns over the safety of crucial evidence linked to several sensitive criminal cases, including the high-profile vote-for-note case. According to officials, the fire broke out on the first floor computer laboratory, which houses servers and digital infrastructure critical to criminal investigations across the State. Thick smoke quickly engulfed the floor, forcing staff to evacuate the building. At the time of the incident, four employees were present inside, but they noticed the fire in time and escaped safely without injuries, police said. Fire and Emergency Services rushed to the spot and deployed five fire engines, bringing the blaze fully under control after sustained efforts. Preliminary inputs indicate that the fire may have been caused by a short circuit, though the exact cause will be confirmed only after a detailed technical inspection. Central Zone DCP Shilpavalli said that while the fire has been extinguished, there are indications that some important files may have been damaged. However, officials clarified that it is not yet clear which specific files or digital records were affected. The FSL is a critical hub for criminal investigations in Telangana, handling digital evidence, audio-video records, forensic reports, and paper-based case files related to major crimes. Apart from the vote-for-note case, the lab also stores material linked to other politically and legally sensitive investigations. Authorities said the actual extent of damage to servers, computers, and physical records will be known only after smoke clearance and a thorough forensic and technical audit. Senior police officials visited the site and reviewed the situation. As a precautionary measure, temporary traffic diversions were imposed in parts of the Nampally area during firefighting operations. An internal inquiry has been initiated to assess losses, verify the safety of evidence, and strengthen fire safety measures at the facility. Further details are awaited as investigations continue.



Fodder destroyed in fire at Begumpet Eight hundred haystacks completely gutted - causes unknown

Peddapalli/Ramagiri : A major fire broke out in Begumpet village of Ramagiri mandal on Saturday night at around 7 PM. Approximately 800 haystacks belonging to Ragula Sagar of the village were completely destroyed in the fire. The fire suddenly erupted in the area where the haystacks were stored, and it spread rapidly, causing extensive damage. Locals stated that the cause of the fire is still unknown. Upon receiving the information, a fire engine immediately reached the spot and brought the fire under control, completely extinguishing it. Fortunately, no loss of life occurred, officials said. Villagers expressed their distress over the significant financial loss incurred by Ragula Sagar due to this incident. Many are appealing to the government to provide assistance to Sagar.

The Penguin Walk Our Schools Refuse to Learn A System Teaching the Wrong Lessons

Tirupati : India's school education system is causing deep harm—quietly, systematically, and in plain sight. In a world shaped by volatility, uncertainty, complexity, and ambiguity (VUCA), our schools continue to teach children that certainty is normal, mistakes are unacceptable, and obedience equals intelligence. From the earliest years, students are trained to memorise, comply, and compete. Curiosity is allowed only within the syllabus. Questioning authority is mistaken for indiscipline. Failure is treated not as feedback, but as a flaw in character. This system may produce marks—but it produces fear far more efficiently.

Pressure without Protection : Indian schooling operates like a pressure chamber. Marks determine worth, board examinations determine destiny, and rank lists decide who is celebrated and who is quietly erased. A small group of "toppers" is showcased as proof of success, while the majority absorb anxiety, comparison, and self-doubt. Rising levels of stress,

depression, and burnout among schoolchildren are not unfortunate side effects; they are predictable outcomes. In a VUCA world, fragile minds are not a personal failure. They are a systemic one.

What the Penguins Understood : Nature offers a lesson our education system refuses to learn. In 2007, scientists studying Emperor penguins in Antarctica observed how they survive temperatures below -40°C. A penguin standing alone will die. Survival is possible only through collective behaviour. Penguins form a huddle—but crucially, they rotate. Those facing the freezing winds move inward, while those protected move outward. This slow, coordinated movement—the Penguin Walk—ensures that no penguin is permanently exposed and none permanently shielded. There is no



competition, no sacrifice of the weak. Nature solved the VUCA problem long ago. Indian school education has chosen to ignore it.

Regulators Cannot Evade Responsibility : This failure rests squarely with those who design and regulate the system. The Ministry of Education, State Education Departments, CBSE, ICSE, and examination boards continue to reward compliance over comprehension and ranking over resilience. Despite repeated policy announcements—most notably NEP 2020—assessment reform remains cosmetic, board exams retain disproportionate power, rank lists persist, and teacher autonomy remains constrained by bureaucratic oversight. Vision documents are celebrated; classroom realities are untouched. When stress rises and learning collapses, regulators re-

spond with circulars, not structural change. This is not a gap of intent—it is a failure of enforcement and accountability.

The Anti-Penguin Walk Classroom—and the Choice Ahead : Our classrooms function on the opposite logic of survival. Students are isolated through constant ranking. Pressure is concentrated on many, while protection is reserved for a few. Failure is punished instead of analysed. This is not meritocracy; it is abandonment disguised as excellence. Teachers, reduced to syllabus clerks and data-entry agents, are denied the space to teach judgment under uncertainty. Marks will not protect children from change, and rank lists will not build resilience. The Penguin Walk offers an unforgiving lesson: survival belongs to systems that move together—not to individuals pushed to endure alone. Indian schools must decide—now—whether they exist to produce obedient exam-takers or confident, adaptable citizens. The cost of choosing wrong will be paid by a generation taught to fear the future instead of facing it.

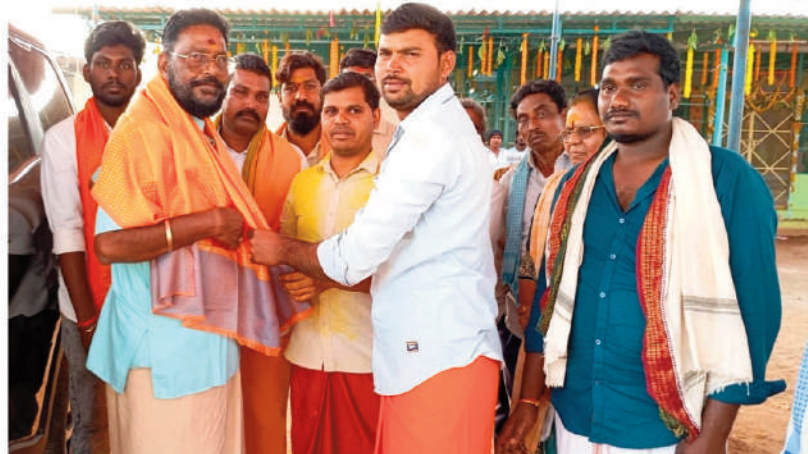

Savings of a Rupee a Day Builds ₹8-Crore School : Kurnool Women's Collective Sets an Example

Kurnool : What began as a quiet dream among a group of rural women who wanted better education for their children has today grown into an inspiring success story. A collective of self-help group women in Orvakal mandal of Kurnool district has built a corporate-style school campus worth nearly ₹8 crore through daily savings, voluntary labour and unwavering determination.

The initiative, led by nearly 10,000 women from thrift groups, resulted in the establishment of Balabharati School, a sprawling institution that now stands as a symbol of collective strength and social commitment. Most of the women involved had little or no formal education, but they were united by a shared belief that quality schooling could transform the lives of their children.

The journey dates back to 1995, when two small thrift



groups were formed in Hussenapur village. The idea gradually spread to 22 villages in the mandal, eventually creating around 1,000 savings groups with nearly 10,000 members. Each woman saved just one rupee a day. Over time, the pooled

₹70 crore to support women-led livelihoods. The turnover of the Orvakal mandal federation rose to about ₹84 crore, enabling the women to establish their own cooperative banking structure. In 2008, the federation launched a small school in rented rooms beside its office and named it Balabharati in honour of advisor Vijayabharati, who had encouraged the women's movement. The dream soon expanded — they wanted a permanent campus that could match corporate schools in facilities and standards.

The federation purchased seven acres of land about a kilometre from Orvakal and began construction. In an extraordinary display of solidarity, the women and their families worked as labourers and masons themselves. For eight years, they contributed voluntary labour without taking wages, carrying bricks, cement and sand, and laying the foundation of the multi-

storey building.

The planned campus includes 60 spacious classrooms across three floors; 40 rooms have already been completed and are in use. A large playground spread over three acres, quality furniture, school buses, CCTV surveillance, audio systems and qualified teachers add to the institution's modern infrastructure. The school uniform and campus design reflect the founders' desire to give rural children an environment comparable to elite urban schools.

Built entirely from the women's pooled savings — about ₹7 crore — and their physical labour, the Balabharati School stands as a rare example of grassroots community action. At a time when social divisions often dominate public discourse, the Orvakal women have demonstrated the power of unity, discipline and vision in shaping a better future for the next generation.

On this occasion, SP Paritosh, in a statement, said that the innocence and vulnerabilities of the public are



the strength of cyber criminals, who are committing various types of cyber frauds. In today's era of widespread technology, cyber criminals are using artificial intelligence to commit crimes in new ways.

He advised people to stay informed and alert about cyber crimes and warned them not to open unnecessary or unknown links that could lead to trouble. He cautioned people not to fall into the traps laid by cyber criminals due to the lure of easy money, and to remember that "easy money means fraud."

He noted that even educated individuals are increasingly becoming victims of cyber crimes. He urged

awareness about multi-level marketing scams, fake trading, part-time job frauds, investment frauds, and so-called "digital arrest" scams, explaining that criminals often lure victims by initially showing small returns and later cheat them online.

He clarified that there is no such thing as a digital arrest and that no one should be afraid of it. He advised people to avoid interactions with strangers online and not to open unknown links or APK files, which can lead to fraud.

If anyone becomes a victim of a cyber crime, SP Paritosh advised them to immediately call 1930 within the "golden hour"/within 48 hours, or register a complaint on the NCRB portal at <https://www.cybercrime.gov.in>.

Care must be taken to prevent errors in the votes counting in Municipality Elections : Collector Adarsh Surabhi

Wanaparthy : Collector Adarsh Surabhi instructed that the vote counting process for the municipality elections should be conducted with utmost care and transparency, and that precautions should be taken to avoid any errors during the counting.

The Collector instructed the officials to strictly follow the election rules and make the counting process a success. TOT Srinivasulu, ROs, and other election officials participated in this meeting.

DCA cracks down on illegal sale, label tampering of habit-forming drugs in Telangana

Hyderabad : The Drug Control Administration (DCA), Telangana, conducted raids at two locations and busted illegal sale of habit-forming medicines and tampering of drug labels in separate incidents.

In Mahabubabad district, DCA officials detected the illegal sale of habit-forming drugs at Sri Laxmi Ganapathi Medical and General Stores in Maripeda village. The shop, operated by Upender Maloth, was found selling Tramadol injections, Tramadol tablets and Alprazolam tablets to drug addicts without maintaining mandatory records.

Officials seized records related to the sale of habit-forming medicines and initiated further investigation. Authorities said the unauthorised sale of such drugs poses a serious threat to pub-



lic health and violates provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act. In another operation, DCA teams uncovered tampering of drug labels of institutional supply stocks at Sri Laxmi Srinivasa Medical and General Stores in Palvancha, Bhadradi-Kothagudem district. The stocks were seized during the inspection.

The DCA warned medical shop operators against illegal sale and manipulation of pharmaceutical products, stating that strict action would be taken against violators. Officials urged the public to report suspicious drug sales to help curb misuse of habit-forming medicines.
