



Young India Schools project sparks row over cost escalation, tender premiums

(Capital Information)

Hyderabad : The proposed Young India International Residential Schools project has triggered a political and administrative controversy after allegations surfaced over sharp cost escalation and higher-than-estimated tender premiums in the multi-crore construction programme.

According to details circulating in official and contractor circles, the construction cost of each residential school has been pegged at about ₹200 crore, significantly higher than the initial estimate of ₹125 crore per campus. With the total project outlay touching around ₹11,500 crore, critics allege that excess quoting in tenders could add an additional burden of nearly ₹1,000 crore to the exchequer.

Officials have already approved 79 schools, and tenders have reportedly been finalised for 76 of them. The government aims to complete all campuses within three years.

Tender documents indicate that several companies, including Megha Engineering & Infrastructures Ltd (MEIL), quoted 4.5 to 4.95 per cent above the estimated contract value. Of the awarded works, 16 projects have gone to MEIL, nine to BSR Infra, and two to BPR Infra. Authorities are yet to call tenders for three proposed schools due to non-availability of land.

Opposition leaders have demanded transparency in the bidding process and sought a detailed public explanation for the escalation in per-school costs. However, officials associated with the project maintain that the revised estimates reflect expanded infrastructure, international-standard facilities, and rising construction input costs.

The Young India Schools initiative is being projected as a flagship education infrastructure programme aimed at providing high-end residential schooling facilities, but the financial aspects of the project are likely to remain under sharp scrutiny in the coming weeks.

He stated that every foundation stone laying and inauguration of development works in Wyra took place during Congress rule, and that those who governed the state for ten years had not undertaken a single new initiative.

He informed that a 100-bed hospital is under construction to provide free medical care to the poor, and that funds have been allocated for the construction of a junior college to strengthen educational infrastructure. He also said that the ITI is being upgraded into an Advanced Technology Centre and that a Polytechnic College has been sanctioned.

Referring to local traders, he said that roadside shops were demolished five years ago, leaving the town disfigured with bare walls. After locals brought this to his notice, he immediately called for the file just yesterday and got approval sanctioned for the construction of a shopping complex. (Cont. on Pg 2)

Opposition alleges foul play in forensic lab fire, seeks probe

Hyderabad : A political controversy erupted on Saturday after a fire broke out at the State Forensic Science Laboratory in the heart of the capital, with opposition voices alleging possible foul play and demanding a high-level investigation into the incident.

Some opposition leaders claimed the timing of the fire — coinciding with the ongoing municipal election activity —

had raised suspicions. They alleged that crucial evidence linked to pending cases may have been targeted and called for an independent inquiry under judicial supervision. The ruling establishment has not responded in detail to the allegations so far.

Senior police officials said a preliminary assessment suggested the fire was brought under control without casualties and that a technical

team has begun examining the cause. Authorities stated that it was too early to draw conclusions and urged political parties to avoid speculation until the investigation is completed.

Government sources maintained that all standard safety protocols were in place at the facility and assured that a comprehensive report would be made public. Fire department officials said the

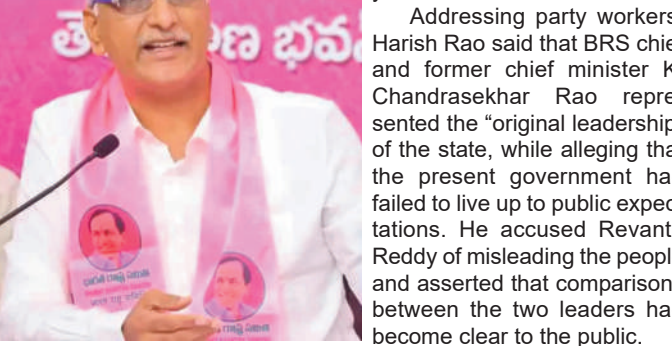
exact origin of the blaze would be determined only after a forensic audit of the site.

The incident has triggered sharp exchanges between political parties, with the opposition pressing for transparency and the government accusing rivals of politicising an accident. Officials reiterated that the inquiry findings would clarify whether the fire was accidental or deliberate.

Harish Rao hits back at CM Revanth Reddy, bats for KCR's return

Hyderabad : Former minister and senior BRS leader T. Harish Rao launched a sharp attack on Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Sunday, claiming that the people of Telangana have already recognised the difference between "the original and the fake leadership" within two-and-a-half years.



Addressing party workers, Harish Rao said that BRS chief and former chief minister K. Chandrashekar Rao represented the "original leadership" of the state, while alleging that the present government had failed to live up to public expectations. He accused Revanth Reddy of misleading the people and asserted that comparisons between the two leaders had become clear to the public.

The former minister urged party cadres to strengthen the BRS at the grassroots and work towards bringing KCR back to power. He expressed confidence that the electorate would once again rally behind the pink party, stating that only KCR could provide stable and experienced leadership to Telangana.

Harish Rao also called on supporters to intensify campaigning in favour of the BRS symbol in the coming political battles, saying that the party would mount a strong comeback. His remarks come amid escalating political sparring between the ruling Congress and the opposition BRS, with both sides trading accusations over governance and development.

AIVA holds round table meet condemning CM's remarks on Velama community

Hyderabad : The All India Velama Association (AIVA) organised an emergency round table meeting in Hyderabad on Sunday condemning what it described as "inappropriate and repeated remarks" made by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy against the Velama community.

The meeting was held at the AIVA office in Himayatnagar and attended by representatives of Velama associations from the Telugu states, senior members of the community, lawyers, and a large number of students. Participants alleged that the Chief Minister's recent speech at Miryalaguda targeted the community and hurt its sentiments. Speakers at the meeting said such comments reflected a disregard for social harmony and demanded restraint in political discourse.

AIVA representatives urged Velama MLAs and MLCs in the Congress party to respond immediately and press for a public apology from the Chief Minister. They warned that failure to do so



would raise questions about their commitment to the community's self-respect. The association also resolved to explore legal options, stating that the remarks amounted to an affront to the dignity of a social group. Legal experts present at the meeting were asked to examine possible courses of action.

Announcing future programmes, AIVA leaders said the agitation would be intensified across the state if no corrective steps were taken. They called for protests at village, mandal and district levels to

register what they termed as a movement for community self-respect.

The association demanded an unconditional public apology from the Chief Minister, an end to caste-based insults in political speeches, and steps by the government to ensure that no community's dignity is undermined. AIVA leaders said the press meet was intended to demonstrate unity within the Velama community and asserted that they would continue to work collectively for their interests beyond party lines.



Women's welfare top priority for Govt : Mayor Gadwal Vijayalakshmi

Hyderabad : Mayor Gadwal Vijayalakshmi said the state government is according top priority to the welfare and development of women through a series of focused initiatives.

On Sunday, the Mayor, along with Khairatabad MLA Danam Nager, inaugurated the newly constructed first floor of a women's building built at a cost of ₹29 lakh in Banjara Hills division of Khairatabad constituency.

Later, at Siram Nagar, the Mayor and the MLA inaugurated a G+3 modern multi-purpose community hall proposed with a budget of ₹2 crore. The Mayor said she had taken special initiative for the construction of the modern facility aimed at serving local residents, particularly women and community groups.

Speaking on the occasion, Vijayalakshmi said that under the leadership of the Chief Minister, the government has implemented several development programmes focused on women's welfare. Over the past five years, GHMC has worked in coordination with the state government and taken special steps to strengthen welfare infrastructure for women, she added.

Revanth Reddy orchestrated the FSL fire incident to destroy the evidence in his cash-for-votes case : KTR

Hanamakonda : The FSL fire incident is undoubtedly a conspiracy.

This fire incident is a drama staged to permanently eliminate the evidence in the cash-for-votes case.

There are many suspicions surrounding the FSL fire incident.

Bharat Rashtra Samithi Working President KTR alleged that the Chief Minister, who is accused in the cash-for-votes case, conspired and burned the evidence in the fire incident that occurred yesterday at the Forensic Science Laboratory in Nampally. KTR alleged that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who also holds the Home Ministry portfolio, is behind this incident because the cash-for-votes case was nearing its conclusion and a conviction was imminent. KTR said that the people of the state also share this opinion. KTR alleged that Telangana has been witnessing numerous atrocities for the past two years because a criminal and a thief like Revanth Reddy is the Chief Minister of the state, and that the recent fire accident at the forensic lab is part of a series of such incidents. He further stated that the fire at the forensic laboratory, which housed all the evidence in the cash-for-votes case in which Revanth



Reddy was caught red-handed, is being portrayed as an accident to deliberately destroy all the evidence. He said that the fact that it took three and a half hours to extinguish the flames on the first floor of a mere three-story building is sufficient proof of a conspiracy.

KTR expressed several doubts about the manner in which the accident occurred. He said that the fire breaking out in a highly secure forensic lab during the winter season, the claim that no employees were present at a place where employees are supposed to be present 24 hours a

day, and the government's statement today that all the evidence related to numerous cases from 2015 onwards has been completely destroyed, after initially claiming yesterday that the accident was not serious, all indicate that this was definitely orchestrated by Revanth Reddy.

KTR stated that the cash-for-votes case has been ongoing for 11 years and is currently in its final stages, and that this fire accident is a drama and a conspiracy to escape from it. KTR expressed suspicion that Revanth Reddy had the forensic lab set on fire at the behest of some

individuals colluding with the BJP in Delhi and on the orders of the Delhi high command. KTR said that this is why the evidence, records, computers, and even the servers in the building were completely destroyed in a fire that raged uninterrupted for three and a half hours. He stated that a total of 50 computers and servers were burnt.

He expressed anguish that evidence related to thousands of heinous crimes and the criminals involved was also destroyed in this incident, giving them the opportunity to roam freely in society. He questioned why the govern-

ment, which initially claimed that there was not much damage in yesterday's incident, is now stating in the FIR that the office containing all the evidence and the room with the evidence were completely burnt down. He said that since the culprit is the Chief Minister of the state, they consider this incident a conspiratorial accident. He alleged that Revanth Reddy, who is already colluding with the central government to cover up his corruption and illegal activities, is continuing this clandestine agreement with the central government even in the cash-for-votes case.

KTR demanded that Revanth Reddy, who bows down to Union Minister Amit Shah every time he goes to Delhi, has orchestrated a deadly conspiracy to destroy the evidence because the matter is in court and there is a possibility of him being punished. He demanded that the central government immediately intervene and bring out the truth in this matter. He said that it is necessary to clearly tell the public that the 'big boss' is not protecting the 'small fry' Revanth Reddy, and that if

there is no collusion between the BJP and Revanth Reddy, the central government should immediately conduct a thorough investigation into this matter with its top investigative agencies.

Along with this, he challenged the government to appoint a retired judge to get to the bottom of this issue. On the other hand, he said that they have no faith in the state police system, and that many police officers are acting as the Chief Minister's private army. He challenged the state government's police system and the DGP to reveal the truth if they have the courage. He said that everyone in Telangana knows how the Chief Minister is using the state's police system like his private army, from land settlements to the atrocities committed by the police acting as a private army for the Chief Minister's family members and brothers-in-law. He mentioned the incident where a close associate of the Chief Minister, Rohit Reddy, threatened a follower of Minister Konda Surekha with a gun, putting it to his head, and extorted 300 crore rupees.

He said that the file for the construction of an underground drainage system in Wyra is being processed at a fast pace.

Shivraj Singh Chouhan emphasised that this agreement carries a clear message for the entire world as well.

"This deal sends a message to the world that India's policy is one of commitment, not compromise. We take decisions in the interest of the country with full confidence," the Union Minister said. He further added that India is moving forward on the international stage with a balanced and positive strategy. We do not engage in the politics of bargaining; instead, we adopt a balanced strategy and believe in positive dialogue. He remarked that all concerns in the country's mind regarding Indian agriculture and farmers have been addressed in this trade deal. This agreement keeps our farmers completely secure.

The Union Minister said that many agricultural products of Indian farmers will now be exported to the United States of America with zero tariffs. Tariffs that were previously up to 50 per cent on several agricultural products have now been reduced to zero by the USA. No election campaign should be conducted 48 hours before the end of polling: Collector and District Election Officer B. Chandra Shekhar

Nalgonda : District Collector and District Election Officer B. Chandra Shekhar has advised political parties and candidates contesting in the mu-



nicipal elections not to conduct any election campaign 48 hours before the end of polling for the municipal elections.

Issuing orders to this effect on Friday, he said that the polling for the municipal elections will be held on the 11th of this month from 7 am to 5 pm. He said that no election campaign should be conducted 48 hours before the end of polling as per the orders of the State Election Commission.

He said that especially those contesting in connection with the elections, political parties should not organize any public meetings, conferences, processions. He also said that the election campaign should not be shown to the public through various media, and that no programs should be undertaken with the intention of attracting the people of the respective polling areas, and that the election campaign should not be promoted.

It was clarified that if anyone violates the election rules and undertakes the above activities, the person violating the prohibitory orders will be punished with imprisonment for up to two years and a fine.

Therefore, keeping these matters in mind, all political parties in the district and candidates contesting the municipal elections are requested to cooperate.

PIB Hyderabad Media Delegation Concludes Five-Day Odisha Tour

PIB-Led Media Delegation Explores Odisha Development Initiatives, Meets Governor

Hyderabad : A six-member media delegation from Telangana, led by the Press Information Bureau (PIB), Hyderabad, concluded its five-day official visit to Bhubaneswar, Odisha.

The tour ended with a courtesy meeting with the Governor of Odisha, Dr. Hari Babu Kambhampati, at Lok Bhavan, Bhubaneswar on Friday.

The tour, organised by PIB Hyderabad, aimed to provide journalists with first-hand exposure to key development initiatives of the Government of India while also highlighting Odisha's cultural heritage, infrastructure growth, and research institutions. The delegation was welcomed in Bhubaneswar by Akhil Kumar Mishra, Additional Director General of PIB and the Central Bureau of Communication,

who briefed members on the state's media landscape and outreach programmes.

During the its five days visit, the delegation toured premier institutions such as the Central Institute of Freshwater Aquaculture (CIFA) and the Institute of Minerals and Materials Technology (IMMT), also explored major heritage and cultural sites, including the Kalabhumis Arts and Crafts Museum, Lingaraja Temple, Dhau Shanti Stupa, the UNESCO World Heritage Sun Temple at Konark, Raghurajpur Heritage Craft Village, and the Jagannath Temple in Puri, gaining insights into Odisha's rich architectural, religious, and cultural traditions.

The five-day visit concluded with a courtesy call on the Governor of Odisha, Dr. Hari Babu Kambhampati, at Lok Bhavan, where the delegation interacted with senior officials and shared their experiences from the exposure visit. In their interaction with the delegation, Governor Dr. Hari Babu Kambhampati highlighted Odisha's steady economic growth, major infrastructure investments exceeding 1.30 lakh crore, expansion of railway connectivity to all districts, and the development of ports, highways, and industrial corridors. He also emphasised the State's leadership in millet production, mineral-based industries, and the growth of education and skill-development institutions such as IIT, AIIMS, NISER, and the World Skill Center.



Delhi: The capital or a city of vanishing lives?

The nation's capital, Delhi, is often touted as a symbol of power, security, and modernity. Soaring buildings, claims of a smart city, 24-hour surveillance cameras, and one of the world's largest police systems—all of this gives rise to the belief that Delhi is safe. But statistics from the first fifteen days of 2026 cast deep doubt on this confidence. According to official Delhi Police data, 807 people went missing between January 1 and 15 alone. On average, 54 people disappeared every day, or more than two people every hour, in the city. This is not a simple crime statistic that can be ignored as part of routine reporting.

The most alarming aspect of this entire picture is that 509 of the missing people are women and girls. This means that nearly two-thirds of the cases are directly related to women's safety. In a capital that makes the most claims about women's safety, the disappearance of women and girls on such a large scale raises serious questions about the system. This is not just a sign of crime, but of the normalization of insecurity, where even the disappearance of women becomes a statistic.

Of these 807 missing cases, 191 involve minors. Of these, 146 are girls. This means that in just fifteen days, an average of 13 children went missing every day, and the majority were girls. This fact should be a wake-up call for any sensitive society. But our societal response is often not as swift as it should be. Statistics are read, debates are held, and then the next news comes.

According to the Delhi Police, 235 people have been found, but 572 remain missing. This number isn't just an administrative progress report. It symbolizes the uncertainty, anguish, and endless wait of 572 families. Each passing day dims the hope of those whose loved ones suddenly disappeared. The question isn't whether some people have been found, but why so many remain untraced.

An uncomfortable but important question is whether every missing person case is taken with equal seriousness. The practical reality is that the disappearances of the poor, migrant workers, domestic workers, or slum dwellers are often taken lightly. In many cases, the initial reaction is filled with suspicion—"He might have run away from home," "He might have gone to a relative's place." This mindset proves even more dangerous, especially in cases involving girls, as initial negligence can lead to irreparable harm later on.

The disappearances of women and children are not solely driven by personal reasons. They involve many sinister aspects, including human trafficking, organized crime, illegal labor, sexual exploitation, domestic violence, and forced marriage. Metropolises like Delhi are not only destinations for these networks, but also transit points. Therefore, it becomes crucial that every missing person case is not simply recorded as a "missing person" but is instead investigated seriously, taking into account potential criminality.

This becomes even more worrying when we consider that all this is happening in the age of technology. Despite technologies like mobile phones, location data, CCTV cameras, digital payments, and social media, if people are still going missing on such a large scale, it reflects either a lack of proper use of resources or a lack of will. When an entire city can be brought to a standstill in a matter of minutes for a VIP movement, why isn't the same urgency shown when an ordinary citizen goes missing?

This problem isn't limited to the police or the government. Society's role and our collective silence are equally responsible. We read the news, feel briefly concerned, and then return to our daily lives. Unless a missing person is found within our family, neighborhood, or circle of acquaintances, they remain distant news. This indifference further exacerbates the problem.

Every government declares women's safety a priority. Helpline numbers, mobile apps, awareness campaigns, and fast-track courts are announced. But the reality on the ground repeatedly belies these claims. If policies were truly effective, 509 women and girls would not have gone missing in the country's capital within a span of fifteen days. This discrepancy exposes the gap between policy and practice.

It's time for introspection. It's time to ask whether our policies are limited to paper. Is every missing case reviewed in a timely manner? Is accountability fixed for negligence? Often, the answers to these questions are lost in silence, and this silence only exacerbates the problem.

This crisis cannot be solved by a single department or a single order. It requires a coordinated effort—police sensitivity, administrative activism, social awareness, and political will all come together. Missing women and children cases must be treated as emergencies, not as routine procedures.

Ultimately, the question isn't just how modern or smart Delhi is. The real question is whether the city is able to protect its most vulnerable citizens. If the answer is negative, it's a failure not just of the administration, but of our collective failure. Missing people aren't just names in statistics. They're a test of our social consciousness—and right now, we seem to be failing this test.

Raise fee reimbursement issue in Assembly: SFI urges Tirupati MLA

Tirupati : SFI leaders submitted a memorandum to Tirupati MLA Arani Srinivasulu on Sunday, demanding the immediate release of approximately ₹7,000 crores in pending fee reimbursement arrears accumulated over the last seven quarters. They urged the MLA to raise this issue during the upcoming budget sessions in the State Assembly.



Obstruction to students' education : SFI State Vice President Bhagath Ravi and District President P. Pavithra stated that poor and middle-class students are facing severe financial hardships due to the delay in fee payments. They expressed concern that many students are on the verge of dropping out as they are unable to pay the required fees.

Arrears totaling ₹7,000 crores : The leaders noted that lakhs of students pursuing Degree, Engineering, and Post-Graduation courses across the state rely entirely on the government's fee reimbursement scheme. They explained that with arrears pending for the last two years, students are facing significant difficulties, especially during examination periods, in both private and government colleges.

Request to the Tirupati MLA : They requested the government to respond immediately and ensure justice for every eligible student without any restrictive conditions. The student leaders urged the MLA to bring this matter to the government's notice and exert pressure during the Assembly sessions to ensure the release of the pending funds.

SFI District Assistant Secretariat members Venkatalakshmi, Ravindra, Srinivasulu, and City Committee members Ajay, Markandeyulu, and Maruti were among those who participated in the program.

Voters Should Exercise Their Franchise Freely in Municipal Elections : SP D.V.Srinivasa Rao

Medak : In view of the municipal elections scheduled to be held on the 11th of this month, Medak District Superintendent of Police D. V.Srinivasa Rao stated that strong police security arrangements have been made across the District.

He said that strict measures are being taken by the District police department to conduct the second general municipal elections peacefully in the Medak, Ramayampet, Toopran, and Narsapur municipalities under Medak District.

Police surveillance has been further strengthened across the District. He emphasized that measures are being taken to ensure voters can freely exercise their right to vote without falling prey to inducements. He warned that everyone must strictly follow the election code of conduct and that non-bailable cases will be registered against those who indulge in unnecessary disturbances.



The SP informed that a security plan has been prepared with about 600 police personnel deployed across the four municipal centers. Elections will be held at 150 polling stations across 75 wards. Out of these, 21 polling stations have been identified as sensitive, and special surveillance has been arranged.

As part of the election process, flag marches were conducted in sensitive areas. He further stated that individuals who may create disturbances during the elections, those with a criminal history, and rowdy-sheeters have been identified in advance, and preventive bind-over action has been taken against about 1,206 persons.

Through extensive inspections in the district, cash amounting to ₹2,69,000 has been seized so far. In 40 cases, 557.44 liters of liquor worth approximately ₹5,23,250 has been seized. Additionally, drugs weighing 336 grams worth ₹3,36,000 were confiscated. Freebies worth ₹9,25,250 were also seized. The total value of all seized items amounts to ₹20,54,660.

Six cases have been registered against individuals for violating the Model Code of Conduct, the SP said. He added that special surveillance has been arranged through CCTV cameras and appealed to the people of the district to cooperate with the police department to ensure the elections are conducted in a peaceful atmosphere.

The polling process must be conducted meticulously without any errors : District Election Officer, Collector Kumar Deepak

Mancherial : District Election Officer and Collector Kumar Deepak stated that the polling process for the 2nd general municipal elections, scheduled for the 11th of this month, must be conducted meticulously without any room for errors. On Sunday, he attended a training program for Presiding Officers (PO) and Assistant Presiding Officers (APO) conducted under the supervision of master trainers at the S.M. Function Hall in Bellampalli mandal center of the district.

On this occasion, the District Election Officer and Collector said that the polling process for the 2nd general municipal elections should be conducted meticulously. He stated that arrangements have been made to ensure that polling takes place with



no more than 800 voters at each polling station, and that the staff assigned to each polling station should be aware of every aspect of the polling process.

He emphasized that the secrecy of the voting compartment must be maintained properly. He instructed that

all precautions should be taken to prevent impersonation and multiple voting, and that the training would cover the precautions to be taken and the rules to be followed after the polling concludes.

He assured that all basic amenities such as drinking water, toilets, lighting, and

fans would be provided to the polling officers at the polling stations. He stressed that every voting-related form must be filled completely on the polling day and that everyone should be vigilant to avoid any errors in the polling process.

He stated that everyone performing election duties should exercise their right to vote through postal ballot. He informed that polling will be conducted on the 11th, re-polling (if any) on the 12th, and the counting of votes will be undertaken on the 13th.

He emphasized that officers and staff performing election duties must compulsorily exercise their right to vote through postal ballot and that awareness should be created to ensure that every eligible person exercises their right to vote. He warned that if any negligence

is shown in election duties, action will be taken according to the election code of conduct.

However, since it was

While the body of Padma, who died in the accident, was found, the body of her husband Pullaiah was yet to be found, and all teams have been conducting search operations since Sunday morning.
