



BJP SEEKS ACTION OVER AIMIM WALKOUT DURING VANDE MATARAM

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad, Khammam Bureau : The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has demanded strict action against AIMIM MLAs for allegedly walking out of the Telangana Leg-

islative Assembly while the national song 'Vande Mataram' was being sung. Describing the incident as an insult to national sentiment and constitutional values, BJP Telangana State President Ramchander Rao, State Treasurer Devaki Vasudeva Rao, along



with other party leaders, met the Governor and submitted a formal complaint seeking intervention. Speaking after the representation, BJP leaders said that 'Vande Mataram' is not just a

song, but a symbol of India's freedom struggle and national pride. They stated that walking out during its rendition reflects a lack of respect toward national symbols and raises serious concerns over the conduct of elected representatives in the Assembly. The party

alleged that such actions hurt public sentiment and diminish the dignity of the House.

The BJP further said that the matter cannot be treated as a routine political issue, as it concerns the honour of the nation. The party urged the authorities to take immediate and appropriate action against the legislators involved and maintained that such incidents should not be allowed to recur in a constitutional institution like the Assembly. BJP leaders also questioned the silence of those present in the House during the episode.

Among those who participated were BJP Telangana State President Ramchander Rao, State Treasurer Devaki Vasudeva Rao, BJP State Office-Bearers, and senior party leaders.

Harish Rao dares Revanth Reddy to contest from Siddipet, predicts BRS return to power

Hyderabad : BRSLP deputy leader and former Minister T Harish Rao threw down the gauntlet at Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy to contest from Siddipet, in response to the latter's offer of a ministerial berth to any Congress leader winning Siddipet constituency. He predicted that the Congress government would not return to power in the next Assembly elections.

"Why send someone else? Revanth Reddy himself should come and contest against me in Siddipet. Let the people decide," he said, adding that the present term would be Revanth Reddy's last.

During an informal interaction with reporters at the Assembly on Wednesday, Harish Rao said the BRS would form the next government and party president K Chandrashekar Rao would once again become the Chief Minister. "Even if Revanth Reddy stands on his head in penance, he will not become the Chief Minister again. The



next government will be formed by the BRS," he declared.

The BRSLP deputy leader accused the Congress government of deceiving all sections of society, particularly BCs, SCs, STs and minorities, by failing to implement its election guarantees. Citing replies given by the government in the Assembly, he said less than two per cent of the funds allocated for community welfare corporations were actually spent, calling it proof of neglect towards weaker sections.

"In the last two years, the

Congress government spent Rs 6 crore of Rs 1,370 crore allocated to BC Corporation, Rs 52 crore of Rs 2,730 crore allocated to ST Corporation and Rs 74 crore of Rs 5,403 crore allocated to SC Corporation. Similar is the case of funds allocated to various communities in the State," he said, adding that the Budget disappointed every section of society, prompting BRS legislators to protest in the House.

Harish Rao also said the government misled unemployed youth by taking credit for job appointments based on posts sanctioned during the previous BRS regime. Citing reply to question raised by BRS working president and Sircilla MLA KT Rama Rao, he said the government admitted to have issued 16 notifications and filling 16,978 jobs since the Congress

came to power. "This government only handed over appointment letters to 50,785 people and taking credit for work done by the previous BRS government," he said.

Criticising the conduct of Assembly proceedings, the BRSLP deputy leader said discussions were being curtailed and key questions were not being taken up. He said even Zero Hour was not being conducted regularly. He demanded that the Budget session be extended by a week to allow proper debate on public issues.

Welcoming delimitation and women's reservation, Harish Rao felt that an increase in Assembly seats would ultimately benefit the BRS, while cautioning that Southern States could face disadvantages due to population-based delimitation for effectively implementing population control norms.

"As in football, we know when to score the goal," he said, reiterating that the BRS would return to power in the next elections.

Jeevan Reddy Resigns from Congress Emotional Scenes in Jagtial

Jagtial : Senior Congress leader and former minister T. Jeevan Reddy announced his resignation from the Congress party, bringing an end to his four-decade-long political association. The development triggered emotional scenes in Jagtial, with supporters and party workers expressing solidarity with the veteran leader.

Amid slogans raised by followers and local leaders, Jeevan Reddy, wearing the Congress scarf, walked from Indira Bhavan to the Jambhi Hanuman temple, where he offered prayers. He later proceeded to Bandari Garden, where he formally declared his decision to quit the party.

Speaking on the occasion, Jeevan Reddy said he was compelled to take the step due to humiliation and mental distress experienced in recent times. He recalled that he had joined the Congress in 1984 and had wit-



nessed both victories and defeats, but was deeply hurt by what he described as the failure to safeguard the rights and dignity of grassroots party workers.

He criticised the party leadership over issues such as internal organisational matters, appointments in local bodies, and inadequate response to attacks on party workers. "Positions are not important... self-respect is paramount," he said, adding that he would continue to fight for the

rights of the people.

Several mandal-level leaders, Youth Congress functionaries, women leaders, sarpanches, councillors, and a large number of activists also announced their resignations from party posts and primary membership. Supporters declared that they would stand firmly with Jeevan Reddy.

Political observers believe that this development could mark a significant turning point in Jagtial's political landscape.

HYDRA Commissioner Inspects Encroachments Following Prajavani Complaints

Hyderabad : Following several grievances raised during the 'Pravajani' program, HYDRA Commissioner AV Ranganath conducted extensive field inspections across Sangareddy district on Wednesday. The Commissioner focused on allegations of land grabbing, layout tampering, and the illegal blockage of water channels in Patancheru and Aminpur mandals.

In Patancheru's Patighanapur village, the Commissioner inspected the Anand Nagar layout. Originally spread across 92 acres with 1,109 plots approved by the Gram Panchayat in 1980, victims alleged that land grabbers had erased layout boundaries and re-registered the land as agricultural property through the Dharani portal. Despite several



plots having valid LRS (Layout Regularization Scheme) documents, park spaces and roads were reportedly occupied. Commissioner Ranganath interacted with a large number of affected plot owners and directed officials to identify the original layout boundaries and clear all encroachments on public utility

spaces. 1,650 plots over 180 acres, was being illegally carved into 100-square-yard parcels for sale. While instructing officials to fence off government lands to prevent further encroachments, Ranganath reassured existing residents and genuine buyers that they need not panic.

The visit concluded with an inspection of the Shambhuni Kunta outlet in Beeramguda. Residents complained of severe flooding caused by a construction company that had blocked the natural surplus weir (nala) for a new venture. Taking serious note of the violation, the Commissioner ordered the immediate restoration of the floodwater canals and directed officials to book criminal cases against the responsible construction firms.



Telangana Police Personnel Awarded Medals for Meritorious Service

Hyderabad : Telangana Police have been awarded medals in recognition of their meritorious service and exemplary performance in duty, according to an official release issued on Wednesday.

The honours were conferred as part of the Republic Day awards announced by the Government of India. The recipients were commended for their dedication, professionalism and significant contributions to maintaining law and order.

Among the awardees, a Deputy Superintendent of Police was recognised for outstanding leadership, while inspectors and other ranks were acknowledged for their consistent service record and commitment in handling sensitive assignments. Their work in crime detection, public safety and effective policing practices earned them the distinction.

Senior officials noted that such recognitions not only honour individual excellence but also motivate the entire force to uphold high standards of service. The awardees expressed gratitude to the department and reaffirmed their commitment to serving the public with integrity.

The Telangana Police leadership congratulated the medal recipients and stated that their achievements reflect the department's ongoing efforts to strengthen policing standards across the state.

Modi briefs Parliament on West Asia crisis, urges unity and vigilance

New Delhi : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday briefed both Houses of Parliament on the ongoing conflict in West Asia, stressing the need for national preparedness, diplomatic engagement and coordinated efforts to safeguard India's economic and strategic interests.

Addressing the Lok Sabha on March 23 and the Rajya Sabha the following day, Mr. Modi described the situation as "deeply concerning", noting its impact on global trade routes, energy supplies and humanitarian conditions. He reiterated India's position that peace, dialogue and diplomacy remained the only sustainable solutions to the crisis.

The Prime Minister said India had significant stakes in the region, including trade links, dependence on the Strait of Hormuz for crude oil, gas and fertiliser imports, and the safety of millions of Indian nationals working in Gulf countries. He condemned attacks

on civilian infrastructure and commercial shipping, terming any obstruction to international waterways unacceptable.

Modi informed Parliament that more than 3.75 lakh Indi-

ans had been evacuated since the conflict escalated, with missions abroad operating round-the-clock control rooms to assist citizens. The government was also in constant diplomatic contact with countries in the region and major global powers.

On the energy front, he said strategic petroleum reserves exceeding 53 lakh met-

tonnes were being maintained, with plans to expand capacity further. Fuel supplies remained stable, with refineries directed to maximise domestic LPG production and States asked to monitor hoarding and black-marketing. He added that foodgrain and fertiliser stocks were adequate, while security agencies remained on alert to ensure uninterrupted supply chains.

Referring to his recent telephone conversation with U.S. President Donald Trump, the Prime Minister said both leaders had emphasised the importance of keeping the Strait of Hormuz open and secure for global shipping.

He appealed to citizens to avoid panic and misinformation, clarifying that there was no proposal for lockdown or movement restrictions. Calling for a "Team India" approach, Modi urged State governments and the public to work together to meet potential long-term challenges arising from the conflict.

'Ippa Sara' remark sparks uproar in Assembly, House stalled amid Congress-BJP clash

Hyderabad : The Telangana Assembly witnessed noisy scenes on Wednesday after a discussion on Ippa Sara (Mahua liquor) snowballed into a political slugfest between the Congress and the BJP, forcing repeated interventions from the Chair and disrupting proceedings.

The debate began during a discussion on the budget demands when BJP MLA Paidi Rakesh Reddy alleged that adulterated toddy mixed with drugs such as alprazolam was being sold in north Telangana, damaging public health. He suggested that the government promote Mahua-based liquor as an organic product that could generate revenue and support tribal livelihoods.

The controversy erupted when he remarked that if the government created a brand for Ippa Sara, it should not be named after "Indiramma", triggering sharp protests from the Treasury benches.

Minister Ponnam Prabhakar objected strongly to the reference to former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi, demanding that the remark be expunged and insisting on an apology. Legislative Affairs Minister D Sridhar Babu said the BJP member had made defamatory comments and must withdraw them, while other ministers joined the protest.

Congress MLAs rose to their feet, shouting slogans, while BJP members countered that the statement had been misinterpreted. BJP floor leader Yelati Maheshwar Reddy defended his colleague, stating that no unparliamentary words had been used.

Rakesh Reddy later clarified that he held Indira Gandhi in high regard and had only meant that her name should not be linked to a liquor brand. With both sides refusing to relent and continuing heated exchanges, Panel Speaker Balu Naik was prompted to repeatedly call for order and ask the BJP MLA to withdraw his remarks. However, the standoff continued, bringing proceedings to a halt.

BRSLP deputy leader T Harish Rao criticised both the Congress and the BJP for wasting the House's time, with the confrontation stalling discussion on public issues. He stated that the House was stalled for over one hour, depriving the opposition of its chance to speak.

The uproar continued for several minutes before the Chair struggled to resume proceedings. Panel Speaker Balu Naik gave a ruling that henceforth, members should refrain from making derogatory or defamatory remarks against respected individuals, especially leaders of national importance like Indira Gandhi.

Crackdown on Illegal Sand Mining Ordered in Mahabubnagar

Mahabubnagar : District Collector Khushboo Gupta has directed officials to take stringent measures to curb illegal sand mining and transportation across the district.

Chairing a district-level sand committee review meeting at the Collectorate on Wednesday, the Collector emphasized the need for strict enforcement and intensified field-level monitoring. She instructed revenue and police officials to conduct surprise inspections to check unauthorized excavation and movement of sand.

Reviewing the sand booking and supply system, Ms.



Gupta said that from April 1, sand distribution must be carried out entirely through the 'Mana Isuka Vahanam' online platform. Officials informed that out of 16 identified sand reaches, only two are currently operational — at Kanmanur in Addakal mandal and Polkampally in Moosapet

mandal — through the online system. The Collector directed officials to make the remaining reaches operational under the online booking mechanism.

She also ordered that all cases of illegal transport, seized vehicles, sand dumps, and penalties imposed be regularly updated in a dedicated WhatsApp monitoring group for transparency and accountability.

To strengthen surveillance, Ms. Gupta called for installation of CCTV cameras in vulnerable sand reaches and enhanced vigilance. She further instructed that Tahsildars compile data on sand

requirements for Indiramma housing schemes in their respective mandals and ensure adequate supply based on demand.

The Collector also suggested setting up a grievance cell to address complaints related to sand booking and supply, and to promptly act on negative media reports.

Officials including Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Madhusudan Naik, Revenue Additional Collector J.L.B. HariPriya, Additional SP N.B. Ratnam, RDO E. Naveen, and Mines Department AD Govind Rajulu, along with Tahsildars, attended the meeting.



No Fuel Shortage in Telangana, Says Dealers' Association

Hyderabad : The Telangana Petroleum Dealers Association on Tuesday clarified that reports of fuel shortage in the state are completely false and misleading, urging the public not to panic.

The association stated that rumours about scarcity have led to unnecessary rush at fuel stations, with people forming long queues. It emphasized that oil marketing companies such as HPCL, IOCL and BPCL currently have adequate fuel stocks and that the supply chain remains uninterrupted.

According to the association, panic buying has resulted in fuel sales increasing by nearly 2.5 to 3 times the normal levels. This sudden surge in demand has caused temporary stock-outs at a few retail outlets, but officials stressed that this should not be misconstrued as a shortage.

The association also warned the public against storing petrol or diesel in cans or containers, stating that it violates PESO regulations and poses serious fire hazards.

Appealing for calm, the association urged consumers to purchase only the required quantity of fuel and refrain from hoarding. It also advised citizens not to believe or spread unverified information and to act responsibly.

Expert Insights on Immunization and Public Health
 Dr. Sajith, Managing Director of Medigo Hospital, addressed the gathering, emphasizing that vaccinations are not just for children but are equally essential for adults to provide a shield against life-threatening diseases. Following this, Dr. Vasireddy Teja, an Infectious Diseases Specialist at Medigo Hospital, detailed the various vaccines available for adults. She highlighted that timely immunization plays a pivotal role in preventing numerous infections



and significantly enhancing overall public health.

Key Vaccines Recommended for Adults
 During the session, medical experts provided a comprehensive overview of essential vaccines that every adult should be aware of to maintain long-term health. They recommended the annual Influenza (Flu) vaccine to protect against seasonal respiratory issues and severe colds. Additionally, the Tdap/Td vaccine was highlighted as a necessity every ten years to safeguard against Tetanus, throat infections, and Pertussis (whooping cough).

Special emphasis was placed on women's health, specifically regarding the HPV vaccine. Doctors noted that taking this vaccine between the ages of 9 and 26 is crucial for preventing cervical cancer and other related diseases. For liver protection, Hepatitis A and B vaccines were advised, while individuals aged 50 and above were encouraged to take the Pneumococcal and Zoster vaccines to prevent pneumonia and shingles.

The programme saw active participation from University faculty members and students from the Engineering and M.Sc. Organic Chemistry departments. The speakers concluded by urging the audience to dispel myths surrounding vaccinations and prioritize their health schedules to foster a disease-free society.

Fuel Shortage Rumors Untrue, Says Malyala SI Naresh Kumar

Toddy Tapper Dies After Falling from Palm Tree

India Accelerates Rare Earth and Lithium Exploration

India has intensified efforts to scale up domestic production of rare earth permanent magnets and accelerate exploration of critical minerals such as lithium, with production capacity targeted to reach 5,000 tonnes by 2030, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology, Earth Sciences, and MoS PMO, Dr. Jitendra Singh said in the Lok Sabha today.

Replying to a series of questions during the Question Hour in the ongoing Budget Session, the Minister said that the country's current requirement of rare earth permanent magnets is about

4,000 tonnes, which is projected to rise to nearly 8,000 tonnes by 2030, highlighting the need for rapid expansion of domestic capabilities.

The Minister informed that a pilot project on neodymium-iron-boron permanent magnets has recently been launched, while a samarium-cobalt magnet plant at Visakhapatnam has been made operational with an initial production capacity of 500 tonnes per year. This capacity will be scaled up to 2,000 tonnes in the next phase and further to 5,000 tonnes by 2030.

Dr. Jitendra Singh said that the government is work-

ing in close coordination across ministries under a whole-of-government approach to fast-track exploration and development of critical minerals.

Responding to a question by Smt. Mahima Kumari Mewar on lithium reserves in Degana, Rajasthan, the Minister said that preliminary survey activities are already underway and further exploration is expected to begin soon. He added that lithium exploration falls under the Ministry of Mines, and similar efforts are also in progress in Reasi district of Jammu & Kashmir.

Dr. Jitendra Singh said

that lithium and rare earth elements are critical for sectors such as electric vehicles, renewable energy, electronics, defence, aerospace, and space applications, and will play an important role in supporting clean energy transition as well as emerging technologies requiring reliable energy systems.

The Minister also informed that recent policy measures, including provisions under the Atomic Energy (Amendment) framework, have opened up exploration of several critical minerals to private sector participation, with safeguards in place for strategic re-

sources such as uranium.

Referring to recent initiatives, he said that rare earth corridors have been announced in Tamil Nadu, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, and Kerala to strengthen the domestic ecosystem for processing and value addition.

The Minister said that rare earth elements are found both in beach sand minerals and rock formations, and their exploration requires different approaches depending on geological conditions. He added that some regions, including Rajasthan, Gujarat, and Jharkhand, have significant deposits of rock-based minerals which are relatively

more complex to explore.

On concerns related to environmental impact, he clarified that mining-related safeguards fall under the jurisdiction of the Ministry of Mines and associated regulatory frameworks, and emphasized the need to curb illegal mining.

Dr. Jitendra Singh said that India is steadily strengthening its position in the critical minerals sector with a focus on reducing import dependence, enhancing domestic production, and building a resilient supply chain to support future industrial and technological growth.

Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy Calls for Accelerated Exploration of Critical Minerals at NMEDT Governing Body Meeting

Adoption of Advanced Technologies and Startup Participation Will Transform India's Exploration Ecosystem, says G. Kishan Reddy

New Delhi (PIB): Union Minister of Coal and Mines G. Kishan Reddy chaired the 7th Governing Body meeting of the National Mineral Exploration & Development Trust (NMEDT), held at GPOA-3, Netaji Nagar, New Delhi, in the august presence of Minister of State for the Department of Atomic Energy, Dr. Jitendra Singh the performance of NMEDT for FY 2025-26 was reviewed in detail.

Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy emphasized that NMEDT must place a major strategic focus on exploration of critical minerals, as achieving Aatmanirbharta in this sector is essential for India's economic growth, energy transition and technological advancement. He directed all States to expedite ongoing exploration projects, ensure faster approvals and improve

coordination so that exploration-to-auction timelines are significantly reduced.

He further highlighted the need to adopt advanced technologies, including AI/ML, drone-based surveys and modern beneficiation techniques, to enhance efficiency and success rates in mineral discovery. The Minister also stressed on greater inclusion of startups, private exploration agencies (NPEAs) and innovation-driven institutions, in line with the vision of Startup India, to bring new ideas and cutting-edge solutions into the exploration ecosystem.

Dr. Jitendra Singh, Minister of State for the Department of Atomic Energy underscored the importance of strong coordination, continuous monitoring and effective follow-up mechanisms to en-

sure timely execution of exploration projects. He emphasized the need to integrate scientific institutions, and leverage advanced technologies into the mineral exploration value chain to accelerate outcomes.

The key achievements of NMEDT discussed during the meeting are:-

As part of the reforms introduced through the amendment to the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957 in 2025, the National Mineral Exploration Trust (NMEDT) has been renamed as the National Mineral Exploration and Development Trust (NMEDT) with effect from 1 September 2025. The contribution by lessees has increased from 2% to 3% of the royalty to strengthen financial support for exploration activities.



The scope of NMEDT has also been expanded to include funding exploration in offshore areas in India and exploration activities & mine development within & outside India.

Launch of National Critical Mineral Mission Funding Initiatives under NCMM

NMEDT have issued guidelines for funding pilot projects for the recovery of critical minerals from overburden, tailings, fly ash, red mud, etc. on 14.11.2025. It will provide funding support of up to ₹20 crore per project, with a minimum 10% contribution from industry partners.

A pilot project has been sanctioned to the Non-Ferrous Materials Technology Development Centre (NFTDC) for establishment of pilot line for Rare Earth Minerals separation from multiple feedstocks.

NMEDT is supporting special studies for identification of critical minerals through geochemical analysis of samples from mine faces, dumps, tailings, residues and slags. Financial assistance is being provided to the Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM) to evaluate recovery potential.

These initiatives align with the National Tailings Policy, 2025 and promote sustainability, resource efficiency and circular use of minerals.

NMEDT is promoting advanced exploration technologies such as drone-based surveys, AI/ML applications

and modern beneficiation techniques to improve data accuracy and discovery success rates, thereby modernizing India's mineral exploration ecosystem.

A total of 76 projects for critical mineral exploration have been sanctioned during FY 2025-26. So far, 45 NMEDT-funded blocks have been auctioned, including 10 blocks of critical minerals. There has also been a significant increase in private sector participation through several facilitating initiatives.

These reforms collectively aim to strengthen India's mineral exploration framework, ensure availability of critical minerals, accelerate project execution, promote private and startup participation, adopt modern technologies and advance sustainable mineral development in the country.

Indian Railways Introduces 1,024 Trains, Extends 907, Increases Frequency of 168 and Augments 4,651 Coaches in Last Five Years to Meet Rising Passenger Demand

74,800 Special Train Trips Operated During Festivals and Vacations Between April 2025 and February 2026

New Delhi (PIB): On Indian Railways, occupancy pattern of trains varies over lean and peak periods. During peak rush periods, the occupancy of the trains especially on popular routes remains full whereas during lean period and on less popular routes, there is sub optimal utilization.

Waiting list pattern is monitored on regular basis and to cater to additional demand, Indian Railways have taken various steps like introduction of new trains, increase in frequency/extension of existing trains, augmentation of load of existing trains on permanent basis, etc. Further, waiting list limits have been

rationalized linking it to the extent of accommodation of that class available in the train.

During the last five years from 2021-22 to 2025-26 (up to Feb'2026), 1024 trains were introduced, 907 were extended, frequency of 168 trains was increased and 4651 coaches were augmented. As the Railway network straddles across state boundaries, trains are introduced, as per network requirement, across such boundaries. However, on originating/terminating basis, Indian Railways during 2021-22 to 2025-26 (Feb'2026) have introduced 444 train services catering to the needs of vari-

ous stations located in the Eastern/North Eastern region including following 75 pair trains serving the stations falling in the state of Bihar.

With a view to meet the demand of passengers travelling in unreserved coaches, Railways have significantly increased the facilities for passengers demanding general class travel. During the last financial year 2024-25 alone, 1250 general coaches have been utilised in various long-distance trains. In the current financial year (upto February, 2026), 860 Coaches have been utilised for permanent augmentation.

To cater to the travel de-



mand of the low and middle income families, Indian Railways have taken up manufac-

turing of 17,000 non-AC coaches (general/sleeper). Moreover, to provide

greater accommodation for the passengers using General and non-AC Sleeper Coaches, the extant policy regarding composition of Mail/Express trains provides for 12 (Twelve) General class & Sleeper class non-AC coaches and 08 (eight) AC-Coaches, in a train of 22 coaches, thereby providing greater accommodation for the passengers using General and non-AC Sleeper Coaches.

Further, to cater to the needs of passengers desirous of availing unreserved accommodation, Indian Railways (IR) operate unreserved non-AC passenger trains/ MEMU /

EMU etc. for affordable travel, which are in addition to the unreserved accommodation (coaches) available in Mail/Express services.

SPECIAL TRAINS

IR also operates Special train services during festivals, holidays, etc. to cater to the extra needs of passengers and supplement the accommodation available by regular services.

Losing education in the race for a job : Dr. Priyanka Saurabh

The educational foundation weakens under the pressure of competitive examinations

Today's youth is experiencing a time when opportunities abound, but the path to access them has become more complex and competitive than ever before. The increasing number of competitive exams, their lengthy procedures, and uncertain results, particularly for government jobs, have left both students and parents deeply confused. The CET (Common Eligibility Test) was presented as a major hope in this context, but the experiences of the past years raise serious questions about this hope.

In Haryana, the examination process failed to gain the desired momentum during the five-year period between 2019 and 2024. As a result, only one examination was fully completed during this period, and some related recruitments are still entangled in judicial proceedings. Even in the 2024-25 cycle, only the preliminary examination has been conducted so far. Given the slow pace at which the entire process is progressing, it is not unfounded to fear that

the final results may take a long time to be released.

But this problem isn't limited to Haryana. The situation with government recruitment processes is more or less similar in almost all states. Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Punjab, Jharkhand, West Bengal, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, and even the northeastern states have consistently faced problems such as delayed recruitment exams, paper leaks, judicial disputes, and delayed results. In many states, exams aren't held for years, and when they are, the process is so lengthy that it tests both the age and patience of candidates.

This has a profound impact on the mental, educational, and social lives of young people. Every year, millions of students graduate and seek employment, but the number of available government positions remains extremely limited. For example, if millions of candidates across the country appear for a single exam,

the number of those selected is limited to thousands. In such a situation, considering government employment as the ultimate goal and relying solely on it becomes an extremely risky decision.

The most worrying aspect of this entire scenario is the rapid spread of a "non-attendance" culture. A trend is being observed in almost every state of the country, where students are avoiding regular college and university classes in the name of preparing for competitive exams. They assume that to achieve success, they must completely break away from the traditional education system. But this thinking is gradually proving detrimental to their future.

In fact, college life isn't just about earning a degree. It's a time when a student's intellectual, social, and emotional development takes place. Class participation, interaction with teachers, group discussions, presentations, and co-curricular activities—all of these contribute to the development of a person's personality. When

students lose these opportunities, they lose out not only on subject knowledge but also on essential life skills.

Another serious side effect of the non-attendance culture is that students' academic foundations weaken. They become focused solely on passing exams rather than delving deeply into the subject matter. Often, after failing competitive exams, they are left with neither a strong academic record nor any alternative career options. As a result, they lose confidence and suffer from mental stress.

It's also worth noting that today's world is extremely technologically advanced. Digital platforms have revolutionized education. Online coaching, video lectures, digital notes, test series, and virtual classrooms are available in every corner of the country. Therefore, the idea that it's necessary to drop out of college to prepare for competitive exams is completely misguided. Students can prepare effectively alongside their regular studies.

By adopting a balanced and practical strategy, students can make the best use of the three years of their undergraduate education. In the first year, they should focus on their studies and engage with general knowledge, newspapers, and current affairs. This strengthens their intellectual foundation. In the second year, they can strengthen their grasp of subjects like mathematics, reasoning, and language. They can also clarify their basic concepts through NCERT books. By the final year, they

should make a clear decision whether they want to pursue higher education or pursue competitive exams.

Higher education and private sector opportunities are also rapidly expanding across various states in the country. New doors are opening for youth in fields such as IT, management, healthcare, startups, skill-based jobs, and freelancing. DCCB Mahabubnagar Targets ₹2,500 Cr Turnover; Push for Inclusive Rural Credit

Mahabubnagar : The District Cooperative Central Bank (DCCB), Mahabubnagar, has set an ambitious business turnover target of ₹2,500 crore for the current financial year, with a strong focus on expanding credit access to small farmers, rural entrepreneurs and economically weaker sections.

The bank's general body meeting was held on Wednesday at its head office under the chairmanship of District Collector Khushboo Gupta, who is also serving as the Person-in-Charge of the bank. She directed officials to ensure easy and timely availability of loans in rural areas, particularly to small and marginal farmers, self-employed youth and small business owners.

Addressing the meeting, DCCB In-charge CEO C. Ravikanth Reddy presented a detailed overview of the bank's performance during the previous financial year, including transactions, deposits, loan disbursements, recoveries and details of defaulters. He also shared the bank's administrative report



and financial outcomes with the members.

The Collector stated that the bank's deposits have reached ₹489 crore as of March 25. She noted that the bank has so far extended ₹753 crore in short-term agricultural loans and ₹1,393 crore in long-term agricultural loans, apart from various non-agricultural loans catering to diverse needs of farmers and consumers.

Highlighting improved financial discipline, she said the bank has reduced its non-performing assets (NPAs) to 2.86 per cent, reflecting better recovery performance. She also

announced that, with approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), the bank will soon roll out UPI services and open 14 new branches to enhance customer outreach.

Expressing satisfaction, officials revealed that the bank has already achieved ₹2,400 crore turnover by March 23, inching closer to its annual target.

The Collector emphasized strengthening the cooperative sector by extending more credit to farmers and small traders. She instructed officials to create awareness among the public about various loan schemes and ensure that

borrowers repay loans on time to remain eligible for renewals.

Special emphasis was laid on expanding credit to women self-help groups and dairy farmers, noting their strong repayment capacity. Officials were also directed to personally visit villages to address issues related to loan recovery and interest payments.

Gupta cautioned that in the absence of an elected governing body, appointed officials must strictly adhere to RBI and NABARD guidelines and refrain from taking major policy decisions without prior approval. She stressed the need to maintain transparency,

efficiency and accountability in banking operations, while ensuring quick resolution of members' grievances.

Earlier, a five-member management committee meeting reviewed the bank's policies, performance, financial position, and compliance with RBI and NABARD norms, along with future action plans.

Senior officials from Telangana State Cooperative Apex Bank, NABARD, and district cooperative departments, along with auditors and inspectors from across the erstwhile Mahabubnagar district, attended the meeting.

Ontimitta/Tirumala : In preparation for the Dhwajaroanam ceremony to be held tomorrow at the Sri Kodanda Rama Swamy Temple in Ontimitta, Kadapa district, the sacred Vishnu Darbha mat (Darbha Matthu) and rope were formally presented to the temple authorities on Wednesday. TTD Forest Department officials handed over these holy items to the temple management.



Significance of Vishnu Darbha
The TTD Forest Department staff specially prepared a Darbha mat measuring approximately 22 feet in length and 7.5 feet in width (weighing about 60 kg), along with a 225-meter long Darbha rope. These items are utilized annually during the flag-hoisting ceremony.

The sacred Vishnu Darbha is purified and dried before being wrapped around the Dhwajasthambham (temple flagstaff). The hoisting of the Garuda flag using this rope marks the official commencement of the Sri Kodanda Rama Swamy Brahmotsavams. It is traditionally believed that this sacred grass possesses purifying properties and natural antimicrobial qualities.

Preparation Process
TTD Forest Department personnel collect this specific variety of Darbha from the

surrounding areas of Chellur village near Yerpedu. After collection, the grass is dried for a week. The subsequent process of weaving the mat and rope is carried out with great devotion over a period of approximately one month.

The presentation ceremony was attended by TTD In-charge DFO Dr. A.V.N. Sivakumar, DFO Vijay Kumar, Deputy EO A. Prashanthi, and other temple staff members.

Chinta Mohan, Senior Congress Leader and Former Union Minister, Holds Press Conference

Serilingampally : Chinta Mohan, Senior Congress Leader and Former Union Minister, held a press conference at the Somajiguda Press Club on Wednesday. On this occasion, he was Recalling the era of wars, Chintamohan paid tribute to the late great leader Rajiv Gandhi, highlighting his decisive role in averting international conflicts.



In February 1991, the US-backed war between Iran and Kuwait unfolded. At that time, Rajiv Gandhi, then the Leader of the Opposition, traveled from Delhi to Moscow to meet Mikhail Gorbachev and discuss ceasefire measures. From there, he proceeded to Tehran, engaging with global leaders, and also held talks with Iraqi President Saddam Hussein, successfully securing a ceasefire on February 28, 1991.

Upon his return via Dubai to Delhi International Airport, he was accorded a warm reception. Chinta Mohan emphasized that the war arose due to the absence of capable leaders like Rajiv Gandhi and Congress being out of power. Unlike some current leaders, Rajiv Gandhi did not remain confined to Delhi but took bold steps to stop the war.

He criticized Prime Minister Narendra Modi's foreign policy, calling it weak on the global stage, and stressed that no one in the world has

matched Rajiv Gandhi's courage to prevent wars. Supporting Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's recent statement, Chinta Mohan argued that increasing MP and MLA seats lacks logic and is a diversionary political tactic. He also highlighted ongoing economic hardships: gas shortages, rising fuel prices, and long queues at petrol pumps across Hyderabad. Chinta Mohan pointed out the imbalance in representation, noting that Uttar Pradesh alone has 160 MPs while the combined South Indian states barely account for 200 seats, despite contributing over 70% of central taxes. He urged reconsider-

ation of the proposed constituency expansions.

At the same time, he welcomed the expansion of women's reservation but criticized the Supreme Court's recent ruling, opposing the judgment and describing it as incorrect. He questioned whether marginalized communities like Dalit Christians would benefit under the current system.

He promised that if Congress comes to power in 2029, constitutional amendments would grant SC status to Dalit Christians.

On an international note, Chintamohan raised concerns about Jeffrey Epstein's global sex trafficking network, which allegedly exploited young Russian women for elderly world leaders and investors. He linked suspicions of secret operations in Tehran, Iran, to subsequent bomb attacks in the region.

Negligence in duties will invite action: Additional Collector Bhaskar Rao

After a full trial, Smt. C. Pavani, Hon'ble VI Additional District and Sessions Judge, Ranga Reddy District Court at Kukatpally, convicted Aravind Singh and imposed the sentence.

The basic requirement for this post is that person should be a graduate and passed the level 1 of the CFA (Chartered Financial Analyst) exam. Raids were carried out on hotels located on Collectorate Road and Marrigudem Road, where a total of 77 domestic gas cylinders were seized. Raghunandan stated that such misuse is a violation of regulations and strict action will be taken against those involved. He urged hotel owners to immediately stop using domestic LPG cylinders and



switch to commercial gas cylinders. DSO Venkatesh reiterated that hotels must use only commercial LPG cylinders for their operations.

Parents Will Be Punished if Minors Cause Accidents by Driving Vehicles - One Town Inspector

A Dedicated Weather System Must Be Established in Warangal - MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavaya

Hanamkonda, March 25 : Against the backdrop of increasingly severe weather fluctuations observed in Warangal district in recent times, MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavaya raised concerns during the Question Hour in the Lok Sabha regarding the lack of adequate weather-related infrastructure in the district. She demanded the immediate establishment of a dedicated weather system for the region. Responding to this issue, Dr. Jitendra Singh, the Minister of State for Earth Sciences, stated that five Automatic Weather Stations (AWS) and several rain gauges are currently operational in Warangal district. However, he clarified that a Doppler Weather Radar (DWR) has not yet been installed in Warangal. He noted that the Warangal region is currently being served by radar systems located in Hyderabad and Visakhapatnam.

Furthermore, the Union Minister explained that while there is no dedicated Flood Forecasting Station specifically within Warangal district, flood situations are being monitored through stations located in neighboring districts. Responding to this explanation, the Warangal MP pointed out that relying on other regions could lead to delays and inefficiencies in providing an immediate response during emergency situations. She urged the Central Government to strengthen accurate weather forecasting capabilities, lightning warning systems, and climate resilience mechanisms at the district level itself. The MP emphasized that despite the existence of current government alert systems and initiatives such as 'Mission Mausam,' specific investments are required for vulnerable regions like Warangal.



The MP urged the Centre to further strengthen precautionary measures and comprehensive disaster management systems to protect people's lives and property.

YASHODA DOCTORS SAVE INFANT WITH ADVANCED TRANSPLANT

Khammam Bureau, March 25 : In a remarkable medical achievement, doctors at Yashoda Hospital, Somajiguda, successfully treated a 10-month-old baby boy from Khammam suffering from a rare inherited bone marrow failure disorder, giving the infant a new lease of life through an advanced haploidentical stem cell transplant. Speaking at a media interaction held at Yashoda Medical Centre, Khammam, Bone Marrow Transplant Specialist Dr. Vikram Kumar said the baby was diagnosed with Amegakaryocytic Thrombocytopenia, a rare hereditary disorder that affects bone marrow function and leads to dangerously low platelet levels. He said the child was brought to Yashoda Hospital on December 26 last year, where detailed clinical evaluation and diagnostic testing confirmed the seriousness of the condition. Con-



sidering the life-threatening nature of the illness, the expert team at Yashoda Hospital decided to proceed with an advanced haploidentical stem cell transplantation, using stem cells from the baby's father. The transplant was successfully performed on January 8, and the infant responded well to the treatment under continuous medical supervision and specialised post-transplant care. Dr. Vikram Kumar said the baby was later discharged after being declared medically stable and is now recovering well. He noted that timely diagnosis, expert intervention and access to advanced transplant facilities at Yashoda Hospital played a crucial role in saving the child's life. Sridhar Rao, Balakrishna and Nagarjuna were present during the media interaction.

COLLECTOR CALLS FOR HIGHER FARMERS' INCOME

Khammam Bureau, March 25 : District Collector Anudeep Durishetty said that all possible measures should be taken to enhance farmers' income and make agriculture more profitable. "THE LIFE AND JOURNEY OF A DYNAMIC POLICE OFFICER - ADDITIONAL DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF POLICE CH. KUSHALKAR"

"The Pride of United Medak District"

(Capital Information) Serilingampally : In the demanding field of policing, where leadership and integrity are paramount, Chitkal Kushalkar has distinguished himself as a committed and dynamic officer. He currently serves as the Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (Administration & Law & Order) in the Siddipet Commissionerate.

He is renowned for his strong administrative skills, law enforcement capabilities and disciplined approach. Kushalkar plays a key role in managing the internal functioning of the police department. From personnel management and inter-departmental coordination to policy implementation and resource planning, he ensures the administrative machinery operates smoothly and efficiently.

Throughout his career, marked by dedication and professionalism, Kushalkar has earned the respect of colleagues and the public alike. Known for his discipline, punctuality, and hands-on approach, he actively reviews departmental activities and guides staff to maintain and achieve high standards of service.

"Early Life and Family Background"

Kushalkar was born on 24th July 1967 into a humble farmer's family in Ameerabad, a village in Nyalkal Mandal of Sangareddy district (formerly part of Medak district). He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Sangamma George and was raised in a modest rural setting that instilled in him the values of hard work, discipline, and resilience.

He belongs to a large family, with six brothers and one sister. Significantly, three of his brothers have served in the police department, highlighting a strong legacy of public service within the family.

Growing up in an agrarian household and under a disciplined



family environment had a profound influence on Kushalkar's character, shaping his sense of responsibility, commitment, and ultimately guiding his path toward a career in public service.

"Education and Early Aspirations:"

Completed his Secondary School Education (Class 10) while residing in the hostel of Methodist Rural High School (MRHS), Zaheerabad. He pursued his Intermediate studies at B.R. Ambedkar College in Chikkadpally.

He went on to complete his graduation from N.B. Science College, located in Madina, Old City. Furthering his academic journey, Kushalkar obtained his postgraduate degree in Geology from Osmania University (OU) Campus.

During his student years, Kushalkar remained focused on his studies without being preoccupied with specific career ambitions. His primary goal was to excel academically. However, during his postgraduate phase, he developed an inclination towards securing a job in the Mines and Geology Department and made ef-

orts in that direction.

"Training and Early Career"

As part of his efforts to secure employment, Kushalkar appeared for the Sub-Inspector (SI) recruitment and was selected in 1994. Following his selection, he underwent rigorous training for a period of one year.

Recalling his training days, Kushalkar described them as extremely demanding, involving daily running, intense physical exercises, and strict dietary discipline. He noted that the physical strain was so intense that even taking a step would feel exhausting.

The training also included survival exercises, where trainees were left in forest areas for up to three days with minimal provisions such as bread and cheese, allowing officials to assess their endurance and survival skills.

Kushalkar emphasized that the training was not limited to physical fitness alone but was equally focused on building mental resilience. He stated that the experience helped him develop the ability to withstand stress and remain composed under pressure, which proved highly beneficial throughout his career in the police service.

"Entry into Police Service:"

C.H. Kushalkar began his career as a Sub-Inspector in 1995 at Morthad Police Station, Armur, and served in various police stations across Nizamabad district. From

1997 to 2003 Kushalkar earned a reputation as a strong field officer in the Naxalite-affected areas of Nizamabad.

During this period, Naxalites conducted special reconnaissance on him, making him a target. This was a key reason for his transfer to Hyderabad. He worked as Task Force SI in the Hyderabad City (2004-2007) and was promoted as Circle Inspector in 2007, serving in Bheemgal and Armur. He was later reassigned to Cyberabad in 2012. He served as CI in Rajendranagar, (First CI of Jagadgirigutta, and KPHB Police Station, and was promoted as ACP in 2019 to the Hyderabad CCS EOW Department.

He later served as ACP, Shadnagar (2021-2023), and as DSP in Vigilance & Enforcement, Hyderabad Range-II (2023-2024). Currently, he is posted as Additional DCP (Admin & Law & Order) in Siddipet Commissionerate after being promoted as Additional SP.

"Balancing Family and Professional Life:"

Kushalkar is married to Aruna Kumari, and the couple has two sons. Owing to the demanding nature of his professional responsibilities, he has often missed family events and festivals. On one occasion, he even had to cut short his own 50th birthday celebration due to official duties.

His wife, Aruna Kumari, who has been the backbone of his success, serves in emergency services as a Head Nurse and has faced similar challenges in her profession. Their children, during their early years, often missed the presence of their parents and at times felt upset when they could not spend time together.

Kushalkar, a police officer, emphasized that education is the foundation of success. Reflecting on his journey, he said he strongly believed that without education, there is nothing, and this belief drove him to focus entirely on his studies.

He stated that education helped him build his career and improve his economic status. In today's world, he added, only education can take individuals to higher positions.

Kushalkar urged the younger generation to prioritize education for a better future.
