



Telangana HC Allows IPS Officer Abhilasha Bisht to Continue in State Cadre

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad : The Telangana High Court has granted interim relief to senior IPS officer Abhilasha Bisht, permitting her to continue serving in the Telangana cadre until further orders.

A Division Bench comprising Justices P. Sam Koshy and Narsing Rao Nandikonda passed the order while hearing her writ petition challenging her allocation to the Andhra Pradesh cadre. The court stayed the implementation of the Centre's decision and directed the Union Ministry of Home Affairs to allow her to remain in Telangana.

The Bench noted that the officer was already covered by an earlier interim order issued in 2025 and expressed its inclination to continue protection. The matter has been adjourned for further hearing to July 1, 2026, or a date after the court's summer vacation.

Abhilasha Bisht, a 1994-batch IPS officer currently serving as Director of the RBVRR Telangana State Police Academy, has contested the cadre allocation process, citing discrepancies in the post-bifurcation seniority list. The allocation had earlier been upheld by the Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT), Hyderabad.

Appearing for the petitioner, senior counsel J. Sudheer argued that the allocation process required judicial scrutiny in view of the alleged inconsistencies.

The court's interim order ensures status quo, allowing the officer to continue in her present role in Telangana pending final adjudication. The case is expected to be heard along with similar petitions related to cadre allocation disputes following the bifurcation of Andhra Pradesh.

Playing with the Hunger of the Poor: Ration Dealers Siphoning Rice!

Massive Weighing Fraud at Chatanpally Ration Shop; Aggression When Questioned!

SHADNAGAR : While the Telangana State Government aims to eradicate hunger by providing rice at ₹1 per kg, some local ration dealers are acting like parasites, snatching food away from the poor. Allegations of severe irregularities have surfaced at the Chatanpally Ration Shop (No. 1539027) in Shadnagar Municipality, Rangareddy district, causing a local stir.

The Magic of Weights:
 Shortage of 500g to 1.5kg! Victims allege that the dealer at Chatanpally is employing deceptive tactics during weighing. Reportedly, by manipulating the weighing scales and bags, the dealer is short-changing each card-



holder by 500 grams to 1.5 kilograms of rice. When common citizens question the discrepancy, the dealer reportedly responds with ag-

gression and intimidation.

Private 'Dhanda' in a Government Shop

According to regulations, government ration shops are prohibited from selling private commercial goods. However, defying these rules, the dealer is allegedly forcing cardholders to buy substandard private brands of oil, pulses, and wheat flour. Cardholders express grief that while they come for subsidized rice,

they are being coerced into buying low-quality private products at high prices. **Lack of Official Supervision?** Similar allegations of irregularities are emerging from various ration shops across the Farooqnagar Mandal. Despite inspections by higher authorities, the conduct of dealers at the ground level remains unchanged. **Public Demand:** Local residents are demanding an immediate inquiry into the Chatanpally ration shop. They are calling for the cancellation of the dealer's license and strict legal action against those involved in weighing frauds and illegal sales.

(Cont. from Pg 1) Seethakka, and Komatireddy Venkat Reddy had assured farmers during their padyatras that lands would be returned, if Congress came to power.

However, instead of fulfilling that promise, the government was now planning to acquire an additional 16,000 acres, calling it a "Bharat Future City." This was a "drama" aimed at benefiting the Chief Minister's family members and associates, he charged.

The BRS working president further criticised the Congress government for failing to manage existing urban issues. Basic civic problems remain unresolved while grand promises of future cities were being made, he said.

Rama Rao questioned the logic behind relocating the proposed fruit market from Koheda, where 178 acres were allocated earlier, to remote areas near Rachakonda hills or beyond Ramoji Film City. This was an illogical move intended to monetise land, he charged.

"The Congress government has expanded the prohibited land list from 16 lakh acres to nearly one crore acres, using it as a tool for 'blackmail politics'" Rama Rao alleged. Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy and officials were pressuring Collectors and facilitating illegal land settlements, he accused.

He thanked party leaders and councilors, who withstood pressure, false cases, and intimidation to secure the municipal leadership for BRS. "The difficult phase for the party is over and that better days are ahead for the State," Rama Rao said.

The meeting was attended by senior leaders including Ranga Reddy district president Manchireddy Kishan Reddy, former Minister P Sabitha Indra Reddy, MLA Sudheer Reddy, and Bhuvanagiri Parliament in-charge Kyama Mallesh and others.

Degrees of Despair: Certificates Held Hostage, Students Pay the Price

(Capital Information) Hyderabad: The idea of education as a great equaliser is steadily eroding in Telangana, replaced by a troubling mix of administrative indifference and aggressive commercialisation. For thousands of marginalised students, higher education is no longer a pathway to opportunity but a maze of financial distress, institutional exploitation and policy failure. At the centre of the crisis lies the staggering backlog of nearly ₹9,300 crore in unpaid fee reimbursement dues. The state's inability to clear these arrears has triggered a chain reaction, emboldening private college managements to tighten their grip on vulnerable students. In a disturbing trend, several institutions have resorted

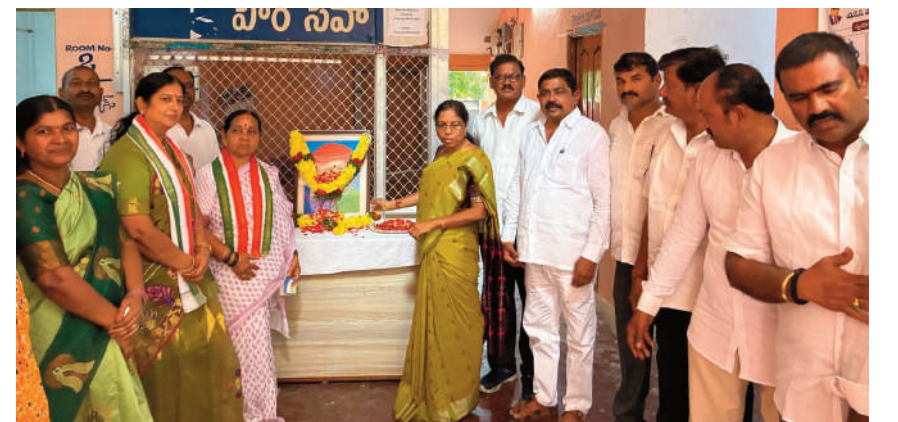
to withholding original academic certificates, effectively holding students' futures hostage even in cases where candidates have secured employment. The situation has been further aggravated by a recent interim order of the High Court, which allows private colleges to directly collect fees from students belonging to SC, ST, BC, EBC and minority communities from the 2026-27 academic year. While legally tenable, the ruling shifts the financial burden squarely onto those least equipped to bear it, threatening to disrupt the academic aspirations of over 14 lakh scholarship-dependent students. Budgetary allocations reflect a deeper structural neglect. Despite recommendations by the Telan-



gana Education Commission to earmark 18% of the state budget for education, the current allocation stands at just 8.23% (₹26,674 crore). This falls significantly short of earlier assurances, raising concerns about the government's commitment to strengthening public education. Compounding the issue is a policy paradox. On one hand, the state is investing in high-cost, corporate-style international schools; on the other, nearly 1,500 government schools have reportedly been shut down over the past two and a half years, citing poor infrastructure. This dual approach risks widening inequality and further marginalising students who depend on affordable public institutions. Higher education institutions are also bearing the brunt of prolonged neglect. Universities such as Osmania and Kakatiya are grappling with severe faculty shortages, vacant posts, inadequate infrastructure and declining research output. Once regarded as intellectual hubs, these institutions

now face a steady erosion of academic standards and reputation. The crisis calls for urgent and decisive intervention. Clearing pending fee reimbursements must be prioritised to restore confidence among students and institutions alike. The government must also explore legal avenues to protect students from adverse financial implications of court orders. Strict action against colleges withholding certificates is essential to curb exploitative practices. Education remains the cornerstone of Telangana's future. Continued inaction risks not only derauling the aspirations of an entire generation but also undermining the state's long-term socio-economic progress. - Vinod Hindustani

His hard work paid off when he was selected as a Sub-Inspector in the Andhra Pradesh Police Department in 1991. After successfully completing his police training, he began his professional career in 1993 with his first posting at Uyyalawada Police Station in

Kurnool district. This initial phase of his service played a crucial role in shaping his policing skills, where he gained hands-on experience in maintaining law and order, handling public grievances, and understanding ground-level challenges. Jayachandra Raju rendered a long and dedicated service of 19 years in the police department. During his career, he served in as many as 25 police stations, gaining wide-ranging experience across different regions and assignments. He worked as a Sub-Inspector (SI) in several police stations including Atmakur, Kosigi, Done, Veldurthi, and Jupadu Bungalow, where he faced frequent transfers—sometimes within a month. At Tuggali Police Station, he was transferred within a single day of posting. He also served in Allagadda Police Station before earning a promotion to the rank of Circle Inspector in 2004 (CI). After his promotion, he continued his service in various key departments such as Law and Order, CBI (Bengaluru), ACB, Railways, and Intelligence wings, handling diverse responsibilities. Later, he served as a CI in Yemmiganur for 72 days before resigning from service in 2010. **"Reasons for Resignation from the Post of Circle Inspector:"** While serving in the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB),

Believing that continuing in the role would go against his principles and integrity, he came to the conclusion that the job and the uniform held no meaning if he could not serve justice honestly. With this conviction, he resigned from his position as a Circle Inspector. **"Life After Resignation and Social Service:"** After returning to his native village, Jayachandra Raju is believed to have founded the Sri Krishna Seva Ashram (in 2000 while he was in Service), where devotional and

for a fair society, he chose to step into the legal profession to continue his service in a new way. He is currently practicing as an advocate in the district courts of Tirupati, Nagari, Puttur, Srikalahasti, and Satyavedu. Through his legal practice, he extends support to underprivileged and marginalized sections of society, helping them navigate legal issues and stand up for their rights. His transition from police service to law reflects his continued commitment to justice and public service. **"Concluding Statement:"** He concluded with a powerful message: "Dharma forgives, but it is the responsibility of everyone to protect it." Interstate Diesel Theft Gang Targeting Parked Vehicles at Night Arrested, Six Accused Held, Including a Minor

(Capital Information) Nalgonda : Police have arrested an interstate gang involved in diesel thefts targeting stationary vehicles during midnight hours. A total of six accused, including one minor, were taken into custody.



Police seized around 1,000 liters of diesel, two DCM vehicles, six mobile phones, and tarpaulins, with the total value estimated at ₹40 lakh. The accused were previously involved in more than 20 diesel theft cases across the Telugu states.

In recent times, a rise in diesel theft incidents has been reported on national highways and other roads under Nalgonda district limits, particularly targeting parked lorries and heavy vehi-

cles at night. Acting on the instructions of District SP Sharath Chandra Pawar, special measures were initiated to curb such thefts. Under the supervision of DSP K. Shivaram Reddy, CCS Inspector M. Jitender Reddy, and Chital CI Nagaraju, two special teams were formed to intensify patrolling on highways and suspicious locations.

On the night of 10-04-2026, police noticed a suspiciously parked DCM vehicle within Chital Police Station limits. Upon inspection, they found diesel cans hidden under tarpaulins, containing approximately 400 liters of diesel. The driver Balakrishna and others were detained and, during interrogation, confessed to stealing diesel from unidenti-

fied lorries parked along highways. The accused also revealed that other gang members were nearby in another DCM vehicle. Police immediately conducted a search operation, located the second vehicle, and apprehended all six gang members along with the remaining diesel. All the accused belong to Palnadu district of Andhra Pradesh.

Modus Operandi: The gang targeted lorries and heavy vehicles parked at night on highways. While drivers were asleep, they would open fuel tanks and siphon diesel. The stolen fuel was stored in specially arranged tanks in their vehi-

cles, allowing them to flee quickly without raising suspicion. Investigation revealed that the accused, driven by bad habits and the desire for easy money, had been involved in multiple diesel theft cases across various districts. On this occasion, the Additional SP urged highway commuters and vehicle owners to immediately contact police via Dial-100 if they notice any suspicious persons or diesel theft incidents. Police noted that delays in reporting often allow criminals to escape.

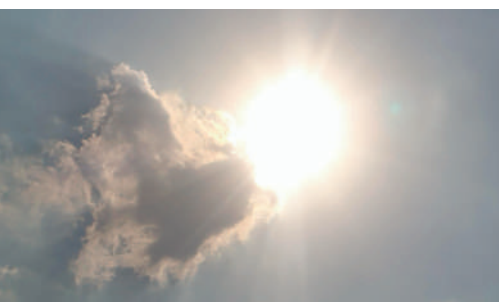

MP D.K. Aruna Urges Support for Women's Reservation Bill, Calls It a New Era in Indian Politics

Says 33% quota will empower women, increase representation in Parliament and Assemblies

MAHABUBNAGAR : At a press meet held at the BJP State Office, D. K. Aruna emphasized that respecting women has always been a core value of Indian culture, where women are revered as embodiments of divinity. She stated that the long-pending 33% Women's Reservation Bill is set to be introduced in Parliament under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Highlighting the Centre's commitment to women's welfare, she said the government is moving forward with sincerity to implement the Nari Shakti Vandan Act and ensure political empowerment for women. She added that Parliament sessions are scheduled from April 16 to 18 to deliberate on the bill, with the aim of implementing it by the 2029 general elections. Aruna remarked that this is not an ordinary bill but the aspiration of

millions of women across the country and a historic step that even previous governments, including the Congress, could not accomplish despite decades in power.

She appealed to all political parties to rise above differences and support the bill in Parliament to ensure its meaningful implementation. Explaining the potential impact, she said that after constituency delimitation, parliamentary seats could increase from 17 to 26 in Telangana, with 9 seats reserved for women, while nationwide around 273 women would enter Parliament.

Similarly, the Telangana Assembly strength could rise to 180 seats, with about 60 seats for women, significantly enhancing their representation in legislative bodies. Aruna noted that increased participation of women in politics would bring transformative changes in governance, economic



growth, employment, and safety, especially in rural and underprivileged communities. She said women, once confined to household roles, have now proven their capabilities across all sectors and will play a crucial role in shaping the nation's future. Criticizing the Congress party, she said it had only spoken about women's empowerment for 40 years without concrete action and urged it to extend full support to the bill.

She alleged that some groups are attempting to obstruct the bill due to political motives. Aruna also highlighted several initiatives of the Modi government aimed at enhancing women's dignity and empowerment, including the construction of toilets under Swachh Bharat, distribution of Ujjwala gas connections, financial inclusion through Jan Dhan Yojana, and Mudra loans for entrepreneurs. She stressed that India's

goal of becoming a developed nation depends significantly on women's participation in economic activities. She added that schemes focusing on nutrition for pregnant women, vaccination for girls, and skill development initiatives such as drone training and Stand-Up India are strengthening women at multiple levels. Aruna appealed to citizens, including women, men, and youth, to create short videos expressing support for the Women's Reservation Bill.

She criticized Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for making statements for media attention and compared his remarks to past regional rhetoric. She concluded by urging all stakeholders not to obstruct a bill that seeks to enhance the dignity and representation of women, stating that empowering women politically would lead to comprehensive national progress.

Minister for Roads & Buildings Komatireddy Venkat Reddy also participated in the meeting. PICO Technology, which provides services to financial markets, has expressed interest in establishing a GCC in Hyderabad through its subsidiary PICO Technology India.

On the occasion, Minister Sridhar Babu briefed the company representatives on the opportunities and infrastructure available in Hyderabad. He stated that the government is implementing long-term infrastructure plans designed to meet not only the requirements of the next 5-10 years, but also the needs of the next 20 years. He pointed out that Hyderabad's office space occupancy stands at 73 percent, significantly higher compared to 52 percent in Mumbai. The Minister noted that due to severe traffic congestion and air pollution in metro cities such as Bengaluru and

Mumbai, several IT companies and GCCs are increasingly relocating to Hyderabad.

Massive Investments Being Made in Road Infrastructure: Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy

Minister for Roads & Buildings Komatireddy Venkat Reddy said the government is making substantial investments to strengthen transport infrastructure across the state.

He stated that a Regional Ring Road is being developed approximately 30 kilometres beyond the existing Nehru Outer Ring Road, along with a network of radial

roads connecting it. He further said that rail connectivity is also being planned alongside the ring roads to create a transportation network that can rival those of the world's leading cities.

The Minister announced that a double-decker road is being constructed between Hayathnagar and LB Nagar. The lower deck will cater to local traffic, while the upper two decks will facilitate vehicles entering and exiting the city.

He remarked that Hyderabad will become the second city after Nagpur to develop such double-decker roads and informed that the tendering process will be completed within the next two months, with works to commence immediately thereafter.

The meeting was attended by PICO Technology Founder & CEO Jarrod Yuster, PICO India CEO Hari Kothandaraman, Director Sitaram, and others.
