

Southern CMs Raise Alarm Over Delimitation Plan, Warn of Federal Imbalance

Chennai/Hyderabad/Bengaluru : A sharp political divide emerged on Tuesday as several southern Chief Ministers voiced strong opposition to the Centre's proposed delimitation exercise, warning it could undermine federal balance and penalise states that have successfully controlled population growth.

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M. K. Stalin described the move as a "direct assault on the rights of states" and "an assault on democracy," particularly in the context of ongoing elections in parts of the country. In a video statement, he questioned the rationale behind reducing representation for southern states despite their progress in population control, calling it a "final warning" to Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Stalin cautioned that the move could trigger widespread protests. "If Tamil Nadu is affected, every family will take to the streets," he said, alleging that the Centre was pushing the



proposal without adequate consultation and warning against any disproportionate increase in representation for northern states.

Echoing the sentiment, Deputy Chief Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin said people of the State would launch protests against the exercise, signalling a potential escalation of political

resistance.

In Karnataka, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah expressed "serious concerns," stating that the proposed delimitation could skew parliamentary representation against southern states. He said it risks rewarding states with higher population growth while disadvantaging those that have performed better on devel-

opment indicators and population control.

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has also stepped into the debate, calling for a united stand among southern states. In letters to his counterparts, including Tamil Nadu and Andhra Pradesh, he urged broader consultations on delimitation and flagged concerns over linking it with the Women's Reservation Bill. He cautioned that such moves could deepen a North-South divide if not handled through consensus.

The issue of delimitation - the redrawing of parliamentary constituencies based on population - has long been a sensitive subject, particularly among southern states that have seen slower population growth compared to their northern counterparts.

With strong statements emerging from multiple states, the debate is expected to intensify in the coming days, raising questions about representation, equity and the future of Centre-State relations.

Andhra Pradesh Launches India's First Indigenous Quantum Facilities

Amaravati : Andhra Pradesh on Tuesday inaugurated India's first indigenous quantum reference facilities, marking a significant step in the country's push towards advanced technology and self-reliance.

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu launched the Amaravati Quantum Reference Facilities (AQR) on the occasion of World Quantum Day and the birth anniversary of B. R. Ambedkar.

The AQR comprises two open-access quantum hardware testbeds - Amaravati 1S at SRM University-AP, based on superconducting technology, and Amaravati 1Q at Medha Towers, developed by Qubitech. These facilities are designed to enable testing, validation and benchmarking of quantum components under real-world conditions, including ultra-low temperatures close to absolute zero.

Officials said the initiative positions Andhra Pradesh as the first State in India to commission



indigenous quantum computing platforms and contributes to the objectives of the National Quantum Mission.

Addressing the gathering, Naidu said the facilities would make cutting-edge technology accessible to students, researchers and startups. He noted that the initiative reflects the vision of inclusive knowledge and technological empowerment, while strengthening India's capabilities in emerging domains.

Developed in collaboration with academic institutions and industry partners, the facilities are expected to support research in areas such as cryogenics, precision electronics and quantum hardware development. The open-access model aims to encourage innovation and foster a domestic ecosystem for quantum technologies.

Early Bird Rebate on Property Tax Announced by GHMC

Hyderabad : The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) has urged property taxpayers to take advantage of its Early Bird Scheme, offering a 5 per cent rebate on property tax for the financial year 2026-27.

According to GHMC officials, the rebate is applicable only if taxpayers clear the entire property tax amount for the year in a single payment. Citizens with pending dues have been advised

to settle all outstanding amounts to become eligible for the rebate.

The civic body has provided multiple payment options for the convenience of taxpayers, including the MyGHMC App and MyCURE App, the official GHMC website, as well as designated Citizen Service Centres and MeeSeva centres.

GHMC has appealed to citizens to make early payments and make use of the rebate facility within the stipulated time.

Cabinet Clears Lok Sabha Expansion to 850 Seats, Sets Stage for Women's Quota by 2029

NEW DELHI : The Union Cabinet on Tuesday approved a legislative package to expand the strength of the Lok Sabha to up to 850 seats and operationalise 33% reservation for women ahead of the 2029 general elections.

The package includes the proposed Constitution (One Hundred and Thirty-First Amendment) Bill, 2026, a Delimitation Bill, 2026, and a separate measure to extend reservation provisions to Union Territories with legislatures. The Bills are expected to be introduced in a special session of Parliament later this week.

At the core of the reform is a proposed increase in Lok Sabha membership from 543 to a maximum of 850, including up to 815 seats for States and up to 35 for Union Territories. The expansion is intended to facilitate one-third reservation for women-estimated at around 270 seats-without reducing the representation



of existing constituencies, addressing a key operational constraint that had delayed implementation.

The delimitation exercise, which will redraw constituency boundaries, is likely to be based on 2011 Census data to expedite the process. Government sources indicated that a proportional increase in seats across States is under consideration to broadly preserve the current bal-

ance of representation while expanding overall capacity.

The reform seeks to address the long-standing freeze on seat allocation based on the 1971 Census, which has led to widening disparities between population growth and parliamentary representation. By increasing the number of constituencies, the government aims to improve representational equity and ease the workload on Members

of Parliament.

At the same time, the proposal carries sensitive federal implications. While the proportional expansion model is designed to avoid immediate shifts in State-wise political weight, concerns persist-particularly among southern and smaller States-over the long-term impact of future population-based redistribution.

The move also advances the implementation of the Constitution (106th Amendment) Act, 2023, which mandates reservation for women but links it to delimitation. By aligning both processes, the government is seeking to enable rollout within a defined electoral timeline.

Officials said consultations are under way to build political consensus ahead of the Bills' introduction. If enacted, the measures will significantly expand the size of the lower house while embedding women's reservation within a restructured parliamentary framework.

Interstate red sanders smuggler arrested

10 red sanders logs worth Rs. 20 lakh seized

Tirupati : Under the orders of Red Sanders Anti-Smuggling Task Force (RSASTF) Head and Tirupati District SP L. Subbarayudu, and the supervision of Additional SP J. Kulasekhar, special operations are being conducted continuously to curb the illegal transport of red sanders in the Seshachalam forest area.

Based on credible information, a joint inspection was carried out by the Task Force and Forest Department personnel in the early hours of April 14 near the Pincha Project forest area in T. Sundupalli Mandal, Annamaya district. During the search, a person found under suspicious circumstances with a motorcycle was taken into custody, and 10 red sanders logs were seized from him.



The arrested individual has been identified as Ramakrishna (26) from Tirupatur district, Tamil Nadu. Investigations revealed that the accused formed a gang with smugglers from Tamil Nadu and Karnataka, engaging laborers from Tamil Nadu to illegally fell red sanders trees and smuggle them to Karnataka.

The accused is reportedly involved in 6 cases across Tirupati, Annamaya, and Kadapa districts. He was also identified as a key player in the recent seizure of 72 red sanders logs transported in a tanker near Pincha in February. Officials stated that steps are being taken to invoke the PD Act against him and confiscate his properties. SP L. Subbarayudu appreciated the Task Force team for successfully cracking the case.

Former CJI B.R. Gavai Delivers Inaugural Dr. Ambedkar Memorial Lecture at NALSAR Hyderabad

Hyderabad : NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad, hosted the inaugural Dr. Ambedkar Memorial Lecture under the aegis of its Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Chair on Constitutional Law and Social Inclusion. The lecture was delivered by Hon'ble Dr. Justice B.R. Gavai, former Chief Justice of India and Chair Professor of the Ambedkar Chair.

Justice Gavai had earlier accepted the position of Chair Professor in December 2025. This visit marked his first to the University in that capacity. In his lecture, Justice Gavai mentioned, "When this offer was extended to me by NALSAR, I accepted it with a simple condition that I would not take any salary. I felt that no monetary consideration can equal the value of being associated, even in a small way, with the legacy of Dr. Ambedkar."

During the visit, he also inaugurated the office space designated for the functioning of the Ambedkar Chair, formally operationalizing the



institutional infrastructure established to support its academic and research activities.

Delivering the inaugural lecture titled "Sustainable Development and Substantive Equality: A Constitutional Dialogue," Justice Gavai offered a reflective engagement with the relationship between development and equality within the constitutional framework. He posed a foundational question: whether development can be sustainable if it does not incorporate substantive equality, and whether the promise of equality can be realized

without addressing material and structural inequalities.

Drawing upon the constitutional vision of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, Justice Gavai emphasized that the Constitution does not envisage equality as a mere formal guarantee, but as a substantive commitment to dismantling entrenched hierarchies. Referring to Dr. Ambedkar's warning about the "life of contradictions," he noted that the persistence of social and economic inequality continues to challenge the realization of constitutional ideals.

Justice Gavai highlighted how structural inequalities

shape access to resources and opportunities, and how environmental and developmental challenges disproportionately impact marginalized communities. Through examples such as drought, agrarian distress, and extreme climate conditions, he underscored that vulnerability is not incidental but socially produced.

He further elaborated that sustainable development must be understood as a constitutional principle that integrates social justice. Development, he observed, cannot be considered sustainable if it perpetuates inequality. Rather, it must actively reduce vulnerability, redistribute access, and prioritize those most at risk. This requires moving beyond formally neutral policies towards frameworks that recognize unequal starting points.

In concluding, Justice Gavai reiterated that a model of development that leaves large sections of society behind cannot be sustainable, and called for a reimagining

of governance that corrects, rather than reproduces, historical disadvantage.

The Vice-Chancellor of NALSAR, Prof. Srikrishna Deva Rao, formally welcomed Justice Gavai and expressed appreciation for his association with the University and for accepting the Chair Professorship. The event witnessed the presence of Vice-Chancellors from other universities, along with a large gathering of faculty members, students, researchers, and members of the academic community.

The Dr. Ambedkar Memorial Lecture is envisioned as an annual flagship initiative of the Ambedkar Chair, aimed at fostering sustained constitutional dialogue on equality, justice, and social transformation. Justice Gavai is expected to continue his engagement with the University through future lectures and academic interactions.

The event concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by the Registrar, Professor N. Vasanthi.

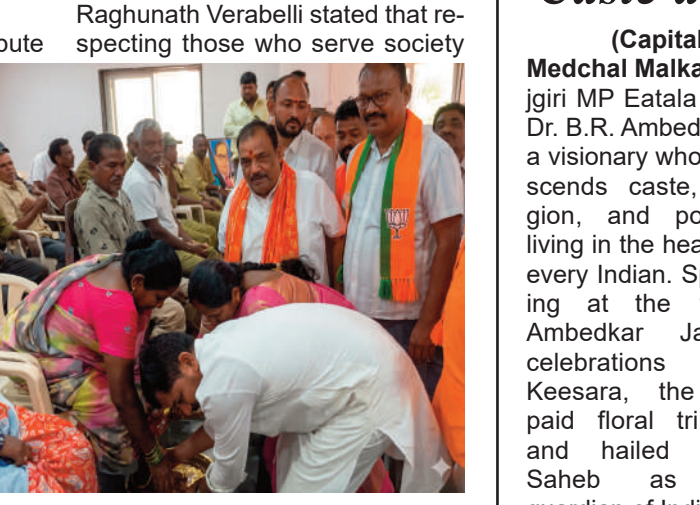
