

Telangana eyes global aerospace leadership as CM flags off Skyroot's Vikram-1 rocket

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad : A. Revanth Reddy on Saturday said Telangana is poised to emerge as a global aerospace hub, as he flagged off the flight hardware of Skyroot Aerospace's Vikram-1 rocket to Sriharikota.

The event, held in the presence of Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu, marked the formal dispatch of India's first privately developed orbital rocket to the Satish Dhawan Space Centre for an upcoming launch attempt.

Describing the occasion as a milestone, the Chief Minister said the rocket had been entirely designed and developed in Hyderabad. "Reaching the stage of an orbital launch within a short time is a remarkable achievement," he said, recalling the company's earlier suborbital launch in 2022.

Mr. Reddy noted that Telangana has emerged as a leading destination in the aerospace sector, with global firms such as Boeing, Airbus and Safran already operating in the State. He

said the government aims to position Telangana as a global aerospace leader by 2047. Highlighting industrial growth, the Chief Minister said Telangana recorded the highest increase in engineering goods exports in the country — 117.9% between 2023–24 and 2024–25

— with aircraft components and defence equipment contributing significantly. Emphasising the importance of skilled manpower, he outlined the State's initiatives to align training with industry requirements. The government plans to integrate Advanced Technology

Centres and polytechnic colleges under the ambit of the Young India Skills University to ensure a uniform, industry-driven curriculum

"Our focus is on training the trainers and creating a future-ready workforce," he said, adding that industry partnerships were being strengthened to enhance employability.

Responding to the initiative, Skyroot Aerospace CEO and co-founder Pawan Kumar Chandana expressed interest in collaborating with the Skills University. "Skilling is a major challenge, and such partnerships will add significant value," he said.

Senior officials, including Special Secretary to the Chief Minister B. Ajith Reddy and Skyroot co-founder Naga Bharath Daka, were present.

The Vikram-1 launch, expected in the coming months, is set to mark India's first private orbital mission, underscoring the growing role of private players in the country's space sector.

Praja Darbars launched to address grievances at grassroots : Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy

Khammam Bureau / Hyderabad : Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy on Saturday said the State government has launched 'Praja Darbars' across Telangana to ensure time-bound and transparent resolution of public grievances at the grassroots level.



The Minister was speaking at a Praja Darbar organised in the Paleru constituency under the Rayigudem cluster as part of the Praja Palana-Pragathi Pranalka initiative. He interacted with residents from several gram panchayats, including Rayigudem, Ajay Thanda, Cheruvumadaram, Mangapuram Thanda, Apalanarasimhapuram, Bud-daram, Kattukacharam,

Kongara, Rajarampeta and Bhairavunipalli.

Mr. Srinivasa Reddy said Paleru had been identified as a model constituency for the initiative, which would later be expanded across the State. He noted that common

issues such as drinking water supply, electricity and land-related concerns, including those linked to the Dharani portal, were being addressed through the programme.

Explaining the objective, he said the initiative, envi-

sioned by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, aims to build public trust by ensuring efficient grievance redressal. "Some issues can be resolved immediately, while others may take time. The focus is on identifying and resolving every genuine grievance," he said.

The Minister emphasised that grievance redressal would be carried out without political bias. "Public service goes beyond party lines. After elections, addressing people's problems becomes the primary responsibility," he said.

He added that unlike earlier, officials are now directly reaching out to citizens to understand their concerns. Dedicated counters were set

up for each panchayat, where officials examined petitions and resolved several issues on the spot, while others were taken up for follow-up action.

Mr. Srinivasa Reddy also announced that from April 27, special review meetings would be held across the State with district collectors and public representatives, focusing on the Revenue and Housing departments. He assured that schemes such as Indiramma Housing and land-related issues would be addressed in a transparent and time-bound manner.

Senior officials and public representatives from various departments participated in the programme and received petitions from the public.

Everyone Must Participate in Self Enumeration for Census 2027 : Collector Sneha Shabarish

Mahabubabad : District Collector Sneha Shabarish has urged all citizens to actively participate in the Self Enumeration process for Census 2027. A press meet was organized on Saturday evening at the Collectorate Conference Hall (IDOC), where the Collector, along with Additional District Census Officer K. Anil Kumar, explained the process through a Power-Point Presentation (PPT) to print and electronic media representatives.

must enter their name and mobile number, verify through OTP, and select a preferred language.

Further, details such as district, town/village, and PIN code must be entered. Users are required to enable location services and mark their residence accurately on the map. Citizens must answer 33 questions related to household details, verify the information through preview, and submit the form. Upon submission, an 11-digit Self Enumeration ID (SE ID), starting with 'H', will be generated.

This ID should be saved and shown to the enumerator visiting the household after May 11 for verification. The Collector emphasized that Census 2027 is the largest participatory exercise in the country and appealed to public representatives, officials, and citizens to take part actively and ensure accurate data submission.

She further stated that the



House Listing and Population Enumeration Phase will be conducted from May 11 to June 9, during which enumerators will visit every household to collect detailed information regarding housing conditions, amenities, and basic demographic data. Citizens were advised to obtain their Self Declaration ID through the online portal and present it to the survey staff during their visit.

The Collector highlighted that census data plays a crucial role in policy formulation, resource allocation, and de-

velopment planning, including improvements in schools, hospitals, roads, and other public services.

Assuring data security, she said that all information collected will remain confidential under the Census Act, 1948, and will not be disclosed publicly or used for any investigations. The Collector also urged people to provide accurate and complete information to enumerators, stating that reliable data will benefit future planning and development. She called upon citizens to partic-

ipate with a sense of responsibility and contribute to national progress.

She informed that around 1,764 personnel have been appointed for the census work in the district, and they have already completed training in two phases. Extensive awareness campaigns are being carried out through print, electronic, and social media, and further publicity measures are being taken to ensure smooth implementation of the program. Officials at all levels, especially mandal-level officers, have been instructed to extend full cooperation to survey staff.

The meeting was attended by CPO V. Srinivasa Rao, District Statistical Officers G. Ashok and Radhan, along with public representatives, media personnel, Chamber of Commerce members, self-help group members, ASHA workers, and Anganwadi teachers.

Drug Abuse is Dangerous: Dr. G. Samaram

Vijayawada : Renowned physician and Chairman of the NTR District Red Cross, Dr. G. Samaram, expressed concern that the increasing use of narcotic substances among youth is becoming a serious threat to the nation's future. He stated that this habit can be overcome with proper treatment and counseling.



Dr. Samaram was the chief guest at a health seminar held on Saturday at Vasavya Nursing Home in Vijayawada, under the leadership of Sri D. Ravi Kumar. He spoke on the topic "Drug Abuse" during the event.

Addressing the gathering, he said that drug abuse is one of the most dangerous issues that is internally damaging society. He noted that the growing trend of substance use among youth is adversely affecting not only individual health but also families, society, and the future of the country.

He explained that what often begins as a casual habit or as a way to relieve stress can quickly turn into addiction, especially under peer influence. He added that social media and movies are also contributing factors.

Dr. Samaram further elaborated that drug use affects the brain's dopamine system, making a person completely dependent. This leads to problems such as memory loss and impaired decision-making. He warned that long-term use can damage vital organs like the heart, liver, and kidneys, and can also cause mental health issues such as anxiety, depression, and violent behavior.

He also highlighted that drug abuse can result in poor academic and job performance, strained family relationships, and an increased risk of serious diseases such as HIV and Hepatitis.

He advised parents to combine affection with proper supervision of their children. He emphasized the need for awareness programs in schools and colleges. Encouraging youth participation in sports and cultural activities, along with providing counseling to handle stress, can help reduce this problem, he said. He also urged that any suspicious behavior should be addressed immediately by consulting medical professionals.

who simply buys a certificate. Such “shortcut degrees” produce candidates without any real skills or knowledge. This doesn't just tarnish the image of the educational system; it pushes the future of the next generation into darkness. It must be said that the district education authorities and university officials have miserably failed to monitor these study centers.

Conclusion: When will the Cleanup Begin?

Immediate measures, such as installing CCTV cameras at exam centers and linking student attendance to biometric systems, must be taken. If the culture of buying degrees with money is not checked, the prestigious name of 'Open University' will lose its dignity and remain merely a 'Certificate Shop.' The government must intervene, conduct a thorough inquiry into the study centers in Nalgonda, and put an end to these 'merchants of education.'

Farmers Urged to Utilize Government Procurement Centers; Grain to be Purchased Without Deductions: MLA Vijay Ramana Rao

He explained that such malicious applications, once installed, can gain access to mobile devices, intercept OTPs and SMS alerts, and compromise sensitive banking information, potentially leading to unauthorised financial transactions.



Students were advised to avoid downloading applications from unknown sources and to rely only on verified app stores. The officer also stressed the importance of checking links and messages before clicking on them and urged participants to spread awareness among their families and peers.

Participants were informed about the cyber crime helpline number 1930

and the national reporting portal for lodging complaints in case of online fraud.

The interactive session saw active student participation, with several queries on cyber safety addressed by the police team. The programme was organised as part of the "Jagrut Hyderabad - Surakshit Hyderabad" initiative aimed at promoting digital awareness and security among citizens.

Attempt to Murder on Sarpanch at Village Jatara Triggers Tension

(Capital Information)

Hyderabad : Tension prevailed in Elukagudem village of Chowdarguda mandal in Rangareddy district after an alleged attempt to murder a sitting sarpanch during a local festival.

According to reports, Elukagudem sarpanch Bandayya was brutally attacked on Saturday evening by former sarpanch Ram Reddy and his associates during the ongoing Eedamma jatara in the village. Bandayya, who belongs to a backward community, had been actively overseeing arrangements for the festival.

Family members alleged that the attack was driven by caste-based animosity, claiming that the accused could not tolerate a person from a lower caste leading the jatara. They stated that the assailants



chased and attacked Bandayya with lethal weapons in full public view, causing severe injuries to his head and other parts of the body.

The injured sarpanch was immediately shifted to the government hospital in Shadnagar for treatment. Doctors are closely monitoring his condition, which is said to be critical. On receiving information,

MLA Veerlapalli Shankar rushed to the village along with party leaders and met the victim's family. Consoling them, he assured strict action against the perpetrators and directed the police to ensure tight security in the village.

Expressing strong condemnation, the MLA said such caste-based violence was unacceptable in a pro-

gressive society and insisted that the guilty be punished severely, irrespective of their status. He also spoke to medical officials and instructed them to provide the best possible treatment, and to shift the victim to Hyderabad if his condition worsens.

Police have registered a case and further investigation is underway.

Self-Enumeration for Census-2027 to Begin from April 26 in Telangana

(Capital Information)

Hyderabad : As part of Census of India -2027, the Self-Enumeration process will commence in Telangana from April 26, according to the Smt. Bharati Hollikeri, Director, Directorate of Census Operations, Telangana. She said that the process will continue until May 10. She addressed a press conference held at the GHMC Head Office in Hyderabad on Saturday.

Highlighting the significance of this census, Smt. Bharati Hollikeri stated that this will be the first census conducted after the formation of Telangana state. It will also be the first fully digital census. Additionally, she noted that a caste-based enumeration will be conducted for the first time since Independence, making this exercise particularly significant.

She further informed that, for the first time, a Self-Enu-



meration facility has been introduced, allowing citizens to directly participate in the census process. People can voluntarily submit their details through the official web portal: <https://se.census.gov.in>.

Clarifying that self-enumeration is not mandatory and it is optional, she described it as a convenience for citizens. The initiative is expected to speed up data collection and reduce the workload of field enumerators. The portal is available in 16 languages, including Telugu, Hindi, and English, and is designed to be highly secure.

She said that for any queries, citizens can refer to the information available on the

portal or contact the helpline number 1855 between 10:00 AM and 6:00 PM.

Out of the total 33 questions in the census, citizens can respond to 27 questions through self-enumeration. The remaining six questions will be completed by enumerators during field visits. No documents or photographs are required to be uploaded. As the process does not involve geo-fencing, allowing citizens to complete it from anywhere.

Describing the census as the "mother of all surveys," Smt. Hollikeri emphasized that it provides comprehensive data essential for policymaking and development planning. She

urged citizens to provide accurate information, stating that it is their responsibility and crucial for the future of coming generations. The goal is to ensure that census data accurately reflects ground reality.

GHMC Commissioner Mr. R.V. Karnan explained the arrangements for conducting the census in Greater Hyderabad and the Core Urban Region (CURE). He stated that each division will be considered as a unit for enumeration. A total of 21,866 enumerators and 3,652 supervisors will be deployed, along with 60 Deputy Commissioners overseeing operations at the circle level. Separate in-charge officer will be appointed for cantonment area. He appealed to citizens to actively participate in the self-enumeration process.

Later, the officials unveiled posters and publicity material related to the census

A request was made to clear encroachments on all footpaths within Kazipet town and to ensure the safety of pedestrians.

due to the state government's failure to file a counter in response to the recent interim orders of the Telangana High Court, private colleges have been permitted to collect fees directly from SC, ST, BC, EBC, and minority students. He alleged that the delay in clearing fee reimbursement dues has forced students to borrow money and pay fees, as certificates are essential for pursuing higher education and securing employment.

He demanded that the government file a counter affidavit before the 30th of this month and ensure that fee reimbursement dues are paid by the state itself. He further called upon the authorities to engage with college managements to prevent harassment of students and facilitate the issuance of certificates without delay. The former minister also criticized the government on multiple fronts, stating that it has failed to release job noti-

The Incident : Juluru Nagesh, a resident of Tatikol village, had been facing domestic disputes with his wife, Radhika. Exploiting this situation, two locals named Juluru Renu Goud and Venkatayya approached Nagesh. They falsely claimed that a case had been filed against him at the Devarakonda Police Station. They further misled him by

stating that the Devarakonda CI (Circle Inspector) was demanding ₹1,00,000 to settle the matter. Fearing legal consequences, Nagesh handed over the amount to the duo. The Deception Uncovered : Upon verification, it was revealed that no case had been filed against Nagesh at the Devarakonda station. On the contrary,

Nagesh himself was a complainant in a separate case (Cr.No: 125/2026) regarding an attack on his house by his in-laws. The investigation clarified that while Nagesh's wife had filed a complaint at the Veldanda Police Station in Nagarkurnool district, the accused (Renu Goud and Venkatayya) lied about hav-

ing influence in Devarakonda to extort the money. Based on the victim's complaint, the Devarakonda police registered a case under Crime No. 155/2026 U/s 318(4) r/w 3(5) of the BNS Act-2023 and have initiated an investigation. Police Advisory: Do Not Trust Middlemen-Devarakonda Inspector P. Venkat Reddy urged the public not to fall prey to brokers or intermediaries. He emphasized that police services should be accessed directly at the station free of charge. He warned that strict legal action would be taken against any "middlemen" caught extorting money by using the name of the police department.

Nationwide Census Begins - Citizens Urged to Use Self Enumeration Facility : B. Sharath Chandra

Nalgonda : Municipal Commissioner B. Sharath Chandra announced that extensive arrangements have been made within the Nalgonda Municipal Corporation limits as part of the nationwide Census being conducted under the directions of the Central Government. He stated that the Census plays a crucial role in the country's development and in designing welfare schemes, and appealed to all citizens to cooperate. A total of 342 enumeration blocks have been set up in the municipal limits, with one enumerator appointed for every 800 people. In total, 377 enumerators and 63 supervisors have been deployed. Training programs for enumerators and supervisors were conducted in three phases under the guidance of master trainers at the Municipal Office and ZP Office meeting halls: Phase 1: April 18-21; Phase 2: April 23-25; Phase 3: April 27-29. This time, the Central Government has introduced a Self Enumeration facility, enabling citizens to register their details online from their homes. This facility will be available from April 26 to May 10, 2026. Citizens can log in to the official website: <https://se.census.gov.in> and complete the process easily. The self-enumeration process includes around 34 questions and can be completed within 2-3 minutes. After submission, an 11-digit SEID number starting with the letter "H" will be generated. Citizens can present this SEID to the enumerator during verification visits. Officials



clarified that the Census is being conducted entirely in digital mode and all information provided will remain confidential. The first phase of the Census will be conducted from May 11 to June 9, 2026, followed by the second phase (Population Enumeration) from February 9 to February 28, 2027. This survey will collect comprehensive data on households, families, occupations, agriculture, and businesses. Since future Central and State Government welfare schemes will be based on this data, citizens are urged to provide accurate information and actively participate. For any queries or assistance, citizens may contact local enumerators, supervisors, or the Municipal Office. Commissioner B. Sharath Chandra appealed to all residents to utilize the self-enumeration facility and support the successful conduct of the Census.

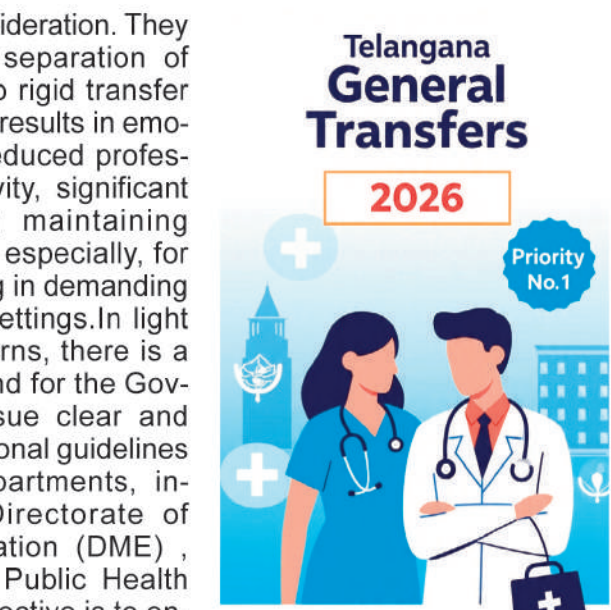

Immediate Procurement of Paddy Demanded by Farmers' Union

Mulugu, April 25 : The Telangana State Farmers' Union has demanded that the government immediately initiate procurement of paddy from farmers. District General Secretary Mr. M.D. Anjad Pasha raised the demand during an inspection of a paddy procurement centre at Kasimdevipet village in Mulugu mandal. A team of the union visited the centre and found that farmers have been drying their produce at the procurement yards for the past 20 days. However, not a single grain has been procured by the government so far, despite the moisture content being within the permissible limit of 14%. Due to the delay in procurement, farmers are facing severe hardship and are being forced to sell their produce to private traders at lower prices. A tenant farmer, Mr. Marri Ashok, reportedly sold his paddy at ₹2,000 per quintal under distress. Addressing the protest, Mr. Anjad Pasha criticised the authorities for their negligence, stating that farmers are being pushed into financial distress due to the lack of
