

PM Modi Launches Telangana Projects Worth ₹9,400 Crore, Focuses on Infrastructure and Industrial Growth

Hyderabad : Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday virtually inaugurated and laid foundation stones for multiple infrastructure and industrial projects worth nearly ₹9,400 crore in Telangana during a programme held at the Hyderabad International Convention Centre (HICC) in Hitec City.



The event was attended by Telangana Governor Shiv Pratap Shukla, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, Union Ministers G. Kishan Reddy and Bandi Sanjay Kumar, state minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy and other public representatives. Among the major projects launched was the PM MITRA Kakatiya Mega Textile Park in Warangal, being projected as India's first fully operational PM MITRA textile park. Spread across over 1,300 acres, the integrated textile hub is expected to strengthen the textile manufacturing ecosystem and generate large-scale employment opportunities.

Other projects included the development of the Zaheerabad industrial and smart city area, four-laning works on NH-167 under the Hyderabad-Panaji Economic Corridor, railway multi-tracking works on the Kazipet-Vijayawada section, a rail under bypass project at Kazipet and a petroleum, oil and lubricants terminal at Malkapur. Addressing the gathering, A. Revanth Reddy described the programme as a "development festival" and stressed the importance of cooperation between the Centre and the state for

derabad Metro Rail expansion, radial roads and the proposed Hyderabad-Machilipatnam 12-lane highway. During his speech, Narendra Modi assured continued support for Telangana's development and highlighted the Centre's increased allocation for railway infrastructure in the state. The Prime Minister also stressed the importance of infrastructure-led growth, renewable energy expansion and reduced dependence on imported petroleum products. He said India is moving ahead rapidly through reforms and modern infrastructure development. Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy said the projects launched during the visit would significantly boost Telangana's industrial growth, logistics network and employment generation. The event highlighted ongoing Centre-State collaboration in sectors including textiles, transport, railways, energy and industrial infrastructure as part of broader economic development initiatives in Telangana.

Tamil Nadu CM Vijay Signs First Orders Focusing on Welfare, Women's Safety and Anti-Drug Measures

Chennai : Newly sworn-in Tamil Nadu Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay on Sunday signed his first set of official orders within hours of assuming office, announcing measures related to free electricity, women's safety and anti-drug enforcement. The decisions were signed shortly after the oath-taking ceremony held at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in Chennai, where Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar administered the oath of office and secrecy to the new Chief Minister and his cabinet.



One of the key announcements was the implementation of a free electricity scheme under which eligible domestic consumers using up to 500 units in two months would receive 200 units of free power during the billing cycle. The new government also approved the formation of a dedicated women's safety unit, referred to as the "Singa Pen" task force, aimed at improving rapid

response systems and strengthening protection measures for women across the state. In another major decision, the government announced the establishment of a statewide anti-narcotics task force, including dedicated units and police stations in districts and urban centres to intensify action against drug trafficking and substance abuse. Officials said the measures were intended to address public welfare concerns and strengthen law-and-order enforcement, particularly with a focus on youth

protection. C. Joseph Vijay also stated that his government would release a white paper on the financial condition inherited from the previous administration and reiterated his commitment to transparent and accountable governance. The swift announcements are being viewed as an effort by the Tamil Nadu government to demonstrate immediate implementation of key electoral promises after securing power in the Assembly elections. While supporters welcomed the decisions as people-centric measures, some political observers and economists raised concerns regarding the long-term fiscal implications of welfare commitments amid the state's existing financial liabilities. Further operational guidelines and government orders regarding implementation of the schemes are expected to be issued by the Tamil Nadu government in the coming days.

Harish Rao questions delay in action in POCSO case

Hyderabad : BRSPL Deputy Leader T Harish Rao on Sunday questioned the delay in police action in the POCSO case involving Union Minister of State for Home Bandi Sanjay's son Bhagirath. He demanded answers from Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy over the handling of the case. In a statement, Harish Rao pointed to lapses in the police taking eight hours to register the case after the victim approached the station. He asked why no action had been initiated against the accused even 36 hours after the case was booked. "Could there be any greater proof of collusion of the Congress and BJP in this State?" he asked, demanding an impartial police investigation and immediate justice for the victim.

Minister Komatireddy Reviews Key Highway Projects with NHAI Chairman

Hyderabad : Telangana Roads and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy on Sunday held a review meeting with Santosh Kumar Yadav to discuss the progress of major national highway and infrastructure projects in the state. The meeting focused on accelerating ongoing and proposed projects being executed by the National Highways Authority of India, including the Regional Ring Road (RRR) and the widening of the Hyderabad-Vijayawada National Highway (NH-65). According to officials, discussions were also held on the proposed 7.1-km double-decker elevated corridor between LB Nagar and Hayathnagar, planned on the lines of a similar model implemented in Nagpur. The state government has already prepared the Detailed Project Report (DPR) for the elevated corridor project and submitted it to the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways for approval. During the meeting, Santosh Kumar Yadav informed the minister that the tender process for both the Hyderabad-Vijayawada highway expansion project and the Regional Ring Road has been completed and that steps are being taken to commence construction works at the earliest. City boys' world record in martial arts

Hyderabad : For the 14-year-old Balabhadrapatruni Yashwanth from the City, a martial arts exponent, it was a dream come true when his two individual feats involving speed-based striking techniques, earned him a unique world record.



In March 2026, Yashwanth recorded 161 full-extension punches in 30 seconds while wearing boxing gloves and 107 full-extension punches in 20 seconds while wearing karate gloves.

Yashwanth, a 10th standard student of Pallavi School and mentored by Shaswat Kumar, performed the feat in March this year and he is affiliated with the Senkoukai Karate organization.

The young talent's rare performance has been recognised by the Asian Book of World Records for performances involving speed-based striking techniques.

In May 2026, he received an additional recognition from the Asian Book of World Records for completing 108 single-hand full-extension wall punches within 30 seconds, again verified under the supervision of Shaswat Kumar.

Busy Lives, Empty Homes: Why Family Time Must Become a National Priority

Tirupati : A Growth Story We Are Not Talking About: India's progress is often measured in numbers—GDP growth, rising incomes, expanding cities. But there is another story unfolding quietly inside homes. It does not appear in economic reports, yet it shapes the future of society in a far deeper way. The modern Indian household is functioning efficiently. But emotionally, it is under strain.

The Two-Income Reality: For most families today, having both parents work is not a choice—it is a necessity. Rising living costs, education expenses, and aspirations have made dual incomes essential. On the surface, everything looks stable. Bills are paid, routines are maintained, and responsibilities are managed. But stability on paper does not always mean stability at home.

The Hidden Cost: Time and Energy: What often goes unnoticed is the cost at which this system operates. Long work hours, demanding

schedules, and exhausting commutes leave parents with limited emotional energy. They are physically present, but mentally drained. Conversations become shorter. Interactions become task-focused. The warmth that once defined home life slowly gives way to efficiency. This is not a lack of care—it is a lack of capacity.

Children Feel What Isn't Said: Children may not always express it, but they experience the shift. When time is limited and attention is divided, emotional connection weakens. Family conversations turn into instructions. Guidance becomes hurried. Screens begin to replace meaningful engagement. Over time, a quiet emotional distance develops—not because families don't value connection, but because they struggle to sustain it.

From Homes to Survival Zones: Homes are meant to offer calm, connection, and comfort. Increasingly, they are becoming spaces of recovery after long, demanding days. Mornings are rushed. Evenings are tired. Nights are

often spent in silence or on devices. Stress replaces calm, and patience gives way to irritation. The home continues to function—but it no longer feels the same.

A Personal Problem or a Public Issue? Despite its widespread nature, this challenge is often treated as a private matter. Families are expected to "manage better," to find balance within systems that leave little room for it. At the same time, political narratives frequently highlight "happiness," "family welfare," and "quality of life." Yet these ideas rarely translate into policies that directly support family time and emotional well-being. If happiness is truly a national priority, this gap cannot be ignored.

What Other Countries Are Doing Differently: Several countries have already recognized that family well-being is



not separate from national development—it is central to it. Nations like Finland, Sweden, and Norway have built systems that actively support family life. Their policies include regulated work hours, flexible employment structures, shared parental leave, and accessible childcare.

The outcomes are clear. These countries consistently report higher levels of happiness, lower parental stress, and stronger social cohesion.

Why Policy Must Step In? If policymakers are serious about improving quality of life, family well-being must move from rhetoric to action. Work-hour limits need to be enforced more strictly. Flexible

work arrangements should be encouraged at a systemic level. Parental leave policies must evolve to include fathers, enabling shared responsibility in caregiving. Childcare should be treated as essential infrastructure, ensuring that working parents are supported rather than stretched. Equally important is protecting personal time. The idea that employees should be constantly available needs to be re-examined. Without clear boundaries, family time becomes the first casualty of professional demands.

Measuring What Truly Matters: India closely tracks economic indicators such as growth and employment. But it does not measure how families are actually living. Introducing a "Family Well-being Index" could change that. By assessing factors like time spent together, stress levels, and work-life balance, policymakers can better understand the real impact of economic structures on daily life. What gets measured gets attention—and eventually, action.

Redefining Progress: This

is not about reducing ambition or slowing down growth. It is about making progress more meaningful and sustainable. A nation's strength is not defined only by its economy, but by the stability and well-being of its families. When homes are emotionally secure, societies become more resilient, productive, and cohesive.

The Question for Leadership: If happiness is truly a priority for leadership, then family well-being must be placed at the centre of policy thinking—not treated as an afterthought. Because a country cannot be emotionally strong if its homes are emotionally exhausted.

The Final Thought: India's future will not be shaped only in boardrooms or policy offices. It will be shaped inside homes in conversations, relationships, and daily interactions. Today, many homes are efficient, organized, and functioning. But they are also tired. The real challenge is not just to build a successful nation. It is to build one where people have the time and space to truly live.

"Village name boards disappear, venture boards appear instead"

Sangareddy : Especially in the Narayankhed Assembly Constituency, Sundays have become a hotspot for vehicles flocking in like vultures. In these ventures, plots are registered in the name of "gunta" land divisions. After selling all the plots, even the land reserved for roads is sold off in acres to others.

Eventually, the old venture disappears, the boards are changed, and the same land reappears under new venture names. Ventures are

being promoted in the name of "Aravind," but in reality, there is very little to show on the ground.

Several ventures under this name are spread across Narayankhed and Nagalgidda Mandal. Buyers are being brought from Hyderabad in

large groups and allegedly cheated. They promise one thing and deliver another, constantly using new tactics and misleading claims.



Many ventures that were previously advertised now have nothing at the site except the signboards, which itself shows the extent of the alleged fraud. Farmers face difficulties and delays when they go for land registrations, but venture owners

reportedly get registrations done quickly and smoothly.

People are questioning why officials appear to be supporting these venture managements despite so many complaints and alleged scams. Just by looking at these venture boards, one can understand how poorly they are being maintained.

Before selling, however, they conduct aggressive promotions in Hyderabad, distributing colorful pamphlets claiming proximity to Karnataka, Telangana, and the Manjeera River, luring innocent people into buying plots.

Once the sales are completed, nothing remains at the site. Locals are now demanding that authorities respond immediately and take strict action against these ventures.

Centre Discriminating Against Telangana, Says Government Whip and MLA Yennam Srinivas Reddy

Questions BJP Over Lack of Funds, Projects and Support for Telangana Development

MAHABUBNAGAR : Government Whip and MLA Yennam Srinivas Reddy launched a sharp attack on the Central Government and the Bharatiya Janata Party, accusing them of neglecting Telangana and adopting a discriminatory attitude towards the state. He questioned BJP leaders to explain what additional benefits Telangana received despite Prime Minister Narendra Modi visiting the state several times after the formation of Telangana. He asked BJP MPs and Union Ministers to reveal the special projects and additional funds they had brought to the state.

According to him, the Centre has been treating Telangana with step-motherly affection since the beginning and has continuously ignored the state's development needs. Yennam Srinivas Reddy said the Prime Minister had promised national project status for the Palamuru region, but the assurance has not



been fulfilled till date.

At the same time, he alleged that the Centre was releasing huge funds for the Polavaram Project in Andhra Pradesh and ensuring speedy completion of the works, while Telangana projects were being neglected. Questioning the reasons behind such discrimination, he alleged that the BJP-led Central Government was functioning in a manner that benefited large corporate businessmen from Gujarat. He claimed that the Centre was working only for the interests of corporate giants like Adani and Ambani.

He further alleged that the Centre was creating several

obstacles for the expansion of the Hyderabad Metro Rail project, forcing the state government to take independent initiative to move the expansion works forward. Criticising BJP supporters, Srinivas Reddy remarked that some leaders were treating Prime Minister Modi with blind devotion while ignoring the real issues faced by the public.

He accused Telangana BJP MPs of limiting themselves to criticising the state government instead of fighting for the rights and interests of Telangana people. He alleged that while the Centre was allocating massive funds to northern states, Telangana's development was

being completely ignored. He also accused the Centre of creating hurdles in the completion of the Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Project.

Referring to earlier remarks on the Kaleshwaram Project, Srinivas Reddy said Prime Minister Modi had once described it as an "ATM" and alleged corruption, but no action had been taken so far. He pointed out that despite several years passing, not a single case had been registered against the former Chief Minister's family. Claiming that the relationship between the Bharat Rashtra Samithi and the BJP appeared stronger than "Fevicol," he alleged political understanding between the two parties.

Highlighting welfare initiatives of the state government, he said free bus travel for women had significantly contributed to women empowerment. He also stated that several students were now moving towards higher education due to measures intro-

duced by the state government.

Yennam Srinivas Reddy criticised the Centre for spending thousands of crores on bullet train projects while failing to provide adequate funds for government schools and the education sector. He alleged that proposals sent by the Telangana Government for the expansion of residential schools had not received approvals from the Centre.

He further stated that the BJP Government at the Centre was prioritising selfish politics over national interest. While the Centre was acting swiftly for the development of Amaravati, it was showing negligence towards the growth and expansion of Hyderabad, he alleged.

Concluding his remarks, Srinivas Reddy said BJP MPs elected from Telangana had become merely ornamental leaders and were failing to fight for the rights, interests and development of Telangana people.

BC Associations Hold Protest Rallies Against PM Modi's Visit in Hyderabad

Hyderabad : Telangana State BC Welfare Associations and the National OBC Intellectual Forum organized massive protest rallies in Hyderabad on Sunday opposing the visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the state. Protesters raised slogans of "Modi Go Back" during rallies conducted from Old MLA Quarters at Hyderguda to Amaraveerula Stupam at Gun Park, and later to the indefinite hunger strike camp being held by former MP and former PCC President V. Hanumantha Rao at Amberpet.

The BC organizations had earlier warned that they

would oppose the BJP public meeting scheduled to be addressed by Prime Minister Modi at Gymkhana Grounds in Hyderabad. Leaders alleged that National Intellectual Forum Chairman Alla Ramakrishna Phule was placed under house arrest by police in the early hours of Sunday. Despite this, activists participated in the protest rallies in large numbers following his call.

Under the leadership of Telangana State BC Welfare Association President Mekapothula Narendra Goud, leaders paid floral tributes to the statues of Jyotirao Phule and Savitribai Phule at Hyderguda. Addressing the



gathering, BC leaders criticized the BJP government for allegedly failing to fulfill its promise of conducting a caste census across the country.

The leaders stated that although Prime Minister Modi claims to represent BC communities, his government had

not delivered justice or meaningful benefits to backward classes during his tenure. They alleged that the BJP government had neglected the welfare and development of BC communities.

Large numbers of BC leaders and activists staged protests at Gun Park and

later extended solidarity to V. Hanumantha Rao at his indefinite hunger strike camp in Bagh Amberpet. They praised his decades-long efforts toward BC welfare and awareness.

Thousands of BC activists participated in the protests. Census Vital for Accurate National Data: Officials Urge Public Participation

The officials further explained that, for the first time, the Census is being conducted through a digital system. They said the introduction of the "Self Enumeration" method marks a new chapter in the Census process, allowing citizens to independently register their family details.

They informed that the Self Enumeration process consists of 34 questions and can be completed within five minutes. Citizens were requested to log in using their mobile number through the official portal

<https://se.census.gov.in> and complete the process.

They also announced that the deadline for Self Enumeration is till 6 PM today and urged everyone to utilize the opportunity to personally submit their details.

The officials stated that from Monday onwards, Census enumerators will conduct door-to-door data collection. Experienced staff have been appointed as Census supervisors and enumerators, and necessary training has been provided to them. Special identity cards have also been is-

sued to the staff, and the public was requested to cooperate during the survey.

They cautioned citizens against suspicious individuals who may attempt to collect information in the name of the Census. Officials clarified that authorized Census staff will carry identification cards containing QR codes, which can be scanned to verify their official details on the government website.

An awareness vehicle was also flagged off during the program.

The officials reiterated that the Census process is highly important and reminded citizens that participation in the Census is the responsibility of every individual.

functioning of the centre and also inspected major scientific equipment and high-end analytical facilities installed at the institute.

Senior officials of the Department of Science & Technology, Banaras Hindu University, scientists, faculty members and representatives from the SATHI Centre were present during the visit.

SATHI-BHU has been established with the support of nearly Rs. 72 crores from the Department of Science & Technology as a national-level shared scientific infrastructure facility providing access to advanced instrumentation, analytical services and technical expertise for academia, research institutions,

industries, MSMEs and start-ups. The facility operates through a Section 8 company model within the university ecosystem and has developed into a major multidisciplinary analytical and research support centre.

From Somnath to Sindoor, The spirit of a resurgent India : Piyush Goyal

New Delhi : The reconstruction and consecration of the magnificent Somnath Temple 75 years ago marked a defining moment in the resurgence of India's civilisational glory and reaffirmed its resilience and determination, which are at the core of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Viksit Bharat 2047 mission.

The 75th anniversary of this sacred milestone gives the nation supreme confidence in the strong foundation and strength of the Indian civilization that emerged stronger after withstanding a series of vicious attacks on the temple by fanatics for 1,000 years.

After every attack, the temple on the serene seashore of Gujarat rose from the ruins in all its splendour. In many ways, its history mirrors the country's past, in which our peace-loving people bounced back after brutal attacks on their belief systems, culture and heritage.

As PM Modi said, just as

there were repeated attempts and conspiracies to destroy Somnath, foreign invaders tried for centuries to annihilate India. Yet neither the revered shrine, nor the country was destroyed.

The PM made it clear that the motive of the attacks on Somnath was more sinister than looting. "If the attacks were only for loot, they would have stopped after the first great plunder a thousand years ago. But that was not the case. The sacred idol of Somnath was desecrated, the temple's form was repeatedly altered. And we were taught that Somnath was destroyed only for loot. The cruel history of hatred, oppression, and terror was hidden from us," he said.

Nehru's Resistance - After independence, Sardar Patel led the mission of reconstruction of Somnath, which was one of the earliest expressions of national self-confidence in a newly free India. But even this faced hurdles.

India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru formally opposed the then President Dr Rajendra Prasad's decision to attend the historic inauguration. But the President inaugurated the temple on May 11, 1951.

The reconstruction sowed the seeds of India's cultural renaissance and pride in the civilization after centuries of ruthless oppression. From the rejuvenation of Kashi Vishwanath and Mahakaleshwar temple in Ujjain to the grand Ram Mandir in Ayodhya; from the revival of Kedarnath to the preservation of countless heritage sites, India is reclaiming its civilisational narrative with dignity and purpose. These efforts are increasing the number of visitors and creating numerous jobs and business opportunities for local people.

Global footprint - Like Somnath, India has emerged stronger. It is making global waves both as the world's fastest growing major econ-



omy and as a country that uniquely blends modernity with its rich heritage. In 2014, after the country emphatically voted the Modi government to power, the UN General Assembly adopted a resolution endorsing by a record 175 countries to observe the International Yoga Day. Yoga is now a global wellness movement that has benefitted people of all cultures across the world.

A decade later, PM Modi inaugurated a grand temple in the Middle east on land gifted by the government of the

United Arab Emirates. Earlier, the PM launched the renovation of a 200-year old temple in Bahrain. He also regularly interacts with Indian diaspora, making them proud ambassadors of Indian cultural heritage.

Globalising Ayush & Yoga - Promoting India's cultural heritage and creating global opportunities for professionals of our traditional knowledge systems has been a key element in the series of Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) India has signed with developed countries in recent years. Apart from creating lucrative global opportunities for our artisans, workers, farmers, fishermen, small businesses and startups, these trade pacts carry forward the PM's vision of vikas bhi, Vivasat bhi (development as well as heritage).

The recently concluded FTA with New Zealand is a significant milestone in India's global outreach in traditional medicine and holistic health-

care. It provides for visa quotas to enable Ayush practitioners and Yoga instructors, along with other Indian cultural and knowledge professionals, to work in New Zealand.

The FTA formally creates an enabling environment for trade in Ayurveda, yoga, and other traditional medicine services and positions Ayush as a contemporary, globally relevant healthcare solution.

Trade pacts with UK, EU and Australia have similar provisions. The FTA with the European Union will allow Ayush practitioners to provide their services using professional qualifications they gain in India. It also facilitates establishment of Ayush wellness centres and clinics in the EU Member States.

Vanquishing New Threats - While India's cultural heritage is attracting global attention, the country remains the target of fanatics, who are using terrorism and infiltration to disturb India's harmonious

heritage.

The New India under the leadership of PM Modi responds powerfully to such threats. With Operation Sindoor, India taught a lesson to terrorists and their sponsors across the border. And in recent assembly elections, voters in West Bengal rejected parties that were supporting infiltrators, practicing vote-bank politics and undermining India's cultural heritage. Significantly, the anniversaries of Operation Sindoor and the reconstruction of the Somnath Temple are just a few days apart. Both highlight India's resilience and strength.

The story of Somnath ultimately transcends politics. It is the story of a civilisation that refused to surrender. Seventy-five years after its reconstruction, Somnath stands not merely as a temple, but as a timeless symbol of India's resilience, continuity and national confidence.

Ancient Shiva Temple Allegedly Demolished for School Construction in Narsampet

Narsampet : Tension prevailed in parts of Narsampet constituency after allegations surfaced over the demolition of an 800-year-old mud fort Shiva temple, reportedly to facilitate the construction of an integrated school.

Addressing a press conference at Khanapur mandal headquarters, former MPP Vemulapalli Prakash Rao and mandal party president Mahalakshmi Venkata Narsaiah accused local authorities and political representatives of deliberately destroying the historic temple under the pretext of educational development.

They alleged that tenders were floated in the names of benami contractors linked to the local MLA and questioned whether the demolition was carried out in search of hidden treasures. The leaders demanded that officials clarify the circumstances under



which the temple was razed overnight.

The speakers further stated that the Archaeology Department had previously identified the site as historically significant during the earlier government's tenure when plans for a Sainik School were initiated. They

questioned how such a heritage structure could be ignored by the present administration.

Despite the availability of alternative government land for the school, the selection of a site housing a historic temple raises serious concerns, they said, alleging a "100 per

cent conspiracy" behind the decision.

They also criticized district authorities, including the Collector and RDO, for alleged inaction and delay in both protecting the temple and proceeding with the school project. The leaders demanded an immediate inquiry into the incident and strict action against those responsible.

Alleging possible illegal excavation for hidden valuables, they claimed that the silence of officials has only deepened public suspicion. They urged the government to respond on why no investigation has been initiated so far despite complaints reportedly submitted by the Archaeology Department.

Several local leaders, including Khanapur Sarpanch Dasari Ramesh, Society Vice-Chairman Devineni Venu Krishna, and others, were present at the meeting.

Maize Procurement Being Conducted Efficiently in Warangal - District : Collector

Mallampalli, Mulugu, May 10 : District Collector Dr. Satya Sharada said that maize procurement in the district was being carried out effectively in accordance with the guidelines issued by the government. The Collector stated that maize cultivation had been taken up in about 1,07,991 acres across the district during the current season, with an estimated production of nearly 3,77,969 metric tonnes. Out of the total estimated yield, the government has set a procurement target of around 2,80,776 metric tonnes of maize, she said. Dr. Satya Sharada noted that farmers were arriving at procurement centres in large numbers following the government's announcement of a Minimum Support Price (MSP) of Rs. 2,400 per quintal for maize. She informed that as of May 9, 2026, nearly 69,140 metric tonnes of maize had been procured in the district, of which 51,302 metric tonnes had already been shifted and stored in warehouses. The total value of procurement has reached approximately Rs. 157 crore, benefiting around 12,945 farmers across the district, the Collector revealed. She further stated that all necessary arrangements had been made at procurement centres to ensure that farmers did not face inconvenience during the procurement process. The Collector said the district administration had identified issues such as shortage of warehouse space and congestion at procurement centres and was taking immediate steps to resolve them. Measures were also being taken to enhance additional storage capacity for smooth procurement operations, she added

Mulugu Farmers Face Hardships as Procurement Delays Continue : Telangana Rythu Sangham

Mulugu, May 10 : Telangana Rythu Sangham Mulugu district president M.D. Gaffoor Pasha alleged that government paddy procurement centres in the district were functioning only in name, while farmers continued to face severe difficulties due to delays in procurement and transportation. A team of the farmers' association on Saturday inspected procurement centres in Kannayigudem, Kasimdevipeta, Rayinigudem, Sarvapurm and Ankanagudem villages of Mulugu mandal. Speaking on the occasion, Gaffoor Pasha said farmers had been waiting for nearly a month for their produce to be weighed and procured, causing immense distress. He said untimely rains during the previous night had further worsened the situation, with heaps of paddy and maize lying exposed in market yards and fields. Farmers were spending sleepless nights trying to protect their produce from rain damage, he added. Stating that selling crops had become more difficult than cultivating them, Gaffoor Pasha alleged that rice millers were exploiting farmers in the name of quality checks and deductions, reducing five to ten kilograms per



quintal as "tarugu" during procurement. He also alleged that after procurement, several farmers were not being issued proper receipts by procurement centre operators. He pointed out that due to shortage of gunny bags and non-availability of lorries, only farmers owning tractors were able to transport their produce to rice mills, while small and marginal farmers were being forced to spend additional money on transportation. The farmers' leader further said procurement centres lacked even basic facilities, including protective tarpaulins to safeguard paddy from unexpected rains. He criticised both the Central and State governments, alleging that anti-farmer policies were pushing farmers into dis-

tress. The association demanded that the government immediately speed up procurement of paddy and maize, ensure that no illegal deductions were made, provide receipts to farmers immediately after procurement, and initiate action against rice mills allegedly involved in exploitation. He warned that if the issues were not resolved immediately, the organisation would mobilise farmers and launch protest programmes. Excise Official Warns Against, Illegal Belt Shops in Kamareddy District

Akrama Danda" published in a daily newspaper regarding the operation of illegal liquor belt shops in Kamareddy district, the District Prohibition and Excise Officer Shri B. Hanumantha Rao (FAC) issued an official press statement on May 10, 2026. He clarified that possessing illegal liquor or operating belt shops in villages without a valid license or permit is a severe violation of the law under Section 34(a) of the T.S. Excise Act 1968. The official emphasized that strict legal action will be initiated against anyone found maintaining belt shops or possessing more than 50 bulk liters of liquor. Providing a summary of recent enforcement activities, Shri B. Hanumantha Rao stated that from December 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026, authorities registered 91 cases across the district and arrested 90 individuals. During these operations, the department successfully seized 307.4 liters of liquor and 140 liters of beer. Furthermore, all A4 shop licensees have been strictly instructed not to sell excessive quantities of liquor or beer to any single individual. To ensure continuous compliance and curb illegal activities, the District Prohibition and Excise Officer confirmed that a special surveillance system has been established to monitor and dismantle the management of illegal belt shops throughout Kamareddy.

Officer Ravikumar warns of strict action against negligence

Nizamabad Buearu, May 10 : Nizamabad District Intermediate Education Officer Ravikumar emphasized that Chief Superintendents, Departmental Officers hold the primary responsibility for the smooth conduct of the 2025-26 Advanced Supplementary Examinations. Speaking at a meeting held on Sunday at the Government Boys (Quilla) Junior College in Nizamabad for CS's, DO's, Custodians, and Assistant Chief Superintendents, he clarified that any deviation from the Intermediate Board's regulations, would result in severe disciplinary measures. He announced that 39 examination centers have been established across, the district for the exams scheduled from the 13th to the 19th of this month under the supervision of the Intermediate Board Commissioner and the District Collector. Ravikumar directed the officials to ensure that CCTV cameras are functional at all centers and that question paper bundles are opened strictly under surveillance. He stressed the importance

of punctuality and the provision of basic amenities at all venues. Regarding security protocols, the DIEO stated that mobile phones are strictly prohibited within, the centers and even the devices of the CS, DO must remain in police custody during the examination hours. He instructed the officials to conduct preparatory meetings with invigilators to explain the rules thoroughly. Furthermore, he noted that flying squads, sitting squads, the District Examination Management Committee would conduct regular inspections. The officials were tasked with publicizing the schedule, noting that first-year exams occur in the morning and second-year exams in the afternoon, while mentioning that a five-minute grace period for late entry is permitted. Ravikumar reiterated that the CS and DO are responsible for the thorough frisking of students before entry. He reminded them of the coordination with Revenue, Education, Electricity, RTC, Health, Postal, Police departments, advising the officials to communicate with local authorities

Speaking in Nizamabad on May 10, the Commissioner emphasized that citizens should not harbor any, misconceptions regarding the SIR mapping as its, primary objective is the comprehensive verification of the voter list. He explained that the current mapping process is being conducted based on the 2002 voter list data. Voters whose names appeared in the 2002 list can now perform self-mapping with their current 2025 voter list entries. This procedure can be facilitated through Booth Level Officers, including Ward Officers, Anganwadi teachers, and Resource Persons who are currently serving as BLO's in various

areas. The Commissioner detailed that the mapping involves linking the current voter card with the 2002 records or connecting oneself to their previous 2002 registration. By providing the BLO with details such as the voter serial number, part number, constituency name of parents or family members from the 2002 list, voters can have their current residence mapped accurately to their names. It is mandatory to complete this mapping with the BLO assigned to the area where the voter's current registration exists. Commissioner Dilip Kumar noted that SIR applies to everyone cautioned against, any negligence in completing the process. He highlighted that while SIR has already been completed in several other states, the pre-mapping phase is currently active in this state with the formal SIR process set to begin shortly. Citizens are required to submit the mapping enumeration form along with documents specified



By, the Election Commission, although those who have already completed the mapping do not need to provide further documentation. Even if there are minor discrepancies between the 2002 details and current data, the mapping can still be successfully finalized. The Commissioner concluded by reiterating the necessity of SIR and encouraged all residents to participate promptly.
