

Telangana to Launch ‘Samagra Sankshema Card’ for Integrated Welfare Delivery

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad :The Telangana Government is set to introduce a comprehensive “Samagra Sankshema Card” aimed at integrating all welfare scheme benefits available to citizens under a single digital platform, in a major push towards technology-driven governance and transparent welfare delivery.

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has directed officials to develop the unified welfare card system to create a centralized database of benefits received by every citizen across various government departments and schemes.

The proposed card is expected to consolidate details related to food security schemes, AarogyaSri health services, Chief Minister’s Relief Fund assistance, fee reimbursement, labour welfare programmes, education benefits, insurance coverage, pensions, and several



other state welfare initiatives.

According to officials, the initiative is designed to provide a complete welfare profile for each citizen while improving transparency, accountability, and efficiency in the implementation of government schemes.

During a high-level review meeting, the Chief Minister instructed all departments to im-

mediately undertake a special drive for the collection and integration of beneficiary data. He emphasised that the new system should leverage Artificial Intelligence-based analysis tools to assess scheme effectiveness, identify duplication, and ensure that benefits reach genuine beneficiaries.

Officials stated that instead

of maintaining multiple welfare cards issued by different departments, the government intends to create a single unified card managed centrally under the IT Department with the support of young technology-oriented officers.

The government also plans to integrate the database with the recently conducted SEEEPC Survey covering social, economic, educational, employment, political, and caste-related data to create a more comprehensive governance framework.

In addition, the proposed system may be linked with health records, death registration databases for automatic pension updates, and other critical citizen services to streamline administrative processes.

The Chief Minister also directed officials to study best practices adopted by other states and countries, particularly in areas such as (Cont. on Pg 2)

Health Minister Damodar Rajanarasimha Reviews Preparations at TIMS Sanathnagar Ahead of Launch

Hyderabad : Telangana Medical and Health Minister Damodar Rajanarasimha on Wednesday conducted an extensive inspection of the Telangana Institute of Medical Sciences (TIMS) Hospital at Sanathnagar to review the ongoing preparations ahead of its full-scale launch.

The Minister inspected various departments of the hospital and personally reviewed the modern medical equipment, healthcare facilities, infrastructure, laboratories, and blood bank being established at the international-standard medical institution.

During the visit, the Minister directed engineering officials to expedite the pending civil works and ensure the hospital is made fully operational at the earliest. He instructed officials to develop separate hostel blocks for male and female doctors within the hospital premises.

Emphasising patient convenience, the Minister ordered the construction of adequate toilet blocks for both outpatients and inpatients. He also directed officials to develop a multi-level parking system within the campus to avoid traffic congestion and ensure smooth movement



of vehicles.

To support attendants accompanying patients, the Minister instructed authorities to establish a dharmashala and set up two canteens within the hospital premises.

He further directed officials to speed up the completion of the administrative building and the TB Hospital Board office works. The Minister also instructed authorities to establish a police outpost at the hospital's main entrance for enhanced security and public safety.

Highlighting the importance of uninterrupted civic services in a world-class healthcare institu-

tion, the Minister ordered officials to ensure continuous maintenance of drainage systems, sanitation, and water supply services across the campus.

The Minister also stressed the need for modern interiors and patient lounges within the hospital. Special emphasis was laid on providing advanced facilities in the dedicated blocks being developed for foreign patients.

In a key decision, the Minister constituted a committee comprising officials from the Directorate of Medical Education (DME), Heads of Departments (HoDs), and engineering officials

of the Telangana Medical Services and Infrastructure Development Corporation to oversee the establishment of an international-standard laboratory at the hospital.

Officials were directed to prepare detailed estimates for the remaining works required for the complete operationalisation of the TIMS hospital.

Following the field inspection, the Minister held a review meeting at the proposed administrative building to assess hospital management plans, healthcare service delivery, and the progress of civil works. He provided directions to senior health department officials regarding the government's objectives and measures to ensure improved healthcare services for the public.

Among those present during the inspection were Dr. Christina Z. Chongthu, Principal Secretary, Medical and Health Department; Dr. Narendra Kumar, Director of Medical Education; Hanumanth, Managing Director of Telangana Medical Services and Infrastructure Development Corporation; Dr. Beerappa, Director of NIMS; R&B engineering official Rajeshwar Reddy; and other senior officials from the Health Department.

Government Will Procure Every Grain Produced by Farmers : Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy

Yadadri Bhuvanagiri : State Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy assured farmers that the government will procure every grain of paddy produced during the current season and that no farmer will suffer losses.

Speaking at a review meeting on paddy procurement held at the Collectorate conference hall on Thursday, the Minister said the government had organized district-level meetings and field visits to accelerate the procurement process.

The meeting was attended by Revenue, Housing and Information & Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, IT and Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Bhuvanagiri MP Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy,

Government Whip and Aler MLA Beerla Ailaiah, Bhuvanagiri MLA Kumbam Anil Kumar Reddy, Nakrekal MLA Vemula Veeresham, Tungaturthi MLA Mandula Samuel, Civil Supplies Commissioner Stephen Ravindra, District Collector Anurag Jayanti and Superintendent of Police Akshansh Yadav.

Uttam Kumar Reddy said farmers need not worry if their paddy gets wet due to unseasonal rains, as the government would also procure wet grain. He instructed the Revenue, Civil Supplies and Police departments to work in close coordination to ensure smooth and speedy procurement without causing inconvenience to farmers.

The Minister further stated that payments would be credited

to farmers' bank accounts within 48 hours of procurement. He also suggested utilizing sand-transport vehicles for a few days to assist in the transportation and unloading of paddy. Noting that the Yasangi season had witnessed record production, he urged officials to ensure safe transportation and storage of procured grain.

Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy said the state had witnessed an excellent paddy harvest this season and assured farmers that every grain would be procured at the declared Minimum Support Price (MSP). He added that large-scale payments had already been made to farmers and that wet paddy would also be accepted.

Future City land fetches record prices Rs 83,500 per sq yard at Raviryal auction

Housing Board earns Rs 140 crore through e-auction sales

(Capital Information) **Hyderabad :** Land parcels located in and around the upcoming Future City region continued to attract massive investor interest, with Telangana Housing Board properties at Raviryal in Maheshwaram mandal fetching record prices in an e-auction conducted on Thursday.

The auctioned lands, situated near the airport and at the entrance of Future City, witnessed intense competition among developers and real estate firms due to their strategic location and clear government titles.

According to Housing Board Vice-Chairman V.P.

Gautham, four land parcels spread across 1,000 to 13,500 square yards were auctioned, generating nearly Rs 140 crore in revenue for the Board.

The highlight of the auction was a 1,113-square-yard parcel that fetched a record Rs 83,500 per square yard against the upset price of Rs 26,000 per square yard.

Around 17 firms participated in the bidding process, reflecting the growing demand for premium government-owned lands in the city's expanding growth corridor.

Another parcel measuring around 6,000 square yards was sold at Rs

62,500 per square yard, while bidders also showed strong interest in a 13,500-square-yard property in the same locality.

Officials said the Housing Board had issued the auction notification last month, inviting bids for the prime properties.

More auctions today

The Housing Board will continue its e-auction process on Friday with four additional plots located in KPHB Colony and Chintal in Qutbullapur. The properties include plots measuring 5,898 sq yards and 2,420 sq yards in KPHB Phase I & II, besides 10,890 sq yards and 3,388 sq yards in Chintal.

Tree Branch Falls on TGO State President's Vehicle in Khammam, All Occupants Escape Unhurt

Khammam/Hyderabad : A major accident was narrowly averted near Rebavaram village in Vaira Mandal of Khammam district on Thursday after a large roadside tree branch collapsed onto the vehicle of Telangana Grain Operators (TGO) State President Sri Eluri Srinivas Rao.

According to information available, Eluri Srinivas Rao was travelling in a Fortuner SUV when a massive branch from a roadside tree suddenly broke and fell on the moving vehicle. The impact caused the driver to lose control, resulting in the vehicle overturning on the road.

The Fortuner sustained extensive damage, with all window panes shattered and parts of the vehicle badly crushed. However, in what many described as miraculous, all occupants inside the vehicle escaped without injuries.

Preliminary observa-

tions suggest that the tree branch had been severely weakened after unknown persons allegedly set fire near the roadside vegeta-



tion. Locals stated that such fires, often linked to the burning of agricultural residue, gradually damage trees internally, making them unstable and highly dangerous to motorists and pedestrians.

Expressing concern over the incident, Sri Eluri Srinivas Rao appealed to the public to immediately

stop burning crop residue and setting fire to roadside trees. He said such negligent practices not only harm the environment but also pose a serious threat to human lives.

"This incident should serve as a wake-up call. Trees weakened by fire can collapse unexpectedly and lead to fatal accidents. People must act responsibly and protect both nature and human life," he said.

Environmental activists and local residents have also called for stricter monitoring and awareness campaigns against the unsafe burning of agricultural waste and roadside vegetation.

The incident has once again highlighted the need for public awareness regarding environmental protection and road safety, especially during the dry season when fire-related damage to trees becomes more common.

District Agriculture Officer Inspected Procurement Centres in Musapet Mandal

Farmers Seek Additional Lorries and Gunny Bags for Faster Paddy Transportation

MAHABUBNAGAR : District Agriculture Officer B. Venkatesh on Thursday visited paddy procurement centres established in Vemula, Komireddypally, Mohammed Hussainpally and Nandipet villages of Musapet mandal along with Mandal Agriculture Officer Anil Kumar and Agriculture Extension Officers. He reviewed the procurement process at the centres and interacted with farmers to understand their problems.

During the inspection at the Vemula procurement centre, farmers requested the arrangement of two additional lorries for paddy transportation. At the Komireddypally procurement centre, farmers and the centre in-charge informed the officer about the need for another lorry to clear the stock.

Farmers at the Mohammed Hussainpally procurement centre informed the officials that 6,000 gunny bags and six addi-



tional lorries were required for smooth procurement operations. Farmers also explained that several lorries and tractors stationed at the procurement centres were facing delays in unloading paddy at rice mills, causing inconvenience in transportation.

Responding to the issues, the District Agriculture Officer spoke to the concerned officials

and instructed them to immediately arrange additional lorries and ensure the supply of gunny bags through the Civil Supplies Department.

He also directed officials to clear all pending entries in the Online Procurement Management System (OPMS) without delay and speed up payments to farmers.

BJP Telangana Spokesperson Alleges Civic Violations in Musheerabad Ahead of Bakrid, Seeks Immediate Action

Hyderabad : NV Subhash, Chief Spokesperson of the Telangana unit of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), on Thursday criticised what he described as a serious violation of municipal regulations and public hygiene norms in parts of Musheerabad ahead of Bakrid celebrations.

In a statement posted on social media platform, Subhash alleged that certain residential lanes near the locally known "Bangladesh Market" area had been turned into open slaughter zones, resulting in blood and waste flowing onto public roads and residential stretches.

"This is a complete breakdown of municipal guidelines and public hygiene in Musheerabad. Residential lanes cannot be converted into open

slaughter zones with blood flooding the roads ahead of Bakrid. Local residents should not suffer due to the failure of civic authorities to enforce the law," he stated.

The issue was initially highlighted by Advocate Neelam Bhargava Ram who shared video footage and photographs on social media allegedly showing blood flowing from the market area into nearby residential streets. According to the local residents, including women from surrounding colonies, expressed concern over sanitation, foul smell, and



possible health risks.

The BJP spokesperson urged the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC), police, and local administration to intervene immediately by clearing the affected areas,

enforcing regulations related to animal slaughter in residential localities, and taking action against those responsible for alleged violations.

The party also called for the identification of designated slaughter locations and proper disposal mechanisms to prevent environmental contamination and maintain public hygiene during the festival period.

Subhash stated that civic laws and public health regulations should be implemented uniformly across all areas to ensure communal harmony and the safety of residents.

The matter has drawn attention on social media, with several users calling for stricter enforcement of municipal sanitation norms and better monitoring of public spaces during festival-related activities.

Officials Visit Bhoothpur, Shift Rain-Soaked Paddy to Parboiled Rice Mill

MAHABUBNAGAR : 156 Bags of Wet Paddy Purchased and Transported to Mill; Farmer Thanks District Administration for Timely Support The State Government continues to stand firmly with farmers with welfare and farmer protection as its primary objective. Acting on government directions, the district administration is ensuring that paddy procurement is carried out at the Minimum Support Price without causing inconvenience to farmers, even during adverse weather conditions.

In a notable example of the government's farmer welfare measures, officials in Bhoothpur mandal purchased rain-soaked paddy and extended immediate support to a distressed farmer. Farmer

K. Srinivasulu of Sheripally village in Bhoothpur mandal had stored his harvested paddy, which was completely drenched following recent heavy rains. Responding swiftly to the farmer's plight, the district administration initiated special measures as per the directions of the District Collector to prevent losses to the farmer.

On Wednesday, District Manager of the Civil Supplies Corporation Ravi Nayak and other officials inspected the procurement centre at Hasnapur and found that the paddy had been stored in a low-lying area and was submerged in rainwater.

Around 150 to 200 bags of paddy were reportedly affected. Following government instructions, officials coordinated with the management



of Narahari Parboiled Rice Mill at Tatikonda and ensured

that even the rain-soaked paddy would be accepted for

procurement.

Continuing the process on

Thursday, District Manager Ravi Nayak and District Civil Supplies Officer Gampa Srinivas revisited Hasnapur village and reviewed the situation. The soaked paddy was packed into bags, weighed and transported through tractors to the nearby Narahari Parboiled Rice Mill.

A total of 156 bags were shifted to the mill. Officials also directed the mill management over phone to immediately unload the paddy. Officials further instructed the procurement centre in-charge to generate the truck sheet immediately after mill acknowledgement so that the farmer receives Minimum Support Price payments on priority basis without delay.

Expressing happiness over the government's response, farmer K. Srinivasulu

said the administration not only promised to purchase rain-soaked paddy but also implemented it in practice. He stated that the government had become a true support system for poor farmers like him.

The farmer expressed heartfelt gratitude to the District Collector, visiting officials and the State Government. He also said the assurance given by officials that the MSP amount would be credited to his bank account within two days gave him great confidence and relief.

INDIA'S DEMOCRACY IS A GUIDING LIGHT FOR THE WORLD

Despite immense pressure during the colonial period, Patel upheld the autonomy and prestige of the institution—a contribution that will continue to inspire Presiding Officers and legislators across the country.

Lok Sabha Speaker emphasized that only dialogue and discussions rooted in logic, seriousness, and facts can preserve the dignity of democratic institutions and maintain public trust. He stated that India's democratic culture has always been based on discussion, consensus, and meaningful deliberation, and that Parliament and state legislatures must continue to remain the highest forums representing the aspirations of the people.

Highlighting the role of technology in governance and legislative functioning, Birla stated that digitization, e-legislatures, and emerging technologies like Artificial Intelligence (AI) are making policymaking and legislative research more transparent, efficient, and accessible.

Kazipet Rail Manufacturing Unit is on the Verge of Completion and Will Begin Manufacturing Intercity Trains : Railway Minister, Ashwini Vaishnaw

New Delhi (PIB) : Kazipet rail manufacturing unit of Indian Railways is on the verge of completion. This is a versatile railway rolling stock manufacturing unit. To begin with, Kazipet will manufacture 200 intercity trains in the next 5 years. The Union Minister of Railways, Ashwini Vaishnaw, and Union Minister of State for Railways, Ravneet Singh Bittu, reviewed the plans to operationalise the Kazipet Rail Manufacturing Unit today along with senior officials.

These trains will be deployed throughout the country for short distance travel. They will have frequent stops. These trains will typically run for about 300 km. Each trip will have many stops so that the citizens can commute between towns and cities. Be it

students going for higher education in their adjacent towns, or common people commuting for their health and work needs.

These trains will give the people a new affordable option for intercity travel. These



intercity trains will be like shuttle services connecting adjacent towns across India. With the production of these trains, a large amount of local traffic is likely to move to railways from roads.

The intercity trains will be equipped with modern features like automatic door closing, superior ventilation and a

safe coach design with a 20-coach configuration. There will be two toilets in every coach, one at each end.

In addition, these intercity trains will have modern jerk free couplers and bogies. These trains will be designed to run at 130 kmph.

The trains will also have regenerative braking. It means that when the train applies brakes, it will become a generator of electricity & feed the regenerative electricity back into the grid. It is, therefore, energy efficient. This is a greener mode of transport and will have significantly less carbon emissions vis-à-vis road transport.

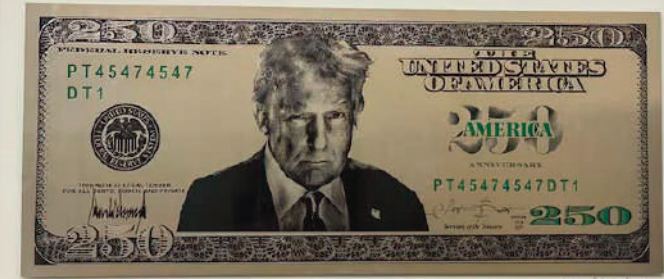
The introduction of such a large fleet by Railways will increase the green and clean transport capacity across the country.

Trump Officials Push Proposal for \$250 Bill Featuring President Trump, Report Says

(Capital Information) Washington, D.C./New Delhi : Officials associated with the administration of Donald Trump have reportedly urged the U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) to develop designs for a new \$250 currency note featuring President Trump's portrait, according to a report published by The Washington Post.

The report stated that U.S. Treasurer Brandon Beach and senior adviser Mike Brown had repeatedly approached BEP officials beginning last year regarding prototype designs for the proposed denomination.

Mock-up versions of the currency note were reportedly circulated internally during August and September. The proposed designs allegedly feature Trump's portrait prominently at the center of the bill, alongside his signature and that of Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent.



The designs are also said to incorporate elements reflecting the American flag and references to the United States' upcoming 250th anniversary celebrations.

If implemented, the move would mark a significant departure from longstanding U.S. tradition and federal law, which has generally restricted portraits on American currency to deceased individuals since legislation enacted in 1866.

According to the report, the then-director of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, who reportedly resisted the proposal, was reassigned last month. One artist associated with the mock-up designs allegedly stated that discussions regarding the design had taken place directly with President Trump.

Supporters of the initiative are said to be presenting the proposal as a commemorative gesture linked to the nation's semiquincentennial celebrations in 2026.

The report also referenced pending legislation in the U.S. Congress, including the "Donald J. Trump \$250 Bill Act" (H.R. 1761), which seeks authorization for the new denomination and exemptions from existing restrictions. However, the legislation has not yet made significant progress.

Officials familiar with the matter reportedly indicated that no final decision has been taken regarding production or circulation of the proposed currency note. The U.S. Treasury Department has reportedly conveyed that it would be prepared to proceed should Congress approve the necessary legislation.

The proposal has generated mixed reactions in political and public circles. Critics have questioned the precedent and symbolism of placing a living political figure on U.S. currency, while supporters describe it as a recognition of Trump's political influence and role in contemporary American politics.

Prof. Kola joined the then Regional Engineering College (REC) Warangal as a Lecturer in February 1999 and steadily rose through the academic ranks to become Senior Professor (HAG). Over the years, he has taught nearly all major core subjects in Chemical Engineering for B.Tech, M.Tech, and PhD programmes.

His research contributions span diverse areas including Biochemical Engineering, Pharmaceuticals and Fine Chemicals, Wastewater Treatment and Membrane Separations, Environmental Engineering, Nanotechnology, Energy Systems, and Process Modelling and Optimization.

During his academic career, Prof. Kola has successfully executed ten major sponsored research projects worth nearly ₹4 crore funded by agencies such as DST, DBT, CSIR, and MHRD. He has two granted patents and three filed patents to his credit.



He has published around 150 research papers in reputed international journals, earning over 2,485 citations, with an h-index of 21 and i-10 index of 44. 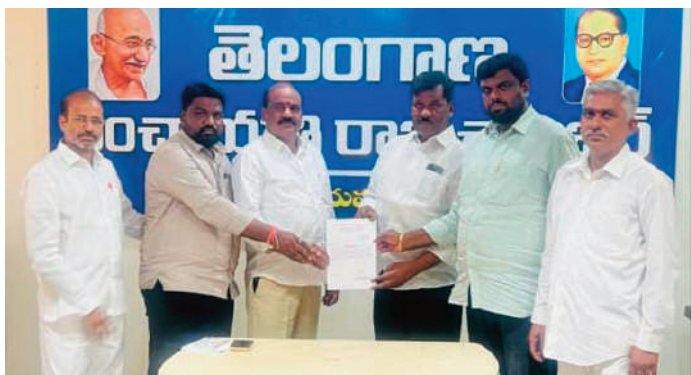

Food Safety Inspection Drive Conducted at Madeenaguda Establishment

Serilingampally : As part of ongoing food safety monitoring initiatives across Cyberabad, CMC Food Safety teams conducted a surprise inspection at an establishment located in Gismat Jail Mandi, Madeenaguda.
During the inspection, officials identified several serious hygiene and food safety violations. Authorities found raw and semi-prepared non-vegetarian items without proper labeling. Chicken, mutton, and fish products were reportedly stored under improper conditions and were discarded immediately on the spot.
The inspection team also observed that the premises were operating without a valid FSSAI license. Essential records including pest control logs, water testing reports, and medical records of food handlers were not produced during the inspection.
Officials further noted unhygienic conditions in the dishwashing area, where water and food stagnation were found. Storage containers used for raw materials were untidy, while food handlers were seen working without aprons and hand gloves. Iron knives were being used in the kitchen and chopping boards were found to be in poor condition. Inadequate lighting was also reported in the kitchen and storeroom areas.
Based on the violations observed, the CMC Food Safety team served a Show Cause Notice to the establishment. Improperly stored food items were discarded immediately and the management was instructed to rectify all hygiene and safety lapses without delay.



According to the hygiene assessment conducted during the inspection, the establishment secured only 43 marks out of a total score of 102, resulting in a hygiene percentage of 43 percent.
As per CMC hygiene grading standards, establishments scoring above 90 percent are categorized as "Good," scores between 50 and 90 percent receive an "Improvement Notice," while scores below 50 percent are issued a "Show Cause Notice."
CMC officials stated that regular inspections of restaurants, kitchens, eateries, and other food establishments will continue across Cyberabad to strengthen food hygiene standards and safeguard public health.

Congress Government Limited to Words: Former MLA Chanti Kranti Kiran

Action Sought to Protect Waqf Land, Muslim Graveyard in Madina Masjid - Founding President Mohammed Sarver

Mulugu, May 28 : Md Sarwar Ahmed has appealed to the District Collector and police authorities to protect Muslim community properties, including the graveyard and mosque lands situated at Lakshmidivipet village in Venkatapuram (Ramappa) mandal of Mulugu district. Addressing the media, Sarver Ahmed alleged that certain individuals had illegally occupied and attempted to claim ownership of Waqf Board land belonging to the Muslim community. He stated that the alleged encroachments and attempts to convert the land into private ventures were hurting the religious sentiments of Muslims in the area. According to him, nearly 0.20 guntas of land in Survey Nos. 4 and 5 were donated in 1995 by Takkallapalli Srinivasa Rao in memory of his parents for the welfare of the Muslim community. Since then, the land has been used as a graveyard and a mosque premises where religious prayers and burial rituals have been conducted for several years. He said the Muslim community had constructed facilities including a mosque, madrasa, moulvi room, ablution area, and graveyard in accordance with religious traditions. The property was reportedly registered and recognised under the Telangana State Waqf Board, and funds had also been sanctioned for the development of the site. Sarver Ahmed further stated that Minister Seethakka had recently inaugurated the mosque and that the Gram Panchayat had earlier granted permissions and resolutions for the development works in the presence of local residents. He alleged that on August 28, 2025, certain individuals allegedly created false documents and obtained pattas through court proceedings, leading to disputes over the land. He named Gundapaneni Padmaja and



Daggu Vijaya, along with others, alleging that they were threatening members of the Muslim community and causing distress among residents. He further said that the land is officially registered with the Telangana State Waqf Board under Registration No. TS0720MHD059GR002. Electricity bills for the mosque are also being regularly paid, he added. Recently, Rs. 5 lakh was reportedly sanctioned for the construction of a compound wall around the graveyard. Sarver Ahmed alleged that some persons recently levelled the graveyard land by dumping soil, uprooted trees, and laid pipelines despite court restrictions. He stated that the High Court, through WP No. 6581 of 2026, had issued a status quo order restraining any construction activity on the disputed land. He appealed to public representatives, the District Collector, and the Superintendent of Police to intervene immediately, provide protection to the Muslim community, and ensure restoration of the graveyard and mosque land. He warned that if justice was not delivered, the Muslim community would launch protest programmes under the leadership of the mosque committee.

BJP Slams Government Over Paddy Procurement Delays, Extends Support to Distressed Farmers

Nirmal/Dilawarpur/Mamada, May 28 : Tension and frustration prevailed at several paddy procurement centres in Nirmal district on Thursday as BJP leaders alleged that farmers were being pushed into hardship due to the State government's negligence and delayed procurement process. BJP Legislature Party leader Aleti Maheshwar Reddy, along with MP Eatala Rajender and party MLAs, visited procurement centres in Ponkal village of Mamda mandal and Dilawarpur mandal as part of the "Rythu Gosa - BJP Bharosa" programme. During the visit, the leaders interacted with farmers who expressed concern over the delay in lifting paddy stocks and the difficulties caused by untimely rains. Farmers reportedly complained that despite months of hard work in the fields, they were now struggling to sell their produce and protect it from weather damage. The BJP leaders criticised the Congress government, accusing it of failing to respond to the plight of cultivators at a crucial time. An emotional moment unfolded in Ponkal village when a farmer broke down while narrating his problems to Maheshwar Reddy. The BJP leaders assured the farmers that the party would continue to stand by them and raise their issues until procurement operations are streamlined and pending stocks are cleared without delay. The leaders also demanded immediate intervention from the government to ensure smooth procurement and prevent further losses to farmers. They alleged that poor coordination at procurement centres and delays in transportation were adding to the burden on already distressed cultivators. Later, at Madegam village in Dilawarpur mandal, local resident Pulindla Srinivas approached the BJP delegation alleging that unidentified thieves had stolen his goats nearly two months ago and that no action had been taken despite repeated complaints. Responding to the grievance, Maheshwar Reddy assured the victim that the matter would be brought to the notice of the police authorities for proper action. As immediate assistance, the MLA provided financial support of ₹50,000 to the affected family. Several BJP leaders, party workers and farmers participated in the programme.

Government is Purchasing Soaked Grain

- Farmers need not panic

Nizamabad Buearu, May 28 : District Collector Ila Tripathi has assured farmers that the government will purchase paddy damaged by, unseasonal rains at the minimum support price, urging them not to panic. She stated that officials have been directed to expedite the process of shifting the wet grain collected from procurement centers to boiled rice mills. Earlier on Wednesday night, Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao conducted a video conference from the State Secretariat with all district Collectors SPs. During this review, they provided clear guidelines to the collectors on accelerating paddy procurement amid the unseasonal rains. The high-level officials emphasized

that authorities must remain active on the field to ensure farmers face no hardships. Following the video conference, Collector Ila Tripathi held a meeting with district officials to provide key instructions. She noted that paddy procurement in the district has already reached its final stages. However, around 120 procurement centers are still being kept operational in areas where the yields arrived late. The Collector mentioned that it brought to their notice that nearly 40 metric tons of paddy bags were soaked due to unexpected rains in areas like Bashirabad and Uploor. In line with government orders, officials have been deployed for field inspections, and measures have been taken to swiftly move the wet grain to boiled rice mills. She also shared her plans to personally visit the mills to monitor the



transport and unloading processes. Reassuring the farming community, she reiterated that the government is accommodating the purchase of damaged grain, so there is no need for anxiety. To prevent any inconvenience to farmers, she ordered officials to prioritize shifting the soaked paddy to boiled rice mills. Additional DCP Shubham Nagrale and other departmental officials participated in this meeting.

Inter-State Kidnap Gang Busted By Kamareddy district police

Nizamabad Bureau, May 28 : have successfully foiled a major kidnaping plot targeting a local businessman and arrested six members of an inter-state gang, recovering an illegal firearm and other materials. Acting on a reliable tip-off that suspicious individuals were assembling near the Krishnajiwadi Shiva Temple to commit a crime, the Tadvai Sub-Inspector and his team rushed to the spot. Upon seeing the police, the suspects attempted to flee, but the alert personnel chased and apprehended them. Under the directions of Kamareddy District SP M. Rajesh Chandra, the direct supervision of Yellareddy DSP S. Srinivas Rao, a coordinated operation was launched involving Sadashivanagar Circle Inspector Santosh Kumar, Tadvai SI Nareish, the Sadashivanagar SI, and an IT Core team including Head Constable Srinivas, PC Yadagiri, and CCS PCs Maisaiah and Kishan to extract complete details of the conspiracy and identify everyone involved. Investigation revealed that the prime accused, Nittu Narsinga Rao, Vadde Swamy, Puli Prashanth Goud, and Suram Swamy, had a prior financial acquaintance with a wealthy Kamareddy businessman named Bhusha Srinivas. To escape their past financial liabilities and make quick money, they hatched a plot to kidnap Bhusha Srinivas and extort a huge ransom from his family. Realizing they needed a lethal weapon to terrorize him, Narsinga Rao and



Vadde Swamy travelled to Maharashtra (A5) from Naigaon, Maharashtra, and 25-year-old Ajay Hanmanth Rao Gongapale and Vaibhav Prakash Baradevar introduced them to a weapon dealer named Maruti Ghoke in Naigaon. They struck a deal to purchase an illegal firearm for ₹30,000 and paid an advance of ₹27,000. On May 27, 2026, Vaibhav Prakash Baradevar and Ajay Hanmanth Rao Gongapale collected the firearm from Maruti Ghoke and arrived near Krishnajiwadi village to hand it over to the local gang, which is when the Tadvai police tactfully intercepted them and disrupted the entire plot. During the operation, the police seized one black firearm, five rubber bullets, two air rifle pellet boxes, five mobile phones, a Hero Splendor Plus motorcycle, two monkey caps, three masks, a nylon rope, yellow tape, black goggles, and ₹3,000 in cash. The arrested individuals have been identified as 55-year-old Nittu Narsinga Rao (A1) from Chityala village, 27-year-old Sura Swamy alias Vadde Swamy (A2) from Santhaipeet village, 40-year-old Puli Prashanth Goud (A3) from Santhaipeet village, 40-year-old Suram Swamy (A4) from Chityala



village, 21-year-old Vaibhav Prakash Baradevar (A5) from Naigaon, Maharashtra, and 25-year-old Ajay Hanmanth Rao Gongapale (A6) from Kokulegaon, Maharashtra. Records indicate that the primary accused, Nittu Narsinga Rao, was previously involved in an attempt-to-murder case at the Tadvai Police Station, and the criminal history of the other accused is being verified. A case has been registered at the Tadvai Police Station under Crime Number 77/2026, invoking Section 61(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) along with Sections 3, 4, and 25(1AA) of the Arms Act, and all six accused are being sent to remand. Meanwhile, the supplier Maruti Ghoke from Naigaon remains at large, and special police teams have been deployed to track him down. The police department has urged citizens, especially the business community, to remain vigilant against such inter-state criminal gangs and report any suspicious movements or illegal weapons immediately via Dial 100 or to the local police, ensuring that the identity of informants will be kept strictly confidential to help maintain peace and public safety.

Collector Orders Speedy Paddy Transportation and Unloading Process in Nirmal

Nirmal, May 28 : District Collector Bhavesh Mishra directed officials to complete the paddy procurement process within the stipulated deadline and ensure immediate transportation of stocked grain to warehouses without delay. On Thursday, the Collector conducted a surprise inspection at the paddy procurement centre set up in Kallur village of Kuntala mandal and later visited the Arli K Sri Anjaneya Swamy Rice Mill to review unloading operations. During the inspection, the Collector examined the procurement process, stock position and maintenance of records at the centre. He enquired with officials about the quantity of paddy procured so far and the balance yet to be purchased. Interacting with farmers at the centre, he assured them that the government would procure every grain without causing inconvenience to farmers. Bhavesh Mishra instructed officials to keep sufficient lorries available for the transportation of paddy bags from procurement centres to rice mills and warehouses. In view of transportation issues caused by shortage of vehicles, he suggested utilising tractors available in villages for shifting paddy stocks wherever necessary. Later, during his visit to Arli K Sri Anjaneya Swamy Rice Mill, the Collector reviewed the unloading process and enquired about the mill's handling capacity and quantity of paddy received so far. He instructed mill management to ensure that vehicles arriving from procurement centres are unloaded quickly and sent back immediately so that procurement activities do not slow down. He also advised the management to appoint additional hamals if required and maintain cleanliness in and around the mill premises. The Collector personally interacted with farmers present at the centre and listened to their concerns. He reiterated that paddy, maize and jowar crops would be procured till the last grain and asked farmers not to worry. Officials were directed to work responsibly and complete procurement operations within the deadline without negligence. Subsequently, a review meeting on grain stocks was held at the Kallur Gram Panchayat office. The Collector instructed officials to take special measures for shifting the stocked grain to warehouses within the prescribed time. He reviewed metric tonne-wise stock details and stressed that farmers should receive complete justice in the procurement process. He said it was the responsibility of officials to ensure that farmers do not face any hardship. During the visit, villagers and the local sarpanch informed the Collector about the availability of five acres of government land at Penchikalpadu village. Responding to the request, he directed officials to examine the site for the construction of a warehouse. Additional Collector (Revenue) Kishore Kumar, Civil Supplies officials Rajender and Sudhakar, Kuntala Tahsildar Kamal Singh, MPDO Alladi Vanaja and officials from various departments participated in the programme.

Nalgonda District Procures 7.40 Lakh Metric Tonnes of Rabi Paddy

: ₹1,313.89 Crore Paid to Farmers

Nalgonda : District Collector B. Chandrashekar has announced that as part of the Rabi procurement drive, a total of 7,40,372 metric tonnes of paddy, valued at ₹1,682.74 crore, has been procured in Nalgonda district as of Thursday. Providing details of the procurement process, the Collector said that 459 paddy procurement centres were established across the district. Procurement has been completed at 217 centres, which have since been closed, while 247 centres are currently operational. So far, 7,42,529 metric tonnes of paddy have arrived at procurement centres, of which 6,90,171 metric tonnes have been transported to rice mills. Truck sheets have been generated for 5,49,974 metric tonnes, and tab entry procedures have been completed for 5,78,979 metric tonnes. The Collector further revealed that ₹1,313.89 crore has already been credited to the accounts of farmers who sold their produce through procurement centres. He reiterated that the district administration is committed to purchasing the entire paddy crop produced by farmers and that rain-damaged paddy will be sent to boiled rice mills for processing.

In a statement issued on Thursday, the Collector said that unseasonal rains affected paddy stocks at several procurement centers in the district. According to the Collector, 650 bags of paddy at Pajjuri village in Tipparthi mandal were soaked by rain and have been procured. 1,800 bags at Lachugudem in Kanagal mandal were pur-

chased and sent to boiled rice mills. 100 bags at Kesharajupalli in Tipparthi mandal were also procured despite being rain-soaked. Around 3,000 bags at Jonnalagudem in Tipparthi mandal were partially damaged by rain. The Collector further said that at the IKP Paddy Procurement Centre in Mukkapalli village of Anumula mandal, arrangements were being made to close the center for the season. While three lorries were being loaded with procured paddy, sudden heavy rain accompanied by strong winds caused trees to fall and roofing sheets to be blown away, resulting in 2,200 bags getting wet. He assured that these rain-affected stocks are also being procured and transported



to boiled rice mills, reaffirming the government's commitment to protecting farmers' interests.

Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy Extends Support to Storm Victim : Immediate House Sanctioned

ASHA Workers Demand ₹18,000 Fixed Salary

: Warn of Indefinite Strike in July

State Will Purchase Every Single Grain at MSP; Wet Paddy to Be Bought Without Deductions, Assures Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy

Peddapalli Bureau : State Civil Supplies Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy has assured farmers that the Telangana government is committed to purchasing every single grain of paddy brought to procurement centers at the Minimum Support Price (MSP). Speaking at a high-level review meeting on Yasangi (Rabi) paddy procurement held at the Peddapalli Integrated District Offices Complex (IDOC) on Thursday, the Minister highlighted that current procurement operations are running 25% to 30% higher than the volumes recorded under the previous administration.

Across the state, 58 lakh metric tonnes of paddy have already been successfully procured, resulting in the disbursement of ₹11,000 crores directly into the bank accounts of nearly 8 lakh farmers. With an additional 15 to



17 lakh metric tonnes left to collect, the state government expects its total procurement to reach approximately 75 lakh metric tonnes, notably surpassing the Food Corporation of India's (FCI) capped target of 51 lakh metric tonnes by an additional 25 lakh metric tonnes.

Addressing the recent unseasonal spells of weather, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy provided strong reassurance regarding rain-damaged

crops, stating that only about 9,000 metric tonnes of paddy statewide have been affected by the rains. He clarified that even if the grain is drenched, the government will purchase it at the full MSP without imposing any price or weight cuts, before routing it directly to boiler mills.

The Minister emphasized that the government will willingly absorb any resulting financial losses rather than allowing the farmers to suffer.

To speed up operations over the next four to five days, local authorities have been instructed to temporarily suspend sand transportation so that all heavy transport vehicles can be deployed exclusively for moving paddy.

Additionally, the Minister noted that rice mills that had defaulted in the past will only receive new paddy allocations once they clear their outstanding dues and interest. Ministers Duddilla Sridhar Babu and Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, along with several local MLAs and top officials, also participated in the comprehensive review.

Minister Sridhar Babu detailed that a strategic action plan is underway, which includes leasing extra warehouse space where needed. He issued a stern warning against the practice of unauthorized weight deductions (tharugu) under the pretext of high moisture or waste, stat-



ing that the current administration has conducted five successful procurement phases without allowing a single kilo of unjustified cuts. Any millers found extracting extra weight from farmers will face severe legal consequences and will be forced to pay full compensation to the affected farmers.

Meanwhile, Government Whip Chinthakunta Vijaya Ramana Rao requested an increase in rice mill allocations

for Peddapalli, pointing out that a massive volume of grain is arriving from neighboring districts, and urged strict action against any non-compliant mills. Reporting on local progress, Peddapalli District Collector Koya Sriharsha stated that the district anticipates a total seasonal yield of 4 lakh metric tonnes, out of which 3.32 lakh metric tonnes—valued at ₹788 crores—have already been procured.

He expressed confidence

that 100% of the district's procurement will be completed by June 5, adding that Peddapalli currently leads the state in digitized operations, including online entries, truck sheet generation, and swift payments to farmers. Providing a different regional perspective, Jayashankar Bhupalpally Collector Rahul Sharma noted that harvesting has been delayed in a few mandals, with 65,000 metric tonnes procured out of a 1.60 lakh metric tonne target.

Due to restricted local storage capacity in Bhupalpally, the grain is being systematically routed to milling facilities in Peddapalli, Warangal, and Hanumakonda. Prior to the review, the ministerial delegation also conducted a physical inspection of the Indira Kranti Patham (IKP) procurement center at Pedda Kalvalla to evaluate ground-level infrastructure and arrangements.

Procurement of Wet Paddy Also Assured; Collector Orders Faster, Transparent Grain Purchase Process

Nagarkurnool : District Collector Hemant Keshav Patil stated that the government is firmly committed to ensuring remunerative prices for every grain produced by farmers and assured that even moisture-affected paddy and maize would be procured as per government norms to prevent losses to farmers.

The Collector directed officials to ensure that the procurement process is carried out swiftly and transparently so that farmers do not face any inconvenience while selling their produce. He emphasized that there should be no delays in grain procurement operations and reviewed issues related to OPMS registration, truck sheets, loading and unloading arrangements.

He also instructed officials to take necessary measures to prevent trucks from remaining stranded at rice mills.

On Thursday, the Collector conducted surprise inspections at Lalitha Umamaheshwara Cotton Ginning Mill in Chennaram village and Venkateshwara Cotton Mill in Nadimpalli village under Achampet mandal. He inspected the stocks of paddy and maize bags stored at the mills and reviewed storage capacity, procurement procedures, and milling operations with the officials concerned.

During the inspection, the Collector enquired about the methods being followed for storing the procured grain, the capacity of warehouses, and the steps being taken to maintain quality standards. He warned that negligence in



storage could damage grain quality and advised officials to take special precautions in

view of the ongoing rains.

He instructed officials to arrange tarpaulins and pro-

TECTIVE covers to prevent paddy and maize from getting wet and directed that ware-

houses be maintained in a hygienic condition. The Collector also reviewed the availability of hamalis (loading workers) and suggested deploying additional labourers if necessary.

To ensure farmers are not forced to wait for long hours, he directed officials to speed up weighing and transportation arrangements. He further instructed that the procured grain should be shifted immediately for milling without unnecessary delay.

The Collector stressed that moisture levels and quality parameters must be examined properly and recorded transparently during procurement. He warned officials to remain vigilant at every stage to ensure that no injustice is caused to farmers and ordered continuous monitoring

to avoid problems at procurement centres.

During the visit, the Collector interacted directly with farmers and enquired about the difficulties they were facing regarding procurement, transportation, and payments. He reiterated that the government gives top priority to farmers' welfare and appealed to farmers to bring quality grain to procurement centres.

The Collector instructed officials to act responsibly towards farmers and ensure smooth procurement operations across the district so that no farmer faces hardship anywhere.
