

Ponguleti Lays Foundation Stone for Reconstruction of Historic Ganapeshwaralayam at Kusumanchi

Khammam/Hyderabad : Telangana Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy on Sunday laid the foundation stone for the reconstruction and development of the historic Sri Ramalingeswara Swamy Temple (Ganapeshwaralayam) at Kusumanchi mandal headquarters in Khammam district. The project will be undertaken at an estimated cost of ₹3.30 crore.



The Minister, accompanied by Khammam MP Ramasahayam Raghuram Reddy and District Collector Divakar T.S., offered special prayers at the temple before formally launching the development works. Addressing the gathering, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy said the Congress government under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy is committed to preserving the cultural and spiritual heritage of all faiths while ensuring equal respect and development for temples, mosques, and churches across the state.

He said the government believes in safeguarding religious traditions without indulging in politics in the name of faith and is taking up several initiatives to strengthen important pilgrimage centres throughout Telangana. Referring to the development of the renowned Bhadradi Sri Sita Ramachandra Swamy Temple, the Minister said the present government has allocated ₹350 crore for its comprehensive development. He noted that works have already commenced and that approximately ₹68 crore has been spent on land acquisition around the temple premises.

The government, he said, is determined to complete major infrastructure works at Bhadrachalam before the forthcoming Godavari Pushkaralu. Ponguleti further stated that development projects are also being undertaken at major pilgrimage destinations such as Basar and Vemulawada. In addition, the government has earmarked ₹1,000 crore for the development of important religious and tourism centres along the Godavari river corridor stretching from Basar to Bhadrachalam. He explained that the reconstruction of Ganapeshwaralayam at Kusumanchi forms part of this broader initiative aimed at preserving Telangana's rich spiritual and cultural heritage while promoting pilgrimage tourism. Later in the day, the Minister also laid the foundation stone for the construction of a BT road from Ponnekallu to Kondapuram in Khammam Rural Mandal. The road project will be executed at a cost of ₹5.20 crore and is expected to improve connectivity and transportation facilities for local residents. The Minister reiterated that the state government is implementing welfare, infrastructure, and development projects with a people-centric approach and is committed to ensuring balanced development across all regions of Telangana. Local public representatives, officials, temple committee members, and devotees participated in the foundation stone-laying ceremony.

Peddapalli Bus Depot Works to be Fast-Tracked and Launched Soon, Says Minister Ponnam Prabhakar

Peddapalli Bureau : State Road Transport Minister Ponnam Prabhakar, along with IT, Industries, and Legislative Affairs Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu and Government Whip & Peddapalli MLA Chinthakunta Vijayaramana Rao, inspected the proposed site for the upcoming RTC bus depot in the Peddapalli district headquarters. Speaking on the occasion, Minister Ponnam Prabhakar stated that the Chief Minister sanctioned the RTC bus depot for Peddapalli following specific requests from Government Whip Vijayaramana Rao and senior Minister Sridhar Babu. Although the project faced initial delays, he assured that measures are now underway to expedite the work and launch the depot at the earliest.



The Minister highlighted that the government is actively taking steps to improve bus connectivity to rural areas. He noted that the demand for rural RTC services has surged significantly following the implementation of the free bus travel scheme for women, making the expansion of the fleet essential. To meet this growing public demand, the process of purchasing new RTC buses is actively ongoing as part of the government's broader commitment to strengthening the public transport system. Addressing the concerns of TSRTC employees, Minister Prabhakar assured that all long-

standing issues would be resolved and urged workers not to succumb to rumors or misconceptions. He announced that a high-level committee led by the Deputy Chief Minister, including five ministers, senior officials, and 40 RTC representatives, successfully held discussions to sanction an 11 percent Pay Revision Commission (PRC) for the workers. Fulfill 420 promises before contesting elections : KTR dares Revanth Reddy

Hyderabad : BRS working president KT Rama Rao challenged Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy to publicly announce that he would contest future elections only after implementing the 420 promises and six guarantees made by the Congress party to the people of Telangana. He said the Chief Minister was attempting to mislead people by claiming that he would not contest elections if electricity meters were installed on agricultural pump sets. "Instead of making such statements, Revanth Reddy should announce that he will not seek votes unless all promises made to the people

of Telangana are implemented, including housing under the Indiramma scheme, welfare guarantees and other commitments made during the Assembly elections," he said while addressing a gathering of BRS leaders from the Secunderabad Cantonment constituency on Sunday. On the proposed Rythu DISCOM, the former Minister said it was being created with the sole objective of eventually scrapping the 24-hour free power supply to farmers. He recalled that while in opposition, Revanth Reddy had publicly stated that three hours of electricity was sufficient for farmers and argued that the current proposal was

designed to translate that mindset into policy. "The real intention behind the Farmers' DISCOM is to dismantle the historic 24-hour free power supply introduced by KCR. The Congress is concealing its anti-farmer agenda while claiming the initiative is meant to benefit farmers," he said, adding that Revanth Reddy had no concern for farmers and that the proposed DISCOM was a death noose for Telangana's farmers. Recalling the power situation before Telangana's formation, Rama Rao said six decades of Congress rule had left the State plagued by severe shortages, frequent outages and industrial power



holidays. He credited former Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao with transforming the power sector within six months of assuming office and delivering uninterrupted 24-hour electricity. "KCR is the first leader in independent India's history to provide free round-the-clock power to the agricultural sector. But the Congress government is now attempting to erase that legacy," he remarked. Stating that the Congress had deceived every section of society by failing to implement its electoral promises, he said farmers and citizens should remain vigilant against policies that could adversely affect their interests.

The BRS working president criticised the Congress government for failing to deliver any meaningful development in Hyderabad in the past two-and-a-half years. He reminded the gathering that Ministers, including Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, had promised 6,000 houses in Cantonment during the by-election campaign. "But not a single house has been delivered since then, in Cantonment or anywhere else in Hyderabad," he added. Rama Rao listed the BRS government's achievements, including the construction of major flyovers, underpasses and bridges, 20,000 litres of free drinking water per (Cont. on Pg 2)

At Kothaguda, the Chief Minister will take part in a mass housewarming ceremony along with beneficiaries whose houses will formally launch Phase-II of the Indiramma Housing Scheme, extending the government's efforts to provide permanent housing to poor and deserving families across Telangana.

Ahead of the Chief Minister's visit, elaborate arrangements are being made by the district administration. To oversee the preparations, Adilabad district in-charge Minister Jupally Krishna Rao arrived in Kagaznagar on Sunday after travelling from Secunderabad aboard the Vande Bharat Express. DGP C.V. Anand Conducts Mega Video Conference with 6,500 Telangana Police Officers

Hyderabad : Telangana Director General of Police (DGP) C.V. Anand, IPS, on Sunday conducted a massive video conference with nearly 6,500 police officers of Sub-Inspector rank and above from various wings of the Telangana Police, outlining a comprehensive roadmap for modern, citizen-centric policing in the state.



Addressing officers from across Telangana, the DGP highlighted the government's expectations from the police department and stressed the need to adapt to emerging challenges. He noted that while policing in the past was largely focused on Maoist activities and conventional crimes, the department must now address evolving threats such as narcotics trafficking, cybercrime, and traffic-related issues that directly

impact citizens. Emphasising the need for a shift in mindset and strategy, Anand announced several key initiatives aimed at strengthening law enforcement and public safety. These include the creation of a dedicated Traffic and Road Safety Wing, the establishment of a specialized Technology Team to leverage advanced policing tools, the for-

mation of a Vigilance and Enforcement Task Force to prevent revenue leakages, and an Anti-Food Adulteration Wing to tackle growing concerns over food safety and public health. The DGP instructed Superintendents of Police and Commissioners of Police to function as effective leaders of their respective units and ensure rigorous supervision of policing activities. He directed senior officers to conduct regular crime review meetings, intensify police station inspections, strengthen day and night patrolling, and ensure prompt response to Dial-112 emergency calls.

In a significant move to improve public engagement, Anand announced that all police units across the state would uniformly observe 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. as public visiting hours, enabling citizens to directly interact with police officers and raise their concerns. He also underscored the importance of maintaining proper protocol while dealing with elected representatives and public figures, while reiterating that integrity must remain the cornerstone of policing. However, he said that after coming to power, the Congress government focused on demolishing houses of the poor under the HYDRAA initiative rather than building new ones.

He also recalled the previous government's sustained pressure on the Union government for the transfer of defence lands in Cantonment and the construction of elevated corridors towards Karimnagar and Nizamabad. Kodali Krishna Rao Appointed Chancellor's Nominee to Manipur University Court

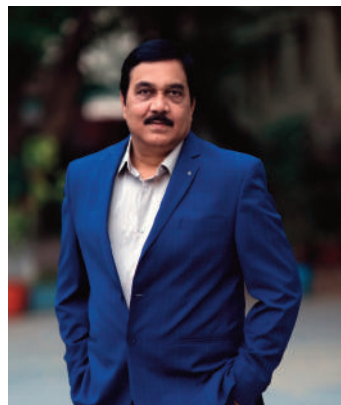

He also had lunch onboard the train before proceeding to review the arrangements for the Chief Minister's programme.

Mr. Krishna Rao is scheduled to inspect the public meeting venue, parking facilities, helipad, stage arrangements and other logistical preparations. He will subsequently hold a review meeting with district of-

ficials to assess the readiness of all departments involved in the event.

TSCPSEU Opposes 1.5% Health Scheme Deduction, Seeks Protection for CPS Pensioners

Jagtial : The Telangana State Contributory Pension Scheme Employees Union (TSCPSEU), Jagtial district unit, has expressed strong opposition to the State Government's decision to deduct 1.5% of employees' basic pay towards the newly introduced Employees Health Scheme (EHS) and Employee Health Care Trust (EHCT).

In a statement, TSCPSEU district president G. Mahesh, general secretary Sarva Sateesh, and treasurer Gollapally Mahesh Goud alleged that the scheme was being implemented without issuing clear operational guidelines or consulting employees and pensioners.

The union questioned the commencement of salary deductions even before the issuance of health cards and finalization of agreements with empanelled hospitals. It also pointed out that no official list of hospitals providing cashless treatment under the scheme

has been released so far. The employee representatives further alleged that the government's matching contribution to the Health Care Trust has not yet been deposited, while employees continue to



await pending Dearness Allowance arrears and implementation of a new Pay Revision Commission (PRC).

Expressing concern over retired CPS employees, the union stated that thousands of pensioners may face difficulties in availing health benefits due to the absence of Pension Payment Order (PPO) numbers. Unlike Old Pension Scheme re-

tirees, CPS pensioners possess only PRAN numbers, which could lead to their exclusion from the scheme.

The union demanded immediate withdrawal of the compulsory 1.5% deduction, issuance of comprehensive guidelines, empanelment of hospitals, and implementation of the scheme only after obtaining employee consent.

It also urged the government to facilitate enrollment of CPS pensioners and their family members through PRAN-based integration in the IFMIS system and ensure cashless medical treatment for retired CPS employees.

TSCPSEU leaders warned that continuing deductions without extending benefits to retired CPS pensioners would be unfair and discriminatory. They called upon the State Government to address the concerns of employees and pensioners and implement the health scheme in a transparent and equitable manner.

Infrastructure and the Need for Transparency

Strengthening basic amenities—such as arterial roads, clean drinking water, and robust drainage networks—is the cornerstone of rural and urban progress.



However, the onus lies heavily on the administration to ensure that every rupee allocated for these public works is utilized effectively. True progress can only be realized when there is seamless coordination across the administrative hierarchy, spanning from Panchayat Secretaries at the village level to Municipal Commissioners and Regional Divisional Officers (RDOs) at the constituency level.

Furthermore, to eliminate systemic loopholes and substandard construction, a culture of absolute transparency must be fos-

tered, where citizens and civil society can readily access quality control reports and expenditure details.

Safeguarding the Rural Financial Ecosystem

While physical infrastructure drives growth, banking and financial stability sustain it. In this context, recent instances of financial irregularities and multi-crore scams emerging in local bank branches are deeply concerning. When hard-earned savings of farmers, small-scale traders, and rural families are compromised due to oversight or internal lapses, it severely dents public faith in the banking system.

The administration and financial regulators must respond to such structural vulnerabilities with swift, stringent investigations. Beyond penalizing the culprits, there is an urgent need to mandate rigorous, continuous auditing protocols to prevent such institutional breaches in the future.

The Role of Fourth Estate

in Local Governance

In navigating these challenges, grassroots journalism must step up as a vigilant custodian of public interest. Media reporting should transcend mere news dissemination; it must act as a catalyst for accountability. Whether it is tracking the official agendas of municipal council meetings or investigating the quality of local civil works, independent and courageous reporting is vital to bridge the gap between administrative promises and ground realities.

The Bottom Line

While strategic planning is a welcome first step, the true measure of governance lies in corruption-free, high-quality execution. Only when administrative machinery remains accountable, public representatives prioritize welfare, and the media stays vigilant, can genuine regional development be achieved.

DCA Telangana Raids Medical Shop in Hyderabad, Seizes Habit-Forming Drugs

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad : The Drugs Control Administration (DCA), Telangana, has launched a crackdown on the illegal sale of habit-forming medicines, raiding a medical shop in Ramanthapur and seizing stocks of regulated drugs allegedly being sold without valid prescriptions.

Acting on specific information, DCA officials conducted a raid at SVR Medicals in Ramanthapur, Hyderabad, and found the establishment allegedly dispensing Codeine-based cough syrups and Tramadol-containing capsules in violation of prescribed drug regulations.

According to officials, the medicines were being sold without obtaining valid prescriptions from registered medical practitioners, contra-



vening provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act and regulations governing the sale of habit-forming pharmaceutical products.

During the operation, DCA officers seized stocks of the drugs and confiscated relevant records and documents for detailed examination.

Officials stated that further

investigation is underway to determine the extent of the violations and identify any additional regulatory breaches.

The Drugs Control Administration said legal action is being initiated against the management of the medical shop in accordance with applicable laws.

Photographs and video footage released by the department showed officials inspecting the premises, documenting the seized materials, and verifying records during the raid.

A senior DCA official said the department remains committed to preventing the misuse of habit-forming

medicines and protecting public health, particularly among young people who are vulnerable to substance abuse.

"The indiscriminate sale of regulated medicines can have serious consequences for public health. Strict action will be taken against establishments found violating drug

control regulations," the official said.

The department reiterated that medicines containing narcotic and psychotropic substances must only be dispensed against valid medical prescriptions and maintained in accordance with statutory record-keeping requirements.

The DCA has appealed to pharmacists, medical shop owners, and healthcare professionals to strictly adhere to legal provisions governing the sale and distribution of regulated drugs.

Officials further stated that similar enforcement drives will continue across Telangana to curb the illegal sale and misuse of habit-forming medicines.

Members of the public can report complaints relating to illegal drug sales and pharmaceutical violations through the DCA Telangana toll-free helpline 1800-599-6969.

The Drugs Control Administration said its ongoing enforcement efforts are aimed at safeguarding public health and ensuring compliance with drug safety regulations throughout the state.

Warangal, May 31 : In view of the onset of the southwest monsoon, District Collector Dr. Satya Sharada has directed officials to ensure the complete procurement of paddy brought by farmers to procurement centres within the stipulated timeframe. On Sunday, the Collector visited paddy procurement centres at Manubothula Thanda, Peddamagadda Thanda and Khanapur mandal headquarters to review procurement operations. During the inspection, she reviewed the progress of paddy procurement, facilities being provided to farmers and the availability of hamalis (load workers). The Collector also interacted with farmers and enquired about the issues they were facing at the procurement centres. When farmers informed her about a shortage of hamalis, Dr. Sharada instructed officials to immediately redeploy workers from centres where procurement had already been completed to locations facing shortages and resolve the issue without delay. The Collector also directed Agriculture Department field-level officials to create awareness among farmers about the harmful effects of burning crop residue. She explained that stubble burning reduces soil fertility, destroys beneficial microorganisms in the soil and adversely affects agricultural productivity in the long run. She urged farmers to adopt alternative methods for crop residue management instead of burning agricultural waste. Later, the Collector conducted surprise inspections at Srinivasa Rao Rice Mill, Sai Krishna Rice Mill and Gopikrishna Agro Agencies in Khanapur mandal. She examined the quality and weight of paddy bags, records and procurement receipts. Dr. Sharada instructed millers to ensure transparency in paddy procurement and maintain accurate weighing procedures so that farmers do not face any injustice. She warned that any practices detrimental to farmers' interests would not be tolerated. Additional Collector G. Sandhya Rani, ZP CEO Ram Reddy, Narsampet RDO Uma Rani, officials of various departments and farmers were present during the visit.

Cyberabad Police Arrest Two More Accused in Gandipet Government Land Fraud Case

Gachibowli : Narsingi Police of the Cyberabad Commissionerate have arrested two more accused in a major land fraud case involving an alleged conspiracy to illegally encroach upon valuable government land in Survey No. 18 of Gandipet village through fake Government Orders (G.Os.) and forged official records. The case was registered as Crime No. 990/2026 under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). Earlier, three persons from Gandipet village were arrested in connection with the case.

The newly arrested accused have been identified as Veladi Radhakrishna (53) and his driver Gyara Praveen Kumar (34). According to the investigation, Radhakrishna worked as an outsourcing employee in the Information Technology and Communications (IT&C) Department of the Andhra Pradesh Secretariat between 2006 and 2009. During his tenure, he became familiar with govern-

ment procedures and administrative systems. After leaving the job, he allegedly began exploiting this knowledge by falsely claiming that he could secure government jobs, land regularisation orders, pattadar passbooks, succession proceedings, and other official permissions for people.

Police said Radhakrishna projected himself as a Deputy Collector and advocate and started cheating unemployed youth by promising government jobs. In one such case, he allegedly collected ₹30 lakh from several job aspirants. When the promised jobs failed to materialise, a cheating case was registered against him at Karimnagar II Town Police Station in 2014.

Investigators stated that Radhakrishna continued similar fraudulent activities over the years. He allegedly collected ₹18 lakh from a person identified as Venkatachari by promising a Secretariat Attender job, leading to a case being registered at Nalgonda II Town Police Station.



In another case, he allegedly took ₹3 lakh from a resident of Moinabad after promising a government job in the Sub-Registrar Office. Several other cases involving cheating, forgery, criminal breach of trust, and related offences were subsequently registered against him at various police stations. Police said that after becoming accustomed to earning money through job frauds, Radhakrishna gradually shifted to-

wards large-scale land-related frauds. During this period, he allegedly developed contacts with individuals claiming rights over government poramboke land in Survey No. 18 of Gandipet village. Through his driver Praveen Kumar, he also came into contact with several persons connected to the disputed land.

The investigation revealed that despite knowing that the land belonged to the govern-

ment and that no lawful ownership rights existed, Radhakrishna allegedly assured prospective buyers, including individuals from Andhra Pradesh, that he could obtain regularisation orders, succession permissions, and other government approvals.

To gain the confidence of those involved, he allegedly promised to create documents granting legal ownership rights over the land and collected substantial amounts

of money from various parties. However, when genuine government approvals could not be obtained, Radhakrishna and his associates allegedly resorted to creating fake Government Orders, fabricated CCLA proceedings, forged No Objection Certificates (NOCs), official letters, and other government documents.

Police said the forged documents carried fake names and signatures of senior government officials and were designed to appear authentic. During the investigation, it was also found that several associates assisted in document preparation, financial transactions, transportation of records, and communication among the accused.

Investigators further revealed that financial transactions worth nearly ₹12 crore took place between prospective purchasers and persons connected to the land deal.

After the case was registered, Radhakrishna allegedly went into hiding to evade arrest. Police said his driver,

Praveen Kumar, assisted him by concealing documents, facilitating communication, and providing information about police movements.

Based on technical evidence and credible intelligence inputs, Narsingi Police traced and arrested both accused.

During the operation, police seized original fabricated Government Orders, five laptops, twelve cheque books, thirteen stamps, seven bank passbooks, ten ATM cards, and thirty-one documents related to various land transactions.

Cyberabad Police stated that the case has exposed a well-organised conspiracy involving fake Government Orders, forged official records, and fraudulent methods aimed at illegally acquiring valuable government land. The investigation is continuing to trace the remaining absconding accused, uncover the complete financial trail, and initiate legal action against all those involved in the conspiracy.

EMT Saves Premature Infant's Life with Timely CPR in Vikarabad

Vikarabad : In a remarkable display of presence of mind and emergency medical expertise, a 108 Ambulance Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), Shanth Kumar, saved the life of a premature infant by administering timely CPR while transporting the baby to a hospital in Hyderabad.



The infant, born to Bhuvaneshwari and Naveen of Thunkimilla village in Bomraspet mandal, Vikarabad district, was delivered three days ago at the Mother and Child Hospital in Tandur. As the baby was born prematurely at just seven months of gestation, he developed serious health complications, including a low heart rate and respiratory distress.

Considering the critical condi-

tion of the newborn, doctors referred the infant to Niloufer Hospital in Hyderabad for advanced treatment. While the baby was being shifted in a 108 ambulance, tragedy nearly struck near Maneguda when the infant suddenly suffered cardiac arrest and his heartbeat stopped.

Realizing the gravity of the situation, EMT Shanth Kumar acted swiftly and performed emergency

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) on the newborn. After a few tense moments, the CPR proved successful and the infant's heartbeat resumed, bringing immense relief to the family and ambulance staff.

The baby was subsequently transported safely to Niloufer Hospital and admitted under the care of specialist doctors.

Family members expressed their heartfelt gratitude to EMT Shanth Kumar for his timely intervention and life-saving efforts. They said they would remain indebted to him for saving their child's life.

The incident stands as a powerful reminder of how prompt medical response and professional dedication can make the difference between life and death.

World No Tobacco Day Program

Hanamkonda : Dr. A. Appiah, the District Medical and Health Officer (DM&HO) of Hanamkonda, called for the creation of widespread public awareness regarding the adverse effects caused by smoking and the consumption of tobacco products.



On the occasion of World No Tobacco Day, an awareness seminar and an exhibition of various posters were organized at the Public Garden in Hanamkonda, followed by a rally extending up to the Head Post Office. Speaking at the event, he emphasized that smoking in public places—such as parks, cinema halls, and markets—poses severe health risks to those in the vicinity, a fact that everyone must take note of.

He stated that, in collaboration with the Police Department, surprise raids would be conducted on shops selling banned tobacco products; cases would

be registered against violators, and fines would be imposed. He further informed that individuals found smoking in public places would be penalized under Section 4 of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA). Additionally, he explained that special awareness programs are being organized for the youth in schools and colleges. Furthermore, measures are being implemented—with the cooperation of relevant government departments and committee members—to prevent the sale of tobacco products within a 100-yard

radius of educational institutions.

He also mentioned that cancer screening tests are being conducted as part of the National Non-Communicable Diseases (NCD) program, and noted that a Cancer Day Care Center is available at MGM Hospital.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Ramaka Srinivas, Founder of the Srinivasa Heart Foundation, stated that India ranks second globally in tobacco consumption and that approximately 8 million people worldwide die annually from tobacco-related diseases. He emphasized

that these deaths are entirely preventable and that conducting continuous awareness programs among the public is of utmost necessity.

Renowned Pulmonologist Dr. Ramesh warned that smoking and the consumption of other tobacco products have a severe impact not only on the lungs but on almost every organ in the human body.

The event was attended by NCD Program Officer Dr. Srinivas, President of the Public Garden Walkers Association G. Rajireddy, Administrator of the Helping Hand Society De-addiction Center Ramu, District Mass Media Officer V. Ashok Reddy, NCD Social Worker Naresh, Supervisor Srinivas Reddy, Pochammakunta Lascar Singaram, GWMC Health Supervisors, ANMs, ASHA workers, walkers, and numerous other visitors.

293 Drunk Drivers Caught in Cyberabad During Weekend Special Enforcement Drive

Gachibowli : Cyberabad Traffic Police conducted a special weekend drunken driving enforcement drive and apprehended 293 motorists for driving under the influence of alcohol.



According to G. Hanmantha Rao, Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police (Traffic-I), the highest number of offenders were two-wheeler riders. Of the total cases booked, 241 involved two-wheelers, 11 three-wheelers, 39 four-wheelers and two heavy vehicles.

Based on Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) levels, 244 offenders registered BAC levels between 36 mg/100 ml and 200 mg/100 ml, while 26 offenders recorded levels between 201 mg/100 ml and 300 mg/100 ml. Another 23 offenders were found with BAC levels ranging from 301 mg/100 ml to 550 mg/100 ml.

Police said all the offenders will be produced before the court for further legal action.

Reiterating its commitment to road safety, the Cyberabad Police warned that drunken driving is a serious offence that endangers not only the driver but also other road users. Officials stated that if a person driving under the influence of alcohol causes a fatal accident, he or she will be booked under Section 105 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023, which pertains to culpable homicide not amounting to murder. The offence carries a maximum punishment of up to 10 years imprisonment

along with a fine. Meanwhile, courts disposed of 173 drunken driving cases during the week from May 25 to May 30, 2026. Among them, four offenders were awarded both fine and imprisonment, five were sentenced to fine along with social service, while 164 offenders were imposed with fine only.

Cyberabad Traffic Police appealed to citizens not to drink and drive and to make use of alternative modes of transportation to ensure safer roads for everyone.

LET US BUILD A TOBACCO-FREE SOCIETY: MURALIDHAR, DSP, RAILWAY POLICESTATION

Nellore : On Sunday, under the joint auspices of the Community Paramedics and Primary Health Care Providers Welfare Association (The PMP Association of India) and Narayana Dental College Hospital, an awareness program was held at the office of the Railway Deputy Superintendent of Police on Railway Feeders Road to mark World No Tobacco Day.



During this event, G. Muralidhar—DSP of the Nellore Railway Police Station and the program's chief guest—unveiled a pamphlet titled "Tobacco-Free Movement." Speaking on the occasion, he noted that World No Tobacco Day is observed annually on May 31st. He emphasized the need to raise awareness regard-

ing the life-threatening diseases caused by tobacco consumption, to expose how e-cigarettes and nicotine products are turning youth and children into addicts, and to empower them to stay away from such products in order to build a tobacco-free society.

It was stated that tobacco use is a leading cause of preventable deaths worldwide; that tobacco smoke and its effects lead to severe health complications—particularly cancer, as well as chronic lung diseases, heart disease, and strokes—in millions of people; and that tobacco contains thousands of harmful chemical substances. It was further noted that the dangers associated with tobacco use

are not limited solely to cigarette smoking; rather, the use of smokeless tobacco products—such as cigars, hookahs, gutka, and pan parag—also poses significant health risks.

The Youth Ensnared by Tobacco : Dr. Krishna Kumar, Dental Specialist.

Dr. Krishna Kumar observed that the younger generation is becoming debilitated by the ever-increasing grip of tobacco

addiction. He noted that habits often begun in early youth merely for fun gradually evolve into full-blown addictions, thereby destroying the future of the youth and leaving them plagued by both mental and physical health issues. He emphasized that advertisements for tobacco-related products must be strictly banned—not only in public spaces such as bus stands, railway stations, cinema theaters, and commercial

complexes, but also across mass media and digital platforms. He urged that measures be taken to ensure that tobacco products are not sold to individuals under the age of 18. Furthermore, he called for the full implementation of the E-Cigarette Act

introduced in 2019, strict curbs on the online sale of e-cigarettes, extensive public awareness campaigns regarding the adverse effects of tobacco consumption, and the regular organization of awareness programs within educational institutions.

Citing this year's World Health Organization theme—"Attract, Unmask—Countering Tobacco and Nicotine Addiction"—he stated that rural doctors

must play a pivotal role in building a tobacco-free society by raising awareness among the youth regarding the harmful effects of smoking and the dangers of nicotine addiction.

Subsequently, DSP G. Muralidhar, Dr. Krishna Kumar, and SI N. Hari Chandana were felicitated with shawls in a grand ceremony. Pamphlets were distributed to auto-rickshaw drivers stationed outside the railway station.

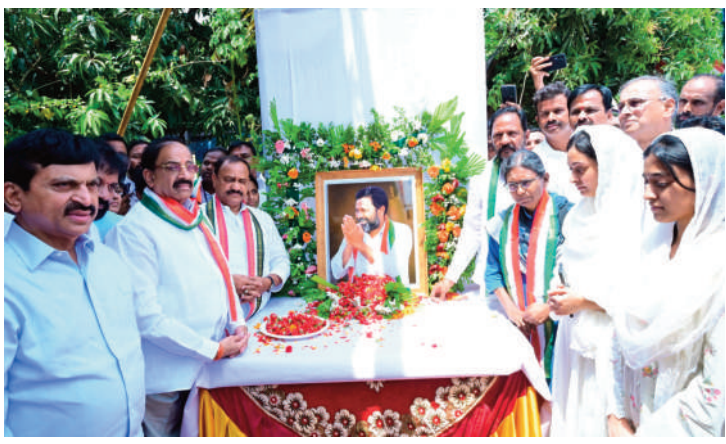

Hundreds Detained as Isolated Violence Mars PSG Champions League Celebrations in France

Paris/New Delhi : While millions of football fans celebrated Paris Saint-Germain's historic UEFA Champions League triumph, isolated incidents of violence and vandalism during post-match festivities led to hundreds of arrests across France, according to official figures released by French authorities.

The disturbances occurred following PSG's dramatic victory over Arsenal in the Champions League final in Budapest, which secured the Paris-based club's second consecutive European title.

According to the French Interior Ministry, 416 people were detained nationwide, including 283 in the Paris region, as security forces responded to sporadic incidents of public

disorder during the celebrations.

Authorities reported that seven police officers sustained injuries, most of them minor, during operations to maintain law and order.

To manage the large crowds, French authorities deployed an extensive security apparatus, including approximately 8,000 police officers in Paris and nearly 22,000 personnel across the country.

Officials said the vast majority of supporters celebrated peacefully. However, small groups were involved in acts of violence and vandalism in several locations.

Among the incidents reported were attacks on police personnel using fireworks and flares, prompting law enforcement officers to deploy tear gas in certain areas.



Authorities also recorded instances of vehicles, scooters, bicycles, and public property being set on fire or damaged.

Police said some individuals attempted to erect barricades and briefly disrupt traffic on sections of the Paris ring road. A group also reportedly attempted to force entry into a police station in the French capital's 8th arrondissement.

Minor disturbances were reported around

the Parc des Princes stadium and along the Champs-Élysées, where tens of thousands of supporters had gathered to celebrate PSG's success.

French Interior Minister Laurent Nuñez strongly condemned the violence, describing the incidents as "absolutely unacceptable." He emphasized that the actions of a small minority should not overshadow the conduct of the overwhelming majority of fans who celebrated re-

sponsibly. The minister reiterated that security arrangements had functioned effectively and confirmed that official victory celebrations scheduled for Sunday would continue under enhanced security measures.

Authorities continue to monitor the situation and investigate the incidents. Meanwhile, PSG supporters across France have continued celebrating the club's historic achievement, which has cemented its place among Europe's elite football teams.

French officials stressed that maintaining public safety remains a priority as the country hosts further celebrations marking one of the most significant sporting achievements in PSG's history.
