Heavy Rains Lash Hyderabad; HYDRA DRF Teams Deployed for Ground-Level Relief Operations

Medchal Malkajgiri Bureau : A massive downpour battered Hyderabad on Tuesday, causing severe waterlogging across several arterial roads and disrupting daily life. Central zones like Begumpet and Khairatabad bore the brunt of the storm, recording nearly 9 centimetres of rainfall in a short span. Knee-deep water accumulated on the key thoroughfares connecting Tank Bund and the State Secretariat, significantly slowing down vehicular movement. To tackle the sudden inundation, the Hyderabad Disaster Response and Asset Protection Agency (HYDRA) deployed its Disaster Response Force (DRF) teams across the city to clear choked drains and pump out stagnant water.

HYDRA Commissioner A.V. Ranganath personally toured the flood-affected zones to inspect ground-level operations and coordinate disaster relief. Commuters faced severe traffic gridlocks on Tank Bund toward the Secunderabad stretch due to a combination of deep water pooling and an uprooted tree blocking the main road. The Commissioner closely monitored the clearance operations as DRF personnel used specialized equipment to cut and remove the fallen tree while simultaneously clearing debris to ensure a smooth flow of stormwater.

Beyond the central district, HYDRA's emergency teams were actively engaged in clearing blockages across major IT and residential corridors, including Serilingampally, Kondapur, Gachibowli, Shaikpet, Tolichowki, Madhapur, Secunderabad, and Hyderguda. Across the city, strong winds accompanied by heavy downpours resulted in trees falling at approximately 76 distinct locations. DRF teams worked continuously through the evening to clear these obstructions from public roads, restore traffic normalcy, and mitigate further urban flooding hazards.

Former Minister Encroached SC/ST Lands to Build Colleges and Hospitals: Minister Adluri Laxman Kumar

Medchal Bureau : Scheduled Castes, Tribal, and Minorities Welfare Minister Adluri Laxman Kumar, along with Medchal-Malkajgiri District Congress President Vajresh Yadav and Medchal Collector Manu Choudhary, inspected the SC Corporation lands that have allegedly been encroached upon in Gundlapochampally village. Speaking on the occasion, Minister Adluri Laxman stated that in 1991, the then-government had allocated 49 acres and 20 guntas of land under Survey Number 509 in the outskirts of Gundlapochampally and Maisammaguda to secure the future of children belonging to Scheduled Castes in Telangana. Taking a sharp, indirect dig at former BRS minister Ch Malla Reddy, the Minister slammed him for abusing his past political power to encroach upon various local lakes, ponds, and public lands to illegally construct private colleges and hospitals.

Minister Adluri Laxman issued a stern warning, stating that as the minister responsible for Scheduled Castes welfare, he would not sit idly by while lands explicitly designated for the SC Corporation are being occupied by powerful individuals. He officially directed the local District Collector to immediately initiate a comprehensive land survey of the entire 49.20-acre patch and hand it back over to the SC Corporation at the earliest. Reaffirming the Congress government's stance against land grabbing, the Minister cautioned that strict legal action would be taken against anyone attempting to encroach upon government properties or farmers' lands, emphasizing that no violators would be spared, regardless of their political stature or influence.

Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka Inaugurates Power Infrastructure Projects Worth ₹11 Crore in Bhongir

Bhongir : Telangana Deputy Chief Minister M. Bhatti Vikramarka said the State Government is strengthening power infrastructure by establishing new substations and storage complexes to ensure uninterrupted electricity supply without even a momentary outage.

The Deputy Chief Minister inaugurated and laid foundation stones for power development works worth about ₹11 crore under the jurisdiction of the TGSPDCL Yadadri Bhuvanagiri Circle.

He inaugurated the newly constructed TGSPDCL Circle Office building in Bhongir town, built at a cost of ₹5.83 crore. From the same venue, he remotely inaugurated a new 33/11 KV substation at Vankamamidi village in Bhoodan Pochampally mandal, constructed at a cost of ₹2.67 crore. He said the facility would significantly improve the quality and reliability of power supply for farmers.

Bhatti Vikramarka also laid the foundation stone for a new Store Complex to be constructed at Hanumapuram village in Bhongir mandal at a cost of ₹2.03 crore, and for a 33/11 KV substation at Narsapur village in



Valigonda mandal with an estimated cost of ₹3.52 crore.

Addressing a public meeting chaired by Bhongir MLA Kumbam Anil Kumar Reddy, the Deputy Chief Minister said the government has been implementing every promise made to the people before the elections. He stated that the government is not only providing free electricity but also ensuring quality power supply across the state.

He noted that despite the state recording a peak power demand of 18,546 MW during the 2025–26 financial year, uninterrupted electricity was supplied successfully without disruptions.

The Deputy CM highlighted several welfare initiatives, including free bus travel for women, interest-free loans, free rice distribution, fee reimbursement for students, and the Indiramma Housing Scheme. He announced that an additional 2,000 Indiramma houses would be allocated to each Assembly constituency during the current year.

Indiramma Family Insurance Scheme Soon

Bhatti Vikramarka announced that the State Government would soon launch the "Indiramma Kutumba Bheema" scheme, providing insurance coverage of ₹5 lakh to nearly

1.15 crore families irrespective of caste or religion in the event of accidental death.

He also assured prompt action to resolve compensation-related issues of Baswapuram land-displaced families.

Bhongir MLA Kumbam Anil Kumar Reddy thanked the Deputy Chief Minister for sanctioning new substations aimed at ensuring uninterrupted power supply to farmers and residents of the constituency. He said several new substations are being established after the formation of the present government and that a dedicated power storage facility is also being developed in Bhongir.

MLC Nellikanti Satyam emphasized the need to provide adequate transformers and electricity connections to farmers and said the new substations would greatly benefit the people of the constituency by reducing power interruptions.

Mega Job Mela Attracts 2,000 Minority Youth; Government Reaffirms Employment Commitment

Nearly 20 training institutes also took part in the event alongside former trainees and students currently undergoing skill development programmes.

According to organisers, nearly 2,000 minority youth from different parts of Telangana attended the Job Mela. Besides recruitment opportunities, participants were provided career counselling and assistance for enrolment in various skill development courses.

Collector Directs Officials to Boost Government School Enrollment by 20% Under Prof. Jayashankar Badibata Program

Discussions focused on improving educational standards and providing better infrastructure in schools.

He also directed officials to identify and reopen schools that had previously been closed due to zero enrollment, appoint instructors and helpers in 91 newly sanctioned pre-primary schools, improve infrastructure, ensure gas connections and toilet facilities in all government schools, and provide ramps and western toilets for children with special needs. He emphasized enhancing digital learning facilities and ensuring that interactive flat panels, computers, and internet connectivity are available and functional in schools.

Traffic Rules Are Not Optional, Says SI as Police Book Violators

Number plate less vehicles targeted in special drive; motorists advised to follow safety regulations

Narayanpet : The Traffic Police in Narayanpet district conducted a special enforcement drive against vehicles operating without number plates and took action against motorists found violating traffic regulations.

During the drive, officials identified 12 vehicles being driven without number plates on public roads. Fines were imposed on the violators, and vehicle owners were instructed to immediately install proper registration plates in accordance with the law.

Speaking on the occasion, Traffic Sub-Inspector Krishna Chaitanya stated that driving vehicles without



number plates is a violation of the law. He emphasized that number plates play a crucial role in vehicle identification, traffic management, and criminal investigations. He noted that some motorists continue to ignore traffic regulations by operating vehicles without registration plates and warned that strict

action would be taken against such offenders under the Motor Vehicles Act.

The SI further explained that the absence of number plates makes it difficult for authorities to identify vehicles involved in thefts, accidents, or other offenses. He urged all vehicle owners to ensure that their vehicles are fitted

with number plates as prescribed by law.

Highlighting the importance of road safety, Krishna Chaitanya said that adherence to traffic rules is the responsibility of every citizen and can significantly reduce road accidents.

He also issued the following safety guidelines to motorists:

- Do not drive without a valid driving licence.
- Two-wheeler riders must wear helmets at all times.
- Car occupants should always wear seat belts.
- Drunk driving is strictly prohibited.
- Do not park vehicles indiscriminately on roads.
- More than two persons

should not travel on a two-wheeler.

- Auto-rickshaws should not carry passengers beyond the permitted seating capacity.
- School students and labourers should not be transported in overcrowded auto-rickshaws.- Avoid using mobile phones while driving.
- Do not engage in racing or reckless driving.
- Follow prescribed speed limits at all times.
- Obey traffic signals and road signs without exception.

The programme enhanced the awareness and technical understanding of police officers regarding the latest features, procedures, and functionalities of the CCTNS 2.0 and e-Sakshya systems.

Officials announced that unemployed tribal youth aged between 18 and 35 years who have completed Secondary School, Intermediate, or Degree-level education are eligible to undergo skill training at the Mega Skill Centre in Hyderabad. Depending on the

course, the duration of training ranges from three to six months. Free accommodation and food facilities will be provided throughout the training period.

The programme offers training in both domain-specific and non-domain subjects. Domain courses include Tourism, Hotel Management, Beautician Training, Tailoring, Embroidery, Software Development, and Entrepreneurship Development. Non-domain training covers Soft Skills, Spoken English, Communication Skills, and Basic Computer Skills. District Revenue Officer A. He acknowledged the valuable contribution of private hospitals and medical specialists who have voluntarily partnered with the Government under PMSMA, significantly strengthening access to specialist care for pregnant women, especially in underserved areas.

The Union Health Minister stated that antenatal care plays a critical role in ensuring safe pregnancy outcomes. He noted that under the Government's maternal healthcare framework, pregnant women receive regular antenatal check-ups, including a specialist-led examination under PMSMA. He further highlighted the pivotal role played by ASHA workers in identifying, tracking and supporting pregnant women throughout their pregnancy journey.

Referring to the launch of the Extended PMSMA (E-PMSMA) strategy in January 2022, Nadda said that the initiative was introduced to ensure closer monitoring and follow-up of identified high-risk pregnancies. Under E-PMSMA, high-risk pregnancies are line-listed, tracked individually and monitored up to 45 days after delivery to ensure healthy outcomes for both mother and child. He added that SMS-based alerts and enhanced support from frontline health workers have further strengthened continuity of care, while additional incentives provided to ASHAs have helped improve outreach and follow-up services at the community level.

Highlighting the achievements made in maternal and child health, Nadda stated that India's progress has received global recognition. Citing the latest United Nations Maternal Mortality Estimation Inter-Agency Group (UN-MMEIG) Report, he noted that India has achieved an impressive 86 per cent decline in maternal mortality since 1990, significantly higher than the global average decline of 48 per cent. He further stated that India has recorded a 79 per cent decline in Under-Five Mortality Rate compared to the global decline of 61 per cent, while the United Nations Inter-Agency Group for Child Mortality Estimation (UN-IGME) Report highlighted a 70 per cent decline in neonatal mortality between 1990 and 2024, compared to the global decline of 54 per cent.

Nadda also underscored the improvements reflected in the latest National Family Health Survey findings. He noted that institutional deliveries have increased to 90.6 per cent, while the proportion of mothers receiving antenatal care has risen to 95.9 per cent. These achievements, he said, are a reflection of strengthened healthcare systems, improved service delivery and enhanced awareness among families regarding maternal health. “These numbers are not merely statistics; they represent the lives of mothers and newborns saved through timely care, early intervention and collective efforts of our healthcare workforce,” he stated.

TGSRTC MD Warns Job Aspirants Against Recruitment Frauds

Hyderabad : TGSRTC Vice Chairman and Managing Director Y. Nagi Reddy has cautioned unemployed youth against falling prey to fraudsters and middlemen who falsely promise jobs in the State-run transport corporation in exchange for money.

Issuing a strong advisory to job seekers, Nagi Reddy emphasized that all recruitment processes in the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGSRTC) are conducted in a completely transparent manner and only through the officially designated recruitment agencies, including the Police Recruitment Board wherever applicable. He clarified that no individual, intermediary, or private agent has any role in the recruitment process.

The Managing Director urged unemployed youth not to be misled by fake job offers, unauthorized advertisements, or agents claiming to secure appointments in TGSRTC. He advised candidates to rely solely on their talent, hard work, and merit to secure employment opportunities.

He further stated that the corporation is committed to maintaining fairness, transparency, and integrity in all recruitment procedures. Candidates were advised to remain vigilant and immediately report any suspicious individuals or fraudulent activities related to job offers.

Nagi Reddy warned that strict criminal action would be initiated against those involved in cheating innocent unemployed youth under the guise of providing jobs in TGSRTC. He reiterated that any attempt to exploit job seekers through false promises would be dealt with firmly in accordance with the law.

Calling upon aspirants to stay alert, he said that merit is the true investment and hard work is the real path to employment.

He encouraged young candidates to focus on preparation and avoid being trapped by fraudulent schemes that could jeopardize their careers and financial well-being.

"Talent is your investment, and hard work is your employment. Stay away from shortcuts and achieve success through merit," the TGSRTC MD affirmed.

"Do not trust brokers or middlemen who demand money by promising jobs. There are no shortcuts to success. Work hard, prepare sincerely, and earn employment through your abilities and dedication," Nagi Reddy said.

Land acquisition process for high-rise projects should be completed : R & R Commissioner Sivakumar Naidu

Since it has been many years since the Netteempadu upliftment scheme started, they want to give first priority to it in terms of land acquisition.



District Collector Rizwan Basha Sheikh said that if there are any objections from the farmers regarding the acquisition of land required for the uplifting schemes in the district, they should be explained and convinced about the government's requirements and the necessity of the projects. Officials of Revenue, Survey and Irrigation Departments have been formed into special teams and ordered to speed up the process of land acquisition.

sale of adulterated and sub-standard seeds.

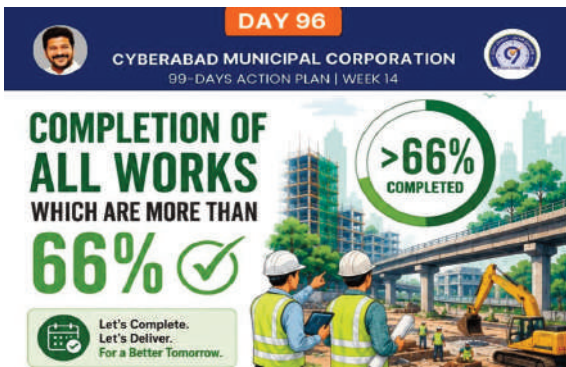

The confrontation began when forest officials visited the Karjelli Beat area to undertake a plantation drive. Podu farmers opposed the activity, leading to heated arguments and a scuffle between the two sides. The situation briefly resembled a conflict zone as tensions escalated.

During the protest, several farmers lay down in front of Forest Department vehicles to prevent their movement. To bring the situation under control, officials, with the assistance of local police, detained some farmers and shifted them to the Kagaznagar Forest Division office. In view of the tense atmosphere,



a large number of police personnel and forest staff were deployed in the village.

Farmers Allege Assault by Forest Officials

Podu farmers alleged that forest officials assaulted them indiscriminately without considering the presence of women and elderly people.



They claimed that officials forcibly pushed them into vehicles and attempted to shift them to Kagaznagar. The farmers stated that their families had been cultivating these lands for generations and depended on them for their livelihood. They expressed concern over losing

their agricultural land and vowed to continue their agitation until the government delivers justice.

We Did Not Attack Anyone" – Kagaznagar FDO Appaiah

Kagaznagar Forest Divisional Officer (FDO) Appaiah denied allegations of assault by forest staff. He stated that

nearly 31 percent of forest land in the Karjelli Range of Chintalmanepalli mandal has been encroached upon. According to him, around 1,600 acres in the Dinda area are under encroachment, and the department has temporarily allowed local farmers to cultivate about 800 acres.

He further said that each family was permitted to cultivate up to four acres under Podu cultivation, yet some farmers continued to protest. Forest officials had gone to plant saplings as part of afforestation efforts, but the farmers obstructed them. Despite attempts to convince the protesters, they refused to cooperate. As a result, a few farmers were taken into custody and shifted to the Kagaznagar Range Office. Appaiah clarified that they would be counseled and later sent back home.

and the boycott of foreign goods. She was imprisoned during the Salt Satyagraha.

She established the Kasturba Industrial School for the advancement of women. Sri Gopala Reddy honored her with the title 'Shrama Sri'. She campaigned for the abolition of the Zamindari system. She was the first woman Vice-President of the All India Congress and the first woman President of the Nellore District Congress Committee.

Proficient in Hindi and English, she was also gifted in writing sto-

ries and poems, as well as in sketching. She passed away on September 15, 1963. She dedicated her entire wealth to the cause of education and the eradication of untouchability. She was a noble woman who worked tirelessly for the cause of education and the eradication of discrimination. Mrs. Annie Besant even created and sent a representation of an undivided India, reflecting her vision for the nation. It is our good fortune that such a great patriot was born in our district. Nepali Domestic Workers Held in Major Villa Theft; Stolen Gold and Silver Recovered Intact

Cyberabad : In a major breakthrough, the Cyberabad Police successfully cracked a high-value theft case reported from Hill Ridge Villas in Gachibowli and arrested three accused persons, including a Nepali couple, while recovering the entire stolen property.

According to Ch. Srinivas, IPS, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Serilingampally Zone, the theft took place on June 6 when a Nepali couple employed as domestic workers allegedly committed the crime in the absence of the villa's occupants. The elderly residents returned home on June 7 and initially noticed that a gold chain adorning a small idol was missing. A complaint was lodged with the police, and a case was registered.

The case took a dramatic turn on June 8 when the couple's son returned home and opened a locker using a key available with him. Upon inspection, it was discovered that gold ornaments weigh-



ing approximately 7 to 8 kilograms and silver ornaments weighing around 1.5 kilograms were missing.

Acting swiftly, Cyberabad Commissioner of Police mobilized Special Operations Teams (SOT), crime teams, and local police personnel to investigate the case. Based on available clues and technical evidence, police tracked the movement of the suspects and formed six special teams, which were dispatched to Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Uttarakhand. Details and photographs of the accused were also shared with police authorities in the respective states for assistance.



A special team constituted under the supervision of the Hyderabad City Police Commissioner to monitor and apprehend Nepali criminal gangs also extended support to the investigation. On June 9, a team led by Gachibowli Detective Inspector Naresh, with active assistance from local police in Uttar Pradesh, apprehended three accused persons at Udampur village in Rampur district. The arrested individuals were identified as Kamal Shahi, his wife Vimal Shahi, and another woman, Kalpana.

Police recovered the entire stolen property intact

from the accused. During interrogation, the trio reportedly confessed that they had accessed the locker using a key kept beside it, removed the valuables, relocked the locker, and fled with the key. The accused are being produced before a local court in Uttar Pradesh and will be brought to Hyderabad on a transit warrant for further investigation.

Cyberabad Police have advised citizens to exercise caution while employing domestic helpers and urged residents to utilize local police verification services to check the antecedents of domestic workers before hiring them.

What kind of response do victims receive when they visit a police station? In this context, the surprise inspection of the Devarakonda CI office by Nalgonda District SP Sharath Chandra Pawar, IPS, and his meticulous scrutiny of case records is not just a routine administrative drill. It is a decisive step toward making grassroots policing more accountable and responsive.

The Challenge of Pending Cases & Quality Investigation

When a crime occurs, the victim seeks immediate justice. However, when cases are dragged out or left pending due to technical delays, staff shortages, or sheer investigative laxity, public faith in the system begins to erode. It is highly commendable that SP Sharath Chandra Pawar chose to focus heavily on "grave cases" (heinous crimes) and long-pending files. In offenses like murder, dacoity, and crimes against women and children, any delay in investigation carries the severe risk of tampering with or weakening crucial evidence.

The SP's explicit directive to gather robust, scientific, and technical evidence to ensure high conviction rates in court is the need of the hour. Public trust in police and fear of the law are established only when investigations are



high-quality and criminals are swiftly brought to justice.

Technology and Digital Policing

In today's digital era, criminals are increasingly adopting sophisticated, high-tech methods, with cyber-crime posing a relentless, daily challenge to law enforcement. To counter this, the police force must remain a step ahead by embracing

modern technology. The District SP's detailed review of the Crime and Criminal Tracking Network & Systems (CCTNS) implementation and digital record management is a timely and necessary intervention. Furthermore, streamlining court disposal follow-ups and the execution of pending warrants is critical to accelerating the entire judicial pipeline.

Zero Tolerance for Laxity in Law & Order

The SP's stern warning that "no negligence will be tolerated in maintaining law and order" sends a powerful message that will undoubtedly instill a greater sense of responsibility among field-level officers. A police station should not merely be a center for interrogating offenders; it must serve as a sanctuary of relief for victims. The concept of "friendly policing" truly achieves its

purpose only when officers remain accessible to the public and resolve their grievances with empathy and speed.

Conclusion

When top brass step out of their administrative headquarters to conduct proactive, surprise field inspections, it naturally infuses energy and alertness into the lower rungs of the department. This recent review at the Devarakonda CI office should serve as a benchmark for improving the efficiency of the entire policing apparatus across Nalgonda district. An ideal police system is one where transparency in enforcing the law, speed in investigation, and a humane approach to public relations are seamlessly integrated.

Husband and wife sentenced to one year in jail in cheque bounce case

The entire loan of Rs 60 lakhs should be paid back to the complainants
Mancherla Second Additional Judge K. Nirosha's verdict

Mancherla : Mancherla Second Additional First Class Judge K. Nirosha today sentenced a husband and wife who gave bad cheques to the lenders in the process of repaying the loan and ordered them to repay the loan of Rs 60 lakhs.

Tatipally Manjula of Gautami Nagar in Mancherla town had given a loan of Rs 38 lakhs in 2016 to Lalitha of Rachapudi, who lived opposite her house. When she asked Manjula to repay the loan, she gave a check to Manjula, but the check bounced, so Manjula approached the court with her lawyer.

After hearing the arguments of the lawyer on their behalf, they requested that the husband and wife be punished. After hearing the arguments of both the parties, Judge K Nirosha ruled that the husband and wife should be imprisoned for a year and the amount taken should be returned.

In another case, Manjula approached the court. If Rachapudi Lakshminarayana did not repay the amount borrowed from Manjula, the superintendent at Adilabad RIMS Hospital, for his needs, he would also be imprisoned for a year and Lakshminarayana would have to pay the amount.

Second Additional Court First Class Judge K Nirosha ruled that he should also be imprisoned for a year and take the amount. Senior advocate Siripuram Rajesh and advocate Sri-ram argued on behalf of the complainant.

According to initial assessments By, the investigating agency, the total value of the accumulated properties, undeclared wealth is estimated to be around two hundred crore rupees. During the thorough searches conducted at the residence of the senior engineer, the anti-graft sleuths seized unaccounted liquid cash amounting to sixty lakh rupees along with a, substantial haul of two and a half kilograms of gold ornaments. Apart from the cash gold recovery, officials discovered an extensive trail of high-value immovable assets registered under various names. The uncovered properties include multiple residential plots, apartments scattered across, prime locations in Hyderabad. a highly expensive luxury villa, an expansive farmhouse on the city outskirts, vast tracts of agricultural land situated in the Nizamabad district. The enforcement agency is currently verifying all recovered property registration documents, Bank locker keys to finalize the exact valuation of the illegal assets as, part of the ongoing legal proceedings

Monitoring to Ensure Availability of Urea Stocks at Every Point

- Distribution Planned via Booking App to Avoid Hardships to Farmers
- Nizamabad District Collector Ila Tripathi Conducts Inspections of Fertilizer Godowns, Sales Centers

Nizamabad Bureau, June 09 : District Collector Ila Tripathi announced that strategic monitoring, is underway to ensure consistent urea stocks across, all co-operative society godowns, sales centers in the district. Assuring farmers that sufficient fertilizer reserves are available for the monsoon season, she urged them not to panic. On Tuesday, the Collector inspected fertilizer warehouses, retail hubs in Janakampet, Yedapally villages of Yedapally mandal. During her visit, she verified physical stocks against registry records, evaluating recent arrivals, distribution figures, expected shipments. Collector Ila Tripathi personally reviewed the operation of the Urea Booking App, explaining its benefits to local farmers. She noted that other states are now adopting this successful model implemented in Telangana, recalling its, seamless execution during the previous Rabi season. Emphasizing that the application prevents diversion and ensures transparent, planned distribution, she counselled farmers against believing rumors. Additionally, she raised awareness about, the benefits of Nano Urea, advising farmers to test it experimentally to observe the results themselves. However, she issued a strict warning to dealers against, forcing farmers to buy Nano Urea or linking it with other products, stating that coercive tactics would result in severe penalties, the cancellation of dealership licenses.



Currently, over 27,000 metric tons of urea are available to meet the immediate needs of the district's farmers, with stocks being dispatched systematically to, prevent any, localized shortages. To assist farmers residing under the jurisdiction of certain defaulting cooperative societies, the Collector highlighted that, fertilizer distribution, is being facilitated through the DCMS to keep stocks accessible locally. She explained that distribution has already commenced in the Bodhan, Banswada constituencies, where sowing begins earlier, measures have been finalized to ensure seamless supply across the Nizamabad, Armoor, Balkonda constituencies as, well. She also advised farmers to avoid the excessive use of fertilizers, pesticides, urging them to strictly follow the guidelines of agricultural officers, scientists. YAKOOB PASHA SEEKS EXTENSION OF BALAKRISHNAN COMMISSION

Balakrishnan Commission by one more year to ensure a comprehensive study on granting Scheduled Caste (SC) status to Dalit Muslims and Dalit Christians. In a statement issued on Tuesday, he said the Commission's mandate is ending before it could complete an extensive nationwide assessment. Yaqub Pasha noted that the Commission, constituted by the Central Government in 2022 following Supreme Court directions, was entrusted with examining the socio-economic conditions of Dalit Muslims and Dalit Christians. However, he pointed out that the panel has so far visited only a few states and is yet to conduct a study tour in Telangana. He expressed concern that representations are currently being accepted only through the Commission's Delhi office, limiting wider public participation. Emphasizing the need for a detailed and inclusive report, Yaqub Pasha said that extending SC status to Dalit Muslims and Dalit Christians would create better opportunities in education, employment and social welfare. He appealed to the Central Government to grant an extension to the Commission, enabling it to undertake extensive field visits and consultations before submitting its final recommendations.

Can Youth Change the Nation? Sarthak Sidhant's Story Suggests They Can

Vijayawada : In an era often defined by social media trends, viral videos and endless scrolling, a 17-year-old student from Jharkhand has emerged as an unlikely symbol of civic vigilance, sparking a national conversation on transparency, accountability and the power of questioning.

Sarthak Sidhant, a teenager with no official authority, investigative background or political influence, has drawn attention for his examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education's (CBSE) digital evaluation tender process. His observations and findings, compiled through publicly available documents, have raised questions about changes made to eligibility criteria and tender conditions in the On-Screen Marking (OSM) system procurement process.

Using open-source information, tender documents, amendments and corporate records, Sarthak reportedly spent months analysing data and identifying patterns that, in his view, warranted public scrutiny. He later published his findings online and presented his concerns before a Parliamentary Standing Committee.

Whether the allegations ultimately withstand official scrutiny remains a matter for competent authorities and investigative agencies. CBSE has maintained that its tendering process was conducted transparently and in accordance with established procedures.

However, beyond the data is abundant, careful examination of that information remains relatively rare.

"Sarthak's case demonstrates how curiosity, critical thinking and digital literacy can empower young citizens," said education analysts following the developments. "It is a reminder that accountability does not depend solely on institutions; it also depends on vigilant individuals willing to ask questions."

The episode has also challenged common stereotypes about today's youth. Often criticised for excessive screen time and online distractions, young people are increasingly using technology for research, civic participation and public-interest initiatives.

Experts point out that tools once available only to large organisations—data analysis

platforms, artificial intelligence applications and digital research resources—are now accessible to students with little more than a laptop and an internet connection. The significance of the episode lies not merely in the allegations raised but in the democratic values it represents. Questioning authority, examining public decisions and demanding transparency are essential elements of a healthy democracy.

Political commentators argue that whistleblowers and citizen researchers serve as an important check within democratic systems. Their role is not necessarily to establish guilt or wrongdoing but to draw attention to issues that deserve examination.

For many, Sarthak Sid-

hant's journey represents more than the efforts of a single student. It reflects the emergence of a generation that is increasingly willing to engage with governance, analyse public information and participate in national conversations.

As India continues its digital transformation, the story offers a powerful lesson: meaningful change does not always begin in government offices, boardrooms or television studios. Sometimes it begins with a young mind asking a simple but important question.

If youth channel their energy towards inquiry, research and responsible civic engagement, they may well become one of the strongest forces shaping the nation's future.

State burdened with Rs. 8 lakh crore debt in the last ten years

BJP and BRS are working together -Deputy Chief Minister criticizes opposition

Station Ghanpur : Deputy Chief Minister, Finance Minister, and Energy Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka alleged that the Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) have joined hands to target the welfare-oriented government. He attended as the chief guest at the inauguration and foundation-laying ceremony of electricity substations and related projects worth ₹60.62 crore in Pallagutta village of Chilpur Mandal, Jangaon district, on Tuesday. The event was presided over by local MLA Kadiyam Srihari.

Addressing the gathering, Bhatti Vikramarka said that the BJP-led Central Government and the opposition BRS in Telangana were deceiving farmers and the public. He criticized the opposition for spreading false propaganda because they could not tolerate the Congress government's record-breaking paddy procurement and welfare schemes. He stated that BRS and BJP leaders had no moral right to speak about farmers' welfare.

Bhatti Vikramarka accused the BRS government of exploiting the state's wealth and resources during its ten-year rule. He said, "Telangana, which was once a prosperous state, was pushed into debts amounting to ₹8 lakh crore. Due to this burden, our Congress government is now compelled to pay ₹76,000 crore annually towards loan repayments and interest. Had these debts not existed, we could have used these funds for public welfare and transformed the state's future."

He alleged that public money was diverted for the benefit of previous rulers, resulting in the failure to provide fine rice and Indiramma houses to the poor over the past decade. He also criticized the BRS leaders for claiming credit for providing free electricity while failing to pay power distribution companies (DISCOMs) on time, pushing them into financial distress.

Because of your mistakes, DISCOMs struggled financially and could not provide quality power. However, after our government came to power, we are directly paying ₹19,000 crore annually to DISCOMs through the Finance Department, including ₹14,000 crore towards free power for farmers and ₹5,000 crore under the Gruha Jyothi scheme for free household electricity. Despite this, BRS continues to spread misinformation," he said.

The Deputy Chief Minister praised Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's cabinet for working 18 hours a day for public welfare. He criticized former minister Harish Rao, accusing him of creating false narratives merely to remain in the news after losing power.

Bhatti Vikramarka also strongly criticized the BJP-led Central Government, alleging that it intended to leave farmers at the mercy of corporate interests. He questioned why the Food Corporation of India (FCI) was not procuring paddy despite the Centre announcing a Minimum Support Price (MSP).

During previous Congress governments, FCI procured grain directly. Why has that system been weakened



now?" he asked.

He assured that regardless of the Centre's actions, the Telangana Congress government would procure every grain produced by farmers. He noted that Telangana was among the few states purchasing maize from farmers at MSP.

He stated that the state government was spending thousands of crores to procure a record 72.30 lakh metric tonnes of paddy during the

Rabi season. He termed the claims of BJP and BRS leaders about supporting farmers as ironic and reminded that the Congress government had even purchased rain-damaged paddy at MSP.

Bhatti Vikramarka highlighted that the Congress government had waived ₹22,000 crore in farm loans in a single phase and challenged opposition parties to persuade the Centre to procure farmers' produce instead of criticizing

the state government.

Criticizing the previous government's Double Bedroom Housing Scheme, he said that the Congress government had sanctioned 4.5 lakh Indiramma houses across the state in the first phase at a cost of ₹22,500 crore, providing ₹5 lakh assistance per house. He announced that an additional 2,000 Indiramma houses would be allocated to each constituency this year. He re-

iterated the government's commitment to ensuring that no poor family remains homeless in Telangana.

Support for Women's Empowerment

Bhatti Vikramarka stated that the government had facilitated ₹67,000 crore in bank linkage loans to women's self-help groups within two and a half years and aimed to increase this amount to ₹1.25 lakh crore over the next five years. He explained that women's groups were being encouraged to purchase buses, which would then operate under RTC, providing them with a stable source of income.

Responding positively to various development requests made by MLA Kadiyam Srihari, the Deputy Chief Minister assured that a feasibility study would be conducted immediately for upgrading the 220 KV substation at Palem in Raghunathpally.

He also promised special funds for line shifting works to relocate hazardous electricity lines passing over village houses.

He emphasized that the Congress government was strictly implementing the SC/ST Sub-Plan Act, which had been neglected in the past, and assured that substantial sub-plan funds would be allocated to the constituency.

MP Kadiyam Kavaya's Remarks

Warangal MP Kadiyam Kavaya said that the government had prioritized the welfare of the poor by implementing free electricity schemes immediately after coming to power. She de-

scribed the 200 units of free electricity under the Gruha Jyothi scheme as a historic decision. She added that the government's substantial funding was transforming Station Ghanpur constituency into a model constituency in the state.

MLA Kadiyam Srihari's Remarks

MLA Kadiyam Srihari said that the newly inaugurated power substations would play a vital role in the constituency's development. He noted that the region, once known for migration, had witnessed agricultural growth due to the Devadula Project and free electricity.

He praised the government's efforts to procure every grain produced by farmers and requested the Deputy Chief Minister to upgrade the 132 KV Raghunathpally Substation, allocate funds for line-shifting works, and sanction SC/ST Sub-Plan funds.

The event was attended by Jangaon District Collector Sandeep Kumar Jha, TGN-PDCL CMD Karnati Varun Reddy, TRANSCO CMD D. Krishna Bhaskar, Telangana Oilfield Corporation Chairman Janga Raghava Reddy, Telangana Haj Committee Chairman Kusu Pasha, MLAs Nayani Rajender Reddy, Revuri Prakash Reddy, K.R. Nagaraju, Gandra Satya narayana Rao, Mamidala Yashaswini Reddy, several district officials, public representatives, sarpanches, and a large number of people.

Subsequently, the Deputy Chief Minister inaugurated a Rythu Seva Kendram (Farmer Service Centre) allotted to women's self-help groups under the Indira Mahila Shakti Scheme.
