



Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy Inspects Rs, 1,648-Crore Mahatma Gandhi Muktyala Branch Canal Lift Irrigation Project

(Capital Information)
Suryapet : State Minister for Irrigation and Food & Civil Supplies, N. Uttam Kumar Reddy, inspected the works of the Mahatma Gandhi Muktyala Branch Canal Lift Irrigation Project on Wednesday at Old Vellatur village in Chinthalapalem Mandal.

The project, being constructed at a cost of ₹1,648 crore, is designed to provide irrigation water to 53,000 acres.

During the visit, the Minister first inspected the underground pump house works and later addressed a meeting.

Speaking on the occasion, the Minister stated that the Mahatma Gandhi Muktyala Branch Canal Lift Irrigation Project, being developed on the Krishna River, will pump water using four 16-megawatt motors.

The project will provide irrigation facilities to: 20,466 acres in 9 villages of Mattampally Mandal, 15,829 acres in 5 villages of Mellacheruvu Mandal, and 16,705 acres in 9 villages of Chinthalapalem Mandal, covering a total of 53,000 acres.

He said that the project would benefit 19,295 families, including: 5,080 Scheduled Tribe (ST) families, 3,540 Scheduled Caste (SC) families, 8,470 Backward Class (BC) families, and 2,205 Other Category (OC) families.

For the project, 191 acres of agricultural land were acquired, and compensation amounting to ₹56 crore was paid to the affected farmers.

The Minister instructed the contractors to complete the project by November.

Among those present were State Perika Corporation Chairman Dongari Venkateswarlu, Municipal Chairman Donthagani Srinivas Goud, DCC District President Gudipati Narasayya, irrigation officials, and local public representatives.

CM Revanth Reddy blames previous regime for Hyderabad flooding, traffic snarls

Hyderabad : A day after facing severe criticism over flooding of many streets and massive traffic jams following a short spell of rain in the city, Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy resorted to his favourite theme, that of holding the previous government responsible for hardships faced by the people.

Interestingly, even after two-and-a-half years of the Congress government's rule and holding the Municipal Administration and Urban Development portfolio, he admitted that a spell lasting just two hours had left the streets flooded and disrupted traffic. For travelling one km, it took people two to four hours, he said.

The Chief Minister was speaking after inaugurating the Future City Development Authority (FCDA) office here on Wednesday. He said branding Hyderabad as a global city was



not enough. Infrastructure and civic amenities must match international standards, he stated.

Tall claims were made about robust development in the last 10 years and an acre was sold for Rs. 100 crore. They should explain the reasons for traffic jams and who was responsible for flooding of streets, he asked.

Revanth Reddy alleged

that large-scale encroachments of lakes, nalas (drains) and public parks, along with permissions for unauthorised constructions, had disrupted the city's natural drainage system.

According to him, rainwater flowed into roads and residential colonies instead of draining into water channels and rivers because of these encroachments. (Cont. on Pg 2)

Despite criticism, Pawan Kalyan defends Telangana 'Jagir' remarks

Hyderabad : Despite the controversy surrounding his recent remarks, Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan defended his comments that Telangana was not anyone's "jagir" and asserted that no one can prevent him from entering the State.

Speaking in a podcast with ANI, the Jana Sena Party (JSP) chief said his remarks were a response to repeated questions about his political role in Telangana.

"Some leaders and fringe elements in Telangana have continuously questioned (me). They kept saying I cannot step into Hyderabad, let alone contest elections there. In my own country, nobody has the right to tell me whether I can enter a State or not. That is why I said this is not your jagir," Pawan Kalyan said.



Responding to JSP's expansion into Telangana was linked to a succession battle with Andhra Pradesh IT Minister Nara Lokesh, Pawan Kalyan dismissed such speculation. He said there was no succession issue in Andhra Pradesh and maintained that he was not aspiring for any position.

On concerns among Chief Ministers in different States about his entry into their political landscape, Pawan Kalyan said they were wary of his ability to influence voters.

"In 2014, I campaigned in Chikkaballapur for the BJP and influenced voters there. The region has a sizeable Telugu-speaking population, and Bengaluru also has a large Telugu community," he stressed.

On the criticism that he was advancing the BJP's agenda, Pawan Kalyan said his views were shaped by nationalism.

"I grew up with the idea of nationalism. If that is the case, then I must say Rahul Gandhi does not belong to southern India despite leading a national party," he remarked.

Commenting on Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy's allegations that the Union government was discriminating against southern States, Pawan Kalyan said such arguments were not beneficial for the country.

"If ordinary people make such comments without understanding the seriousness of the issue, it is understandable. But when a Chief Minister raises it, the argument must be addressed and countered. You can reframe your argument differently but not in the context of North and South," he added.

Just as one approaches a marriage proposal for their own child with great scrutiny, real estate transactions should be handled with equal diligence and transparency," he advised. He further added that to survive in the market, one must prioritize transparency, quality, and accountability.

HYDRAA is Not Responsible



for Real Estate Slowdown

Clarifying concerns regarding the current market climate, the Commissioner stated that HYDRAA is not responsible for the recent slowdown in the real estate sector. He noted that the sector is influenced by broader global and national economic conditions, job stability, and salary trends. He urged stakeholders to recognize that this cooling effect is not isolated to Hyderabad but is a trend seen in other major cities across the country as well.

Change is Necessary for Progress

Highlighting the state government's vision, Commissioner Ranganath explained that HYDRAA was established to transform Hyderabad into a cleaner, more sustainable, and eco-friendly city. "To bring about change, some initial difficulties are inevitable, but these changes are essential for the greater good of society," he remarked.

He shared that the initiatives undertaken by HYDRAA have gained international attention, with representatives from various countries and cities expressing interest in the agency's model during the recent BRICS summit in Odisha. Experts there concluded that such systems are vital for maintaining environmental balance and mitigating natural disasters.

Protecting Public Assets
Detailing HYDRAA's impact, the Commissioner highlighted the agency's scientific approach to identifying and restoring water bodies. He cited the recent heavy rains, noting that the restored Bathukamma Kunta in Amberpet successfully managed floodwaters that would have otherwise inundated nearby slums and colonies.

Commissioner Ranganath revealed that in the 23 months since its inception, HYDRAA has successfully protected government lands worth approximately ₹1.10 lakh crore. He added that the agency is currently working to protect another ₹1 lakh crore worth of public assets this year.

"The public has realized the true benefits of HYDRAA, and our actions have been carried out without causing harm to the poor," he asserted.

Centre Approves Campuses of Three Leading Foreign Universities in India

New Delhi : In a significant step towards the internationalisation of higher education under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Wednesday handed over Letters of Approval (LoAs) to three globally renowned universities for establishing campuses in India.

The approved institutions are the University of York and the University of Bristol from the United Kingdom, and the University of New South Wales (UNSW) from Australia. While the University of York and the University of Bristol will establish campuses in Mumbai, UNSW will set up its campus in Bengaluru.

The Letters of Approval were formally presented by Vineet Joshi, Secretary, Department of Higher Education and Chairman of the University Grants Commission (UGC), in the presence of the Union Minister. Senior representatives of the universities and officials from the British and Australian High Commissions attended the event.

Addressing the gathering, Dharmendra Pradhan described the development as a milestone in India's efforts to attract leading global educational institutions and strengthen international academic collaboration.



democratic collaboration.

He said the entry of world-class universities into India would create new opportunities for students, researchers and innovators while promoting excellence in teaching, research and interdisciplinary learning.

"These partnerships will help nurture the next generation of scholars, researchers and innovators and strengthen collaboration between Indian academia, industry and globally reputed institutions," the Minister said.

According to the Ministry of Education, the campuses will offer internationally benchmarked academic programmes while maintaining fee structures broadly comparable to those of leading private universities in India.

The initiative aligns with the vision of NEP 2020, which seeks to promote "internationalisation at home" by enabling Indian students

to access world-class education within the country. It is also expected to boost research collaboration, faculty exchange and knowledge-sharing between Indian and international institutions.

Officials noted that Mumbai and Bengaluru were selected due to their status as major centres of business, technology, innovation and higher learning.

The Ministry of Education welcomed the universities to India's expanding higher education ecosystem and expressed confidence that the collaborations would contribute to the country's emergence as a global hub for education, research and innovation.

More approvals for reputed international universities are expected in the coming months as India continues its efforts to attract global academic institutions under the NEP framework.

Government Aims to Make Women Millionaires: Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy

Madugulapally : State Roads, Buildings and Cinematography Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy said that the Telangana Government is committed to empowering women economically and aims to transform them into millionaires through various welfare and development initiatives.

On Wednesday, the minister inspected the construction works of the Mandal Complex buildings at Madugulapally mandal headquarters in Nalgonda district. He instructed officials to ensure quality standards in construction and complete the works at the earliest. Later, he inaugurated a Gram Panchayat building constructed at a cost of ₹20 lakh and a Village Federation building built with ₹10 lakh in Cheruvupalli village.

Addressing the gathering, the minister said that several development works, including roads and Indiramma housing, have been sanctioned for Madugulapally mandal. He



stated that a double-lane road project worth ₹6 crore has been approved and power substations have been sanctioned for Ellammagudem and Dacharam villages. He emphasized that Indiramma houses are being allotted to eligible beneficiaries irrespective of political affiliations.

Despite financial challenges, the state government is implementing welfare schemes for all sections of society, including free electricity and Rythu Bharosa, he said. He added that double-

road projects from Madugulapally to Marriguda and a ₹60-crore double-road project at Konetipuram are being undertaken.

The minister further stated that road infrastructure works worth ₹20,000 crore are being executed across the state under the HAM model, while another ₹7,000 crore is being spent through the Panchayat Raj Department to provide road connectivity to all habitations. These projects will help reduce road ac-

cidents and attract industries, creating employment opportunities for youth, he said.

Highlighting the government's focus on education, he noted that around 3.5 lakh intermediate students are being provided breakfast and lunch under a unique scheme implemented by the Telangana Government. He also announced efforts to upgrade junior colleges in Kanagal and Tipparthi with model infrastructure and improve health-care facilities in the region.

During the inauguration of the Cheruvupalli Gram Panchayat building, the minister urged women to join Self-Help Groups (SHGs). He said the government is taking steps to establish rice mills through women's groups in every mandal, provide interest-free loans, and support women-led enterprises. As part of these initiatives, one bus has been allotted to women's groups in each mandal to enhance their economic activities.

He also announced the sanction of 50 Indiramma houses for Cheruvupalli village and assured that an additional 50 houses would be provided if required.

"A few influential people occupied lands in Gandipet and Himayathsagar and efforts are being made to clear such encroachments," he asserted.

The Chief Minister defended the demolition of unauthorised structures, saying the government was acting to prevent long-term damage to the city's environment and infrastructure. "Did I or any cabinet Ministers offer an inch of land to anyone? We are rejuvenating rivers and boosting lake economy by permitting vegetable, milk and other stalls at the lakes," Revanth Reddy said.

Responding to criticism over the Bharat Future City project, he said major de-

velopment initiatives had faced opposition in the past as well. He recalled that projects such as HITEC City, the Outer Ring Road and Rajiv Gandhi International Airport were initially ridiculed and opposed.

"Had earlier governments abandoned those projects because of criticism, would today's youth have received these employment opportunities?" he asked.

The Chief Minister said Bharat Future City was being developed with future generations in mind. But, a few demons were asserting in the United States that they would obstruct the Future City after coming to power, the Chief Minister stressed.

"Such people will be thrashed by the people and they will lose even the opposition status," Revanth Reddy said.

Collector and SP Lead 'Arrive Alive' Road Safety Awareness Rally in Suryapet - Call for Collective Action to Prevent Road Accident Deaths

He urged motorists to follow traffic rules, practice defensive driving, carry valid

documents, and wear helmets and seat belts. He noted that statistics show many deaths occur because riders and drivers fail to use helmets and seat belts.

During the programme, helmets were distributed to ASHA workers, a road safety pledge was administered, and the police cultural team spread awareness through songs. Several police, transport, fire, and road safety officials participated in the event.

DYFI Demands Closure of Unrecognised Private Schools, Submits Memorandum to DEO

Hyderabad : The Democratic Youth Federation of India (DYFI) Hyderabad City Committee on Wednesday submitted a memorandum to the Hyderabad District Education Officer (DEO), demanding immediate action against unrecognised private schools operating in the district.

A delegation led by Hyderabad City Secretary Javed met District Education Officer Yadav and urged the Education Department to identify and shut down all schools functioning without official recognition.

In its representation, the organisation alleged that the unchecked growth of private schools had led to the commercialization of education and placed an undue financial burden on parents. DYFI leaders described the operation of unrecognised institutions as a serious concern and called for strict enforcement of government regulations governing school recognition.

The memorandum sought immediate closure of unrecognised schools, effective implementation of existing norms and measures to ensure quality, affordable and regulated education for all children.

Speaking on the occasion, DYFI leaders alleged that several private schools were functioning without ad-

equated infrastructure, qualified teaching staff and adherence to prescribed safety standards. They claimed that such institutions were operating primarily for profit and adversely affecting the quality of education available to students.

The organisation also expressed concern that the proliferation of unregulated educational institutions was widening inequalities in access to quality education.

The delegation included district leaders Rajayya, Devender, Anvesh, Ravi, and other activists.

DYFI leaders warned that if the Education Department failed to take prompt action against unrecognised schools, the organisation would intensify its campaign through protests and public awareness programmes aimed at safeguarding the interests of students and parents.

COLLECTOR CALLS FOR 100% ELIGIBLE VOTER COVERAGE

The events were conducted under the leadership of the BJP Mahila Morcha and attended by BJP State Official Spokesperson and Serilingampally Assembly In-charge Ravikumar Yadav, along with party leaders, office-bearers and workers.

Speaking on the occasion, Ravikumar Yadav said that the last 12 years of Prime Minister Modi's leadership have been guided by the principles of trust, development and public welfare, with the vision of building a "Viksit Bharat" (Developed India). He stated that over 4,399



days and 1,05,576 hours of governance, India has witnessed significant progress across various sectors and has emerged as the world's fourth-largest economy.

Highlighting key achievements of the Central Government, he said that under the PM-KISAN scheme, more than ₹4.3 lakh crore has been directly transferred to the bank accounts of over 11 crore farmers. He noted substantial growth in agricultural and dairy production, while

emphasizing the government's commitment to rural development and infrastructure expansion.

Yadav also pointed to India's global leadership during the COVID-19 pandemic, including the supply of vaccines to 99 countries, and the successful hosting of the G20 Summit. He said the country attracted more than ₹70 lakh crore in foreign investments over the past 12 years and strengthened national security through decisive actions such

as the surgical and air strikes.

He further highlighted flagship initiatives including Swachh Bharat, Fit India, Vocal for Local, and Atmanirbhar Bharat, which he said have promoted cleanliness, health awareness and self-reliance. He noted that over 4 lakh kilometres of rural roads have been constructed, while the national highway network has expanded from 91,000 kilometres to 1.46 lakh kilometres, with road construction pro-

gressing at an average pace of 34 kilometres per day.

Referring to major infrastructure projects, Yadav cited the Chenab Bridge, Atal Tunnel, and Pamban Bridge, along with the introduction of more than 164 Vande Bharat trains and the increase in the number of airports from 74 to 164. He also highlighted the growth of India's startup ecosystem, which now includes over 2.06 lakh startups and 120 unicorns.

Clear All Pending Compensation for Udandapur Reservoir Displaced Families Within Two Months: R&R Commissioner K. Shivakumar Naidu

High-Level Review Held on Land Acquisition and Rehabilitation Works of PRRLI, Koilsagar, MGKLIS and Rajiv Bheema Projects

MAHABUBNAGAR : Commissioner for Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement (R&R), K. Shivakumar Naidu, directed officials to resolve all issues of the families displaced by the Udandapur Reservoir being constructed under the Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Scheme (PRRLI) and ensure that all pending compensation packages are paid within the next two months. He chaired a high-level review meeting on land acquisition and rehabilitation works related to the Udandapur Reservoir, Koilsagar Project, Mahatma Gandhi Kalwakurthy Lift Irrigation Scheme (MGKLIS), and Rajiv Bheema Project at the District Collectorate Video Conference Hall on Wednesday. Officials from the Revenue, Irrigation, Land Survey, Electricity, Roads & Buildings (R&B), and Mission Bhagiratha departments attended the meeting.

During the review, the Commissioner examined the progress of the Udandapur Reservoir and the land acquisition process for the proposed Lakshmidhevipalli Reservoir connecting tunnel. Revenue officials informed the Commissioner that the project would submerge Udandapur and Vallur villages, along with six habitations, along with Regadipatti, Chinnagutta, Thummalakunta, Shyamagadda, Ontigudise, and Polepalli.

The Administrative Project Officer of R&R stated that compensation amounts had already been credited to the bank accounts of 1,890 displaced persons, while awards

for the remaining eligible beneficiaries were being finalized and compensation would be released shortly.

Officials also informed the meeting that development works were progressing in the 280-acre rehabilitation layout earmarked for Udandapur project-affected families. Responding to this, the Commissioner instructed officials to expedite the completion of roads, drainage systems, electricity infrastructure, and other essential amenities in the rehabilitation colony and hand over plots to the displaced families at the earliest.

Addressing boundary disputes in certain rehabilitation areas, the Commissioner directed the Jadcherla Tahsildar and Assistant Director of Land Survey to conduct field inspections and resolve the issues without delay.



He further stated that the government would release ₹3 crore within a week for the construction of an electricity substation and instructed power department officials to accelerate the erection of electric poles. He also directed officials to complete Mission Bhagiratha pipelines, overhead water tanks, Anganwadi centres, schools, community halls, and temple construction works in the rehabilitation colony on priority.

Koilsagar Project Review

Reviewing land acquisition issues related to the Koilsagar Project, Commissioner Shivakumar Naidu sought detailed information from officials and directed Special Deputy Col-

lector Ram Reddy to submit a comprehensive report within one week.

MGKLIS Land Acquisition

Officials informed the Commissioner that out of the 105 acres required for the Mahatma Gandhi Kalwakurthy Lift Irrigation Scheme (MGKLIS), 90.5 acres had already been acquired, while acquisition of the remaining 13.5 acres was still pending. The Commissioner instructed Irrigation Department officials to complete the land acquisition process at the earliest.

Rajiv Bheema Project

Officials reported that less than one acre of land remained to be acquired for the Rajiv Bheema Project and that there were no major pending issues. The Commissioner also directed officials to expedite the resolution of court cases related to land ac-

quisition under the PRRLI project in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition Act. Emphasizing the State Government's commitment to completing all irrigation projects in Mahabubnagar district on priority, he instructed officials to ensure timely rehabilitation of all displaced families and complete land acquisition for all projects within the stipulated timeframe.

ACB Books R&B Engineer-in-Chief in Disproportionate Assets Case; Assets Worth ₹17.94 Crore Unearthed

Hyderabad :The Telangana Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) has registered a disproportionate assets case against Mohan Naik Jarupla, Engineer-in-Chief (State Roads), Roads and Buildings Department, alleging that he amassed assets far beyond his known sources of income through corrupt practices during his service.

According to the ACB, the case was registered under provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988, as amended in 2018. Simultaneous searches were conducted on Tuesday at the officer's residence, office and 11 other locations linked to his relatives, associates and alleged benamidars.

During the raids, investigators reportedly uncovered assets valued at approximately ₹17.94 crore, while of-



ficials indicated that the actual market value of the properties could be significantly higher.

Among the assets identified were five agricultural land parcels spread across 19.38 acres in Mullangi village of

Nizamabad district, officially valued at about ₹82.89 lakh. The ACB also detected seven residential flats—three in Kompally and four in Gachibowli—valued at around ₹7.34 crore.

In addition, officials found a triplex villa in Miyapur worth approximately ₹2.5 crore, a newly constructed house in Kukatpally valued at ₹62.14 lakh and records indicating payment of an advance amount of ₹1 crore towards the purchase of a villa in Nizamabad.

The searches also led to the seizure of ₹55 lakh in cash, bank deposits of around ₹1.44 crore, gold ornaments weighing approximately 2.5 kilograms valued at ₹2 crore and silver articles weighing about six kilograms

worth ₹3.6 lakh.

Investigators further identified household articles valued at around ₹1.26 crore, electronic gadgets including nine mobile phones and four laptops worth ₹11.25 lakh, and two vehicles valued at approximately ₹25 lakh.

The ACB stated that further verification of additional assets and financial transactions is underway as part of the ongoing investigation.

Officials said the accused officer would be arrested and produced before the Principal Special Judge for SPE and ACB Cases, Hyderabad, for judicial remand.

The bureau has urged citizens to report instances of bribery or corruption by public servants through its toll-free helpline 1064 or other official communication channels, assuring confidentiality to complainants.

BJP Govt Crushing the Poor with Rising Prices: Yennam Srinivas Reddy

Congress Launched Massive Protest in Mahabubnagar Against Inflation, Unemployment and Anti-People Policies of the Centre

MAHABUBNAGAR : Government Whip and Mahabubnagar MLA Yennam Srinivas Reddy launched a sharp attack on the BJP-led Central Government, accusing it of burdening the poor and middle-class families with soaring prices and anti-people policies. He called upon the public to defeat the BJP and support a change in leadership at the national level. Participating as the chief guest in a massive dharna organized by the Congress Party at the Gandhi Statue near Ashok Talkies Crossroads in Mahabubnagar, following a call given by the Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC), Yennam Srinivas Reddy said the protest marked the beginning of a sustained movement against the Centre's policies.

Prior to the dharna, Congress leaders and workers paid floral tributes to Dr. B.R. Ambedkar by garlanding his statue near the RTC Bus Stand. A padyatra was later taken out from the Ambedkar Statue to the protest venue, led by Devarkadra MLA G. Madhusudan Reddy, District Congress Committee (DCC) President Sanjeev Mudiraj, and other party leaders. Addressing the gathering, Yennam Srinivas Reddy alleged that the BJP government has failed to address the concerns of ordinary citizens and has instead pushed them into financial distress through continuous price hikes.

He said the prices of essential commodities, LPG cylinders, petrol and diesel have increased drastically, making life difficult for poor and middle-class families. He



recalled that during the tenure of former Prime Minister Dr. Manmohan Singh, under the leadership of Sonia Gandhi, the Congress government effectively managed the economy and protected the public

from inflation despite high international crude oil prices. The Government Whip criticized the Centre for its inability to generate employment opportunities and alleged that the ruling party came to

power by encouraging communal and caste divisions.

He said that after more than a decade in power, the BJP government has failed to provide solutions to public problems, leaving youth, farmers, workers and middle-class families struggling with rising unemployment and economic hardship. Calling for political change, Yennam Srinivas Reddy said it is the responsibility of every citizen and Congress worker to take the party's message to every village and urban locality.

He urged party cadres to expose what he described as the anti-people policies of the Central Government. Emphasizing the need for inclusive and balanced leadership, he said the country should give Rahul Gandhi an opportunity to lead. He added that concentrating power in the hands of a sin-

gle leader for a prolonged period hampers democratic progress and development.

Speaking on the occasion, DCC President Sanjeev Mudiraj strongly criticized the Centre's policies, stating that they have adversely affected youth, students and common citizens. He said the NEET paper leak controversy had shaken public confidence in the education system, while repeated LPG price hikes had placed an additional burden on economically weaker sections and middle-class households. He demanded that the Central Government address issues such as the falling value of the rupee, rising unemployment and inflation, and act responsibly in the interest of the people.

Editorial Technology Democratized Educational Opportunities

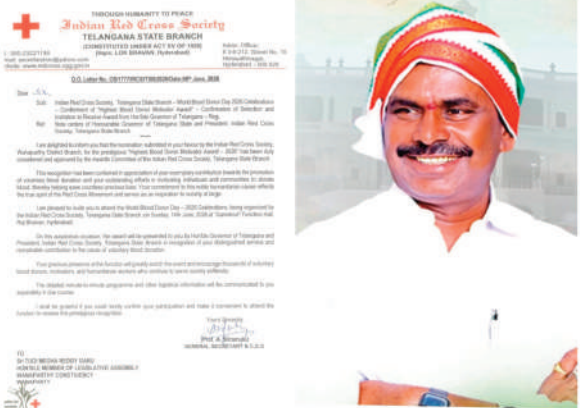
A record volume of blood was collected during a mega blood donation camp organized to mark the MLA's birthday; the blood col-

Road safety is meant to save the lives of motorists, not to cause them inconvenience : SP Sunitha Reddy

Wanaparthi : District Collector Adarsh Surabhi stated that every motorist must strictly adhere to road safety rules to protect not only their own lives but also the lives of others.

The District Collector and District SP attended the 'Arrive Alive' program as chief guests on Wednesday. The event was jointly organized by the Wanaparthi Municipal and Police departments at the local Kalyana Sai Function Hall as part of the 99-day 'Praja Palana Pragathi' (People's Governance & Progress) action plan. Auto-rickshaw drivers, bus drivers, and members of women's groups participated in the event, where footage of some of the country's most severe road accidents was screened. Additionally, artists from the Police and Cultural departments

presented performances illustrating the dangers associated with road accidents and substance abuse.

Speaking on the occasion, the Collector noted that while every driver feels confident in their driving skills, accidents caused by negligence can lead to fatalities, leaving family members to bear the heavy price of that carelessness. It was stated that a life is lost in a road accident every four minutes in the country.

Consequently, various awareness programs for motorists are being conducted in Wanaparthi district to prevent accidents. Everyone was urged to strictly adhere to traffic rules—such as wearing helmets for two-wheeler riders, fastening seatbelts for four-wheeler drivers, observing speed limits, and avoiding drunk driving or using mobile



phones while driving. It was made clear that violators would not be spared and would face heavy fines.

District SP Sunitha Reddy clarified that while people often mistakenly believe po-

lice checks are meant to cause harassment, these measures are actually intended to safeguard motorists' lives rather than inconvenience them. Noting the alarming frequency of

road accidents—with at least 15 lives lost daily across the country—she mentioned that the State Chief Minister has initiated the "Arrive Alive" program, coordinated by the Police, Revenue, Panchayat

Raj, and Transport departments, effective from January 2026.

She emphasized that road safety is a collective responsibility and urged motorists to drive in a manner that protects both their own lives and the lives of others whenever they step out.

She poignantly remarked that only those who have experienced it truly understand the profound tragedy that engulfs a family when a loved one—who left home saying "I'll be back soon"—never returns due to a fatal road accident.

They advised everyone to drive carefully while adhering to road safety and traffic regulations. They urged drivers to avoid speeding, driving under the influence of intoxicants, using mobile phones while driving, and carrying

more than the permitted number of passengers.

They emphasized the importance of wearing helmets and seatbelts, following traffic rules, and remaining mindful of pedestrians and other vehicles. Subsequently, they presented helmets to and commended the members of 'Telangana Samskruthika Sarathi' and police artists who had performed a program on road safety.

ICAR-CRIDA Conducts Soil Health, Balanced Fertilisation Awareness Drive in Sangareddy

Nagarkurnool Unveils ₹9,768-Crore Annual Credit Plan for 2026–27 to Boost Agriculture, Employment, Housing and Education

Nagarkurnool : Collector Hemant Keshav Patil Calls on Banks to Expand Credit Flow and Drive Inclusive Economic Growth.

Nagarkurnool District Collector Hemant Keshav Patil has directed bankers to play a proactive role in accelerating the district's economic development by extending greater credit support to agriculture, industries, women's self-help groups, and other priority sectors. He urged banks not only to achieve the credit targets set by the government but also to surpass them through focused action plans.

The Collector was speaking at the District Consultative Committee (DCC) and District Level Review Committee (DLRC) meeting held on Wednesday at the NIC Video Conference Hall in the Nagarkurnool Collectorate. The meeting reviewed the performance of various banks, progress in loan disbursement, implementation of government welfare schemes, and credit flow to priority sectors.

On the occasion, the Collector formally released the Annual Credit Plan (ACP) for the financial year 2026–27, prepared by the Lead Bank Office, Union Bank of India, aimed at promoting comprehensive economic development across the district.

The plan envisions enhanced credit support for agriculture, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), housing, education, renewable energy, and social infrastructure, with a focus on strengthening the rural economy, generating employment, increasing farmers' incomes, and encouraging entrepreneurship among youth.

₹9,768-Crore Credit Target for 2026–27

The district's Annual



Credit Plan has been designed with a total outlay of ₹9,768 crore, targeting 2,77,772 loan accounts across various sectors.

Of the total allocation: 88.42% has been earmarked for priority sectors.

11.58% has been allocated to non-priority sectors.

Officials stated that greater emphasis on productive sectors would significantly accelerate economic activity and development across the district.

Agriculture Receives the Largest Share

Recognizing agriculture as the backbone of the district's economy, the Annual Credit Plan allocates ₹8,637 crore to the agricultural sector.

The funds will support: Crop cultivation and production

Farm mechanization/Irrigation facilities

Agricultural infrastructure development

A substantial ₹6,870 crore has been earmarked for agricultural term loans and infrastructure development.

To ensure timely access to crop finance, ₹2,310.07 crore has been allocated under farm credit.

try, fisheries, and horticulture.

He called for improved banking services in rural areas, particularly in the Achampet Assembly constituency, and stressed the need to enhance financial inclusion across the district.

Highlighting the role of Self-Help Groups (SHGs) in women's empowerment, the Collector directed banks to avoid delays in sanctioning loans to women's groups, noting that financial support to SHGs would further strengthen the rural economy.

HYDRAA Reclaims 15 Acres of Government Land Near Cyber Towers; Property Worth Rs. 3,000 Crore Secured

Medchal Malkajgiri Bureau: HYDRAA has reclaimed 15 acres of prime government land near Cyber Towers, Madhapur, valued at approximately ₹3,000 crore. The agency secured the site with fencing and official government signboards following a landmark High Court verdict that settled a decade-long ownership dispute involving Ittina Properties.
The land, located in Khanamet village, was being claimed by the private firm based on alleged land assignments from 1963.
However, revenue officials successfully exposed the documents as forgeries, noting that the papers were dated to a period before the relevant Tahsildar office was even established. Furthermore, records confirmed that the official who allegedly signed the documents never held that position.
Dismissing the petitioner's claims due to these fraudulent documents, the High Court directed the authorities to protect the land. Acting on this mandate, HYDRAA successfully reclaimed the property, ensuring the site remains under government control.

Heavy Monsoon Rains Bring Hyderabad to a Halt, Revive Questions Over Flood Preparedness

Hyderabad : The first major spell of the southwest monsoon brought Hyderabad to a near standstill on Tuesday, as heavy rainfall ranging between 98 mm and 129 mm in several parts of the city inundated roads, disrupted traffic and exposed continuing challenges in urban flood management.

Several prominent locations, including Tank Bund, Lower Tank Bund, the Bible House Road Under Bridge (RUB), roads surrounding the Telangana Secretariat and stretches of the city's IT corridor, witnessed severe waterlogging. In many areas, water levels rose to knee- and waist-deep, leaving vehicles stranded and causing traffic snarls that lasted for hours.

The heavy rains affected normal life across the city, with lakhs of commuters fac-

ing significant delays while attempting to navigate flooded roads and traffic bottlenecks.

Adding to the disruption, strong winds uprooted around 76 trees across Hyderabad, affecting traffic movement and power supply in several localities. Authorities also reported two electrocution deaths in the Chandrayangutta-Bandlaguda area, highlighting the dangers posed by exposed electrical infrastructure during extreme weather conditions.

The rainfall triggered widespread criticism on social media, where citizens questioned the city's preparedness for the monsoon despite repeated assurances from civic authorities. Residents pointed to recurring issues such as inadequate stormwater drainage, pre-monsoon road excavation works, rapid urbanisation and poor inter-agency coordination as



contributing factors behind the flooding.

The Telangana Government, however, maintained that extensive precautionary measures had been undertaken ahead of the monsoon season. On June 1, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy chaired a high-level review meeting with senior officials from Municipal Administra-

tion, Irrigation, Disaster Management, Health, Home, Fire Services and HYDRAA to assess preparedness measures.

During the meeting, the Chief Minister directed all departments to remain on high alert and approved ₹1,000 crore towards disaster preparedness and emergency response. Officials were also

instructed to expedite maintenance of water infrastructure and strengthen contingency plans for weather-related emergencies.

According to officials, HYDRAA had identified 523 vulnerable waterlogging points across Hyderabad and initiated preventive measures, including desilting of stormwater drains, restoration

of lakes and strengthening of emergency response systems.

As weather warnings intensified earlier this week, the Chief Minister reviewed the situation and directed officials to closely monitor low-lying areas. IT companies were advised to consider work-from-home arrangements, while educational institutions were asked to take suitable precautionary measures based on local conditions.

Following Tuesday's downpour, teams from GHMC, HYDRAA, the Fire Department and Traffic Police were deployed across affected areas to clear fallen trees, remove stagnant water and restore normal traffic movement.

Despite these measures, the latest flooding has reignited concerns over Hyderabad's long-term urban re-

silience. Urban planners and environmental experts have repeatedly identified encroachment of lakes and natural drainage channels, aging stormwater infrastructure and the loss of natural water retention areas as key factors behind recurring flood incidents.

Government officials maintain that ongoing initiatives under the Telangana Rising 2047 vision, including large-scale rejuvenation of lakes, nalas and drainage networks, are intended to provide sustainable long-term solutions to urban flooding.

With the weather department forecasting additional rainfall over the coming days, authorities have kept emergency response teams on standby and urged residents in low-lying and flood-prone areas to remain vigilant and follow official advisories.
