Tamil Nadu CM Vijay Seeks Greater Central Support at NITI Aayog Meeting

New Delhi : Tamil Nadu Chief Minister C. Joseph Vijay on Thursday presented an ambitious roadmap for the State's economic and social development at the 11th Governing Council Meeting of NITI Aayog, urging the Union Government to partner with the State in achieving its long-term growth objectives.

Addressing the meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Vijay outlined Tamil Nadu's vision of becoming a \$1.5 trillion economy by 2036, built on four key pillars - youth, poor, women and farmers - while contributing to India's goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047.

Emphasising youth empowerment, the Chief Minister proposed a Youth Skill and Employment Mission aimed at providing stipend-supported internships and training opportunities to five lakh young people annually. He sought Central assistance for establishing district-level skill development centres focused on emerging sectors such as artificial intelligence, deep technology, cybersecurity, electric vehicles and semiconductors. He also advocated support for start-up incubators and deep-tech venture capital initiatives.

On education, Vijay reiterated Tamil Nadu's opposition to the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) and requested that the State be permitted to fill MBBS, BDS and AYUSH seats under the State quota based on Class XII examination marks.

Highlighting social welfare initiatives, he announced a Poverty-Free Tamil Nadu Mission aimed

at converging various welfare schemes to improve living standards. He also sought Central support for affordable housing programmes and requested approval for establishing a second All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) in Coimbatore.

The Chief Minister underlined Tamil Nadu's achievements in promoting women's participation

in the workforce and proposed the creation of specialised women's safety units to further strengthen security and employment opportunities.

Addressing issues concerning agriculture and fisheries, Vijay announced a ₹2,045-crore Cooperative Crop Loan Waiver and urged the Centre to safeguard the traditional fishing rights of Tamil Nadu fishermen in the Palk Bay region. He also called for continued efforts to secure the release and welfare of fishermen detained across international maritime boundaries.

The Chief Minister sought timely clearances for major road, rail and high-speed rail projects, along with support for flood mitigation initiatives. He also requested the release of pending Samagra Shiksha funds amounting to ₹3,284 crore without imposing additional conditions.

In a cultural proposal, Vijay urged the Union Government to declare the ancient Tamil classic Thirukkural as the National Literature of India.

Stressing the importance of cooperative federalism, the Chief Minister said empowered States were essential for building a stronger and more prosperous nation.

Telangana CM Revanth Reddy Meets Prime Minister, Seeks Support for Key Telangana Infrastructure Projects

New Delhi : Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy met Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi on Thursday on the sidelines of the 11th Governing Council Meeting of NITI Aayog and sought the Centre's support for several major infrastructure and connectivity projects in the State.

According to the Chief Minister, the meeting focused on issues of mutual interest concerning the Central and State Governments and on accelerating development initiatives critical to Telangana's future growth.

During the interaction, Revanth Reddy requested the Prime Minister's intervention to expedite approvals and financial support for a number of key projects, including the expansion of the Hyderabad Metro Rail network, construction of the Regional Ring Road and development of a proposed 12-lane expressway connecting Future City in Telangana with the Bandar seaport in Andhra Pradesh.

The Chief Minister also sought Central assistance for the establishment of airports at

Warangal and Adilabad, among other infrastructure projects aimed at improving connectivity and promoting economic development in the State.

Following the meeting, Revanth Reddy expressed optimism about receiving a positive response from the Union Government. He said the proposed projects would play a crucial role in strengthening transportation infrastructure, attracting investments and supporting Telangana's long-term growth objectives.

The meeting took place amid ongoing discussions on Centre-State cooperation and development priorities during the NITI Aayog Governing Council deliberations.

Photographs released by the Prime Minister's Office showed the two leaders engaged in a cordial interaction.

The outcome of the proposals submitted by the Telangana Government is expected to be taken up with the concerned Central ministries and departments in the coming months.

Harish Rao Demands Notification for 19,000 Vacant Police Posts

Hyderabad : Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader and former minister Harish Rao on Thursday demanded that the Telangana Government immediately issue a notification for all 19,000 vacant police posts in the State, alleging that the Congress government had failed to fulfil its employment promises made during the 2023 Assembly elections.

Addressing the issue in a statement, Harish Rao claimed that despite completing two-and-a-half years in office, the Congress government had filled fewer than 20,000 government posts, falling short of its promise to provide two lakh jobs annually. He alleged that the delay in recruitment had left thousands of unemployed youth without opportunities and caused many aspirants to cross the prescribed age limits.

Referring to vacancies in the Police Department, the BRS

leader said the Director General of Police had indicated that around 19,000 posts remained vacant. However, he alleged that the government was preparing to notify only 5,000 posts and termed the move inadequate.

Harish Rao demanded that all vacant police posts be filled through a single comprehensive recruitment notification. He further contended that nearly 2,000 of the proposed posts were confined to the Hyderabad Commis-

sionerate, which, according to him, would reduce opportunities for candidates from rural areas and affect representation across various categories.

Drawing a comparison with the previous BRS government, he stated that large-scale recruitment drives had been undertaken during its tenure and claimed that nearly 48,000 police personnel were recruited through multiple notifications.

The former minister also

urged the government to restore the age limits that were in force during the BRS administration, including 36 years for constable posts and 38 years for sub-inspector posts. He called for a review of the existing physical test criteria and sought a return to the earlier system of qualifying in three out of five physical events.

Among other demands, Harish Rao sought complete waiver of application fees for police recruitment examinations, citing promises made in the Congress election manifesto. He also requested the establishment of dedicated practice grounds in areas such as Dilsukhnagar and Ashok Nagar to help aspirants prepare for physical efficiency tests.

The BRS leader asserted that his party would continue to raise issues concerning unemployed youth and press for the recruitment of all vacant police posts in the State.

UN to Host First Global Dialogue on AI Governance in Geneva

New Delhi : The United Nations will convene the inaugural Global Dialogue on Artificial Intelligence (AI) Governance on July 6 and 7 at the Palexpo International Convention Centre in Geneva, marking a major step towards creating an inclusive global framework for cooperation on AI governance.

Established under a United Nations General Assembly resolution, the Dialogue will serve as a new multilateral platform bringing together governments, industry leaders, academic institutions, civil society organisations and international agencies to address emerging opportunities and challenges associated with artificial intelligence.

The event will be held alongside the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS) Forum 2026 and the International Telecommunication Union's AI for Good Global Summit, creating one of the largest global gatherings focused on digital transformation, emerging technologies and AI policy.

According to organisers, the

Dialogue aims to promote international cooperation on AI governance, facilitate the exchange of best practices and ensure that discussions on the future of artificial intelligence reflect the priorities and concerns of countries at all levels of technological development.

Key areas of discussion will include the economic, social, ethical, cultural and technical implications of AI; bridging digital and AI divides; capacity-building for developing countries; access to computing infrastructure; and the development of safe, secure and trustworthy AI systems.

Participants will also deliberate on issues related to human

rights, transparency, accountability and human oversight in AI deployment, with an emphasis on ensuring that technological advancements benefit societies equitably.

The programme will feature high-level plenary sessions, thematic discussions, breakout meetings and side events. Delegates will also receive the first report of the United Nations Independent International Scientific Panel on AI, which is expected to provide scientific insights and recommendations on global AI governance.

Among the senior leaders expected to participate are United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres, President of the United Nations General Assembly Annalena Baerbock, ITU Secretary-General Doreen Bogdan-Martin, UNESCO Director-General Khald El-Enany,

and United Nations Special Envoy for Digital and Emerging Technologies Amandeep Singh Gill.

The Dialogue will be co-chaired by Egrisdela López, Permanent Representative of El Salvador to the United Nations, and Rein Tammsaar, Permanent Representative of Estonia.

The initiative follows commitments made during the 2024 Summit of the Future and the adoption of the Global Digital Compact, which called for stronger international cooperation on emerging technologies. Organisers have indicated that a second session of the Dialogue is planned in New York in 2027.

Officials said the process is designed to complement existing global AI initiatives while promoting interoperability, knowledge sharing and capacity-building across nations.

The Geneva meeting is expected to play a significant role in shaping future international discussions on human-centred and inclusive AI governance as countries seek to balance innovation with safety, equity and accountability.

HYDRAA Commissioner Inspects Waterlogging Point at Kondapur, Orders Drainage Restoration

Serilingampally : HYDRAA Commissioner Ranganath conducted a joint inspection at a major waterlogging point near Santhosh Sabha in Kondapur on Thursday and reviewed the situation on the ground.

DYFI Demands Rollback of TGPSC Application Fee Hike

Hyderabad : The Democratic Youth Federation of India (DYFI), Hyderabad City Committee, has demanded that the Telangana Public Service Commission (TGPSC) immediately withdraw the recent increase in application processing fees and restore the earlier fee structure.

In a statement issued on Thursday, Hyderabad City Secretary M.D. Javed alleged that the hike in the application processing fee from ₹200 to ₹1,000 had placed a significant financial burden on unemployed youth aspiring for government jobs.

He said job aspirants were already facing difficulties due to the limited number of recruitment

notifications and were spending substantial amounts on coaching,

study materials and examination preparation. The steep increase in application fees, he argued, would further add to their financial strain.

Javed pointed out that TGPSC had recently issued separate recruitment notifications for 222 Assistant Executive Engineer (Civil) posts and 49 Assistant

Department, 19 Assistant Environmental Engineer posts in the Telangana State Pollution Control Board and 24 Deputy Education Officer posts in the School Education Department.

According to him, issuing separate notifications requires candidates to submit in-

dividual applications and pay the processing fee for each recruitment notification, thereby increasing the overall cost borne by job seekers.

The DYFI leader urged the Telangana Government and TGPSC to reconsider the fee hike and reduce the processing charge to its previous level. He also called upon the commission to issue combined recruitment notifications wherever feasible to lessen the financial burden on candidates.

Stating that unemployed youth were already facing economic hardships, Javed appealed to the authorities to adopt measures that would make government recruitment processes more accessible and affordable.

Hyderabad Police Bust 'IGNITE' Network, Arrest Six in Multi-State Operation

Hyderabad : The Hyderabad City Police has arrested six persons in connection with the newly launched 'IGNITE' network, which investigators allege is a rebranded version of previously controversial money circulation schemes operating under names such as Gold Quest, QuestNet and QNET/Vihaan Direct Selling.

The arrests were made during a coordinated multi-state operation, codenamed "Operation Ignite Crackdown", carried out by the Central Crime Station (CCS). The accused were apprehended from Kerala, West Bengal, Delhi and Uttar Pradesh.

According to police, the operation was launched within 18 days of the formation of the IG-



NITE entity in India, following intelligence inputs and preliminary complaints from victims. Officials said three complaints have already been registered, leading to the filing of FIRs and a detailed investigation into the network's activities.

Investigators alleged that the organisation was operating a multi-level marketing and money circulation model similar to

large scale.

Officials estimated that the crackdown may have averted a potential fraud running into thousands of crores of rupees if the network had been allowed to grow unchecked.

Police said the case represents the fourth incarnation of a business model that has surfaced under different names over the past three decades. Earlier versions,

including Gold Quest and QuestNet, had attracted scrutiny from regulatory and investigative agencies. The Serious Fraud Investigation Office (SFIO) had previously raised concerns regarding the operations of such schemes and their potential impact on investors.

The Hyderabad City Police said investigations are continuing to identify additional individuals involved in the network and to determine the full extent of its operations.

In a public advisory, police urged citizens to exercise caution before investing in schemes that promise high returns linked to recruitment-based business models. They also appealed to the public to report suspicious financial activities to law enforcement agencies at the earliest opportunity.

Nepali Gang Held in Hill Ridge Villas Mega Theft Case; Entire Loot Recovered

Cyberabad : Cyberabad Police have cracked a sensational theft case reported at Hill Ridge Villas in Gachibowli, arresting three members of a Nepali gang and recovering the entire stolen property, including nearly 8 kg of gold ornaments.

The theft took place on June 6 while the occupants of a villa were away. The elderly residents returned home on June 7 and noticed that a gold chain adorning a small idol was missing. Based on their complaint, Gachibowli Police registered a case and launched an investigation.

The case took a serious turn on June 8 when the complainant's son opened a locker inside the house and discovered that around 7-8 kg of gold ornaments and 1.5 kg of silver ornaments had been stolen. Following the revelation, Cyberabad Police Commissioner Dr. M.

Ramesh, IPS, immediately mobilized Special Operations Teams (SOT), crime teams, and local police personnel to track down the culprits.

Multiple police teams were dispatched to Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, and Uttarakhand, while details of the suspects were shared with police authorities in various states. A special team formed to monitor Nepali criminal gangs also joined the investigation.

Acting on credible leads, a police team led by Gachibowli Inspector P. Naresh, with assistance from Rampur District Police in Uttar Pradesh, apprehended three accused on Bilaspur Road in Rampur district on June 9. The arrested individuals were identified as Kamal Shahi, Vimla Shahi alias Bimala Shahi, and Kalpana Shahi, all residents of Nepal.

Police said the gang primarily targeted affluent families living in luxury villas. The



accused allegedly gained access to households by working as domestic helpers or placing associates as domestic workers. They collected information about the movements of family members and struck when houses were vacant.

Investigators revealed that the gang's alleged mastermind, Suresh alias Suraj, who remains absconding, brought workers from Nepal and arranged their employment in high-end residences. Using information gathered through these workers, he planned and executed thefts. In the present case, domestic workers were allegedly placed in the victim's villa to facilitate the crime.

During interrogation, the accused reportedly confessed that they found the locker key kept near the locker, opened it, removed the valuables, relocked it, and escaped with the key.

Police recovered the entire stolen property, including approximately 7.837 kg of gold ornaments, 1.361 kg of silver items, ₹33,170 in cash, and two mobile phones.

The accused are being produced before a local court, and efforts are underway to bring them to Hyderabad on transit warrants for further investigation.

Cyberabad Police Commissioner Dr. M. Ramesh appreciated the officers and staff involved in the operation and announced cash rewards for their exemplary work in solving the case and recovering the stolen property.

The investigation was carried out under the guidance of Serilingampally DCP Ch. Srinivas, IPS, with the support of Additional DCP N. Uday Reddy, ACP Kalinagara, Inspector Balaraju, Inspector Naresh, and the Gachibowli Police Station crime team.

HMDA Reschedules Banjara Hills-Hakeempet Land E-Auction to July 2

Hyderabad : The Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority (HMDA) has revised the schedule for the e-auction of a prime land parcel located at Banjara Hills-Hakeempet in Hyderabad.

According to an official notification, the land parcel measuring Ac. 8.24 guntas, situated in Survey No. 102/1, T.S. Nos. 1/P and 3/P of Hakeempet Village in Shaikpet Mandal, is being offered for sale through e-auction.

The pre-bid meeting and e-auction, which were earlier scheduled for June 12 and June 19, respectively, have been postponed due to administrative reasons.

HMDA stated that the pre-bid meeting will now be conducted on June 19, while the e-auction has been rescheduled to July 2.

The authority has requested all prospective bidders, delegates and stakeholders to take note of the revised dates and make necessary arrangements accordingly. The auction is expected to attract strong interest from real estate developers and investors, given the strategic location and high commercial value of the property.

Additional Collector Haripriya Launched Urea Booking App for Kharif 2026 Season

Farmers can now book urea online from 250 authorized fertilizer dealers across 17 mandals; district reports ample stocks and buffer reserves

MAHABUBNAGAR : Revenue Additional Collector J.L.B. Haripriya on Thursday launched the "Urea Booking App" for the Kharif 2026 season at the District Agriculture Office located in the Integrated District Offices Complex (IDOC).

Speaking on the occasion, the Additional Collector said the Urea Distribution App would enable farmers to purchase urea conveniently without facing the difficulties experienced in previous years.

Earlier, farmers often had to leave their work and spend several hours waiting in long queues to obtain urea. With the introduction of the new app, farmers can now book urea online and



collect it from any of the 250 authorized fertilizer dealer outlets spread across the district's 17 mandals.

She assured farmers that adequate stocks of urea are available for the Kharif 2026 season and urged them not to worry about any shortage. District Agriculture

Officer B. Venkatesh stated that there is no scarcity of urea in the district.

He informed that 14,759 bags of urea, equivalent to 664 metric tonnes, are currently available for booking through the app. In addition, a substantial buffer stock of 8,513 metric tonnes has

been maintained, including 5,868 metric tonnes with MARKFED, 2,339 metric tonnes in company warehouses, and 306 metric tonnes with wholesale dealers.

The Agriculture Officer further said that tenant farmers and ROFR (Recognition of Forest Rights) beneficiaries are also eligible to procure urea through the app. He emphasized that urea would be supplied transparently at government-approved prices.

District Agriculture Officer B. Venkatesh, ADA (Technical) B. Madhavi, Agriculture Officer (Technical) M.A. Basith, and other agriculture department officials participated in the programme.

Complaint Filed with HYDRAA Over Alleged Encroachment of Park Land in Deeptisri Nagar Colony

Serilingampally : Representatives of the social organization Janam Kosam have lodged a complaint with HYDRAA alleging encroachment of a portion of a designated park area in Deeptisri Nagar Colony.

According to the complaint, the layout contains a park site measuring 9,752 square yards, of which



nearly 1,000 square yards is allegedly being occupied in the name of constructing a cricket net court. The organization claimed that the land under alleged encroachment is valued at approximately ₹15 crore.

Janam Kosam President Kasireddy Bhaskar Reddy and General Secretary Nagam Rajasekhara submitted the complaint at the HYDRAA headquarters on Wednesday evening, seeking immediate intervention by the authorities.

In a statement, the organization asserted that any construction activity within a designated park area is unlawful and contrary to environmental norms. It further stated that utilizing park land for purposes other than public green space could amount to a violation of judicial guidelines and court directions relating to the protection of public parks.

The organization has demanded that the alleged encroachments be removed immediately and that appropriate legal action be initiated against those responsible, in accordance with the law.

Editorial

Venture Capital and Technology Adoption Funds to Accelerate India's Space Economy

Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology and Earth Sciences; Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, Department of Atomic Energy, Department of Space, Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Dr. Jitendra Singh today called upon industry leaders to significantly scale up investments and participation in India's space sector to accelerate the development of globally competitive indigenous technologies and reduce dependence on external sources.

Addressing the 10th IN-SPACe Industry Connect, Dr. Jitendra Singh emphasised that while India's start-up ecosystem has demonstrated remarkable innovation and technological capability, achieving leadership in the global space economy would require stronger participation from established industries through enhanced funding, manufacturing strength and market access.

Dr. Jitendra Singh stated that the opening up of the space sector to private participation under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi marked a historic shift in India's approach to strategic sectors. He described the reforms as a courageous decision that unlocked India's latent entrepreneurial potential and transformed the country's space ecosystem within a short span of time.

Highlighting the policy initiatives undertaken to support the sector, Dr. Jitendra Singh said that the space sector reforms were followed by the Indian Space Policy 2023, which provided strategic direction and regulatory clarity to stakeholders. He further noted that the liberalisation of the Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) regime has helped attract investments and improve India's integration with global value chains. The Minister described the establishment of the Indian National Space Promotion and Authorization Centre (IN-SPACe) as a major institutional reform that has enabled, promoted, authorised and supervised non-governmental participation across the entire space value chain.

Dr. Jitendra Singh highlighted the Government's efforts to strengthen the innovation ecosystem through financial and institutional support mechanisms. He informed that a ₹1,000 crore Venture Capital Fund and a ₹500 crore Technology Adoption Fund have been introduced to facilitate innovation and commercialisation in the sector. He added that initiatives relating to seed funding, incubation support, skill development programmes and an AICTE-approved Space Technology curriculum are contributing towards building a future-ready talent pipeline for the country's expanding space economy.

Referring to the rapid growth of India's private space ecosystem, the Minister noted that what began with a handful of pioneering enterprises has now evolved into an ecosystem comprising over 400 start-ups and several hundred large and small companies. He stated that Indian enterprises are today developing launch vehicles, satellites, propulsion systems, Earth observation applications, space situational awareness capabilities and a range of downstream solutions. Companies such as Skyroot Aerospace, Agnikul Cosmos, Pixxel, Galaxeye, Digantara and Dhruva Space, he said, exemplify India's entrepreneurial capabilities and technological innovation.

Calling for the emergence of a stronger culture of philanthropy in scientific research, Dr. Jitendra Singh noted that while philanthropic contributions have traditionally been directed towards charitable causes, investment in research and innovation should also be recognised as an important service to society.

The Minister also appealed to industry stakeholders to candidly communicate the challenges and constraints they encounter while operating within the evolving space ecosystem. Assuring them of the Government's support, he stressed the importance of maintaining an open and constructive dialogue between policymakers and industry.

Dr. Jitendra Singh acknowledged the industry's concerns regarding the need for faster approvals, streamlined processes and an effective single-window mechanism. He emphasised that the objective of governance should be to incentivise innovation rather than create unintended barriers.

Breaking the Speed Culture - Why ‘Arrive Alive’ is a Collective Social Duty

Hyderabad : Modern life is locked in a relentless race against time. Yet, when this rush turns fatal on our highways, the reminder from top police officials at the Veliminedu Gram Sabha—“Speed is secondary, reaching alive is what matters”—strikes a deep, necessary chord. Organized under the 99-day Praja Palana initiative, the Nalgonda Police's “Arrive Alive” campaign is not just another routine awareness drive; it is a vital intervention on highways that have bled for far too long.

The Human Cost of Statistics

Too often, road accidents are reduced to mere numbers on a page. However, as DGP V.V. Srinivasa Rao rightly noted, a single fatality can plunge an entire household into an abyss of financial and psychological trauma. It is tragic that 90% of these mishaps are caused not by mechanical failures, but by human overconfidence and reckless habits. Wrong-way driving, using mobile phones while driving, and refusing to wear helmets are preventable evils. When will the younger generation realize that a moment of thrill can cause a lifetime of grief?

Scientific Policing: Fixing the Black Spots

Historically, administrative responses to road accidents stopped at penalizing drivers. The approach taken by Nalgonda SP Sharath Chandra Pawar, however, shows the power of scientific policing.



“Instead of just handing out traffic fines, the police actively mapped ‘black spots’ in Veliminedu, fixing road defects, adding barricades, and improving lighting. The result? Fatalities plummeted from 16 to a mere 2 this year.”

“This proves that structural adjustments, paired with strict enforcement, save lives. In an era of unpredictable highway behavior, every citizen must learn the art of ‘defensive driving’—assuming that the other driver might make a mistake and preparing accordingly.”

Systemic Safety: The Golden Hour

The government's plan to provide up to ₹1.50 lakh in cashless emergency treatment during the crucial “Golden Hour” is a commendable safety net. By eliminating financial friction at hospitals during emergencies, the state is actively safeguarding lives. Coupled with the state's

new specialized Traffic Management wing, Telangana is building a robust infrastructure for road safety.

The Veliminedu Model: A Blueprint for the State

The absolute highlight of the Veliminedu summit was the civic maturity shown by its residents. Led by Sarpanch Chandra Reddy, the entire village passed a self-imposed, unanimous resolution banning helmetless riding within their jurisdiction. Social contracts like these are far more powerful than police challans or legal threats. If every village in Telangana replicates the Veliminedu model, our roads will transform from hazard zones into safe corridors, ensuring that every journey ends with a safe arrival home.

The Fibre Economy: India’s Next Big Global Opportunity

“From local abundance to global leadership in sustainable materials and future-ready “textiles

India's relationship with fibre is civilisational, 5,000 years deep, woven into our villages, our traditions, and our collective identity. From the legendary muslins of Mohenjo-daro, celebrated as “woven air”, to the craftsmanship that travelled across continents, fibre has always been the lifeblood of our rural economy. Today, at the cusp of a global sustainability revolution, that ancient knowledge is our greatest competitive advantage.

For decades, the banana pseudostem was discarded as waste. Today, that same biomass is premium fibre, feeding export markets, sustaining rural livelihoods, and turning agricultural residue into national revenue. From waste to wealth, from local abundance to global opportunity: this is the essence of India's New Age Fibre movement, paving the way for India's path to global leadership in green materials and future-ready textiles.

New Age Fibres are sustainable, plant-based materials that blend India's

traditional knowledge with modern innovation. Fibres like Bamboo, Hemp, Banana, PALF, Flax, Ramie, Sisal, Milkweed, and Kapok have existed for centuries, but are now being rediscovered for high-value uses in textiles, defence, biodegradable composites, and premium products. They are expanding India's natural fibre basket for a greener future.

Rising incomes, global sustainability mandates, and traceable sourcing requirements are fundamentally rewiring global supply chains and driving a new fibre economy. Consumers are seeking comfort, breathability, and sustainability in everything they wear. This structural shift is why India's fibre consumption is set to surge from 15 MMT today to 23 MMT by 2030. The world is increasingly seeking exactly what India can offer: ethical, sustainable, and high-performance natural fibres backed by centuries of expertise.

This vision is supported by a clear institutional and policy framework. Under the Mission

for Cotton Productivity, with a total outlay of ₹5,664 crore for 2026–2031, a dedicated ₹300 crore New Age Fibres component has been kept. Complementing this effort, the National Fibre Mission announced in the Union Budget 2026–27 provides the broader strategic framework, resting on four pillars: KRISHI-SUTRA for cultivation and raw material development, INFINITI for research and innovation, GRAM-SETU for infrastructure and enterprise creation, and GMPS for branding and market development.

The strength of this policy framework lies in decades of scientific research already delivering results. Milkweed (Aak/Madar), traditionally offered to Lord Shiva, has emerged as a breakthrough after 18 years of research at the Northern India Textile Research Association (NITRA), evolving into defence applications such as sleeping bags for soldiers operating at –



20°C. These are 10% lighter than polyester alternatives, warmer than wool, and CLO/Cell certified. Grown on 55 million hectares of wasteland without fertiliser, it can generate ₹1.5–2 lakh per acre annually for farmers.

Banana fibre offers an estimated 1.8 million tonnes annual production potential and additional farmer income from agricultural residue, while Bamboo can yield up to 60 tonnes of biomass per hectare, creating major opportunities for the Northeast. Hemp is also emerging as a promising global market, with

cultivation already permitted in Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh. Along with Flax, Sisal, Ramie, PALF, Nettle, and Kapok, these fibres are steadily expanding India's sustainable fibre base.

Building on this scientific momentum, the National Seminar on New Age Fibres became a platform where science, policy, and enterprise could converge. It brought together researchers, scientists, entrepreneurs, farmer organisations, industry leaders, and policymakers under one roof. Three Task Force reports covering all ten priority fibres were released, translating field science directly into scheme design and investment priorities.

The seminar also openly identified gaps in standards, processing infrastructure, and institutional financing, reflecting a mission focused on real execution. Key priorities emerged: scaling production from 10,000 MT to 10 lakh MT in five years, developing quality standards, promoting ma-

chinery indigenisation, reducing dependence on imported processing technology, and building cluster-based fibre ecosystems from cultivation to value addition. Together, these steps position New Age Fibres as a whole-of-government mission for rural prosperity and sustainable growth.

Perhaps the most transformative frontier is fibre blending. India's real strength lies not in a single fibre, but in combining them intelligently, such as milkweed for thermal lightness, wool for warmth, bamboo for breathability, and cotton for softness. A blended fabric is not a compromise; it is a performance upgrade creating fabrics that are stronger, smarter, and more sustainable, with better comfort, moisture management, durability, and versatility across fashion, lifestyle, and technical textiles.

The benefits cascade across the entire value chain. Consumers get better comfort and functionality, manufacturers gain premium and differentiated products, and farmers benefit from diversi-

fied demand and more resilient incomes. For India, blending is more than a technical innovation; it is the bridge from raw fibre supply to globally competitive, value-added brands rooted in Indian identity.

At its core, the New Age Fibre movement is about transforming lives, creating opportunities for farmers, strengthening rural livelihoods, empowering women, and enabling entrepreneurs to build global enterprises from local resources. Anchored in Prime Minister Narendra Modi Ji's 5F Vision: Farm to Fibre to Fabric to Fashion to Foreign, India's Green Fibre Revolution is not a distant promise. The strategy is set. The institutions are engaged. The science is proven. The entrepreneurs are ready. What India is now doing, fibre by fibre, blend by blend, region by region, farm by farm, is writing the next great chapter of its textile story.

She clarified that medical and health staff would conduct door-to-door visits on June 29



and 30 to administer polio drops to children who could not receive the vaccine at the booths on June 28.

Regarding the National Deworming Day on July 13, the Collector said that deworming (Albendazole) tablets should be administered to all children and adolescents between the ages of 1 and 19 years. She informed that a total of 1,67,702 children and adolescents in this age group have been identified in the district.

The tablets will be distributed through all government and private schools, colleges, and Anganwadi centres. The Collector instructed officials from the Health Department, Education Department, and Women and Child Welfare Department to work in close coordination to ensure the successful implementation of both major programmes with 100 percent coverage.

World Transplant Day: SALI Celebrates Gift of Life with Recipients

Hyderabad : Marking World Transplant Day, the South Asian Liver Institute (SALI) celebrated the remarkable journeys of organ transplant recipients and reaffirmed its commitment to advancing liver transplantation, organ donation awareness and world-class liver care.

SALI traces its origins to the pioneering medical team that established the first successful liver transplantation programme in the erstwhile Andhra Pradesh, laying the foundation for modern liver transplant services in the region. Today, the institute is among the largest and most active liver transplant centres in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

Speaking on the occasion, SALI founder Prof. Dr Tom Cherian highlighted India's growing stature in organ transplantation. "A record 20,019 organ transplants were performed in



India in 2025, placing the country among the top five nations globally in transplantation," he said.

The institute has achieved several milestones over the years, including performing the region's first split liver transplant — a complex procedure in which a single donor liver is divided to save two lives. SALI has also emerged as a referral centre for highly challenging liver transplant cases, including paediatric transplants and

patients with advanced portal vein thrombosis and complex vascular abnormalities.

Despite handling some of the most technically demanding procedures, the institute reports patient and graft survival rates exceeding 91 to 93 per cent in selected cohorts, comparable to leading international transplant centres.

At the World Transplant Day event, transplant recipients shared inspiring stories of resilience and recovery. Among them were Deepu,

the smallest liver transplant recipient in Andhra Pradesh, and Vishal, who underwent a transplant in Telangana in 2019 when he weighed just 4.7 kg. Prof. Cherian praised their courage and determination, describing them as symbols of hope for countless patients battling liver disease.

SALI has also played a key role in strengthening public-sector transplantation services by supporting transplant programmes at Osmania General Hospital and

Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (NIMS).

Through clinical excellence, research, training, public awareness initiatives and advocacy for organ donation, the institute has made significant contributions to the growth of transplantation in India. It currently operates four liver transplant centres across three states and more than 13 liver speciality clinics nationwide.

The institute was also credited with introducing Enhanced Recovery After Surgery (ERAS) protocols in the field of transplantation in India, helping improve patient recovery and outcomes.

Observing that liver disease affects people across all age groups and backgrounds, Prof. Cherian stressed the need for greater awareness about organ donation, noting that every donor has the potential to give multiple patients a second chance at life.

₹83 Crore Sanctioned for New Drinking Water Treatment Plant in Nalgonda

Nalgonda : The Telangana Government has issued G.O. No. 579, sanctioning ₹83 crore under TUFIDC funds for the establishment of a new drinking water treatment plant in Nalgonda Municipal Corporation. Nalgonda Corporation currently has more than 50,000 households, which receive drinking water on alternate days through the existing 37 MLD (Million Litres per Day) Water Treatment Plant at Panagal. To ensure daily water supply to residents, Mayor Burri Chaitanya Srinivas Reddy brought the matter to the attention of Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy. After reviewing the issue, the Minister submitted a detailed proposal to the government, taking into account the city's drinking water requirements up to the year 2053. Acting on the proposal, the government approved the construction of a new water treatment facility and issued the necessary orders.

Daily Drinking Water Supply a Reality

At present, the 37 MLD treatment plant at Panagal supplies drinking water to over 50,000 households on an alternate-day basis. Under the new project, a 70 MLD-capacity Water Treatment Plant will be constructed. Officials stated that once the new facility becomes operational, it will significantly enhance water availability and create the possibility of providing daily and uninterrupted drinking water supply across the city. Preparations are underway to invite tenders for the project within the next 15 days.

Minister's Initiative Made the Project Possible : Mayor

Mayor Burri Chaitanya Srinivas Reddy said that the project became possible due to the special initiative taken by Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy to ensure daily drinking water supply for Nalgonda residents. He stated that the government's approval of ₹83 crore for the new treatment plant reflects its commitment to improving civic infrastructure. Once completed, the facility is expected to address drinking water needs not only within Nalgonda town but also in surrounding areas, ensuring a reliable and sustainable water supply for years to come.

Reviewing the progress, he instructed engineering officials to further accelerate the works to ensure smooth and increased water flow to the tail-end regions during the upcoming agricultural season. The Minister stated that the Rs. 442 crore allocation for the canal lining project was sanctioned after he personally took up the matter with Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy. He emphasized that the project should be completed expeditiously so that farmers receive maximum benefits and irrigation water reaches a larger ayacut area during the current monsoon season. The AMRP canal lining works are being carried out over a stretch of nearly 136 kilometres, from Angadipet to the Musi River. While the original AMRP canal excavation was completed during 1985-86, canal lining works have been taken up nearly four decades later following the



initiative of Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy. Officials explained that upon completion of the lining works, irrigation water can be supplied more efficiently to around 2.20 lakh acres of agricultural land. At present, due to the absence of lining, significant water seepage results in difficulties for farmers in tail-end areas. The lining project is expected to improve water flow, reduce losses, and ensure timely supply of irrigation water to a larger ayacut. Irrigation Chief Engineer Srinivas Reddy, Superintending Engineer Bhadru, Executive Engineer Nehru Naik, other engineering officials and staff accompanied the Minister during the inspection.

Collector Calls for Stronger Tobacco Control Measures in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District

Yadadri Bhuvanagiri : District Collector Anurag Jayanti, has directed officials to strengthen tobacco control measures across the district. Speaking at the District Level Coordination Committee (DLCC) meeting held at the Integrated District Offices Complex (IDOC), Rayagiri, Bhongir, he emphasized the need for coordinated efforts by all departments to effectively implement tobacco control laws and awareness programs.

The Collector instructed officials to organize extensive awareness campaigns, enforcement drives, and inspections in connection with World No Tobacco Day, observed annually on May 31. He directed strict imple-

The Collector also instructed officials to identify

and remove shops selling tobacco products within a 100-yard radius of educational institutions through coordinated action involving the Education, Police, Municipal, Panchayat Raj, Health Departments, and NGOs. He stressed continuous monitoring to prevent students from falling into tobacco addiction.

Further, he called for all schools and colleges in the

district to be developed as Tobacco-Free Educational Institutions (TFEIs) by installing mandatory signboards, conducting awareness programs, and ensuring strict adherence to prescribed guidelines.

Municipal Commissioners, Rural Local Body Officials Must Work in Coordination : Collector Prateek Jain

Sangareddy : District Collector Prateek Jain directed officials of various departments to work in close coordination for the effective implementation of the Solid Waste Management Rules-2026 and to ensure a clean and healthy environment across the District. Chairing a review meeting at the Collectorate Mini Conference Hall on Thursday, the Collector held discussions with Municipal Commissioners, the District Panchayat Officer, ZP CEO, Divisional Panchayat Officers, officials from the Pollution Control Board, Industries Department, Medical and Health Department, Animal Husbandry Department, DRDO and other departments.

Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that scientific solid waste management must be implemented in accordance with the directions of the Supreme Court and the guidelines issued by the State Government. He instructed officials



to strictly enforce the segregation and collection of wet and dry waste generated in villages and urban areas.

He emphasized the need for continuous monitoring of door-to-door garbage collection, waste transportation and processing activities. Officials were directed to completely curb the dumping and burning of waste in open areas. He also instructed Gram Panchayats and Municipalities to identify garbage-prone locations and prepare special action plans

to resolve such issues.

The Collector directed officials to identify apartments, industries, commercial complexes, educational institutions and function halls that generate large quantities of waste as Bulk Waste Generators and ensure that they manage waste in compliance with prescribed regulations.

He further instructed officials to closely monitor the implementation of Plastic Waste Management Rules and take special measures to prevent the use of single-use

plastics. Stressing the importance of maintaining cleanliness on roads and public places, he called for regular inspections and monitoring.

The Collector also directed officials to prepare action plans for land acquisition and the development of infrastructure required for establishing dumping yards and waste processing centres in newly formed municipalities and Gram Panchayats. He stressed the need to create widespread public awareness about Solid Waste Man-

agement Rules and encourage greater community participation in sanitation activities.

During the meeting, he reviewed trade licence fee collections, property tax collections and last year's revenue performance with Municipal Commissioners. He urged all departments to work together to successfully implement the Solid Waste Management Rules-2026 and transform the District into a cleaner and healthier place.

Collector Calls for Rainwater Harvesting and Construction of Soak Pits in Every Household

He appealed to residents to construct soak pits and rooftop rainwater harvesting structures in their homes. He also directed

officials to ensure the construction of community soak pits in all educational institutions and government offices. The District Rural Development Officer (DRDO) was instructed to immediately sanction and undertake construction wherever such facilities are not yet available. The Collector further emphasized the need for judicious use of water and urged people not to waste drinking water supplied through the Mission Bhagiratha scheme. He directed Panchayat Secretaries to create awareness among villagers about water conservation and advised households to properly close taps to prevent unnecessary wastage. He instructed officials to continue the Jal Sanchay, Jan Bhagidari campaign until the first week of August and reiterated that collective efforts are essential to ensure water security across the district. The Collector also directed the Panchayat Raj Engineering Department to conduct mandal-level meetings with Assistant Engineers and focus on rainwater conservation structures, including



community soak pits, water harvesting systems, and household soak pits, while regularly reviewing progress. During the meeting, the performance of the banking sector for the financial year 2025-26 was reviewed, and the Annual Credit Plan (ACP) for 2026-27 was formally launched. For the financial year 2025-26, banks in the district exceeded expectations by disbursing loans worth ₹7,997 crore against the annual credit target of ₹6,717.58 crore, achieving 119.05 percent of the target. Under the priority sector, banks disbursed ₹5,656.59 crore against a target of ₹5,392.24 crore, achieving 104.90 percent. The agriculture sector alone received ₹4,893.37 crore in loans against a target of ₹4,341.82 crore, registering 112.70 percent achievement. The Collector also unveiled the 2026-27 Annual Credit Plan, which proposes a total credit outlay of ₹7,848.60 crore, reflecting a 16.84 percent increase over the previous year's target. Of this, ₹6,337.71 crore has been earmarked for the priority sector, including ₹4,978.44 crore for agriculture and ₹1,182.53 crore for MSMEs. Crop loans alone account for ₹2,766.72 crore under the agriculture allocation. Under the DRDA-SERP Self-Help Group Bank Linkage Programme, loans worth ₹650.88 crore were disbursed against a target of ₹611.18 crore, achieving 106.50 percent. Similarly, MEPMA Self-Help Groups received ₹123.28 crore, achieving 121.24 percent of the target. Officials informed the meeting that under the PM SVANidhi Scheme, 7,367 applications were sanctioned in the first phase, 4,318 in the second phase, and 1,305 in the third phase. - State Govt's App Causing Severe Distress to Farmers

Nizamabad Bureau, June 11 : In a bid to resolve the challenges faced by farmers at the ground level due to the online fertilizer booking application introduced By ,the state government. BJP District President Dinesh Patel Kulachari met the Indur District Collector on Thursday , submitted a formal memorandum. Speaking to the media later, he clarified that the newly launched urea booking app by the Telangana state government is strictly limited to this state , the central government has, absolutely no involvement with it. He emphasized that the center is fully prepared to provide as, much urea as requested by the state to prevent any shortage, but the structural flaws within the distribution system are causing immense hardship to the farming community. Under the current system, using the mandal as a standard unit for booking urea through the app has turned out to be a major obstacle on the field. Because the distribution centers are located far away from the villages, farmers are forced to bear additional transportation costs to move the booked bags to their respective areas, leading to significant financial losses. While paddy transplantation is currently underway on a large scale across the district, there is still no official clarity from the government regarding the specific number of urea bags allocated per acre, which is creating widespread confusion among farmers. The District Collector responded positively to the issue, acknowledging the technical flaws in the application, and assured that measures would be taken to switch the distribution base from a mandal unit to a revenue village unit to facilitate local distribution. On this occasion, Dinesh Patel demanded that the state government immediately issue clear guidelines regarding per-acre urea allocation and prove its commitment toward the welfare of farmers. The program saw the active participation of several leaders, including Kanchetti Gangadhar, Gadde Bhumanna, Pramod Kumar, Nakka Rajeshwar, Ananth Reddy, Nuthala Srinivas, Tirupati Reddy, Karka Gangareddy, Vijay Krishna, and Bobbili Venu.

RTC Services Should Be Expanded to Remote Villages - Nizamabad District Collector Ila Tripathi

Nizamabad Bureau, June 11 : Nizamabad District Collector Ila Tripathi directed officials of the State Road Transport Corporation (RTC) to expand bus services to remote villages , operate services on routes frequently used By students, farmers, and the general public in order to improve transportation facilities. Taking note of complaints received through the Prajavani grievance platform regarding the lack of RTC bus connectivity, as well as, requests made by residents during the recently conducted Praja Palana Gram Sabhas for additional bus services, the Collector convened a joint meeting with RTC officials , Mandal Parishad Officers at the IDOC on Thursday. During the meeting, details of remote villages and tribal hamlets requiring RTC bus services within various mandals were collected through the MPOs, the compiled list was handed over to RTC officials. Collector Ila Tripathi instructed the officials to introduce RTC bus services in these areas based on the transportation needs of the people. She stated that operating bus services in regions with regular passenger movement would not only provide better transportation facilities to the public but would also generate adequate revenue for the RTC. The Collector observed that schools are set to reopen shortly, that farmers will be travelling, frequently during the Kharif season to procure fertilizers, seeds, and pesticides. She added that people depend on public transportation for their daily needs and urged RTC officials to launch new bus services to residential areas, remote villages accordingly. She further directed that the number of bus trips be increased wherever passenger demand and public movement, justify such measures. Collector Ila Tripathi instructed RTC authorities to examine the list submitted by the MPOs, ensure that bus services are made available on all routes



where there is a genuine requirement. She also emphasized the need to provide transportation facilities to residents of newly developed habitation areas. The Collector directed officials to take necessary steps to commence RTC services on the proposed routes from next Monday and made it clear that she would conduct another review after a fortnight to assess the progress. Telangana to Build Permanent Offices for Tahsildars, RDOs and Sub-Registrars Writing

Hyderabad : In a major initiative aimed at strengthening public administration and improving citizen services, the Telangana government has decided to construct permanent buildings for Tahsildar, Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO) and Sub-Registrar offices across the state.

Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy announced the decision after reviewing the functioning of the Revenue and Housing departments with senior officials at the Secretariat on Thursday.

The minister said the government was committed to providing transparent, efficient and citizen-friendly services through well-equipped government offices. He noted that several revenue offices continue to



function from rented premises or dilapidated buildings, which affects service delivery and public convenience.

As part of the first phase, the government will construct modern permanent buildings for 125 Tahsildar offices and 11 RDO offices that are currently operating from rented or unsuitable structures. Officials have been directed to identify suitable land parcels and expedite construction works.

Ponguleti said all buildings would be developed

under the Housing Corporation with a uniform design across the state to ensure accessibility, functionality and a dignified environment for both citizens and employees. The final designs will be approved in consultation with Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy.

The minister also instructed officials to submit reports on offices requiring repairs and renovation. He emphasized that government offices providing essential public services

should not function from rented buildings and should reflect the government's commitment to quality governance.

Criticising the previous government, Ponguleti alleged that the reorganisation of mandals was undertaken without adequate planning, resulting in administrative challenges and infrastructure deficiencies. He said the present government had strengthened administration by sanctioning necessary posts for newly created mandals.

On the registration front, the minister said the government has already launched the construction of integrated Sub-Registrar office complexes with modern facilities. Around 39 Sub-Registrar offices in Hyderabad, Rangareddy, Medchal-

Malkajgiri and Sangareddy districts within the Outer Ring Road limits are being reorganised into 12 clusters for integrated infrastructure development.

Foundation stones have already been laid and construction works commenced at Gachibowli, Medchal-Malkajgiri, Patancheru and Koheda. The government also plans to construct new buildings for two DIG offices, four District Registrar offices and 52 Sub-Registrar offices, with built-up areas ranging from 4,000 to 10,000 square feet depending on registration volumes.

The minister further stated that efforts were progressing to identify land for Indiramma housing projects in CURE areas and that a meeting with district collectors would be convened shortly to review the process.

Forest area should be protected : Minister Gaddam Vivekananda

Mancherial : State Minister for Labour, Employment Training, Factories, Mines and Geology Gaddam Vivekananda said that protecting the forest area is everyone's responsibility. District Collector Kumar Deepak, District Forest Officer Rahul Kishan Jadhav, Market Committee Chairman Mahesh Tiwari, Forest Division Officer, village sarpanchs and officials attended the program organized by the Forest Department in Chennur Forest Range of the district on Thursday as part of the 99-day activity of the Public Administration Progress Plan.

Speaking on the occasion, the State Minister said that everyone should work for the development of the forest area to provide a balanced environment for future generations. He said that steps should be taken to develop the tourism sector and that the crocodile park and other areas in this area should be developed for tourists, thereby increasing employment opportunities in the tourist area.

He said that as part of farmer welfare, purchase centers were set up and quality grain was purchased from farmers at support prices as per the rules. He said that the yield was higher this time than last year, and about 2 lakh metric tons of grain was purchased quickly, solving the problems of lorries and porters before the due date, and steps were taken to prevent farmers from losing money due to untimely rains. He said that 3,500 houses were sanctioned in the first phase in Chennur constituency and 2,000 houses in the second phase.

He said that Rs. 5 lakh was sanctioned to the beneficiaries of Indiramma Houses and steps were taken to construct houses, and construction of 2 lakh Indiramma Houses will be undertaken across the state. He said that steps are being taken to construct houses for those who cannot afford to build houses.

He said that ration cards, small rice and 200 units of free



electricity will be provided to the eligible people, and steps are being taken to provide pensions to the eligible people. He said that a 5-bed dialysis center will be set up in Chennur and services will be provided locally so that kidney patients do not have to go to other areas.

He said that steps will be taken to provide all types of medical services through the 100-bed government hospital established in Chennur mandal center, and as part of this, 23 doctors and staff will be appointed and medical equipment

and furniture will be provided. He said that an ICU with 10 beds will be set up and emergency services will be provided, the hospital will be opened soon, and steps will be taken to further develop the hospital.

He said that in order to strengthen the education system, steps are being taken to set up an integrated residential school at a cost of Rs 200 crore within Chennur constituency and provide education to about 2,000 students, and efforts are being made to provide admissions in the next academic year. He said that breakfast and midday meal will be provided till intermediate.

He said that steps will be taken to set up 2 Advanced Technology Centers in Chennur constituency and provide vocational education and skill development training to the unemployed youth of this area and provide employment opportunities abroad. The District Collector said that as part of forest development, everyone should plant and protect trees,

and trees should be planted in community areas and forest areas in the district.

He said that there are a lot of mining areas in the district, and to maintain the climate balance, control pollution and protect nature, everyone should take responsibility to plant and protect trees. He said that steps will be taken to protect the people who depend on the forest for their livelihood. He said that jungle safaris have been organized towards the development of tourism in the district and steps will be taken to make the Butterfly Park more beautiful.

Later, Employment Department Officer Ravi Krishna, along with the Mandamarri Area General Manager of Singareni Sanstha and officials, visited the ongoing German language training classes at the Skill Development Center in Mandamarri town and inspected the management of the classes. Khammam Bureau : Police have launched an intensive investigation into a burglary reported at the Sony Vision showroom in Khammam city, where unidentified persons allegedly decamped with valuable mobile phones during the night.

Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt visited the scene soon after receiving information about the incident and reviewed the situation with senior officers. He instructed officials to expedite the investigation and take all necessary steps to trace and apprehend the offenders.

According to the complaint lodged by the showroom management, the burglars broke open the shop locks, entered the premises and stole high-end mobile phones kept in the stock room. A case has been registered and further investigation is underway.

The Clues Team collected fingerprints and other forensic evidence from the spot, while police teams are scrutinizing CCTV footage from the showroom and nearby areas to identify the suspects and establish the sequence of events.
