Defence Ministry Grants Permission for Gandhi Sarovar Project at Babu Ghat

Hyderabad : In a major boost to the ambitious Musi Riverfront Development initiative, the Ministry of Defence has granted working permission to the Musi Riverfront Development Corporation (MRDC) for the development of the proposed Gandhi Sarovar Project at Babu Ghat in Hyderabad.

According to an official communication issued by the Department of Defence (Lands) on June 18, 2026, the President of India has accorded approval for the utilization of 83.814 acres of defence land belonging to the Artillery Centre, Golconda, for the project. The land is estimated to be worth more than ₹533.42 crore.

The approval enables MRDC to undertake the development of Gandhi Sarovar, envisioned as a major cultural, spiritual and recreational landmark under the Musi Riverfront Development Project.

The proposed project includes the installation of a grand statue of Mahatma Gandhi, a museum dedicated to his life and ideals, a meditation centre, landscaped public spaces and other visitor amenities.

Officials stated that the sanctioned land comprises multiple parcels located in Bandlaguda, Gandipet (Ranga Reddy district) and Golconda areas. The permission has been granted under the Ministry of Defence's Equivalent Value Infrastructure (EVI) policy, under which the state government will create equivalent infrastructure facilities for the Army in exchange for the use of defence land.

The Gandhi Sarovar project is expected to become a centerpiece of the larger Musi River rejuvenation programme, which aims to transform the 55-kilometre stretch of the river through (Cont. on Pg 2)

Telangana Launches WhatsApp-Based School Education Services Over 18 Lakh Students and Parents to Benefit

Hyderabad : In a major step towards strengthening digital governance and improving communication with students and parents, the Telangana Government on Friday launched School Education Services through WhatsApp, enabling direct access to a range of educational services and updates.

The initiative was formally inaugurated at LB Stadium by Telangana Governor Shri Jishnu Dev Varma and Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy in the presence of senior government officials.

Under the new system, more than 18 lakh students and parents across the State will receive timely information related to academics, examinations, scholarships, educational materials, school activities, health programmes and other student-centric services through WhatsApp.



The platform has been developed by the Electronic Service Delivery (ESD) - MeeSeva Division of the Information Technology, Electronics & Communications Department in collaboration with the School Education Department.

Officials said several

services are already available on the platform, including progress reports, hall ticket downloads, marks memo, examination results, bonafide certificates, transfer certificates and SSC memo correction requests. The system has already facilitated the delivery of more than 83,000 historic SSC memos.

In the next phase, the government plans to introduce additional services such as student and parent feedback systems, attendance information, updates on distribution of uniforms and textbooks, pre-matric scholarship services, mid-day meal updates, health and wellness programmes, sports activities and residential school welfare initiatives.

A unique feature of the initiative is the introduction of "Palapitta", Telangana's State Bird, as the official digital mascot. Through animated

videos and interactive messages, Palapitta will share important educational information and government announcements with students and parents.

Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy said the government is committed to leveraging technology to improve educational outcomes and strengthen engagement between schools, students and parents. He described the initiative as an important milestone in Telangana's digital transformation journey.

Officials stated that the WhatsApp-based platform will significantly reduce paperwork, minimize visits to government offices and ensure faster delivery of services, making education-related information more accessible and transparent for citizens across the State.

Hyderabad Police Holds High-Level Meeting on Student Safety Ahead of New Academic Year

Hyderabad : A high-level coordination meeting focusing on the safety of school children was organised by Hyderabad Traffic Police at Ravindra Bharathi on Friday, bringing together senior government officials, school managements and other stakeholders to discuss measures for safe student transportation and road safety.

Hyderabad Police Commissioner V.C. Sajjanar, IPS, participated in the meeting along with Transport Commissioner Dr. K. Ilambarathi, IAS, GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan, IAS, and senior officials from various government departments.

The meeting reviewed safety arrangements for nearly 12 lakh students studying in approximately 3,800 schools under the Hyderabad Police Commissionerate limits as the new academic year begins.

People Should Stay Alert During Thunderstorms and Lightning Strikes : SP Narasimha

Suryapet : Suryapet District Superintendent of Police (SP) Narasimha IPS has appealed to the public to remain vigilant during periods of rain accompanied by strong winds, thunder, and lightning. He warned that taking shelter under trees or staying in open areas during thunderstorms can be extremely dangerous due to the risk of lightning strikes.

According to weather department forecasts, the district is likely to experience rainy weather accompanied by gusty winds in the coming days. In a statement, the SP urged all residents to exercise caution and follow safety



measures. He particularly advised farmers, agricultural workers, and the general public to stay alert during thunderstorms, avoid standing under trees or taking shelter in old and un-

safe buildings, and closely monitor weather conditions. People should move to safe locations or return home as soon as adverse weather conditions develop. Referring to incidents that

occurred on Thursday evening, the SP stated that during heavy rain and strong winds near Vardhamanukota village in Nagaram Mandal, lightning struck a palm tree in an agricultural field.

Two residents of the same village, who had taken shelter under a nearby neem tree, were injured in the incident.

In another incident reported from Revuru village in Mellacheruvu Mandal, several goats died after being struck by lightning. Important Safety Guidelines

Never stand under trees in fields during rain and thunderstorms, especially under palm trees and neem trees.

During strong winds and lightning activity, avoid staying in open areas and immediately move to a permanent house or a safe building.

Do not go near electric wires, transformers, or metal poles during rainfall and thunderstorms.

Farmers working in fields should closely monitor weather changes and move to safer locations before conditions worsen.

SP Narasimha IPS urged everyone to follow weather warnings and safety advisories to prevent loss of life. In case of emergencies, the public should contact the local police or dial 100 for assistance.

Addl. Collector Bhaskar Rao Participates in Friday Dry Day Programme at Masaipet

Former Corporator Sindhu Adharsh Reddy Meets Zonal Commissioner Over Drinking Water Issues in Vidyut Nagar Colony

11-Year-Old Found Driving Luxury Car on Hyderabad ORR; Father Booked

Hyderabad : An 11-year-old boy was allegedly found driving a luxury car on the Outer Ring Road (ORR) in Hyderabad, triggering concern after a video of the incident went viral on social media.

Acting on the viral footage, Rajendranagar Police identified the vehicle owner as Abdul Hadi, a resident of Tolichowki, and took him into custody for questioning.

Police registered a case against Abdul Hadi under relevant provisions for allowing a minor to drive a motor vehicle, an act that violates traffic and motor vehicle laws. The luxury car involved in the incident has also been seized.

Authorities reiterated that permitting underage children to drive poses a serious threat to road safety and warned that strict action will be taken against those found violating the law.

Cyberabad Police Impose Restrictions Around NEET-UG 2026 Exam Centres

(Capital Information)
Cyberabad : To ensure the smooth and peaceful conduct of the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET-UG) 2026, Cyberabad Police Commissioner Dr. M. Ramesh, IPS, has issued prohibitory orders under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS). The orders aim to maintain public order, prevent disturbances, and avoid any obstruction to candidates appearing for the examination.



As per the notification, the restrictions will be in force from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on June 21, 2026, at all NEET-UG examination centres located within the limits of the Cyberabad Police Commissionerate. During this period, the assembly of five or more persons within a radius of 200 metres from the examination centres has been prohibited.

The Commissioner has also directed that all photocopy (Xerox) and internet centres situated within 100 metres of the examination venues remain closed during the examination hours. The measure has been taken to prevent any malpractice and ensure a fair examination environment.

The order exempts police personnel, military personnel, Home Guards, Education Department flying squad teams, and funeral processions from its purview.

Cyberabad Police have cautioned that any person found violating the prohibitory orders will face prosecution under the relevant provisions of law.

Water Scarcity on One Side, Water Wastage on the Other : Pragathi Nagar Residents Demand Action

Medchal-Malkajgiri : The drinking water crisis in Pragathi Nagar is becoming increasingly severe. With declining groundwater levels due to inadequate rainfall and irregular municipal water supply, residents say they are already struggling to meet their daily water needs.

Amid these challenges, residents allege that repair works undertaken by the Water Board are leading to new problems. Last week, a pipeline leakage was identified and repaired near Aleap Circle. However, soon after the repair work was completed, another leakage emerged less than 200 meters away, raising concerns about the condition of the water distribution network.

Locals say it has become a recurring issue where fixing one leakage is followed by another appearing nearby. As a result, large quantities of treated drinking water are being wasted, with water flowing along nearly a kilometer of roadway.

Residents have expressed strong dissatisfaction over the wastage of precious drinking water at a time when many households are facing water shortages. They are urging the concerned authorities to conduct a comprehensive inspection of the pipeline network and implement a permanent solution rather than relying on temporary repairs.

"When people are struggling for drinking water, it is unfortunate to see such large-scale wastage. Fixing one leak only to see another appear nearby is not a sustainable solution," residents said.

Editorial

“R&D and capital infusion key to drive an industrial entity forward”

“A nation capable of meeting its own requirements moves forward with the greatest confidence towards safeguarding its interests,” said Raksha Mantri Rajnath Singh as he performed the Bhoomi Pujan for the state-of-the-art 10,000-Tons Aluminium Extrusion Press, along with Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis, at Ordnance Factory Ambajhari, Nagpur, a unit of Yantra India Limited (YIL) on June 19, 2026. He asserted that the Extrusion Press symbolises a shift in the country’s approach from relying on imports to producing critical goods domestically. He described taking control of security-related necessities as imperative in the present geopolitical scenario to remain future-ready.

The proposed press will be one of the most advanced facilities of its kind in the country. It will support the manufacture of large and complex aluminium alloy profiles required for defence systems & platforms, aerospace & aviation structures, missile programmes, railways & transportation sectors and other strategic industrial applications. The project will help reduce dependence on imports of critical aluminium extrusions and strengthen the domestic supply chain, while supporting the future requirements in strategic sectors through indigenous production.

“This extrusion press addresses a crucial need. Modern fighter jets, missiles, and advanced space programmes require metals that are lightweight and strong, capable of withstanding even the most extreme conditions. Such metals are produced through specialised processes. If the quality of the metal is superior, it will serve well in every situation,” said Raksha Mantri.

Highlighting the significant role played by Made-in-India equipment in the success of Operation Sindoor, Rajnath Singh stressed the need to increase the indigenous manufacturing of robust hardware to complement the bravery of defence forces personnel. He underlined that thousands of crucial components constitute the true strength of big machines, and the extrusion press will go a long way in making the nation self-reliant in this critical domain.

Raksha Mantri added that, today, while the nature of warfare is evolving and enemies are harder to detect, conventional warfare & its associated means remain just as relevant as they were in 1947, and will retain much of the same relevance in 2047 as well. He furthered that the importance of a strong military-industrial base will continue for a long time, and the Extrusion Press is a step towards fulfilling a major national need, keeping the future requirements in mind.

Rajnath Singh highlighted that the Government is marching ahead to realise Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s vision of Aatmanirbhar Bharat by simultaneously working on four key elements - technology, workforce, knowledge, and faith in the nation. He stated that the Government’s persistent efforts are yielding positive results as the domestic defence production, which stood at Rs 46,000 crore in 2014, has risen to a record Rs 1.78 lakh crore in Financial Year (FY) 2025-26. He added that the nation was exporting arms and equipment worth less than Rs 1,000 crore in 2014, which has now skyrocketed to an all-time high of Rs 38,424 crore. “This represents not just a rise in numbers, but a growth in India’s capabilities. Quality Education Key to Eliminating Inequality : Nuthi Srikanth Goud

Hyderabad : Telangana BC State Finance Corporation Chairman Nuthi Srikanth Goud has hailed the proposed Telangana Public School system as a landmark initiative aimed at ensuring educational equality and social justice. He said the programme, envisioned under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, would help bridge the gap between different sections of society through a common school framework.

In a statement issued on Friday, Srikanth Goud said that the future of the State is shaped in classrooms and that a common school system is the most effective way to eliminate disparities in education. Teachers must be provided with continuous, high-quality professional development to adopt interactive, modern pedagogical tools.

Education should never be reduced to a mere passport for a corporate paycheck. Its true purpose is to sculpt well-rounded individuals, critical thinkers, and empathetic citizens.

For a meaningful shift to happen, society must stop treating children as “rank-producing machines,” and institutions must look beyond commercial commercialization. Only when we consciously pivot from a relentless chase for marks to a dedicated mastery of skills can we truly unlock the potential of the next generation.

Oncology Team at Yashoda Hospitals, Malakpet Saves Life of AML Patient

Miryalaguda : Speaking at a press conference held in Miryalaguda town on Friday, Dr. Rohit Reddy, a Consultant Medical Oncologist at Yashoda Hospitals, Malakpet, explained that Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML) is a type of blood cancer that can rapidly progress to a life-threatening stage within days or weeks if treatment is delayed. He noted that these abnormal cells can spread through the bloodstream to other organs, potentially causing severe infections, uncontrollable bleeding, or organ failure.

He said that successful treatment and recovery of a 34-year-old man from Miryalaguda who was suffering from AML. Upon admission, the patient was in a critical condition; doctors quickly identified the illness not as a common ailment, but as Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML), a rapidly progressing blood cancer.

In this emergency situation, the expert oncology team at Yashoda Hospitals, Malakpet, stabilized the patient using fluids, antibiotics, and blood transfusions before initiating induction chemotherapy to destroy the cancer cells. Continuous medical monitoring and round-the-clock care helped control infections. Despite the severity of the leukemia and complications such as febrile neutropenia and MRD positivity, timely induction therapy “Remission was achieved through chemotherapy and HiDAC consolidation, continuous monitoring and supportive care played a crucial role,” they stated.

Gorukanti Pavan (Director), K. Srinivasa Reddy (Unit Head), and Srinivasa Chidura (Associate Vice President) of Yashoda Super Speciality Hospital, Malakpet, Hyderabad, emphasized that state-of-the-art oncology infrastructure and modern diagnostic technology combined with timely chemotherapy protocols, infection control, blood transfusion facilities, and continuous monitoring are essential for effectively managing complex and life-threatening blood cancers like AML. Vasu Kiran Reddy and others also participated in the event.

Collector, SP Inspect Site for New Traffic Police Station and Bharosa Centre in Nagarkurnool

Nagarkurnool : As part of efforts to strengthen traffic management and expand support services for women and children in Nagarkurnool town, the district administration has expedited the process of identifying suitable land for the construction of a newly sanctioned Traffic Police Station and Bharosa Centre.

In this regard, District Collector Hemant Keshav Patil and Superintendent of Police Dr. Sangram Singh G. Patil jointly inspected government land located near Kollapur Chowrasta within the Nagarkurnool Municipal limits on Friday. During the visit, they examined various aspects of the proposed site, including its geographical suitability, road connectivity, land extent, and public accessibility.

The Collector held discussions with officials regarding the land requirements for the proposed Traffic Police Station and Bharosa Centre and directed revenue authorities to submit complete details of the site. He instructed them to furnish information on survey numbers, government ownership status, total land extent, boundaries, and other relevant records at the earliest.

He further directed revenue officials to identify the required extent of government land and immediately prepare and submit proposals for the establishment of the two facilities.

Speaking on the occasion, the Collector noted that Nagarkurnool is rapidly developing as a district headquarters and that the number of vehicles in the town has increased significantly. With traffic congestion steadily rising at major junctions, he said the



establishment of a dedicated Traffic Police Station would enable more efficient traffic regulation and strengthen road safety measures.

The Bharosa Centre, he added, will provide integrated support services for women and children facing issues such as domestic violence, sexual harassment, and other forms of abuse. The centre will offer counselling, legal assistance, medical services, and police support under one roof, ensuring coordinated and victim-friendly services.

The Collector emphasized the need to allocate sufficient land to meet future requirements and to select a location conducive to the development of necessary infrastructure. He instructed officials to thoroughly verify all government land records and ensure that proposals are prepared without any legal complications.

Superintendent of Police Dr. Sangram Singh G. Patil stated that the government accords top priority to public safety and women's welfare. He expressed confidence that the establishment of the Traffic Police Station and Bharosa Centre in Nagarkurnool would bring police services closer to the people and enhance public convenience.

"Farmers Must Be Provided with Urea – Kakani"

Nellore : SPSR Nellore District: Amidst the severe difficulties farmers in the district are facing due to a urea shortage while cultivating the second crop (Edagaru), former MLA Kiliveti Sanjeevaiah, Rural In-charge Anam Vijay Kumar Reddy, Farmers' Wing President Shivuni Narasimha Reddy, along with farmers and farmers' association leaders, organized a protest rally. They highlighted the hardships caused by the lack of urea and submitted a representation to the Agriculture Officer at the District Agriculture Office, demanding that an adequate supply of urea be provided to meet the farmers' needs. The representation was submitted by the former Minister and YSR Congress Party District President of the undivided Nellore district, Kakani Govardhan Reddy.

Kakani staged a protest alongside farmers, vehemently criticizing the coalition government's policies regarding the urea shortage and other agricultural issues. He expressed deep concern that, at a time when the Edagaru crop season has commenced and farmers are fully engaged in cultivation, even essential

urea is unavailable to them.

He lashed out at the coalition government for remaining completely indifferent while farmers in the district face severe hardships due to the urea shortage.

He recalled that under the YSRCP government, led by Jagan Mohan Reddy, fertilizers, pesticides, and seeds were supplied in abundance to farmers through Rythu Bharosa Kendras (Farmer Support Centers) to meet their exact requirements.

Kakani remarked that while the Chandrababu government is one of mere words, Jagan's government is one of action.

He stated that the situation forcing farmers to take to the streets and stand in queues for hours to obtain urea is a clear indication of the coalition government's failure.

Farmers are already reeling under a heavy financial burden due to soaring cultivation costs. Kakani terms the creation of a urea shortage at such a critical juncture—thereby subjecting farmers to further hardship—as an atrocious act.

Kakani warns alliance leaders and officials to shake off their slumber and take



note of the ground realities.

Kakani warns that if the urea issue is not resolved, the agitation on behalf of the farmers will be intensified. Key points highlighted by Kakani:

The YSR Congress Party always stands at the forefront in supporting farmers who rely on their own hard work for a livelihood.

Cultivation for the second crop (Edagaru) has commenced in Nellore district, and paddy transplantation is complete; however, a urea shortage is severely plaguing the farmers.

No one understands why the Chandrababu government is treating farmers so inhu-

manely and engaging in vindictive actions.

Since coming to power, the alliance government has not taken a single farmer-friendly decision; instead, it is implementing policies that are detrimental to farmers.

Urea purchase cards were issued for Nellore district during the first crop season itself. Restrictions were imposed limiting farmers to just three bags per acre, prohibiting the use of any quantity beyond that.

Even regarding that allocation of three bags, Telugu Desam Party leaders forcibly diverted the stock and sold it on the black market.

It is a wretched situation

for farmers under this alliance rule; they are forced to spend Rs. 400 to Rs. 500 and purchase urea at double the standard price.

Farmers across the state are facing severe difficulties due to a lack of urea; some are incurring losses by purchasing it from the black market.

Previously, the card system for urea distribution caused inconvenience; now, the introduction of a new app-based system is causing further trouble for farmers, with tenant farmers facing particularly severe issues.

Landowners often reside abroad—where it is night while it is day here—creating complications with the OTP-

based verification process.

The coalition government lacks clarity regarding the limit on urea bags per acre; they initially set the limit at one-and-a-half bags, then raised it to two, and—only after we staged protests and questioned them—gradually increased it to three bags.

It is unfortunate that leaders are discouraging farmers from cultivating paddy—contrary to established farming practices—without providing alternative market avenues. One must recall the consequences faced by the Sri Lankan government after it forcibly imposed similar organic farming policies.

They cite health concerns arising from excessive urea usage as a pretext for introducing these agricultural apps; however, the coalition government is harassing farmers with apps and cards without first creating awareness about the issue.

Under the leadership of Jagan Mohan Reddy during the previous YSRCP government, we ensured the timely delivery of urea, fertilizers, and seeds directly to farmers' doorsteps through Rythu Bharosa Kendras (RBKs).

We ensured there was no shortage of urea anywhere

and eliminated the need for farmers to take to the streets in protest.

Prices of complex fertilizers, which ranged from ₹1,100 to ₹1,200 during the previous YSRCP government, have now risen to ₹2,100. ...have reached,

Officials state that the cost of complex fertilizers will be ₹2,400—meaning prices have doubled (a 100% increase); the alliance government has failed to control prices.

If farmers, unable to bear the hardships, abandon agriculture, the alliance government, the Chief Minister, and Lokesh intend to acquire those lands at low prices for industrial development and cash in on them; they have no concern for farmers' welfare.

The YSR Congress Party government is the one that has always stood by the farmers.

While the YSR Congress Party government provided 'Rythu Bharosa' assistance to 54 lakh farmers, the current alliance government has reduced the number of beneficiaries to 47 lakh and is providing the aid in a meager, inadequate manner.

MASQUITOES MAJOR ENEMIES OF PUBLIC HEALTH

"Let us prevent mosquitoes from breeding and biting" : Dr. Mainampalli Simhachalam, District Malaria Control Officer

Nellore : An awareness seminar and rally regarding malaria were held on Friday at Krishna Chaitanya Nagar in Bujabuja Nellore to mark the National Malaria Awareness Month. The event was organized jointly by the District Medical and Health Department, the District Malaria Control Department, and the Community Paramedics and Primary Health Care Providers Welfare Association (PMP Association of India).

Speaking as the chief guest, District Malaria Control Officer Dr. Mainampalli Simhachalam stated that the month of June is observed annually as National Anti-Malaria Month to safeguard public health ahead of the monsoon season in India. He explained that the primary objectives of this observance are to curb the spread of mosquitoes, conduct door-to-door fever surveys, and raise awareness about environmental sanitation.



He emphasized that mosquitoes are major enemies of public health and noted that the programs are being conducted with the specific goal of preventing them from breeding and biting. It was stated that mosquitoes spread diseases such as malaria, filariasis (elephantiasis), dengue, encephalitis, and chikungunya, and that species like Anopheles, Culex, and Aedes commonly breed in and around our homes.

Residents were advised to observe "Friday Dry Day" by emptying water from coolers, pots, plastic drums, and old tires to keep these areas dry

and prevent mosquito breeding. Preventive measures suggested included spraying insecticides around the home, taking anti-malarial medication as prescribed by a doctor, conducting anti-larval spraying in areas where water accumulates, sleeping under mosquito nets, maintaining cleanliness in the surroundings, installing wire mesh on windows, and wearing full-sleeved clothing.

Baddepudi Narasimhagiri, the Corporator of the 25th Division, inaugurated the rally and spoke about the importance of immediate action upon noticing symptoms such as fever, chills,

headache, body aches, and fatigue. He urged people to undergo blood tests at the nearest government Primary Health Centre (PHC) and, if diagnosed with malaria, to take the prescribed anti-malarial medication regularly.

He also informed the public that free malaria testing, mosquito control medicines, and mosquito nets are available at nearby government hospitals or health centres and encouraged everyone to make use of these facilities.

Subsequently, Malaria Control Officer Mailapalli Simhachalam was felicitated in a grand manner.

Additional Malaria Officer Jayaram, PHC Hospitals Coordinator Kondapuram Venkateswarlu, Seshu School Correspondent B. Adishesu, K. Suresh, D. Former Corporator Gangadhar Reddy Demands Action Against Nala Encroachments

Complaint Submitted to MRO Against Akruti Constructions

Serilingampally : Former Gachibowli Division Corporator V. Gangadhar Reddy has submitted a representation to the Serilingampally Mandal Revenue Officer (MRO), urging immediate action against alleged encroachments on a government nala and public land by Akruti Constructions in Survey No. 21 of Gopanpally village under the Serilingampally constituency.

In his complaint, Gangadhar Reddy alleged that the construction company had encroached upon government land and undertaken unauthorized construction activities by occupying a natural drainage channel (nala). He expressed concern that despite the government's commitment to protecting public lands, lakes, and nalas, illegal encroachments continue to



take place at the ground level.

He stated that the alleged encroachment not only affects government land but also impacts a village cremation ground and a natural water channel that serves as a crucial drainage route for nearby water bodies. Such actions,

he said, pose a serious threat to public interests and environmental sustainability.

Gangadhar Reddy warned that obstruction of the nala could lead to severe flooding in surrounding colonies and villages during periods of heavy rainfall. He further

noted that blocking natural water flow channels to lakes could adversely affect ecological balance and groundwater recharge.

Demanding immediate intervention, he urged revenue authorities to conduct a detailed site inspection, remove all encroachments on the government land, nala, and cremation ground, and restore them to their original condition. He also called for stringent legal action against those responsible to prevent similar violations in the future.

The former corporator emphasized that authorities must act swiftly in the larger public interest. He cautioned that if prompt action is not taken, local residents and villagers may be compelled to launch large-scale protests to safeguard public resources and community infrastructure.

Speaking on the occasion, Collector Ila Tripathi informed the Chief Electoral Officer that the district administration has finalized all arrangements to conduct the SIR process strictly in line with the guidelines, timelines issued By, the Election Commission. She highlighted that multi-level training programs have already been conducted, that three rounds of meetings have been held at the district level with ERO's, AERO's, representatives of various political parties. NIRMAL DISTRICT PUSHES DIGITAL PAYMENTS TO CURB IRREGULARITIES IN STREE NIDHI LOAN RECOVERIES

Nirmal, June 19 : Authorities in Nirmal district have intensified efforts to strengthen transparency in the Stree Nidhi loan recovery system by accelerating the adoption of digital payment mechanisms and introducing cashless collection methods through POS machines. Stree Nidhi, which provides financial assistance to women self-help groups, has recorded encouraging progress across the district in both loan disbursement and recovery. However, officials are also facing challenges arising from weak field-level monitoring and allegations of financial irregularities in certain areas. According to official data, Nirmal district currently has 57,476 loan beneficiaries who have collectively received loans worth ₹50.94 crore. Against a total demand of ₹137.24 crore, recoveries amounting to ₹116.46 crore have been achieved, resulting in an overall recovery rate of 84.86 percent. Nevertheless, outstanding dues of ₹20.78 crore remain pending across the district. Officials say that lapses in supervision, particularly at the Village Organization Assistant (VOA) level, have created opportunities for misuse of funds in some villages. Allegations have surfaced that inadequate monitoring enabled certain representatives of women's groups to divert collected money for personal use, affecting repayment performance and undermining public confidence in the programme. To address these concerns, the district administration is rapidly expanding online payment systems and encouraging borrowers to make repayments through POS machines. The new cashless model ensures that collected amounts are directly credited to official bank accounts, reducing the scope for manual handling of cash and enhancing accountability. Block-wise performance shows significant variations. Dilawarpur emerged as the top performer with a recovery rate exceeding 98 percent, closely followed by Lokesra. Swashakti, Nirmal Rural and Basar also recorded strong performances with recovery rates above 90 percent. Several other mandals maintained satisfactory repayment trends. However, Khanapur remained the weakest performer with a recovery rate of just over 53 percent and accumulated arrears exceeding ₹2.33 crore. Pembi and Navayuga Urban Federation also registered comparatively low recovery percentages, highlighting the need for stronger field-level intervention. The district has simultaneously excelled in extending fresh credit to self-help groups. Against an annual credit plan target of ₹106.49 crore, authorities facilitated loan disbursements worth ₹115.36 crore, achieving 108.33 percent of the target. A total of 11,047 self-help groups with more than 87,000 members are currently associated with the programme. Lokesra Mandal has emerged as a stand-out performer in credit expansion as well. Against a target of ₹9.41 crore, it disbursed ₹12.95 crore, achieving 137.61 percent of its goal while maintaining a robust recovery rate of nearly 99 percent. Officials have warned that strict action will be initiated against individuals involved in financial misappropriation. They stated that cases of fraud and deliberate non-payment could attract action under the Revenue Recovery Act, including legal proceedings and imprisonment. With digital payment systems becoming central to the recovery process, the district administration aims to eliminate leakages, improve financial discipline and safeguard the long-term sustainability of the Stree Nidhi programme for women self-help groups.

Section 163 BNSS Enforced for NEET (UG) - 2026 Examination - Stringent Security Arrangements in Place

The restrictions will remain in force from 12:00 PM to 7:00 PM on the day of the examination in the vicinity of all exam centres.

Restrictions:

- Gathering of more than five persons within a 200-metre radius of examination centres is prohibited.
- Public meetings, rallies, protests, demonstrations, and campaign activities are not allowed.
- Use of loudspeakers, microphones, and DJ systems is strictly prohibited.
- Internet centres, photocopy (Xerox) centres, and stationery shops must remain closed during the examination period.
- Students are advised not to bring mobile phones, electronic watches, or any other electronic gadgets

into the examination centres.

Security Arrangements:

Two examination centres have been established in Bhupalpally district:

1. Government Degree College, Bhupalpally
2. Government Junior College, Bhupalpally

The following security measures have been put in place:

- Strong police deployment at all examination centres.
- Special police patrolling teams in surrounding areas.
- Surveillance and monitoring teams to prevent any untoward incidents.

Mulugu GP Appointment Sparks Political Controversy

Questions Raised Over Withdrawal of Support to Dalit Lawyer ; Allegations of Lobbying for BC Advocate

Mulugu, June 19 : The appointment of the Government Pleader (GP) for Mulugu district has triggered a political controversy, with allegations that a recommendation initially made in favour of a Dalit advocate was later withdrawn to accommodate another lawyer belonging to the Backward Classes (BC) community. According to sources, a Madiga community advocate aspiring for the GP post had approached the local Congress MLA and reportedly secured a recommendation letter. After the recommendation was forwarded to the Secretariat, the advocate was said to be confident of receiving the appointment. However, developments thereafter allegedly altered the course of the selection process. Political circles claim that intensive lobbying was undertaken on behalf of a BC advocate who had earlier served as Assistant Government Pleader during the previous BRS regime. Reports suggest that a prominent advocate from the same community, who had previously served as an MPP under the then TRS government, played a key role in influencing the process. Allegations have also surfaced that the original recommendation in favour of the Dalit advocate was sidelined and a fresh recommendation was introduced into the file. Questions are now being raised over whether any procedural irregularities or file tampering occurred, although no official confirmation has emerged so far. The controversy has taken another turn with reports that the Dalit advocate lodged a police complaint alleging that the rival aspirant verbally abused and threatened him over the phone. Legal circles, however, contend that there has been little visible progress in the investigation. Sources close to the Dalit advocate say he has expressed deep dis-

appointment, claiming that he was initially assured support but was later denied an opportunity. He is understood to have approached Dalit leaders and public representatives seeking intervention. The matter was reportedly brought to the attention of the local Member of Parliament, who is said to have assured the complainant that the issue would be examined and appropriate justice ensured. Meanwhile, some lawyers and political leaders have reportedly submitted complaints to the Law Department against the BC advocate in contention, alleging irregularities during his tenure as Assistant Government Pleader. The complaints reportedly question his handling of government cases and allege that he continued to discharge responsibilities even after the expiry of his tenure without formal extension. The advocate concerned has not yet publicly responded to these allegations. The developments have sparked debate within political and legal circles. Questions are being raised as to why individuals associated with key positions during the previous BRS administration are allegedly continuing to enjoy support from sections of the present Congress leadership. What began as an appointment process for a legal post has now evolved into a wider discussion involving political influence, social representation, Dalit empowerment, and the continuing influence of former BRS networks in local governance. The government's final decision on the GP appointment is being closely watched across the district. 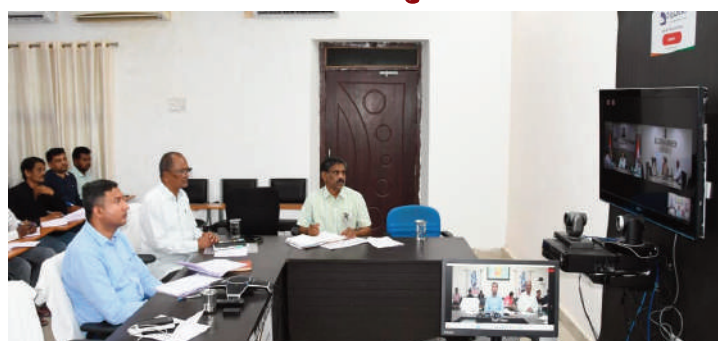

CEO SUDARSHAN REDDY CALLS FOR FLAWLESS VOTER LIST REVISION

1,200 voters and that members of the same family are assigned to the same polling station wherever feasible.

Khammam District Collector Divakar TS, who participated in the review meeting, said awareness programmes had been conducted for representatives of recognized political parties across the district. Training sessions for Booth Level Officers and Booth Level Agents were also organized, while wide publicity is being carried out through banners, hoardings and electronic media. The meeting was attended by Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Dr. P. Srija, Khammam Municipal Commissioner Abhishek Agastya, Kalluru Sub-Collector Ajay Yadav, Special Deputy Collector Sadanandam, Khammam RDO Srinivas and other election officials.
