

Farmers should take up crop diversification, says CM at State Formation Day celebrations

(Capital Information)
Hyderabad : Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy stressed on the need for crop diversification and wanted farmers to cultivate new crops to transform Telangana into a land of diverse and abundant harvests.

During this Rabi season, the State government procured 63.65 lakh metric tons of paddy and deposited Rs.11,903 crores directly into farmers' accounts. This apart, nearly 10,000 metric tons of soaked paddy was procured to rescue farmers from losses due to unseasonal rains, he said.

Addressing at the State Formation Day celebrations here on Tuesday, the Chief Minister said the cultivation of sorghum (Jonna) and maize crops in the State also witnessed an unprecedented surge.



Telangana farmers created a new record by cultivating maize approximately in 16 lakh acres and sorghum across 4 lakh acres during this Yasangi season. The government bore an expenditure of nearly Rs. 4,275 crores for procurement of maize and so far and Rs. 1,154 crores for procurement of sorghum, he said.

The Chief Minister said several projects, including those undertaken by the Congress government under the Jalayagnam initiative in 2004 and a few launched in 2014-15 remained incomplete.

The government was working with determination to complete the pending projects by undertaking the necessary land acquisition. Efforts were on to revive the Pranahita-Chevella project, he said.

"I recently wrote a letter to Maharashtra Chief Minister on Tummidihatti barrage. Following discussions, we will formulate and implement an action plan to construct the Tummidihatti Barrage," Revanth Reddy stressed.

The Chief Minister

briefed about a few initiatives taken up by the State government. A law has been designed to guarantee social security for the elderly and enacted legislation to ensure accountability regarding the maintenance of parents, bringing not only government employees but also elected public representatives under its purview, he stated.

Similarly about four lakh gig workers were currently employed in the State. Until now, their jobs and their livelihoods lacked any form of security and the Telangana government enacted a law specifically to ensure their job security, he said.

To recognize the services of those who fought for separate Telangana and ensure their families receive due justice, the government constituted a

Committee under the leadership of K Keshava Rao and Prof Kodandaram.

"Based on the Committee report, we will appropriately honour all the freedom fighters of Telangana," he said.

In view of the scorching heat, the Chief Minister presented his address in brief. He said all the details to be shared by the government were incorporated in the booklet distributed to the people.

Before concluding his speech, the Chief Minister stated that the State government was aiming to transform Telangana into a one-trillion USD economy by 2034, and a three trillion USD economy by 2047.

"To realize this, we are seeking the unwavering support of the people and their cooperation and blessings," Revanth Reddy said.

GOVT COMMITTED TO WELFARE, DEVELOPMENT

Khammam Bureau : Reiterating the Telangana Government's commitment to inclusive growth, Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu said welfare, development and social justice remain the three pillars guiding the State's administration. The minister participated as the chief guest and handed over the sanction documents of Indiramma houses and 2BHK houses to the beneficiaries at the Kaloji Kalakshetra in Hanumakonda on Tuesday. Warangal MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya, Warangal West MLA Nayini Rajender Reddy, District Collector Chahat Bajpayee, public representatives and officials participated in the program.

Later, the minister said that the state government under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy is working with the welfare of the poor as its top priority. CM to review critical PRLIS works, conduct joint aerial inspection with Karnataka Minister, and address massive public meeting at Uddandapur

ages 2 and 3 covering the Narlapur Reservoir and canal works, Package 1 and the Mahatma Gandhi Kalwakurthy Lift Irrigation Scheme (MGKLI) Lift-I at Yellur, Package 8 comprising the Stage-III Pump House and Vattem Reservoir network, Packages 14 and 15 relating to the Karivena Reservoir, and Packages 17 and 18 associated with the Uddandapur Reservoir.

Additionally, the Chief Minister will conduct a joint aerial inspection of the Koilsagar Project and proposed barges on the Krishna and

Bheema rivers alongside Karnataka Minor Irrigation Minister N.S. Boseraju. Sanjeev Mudiraj noted that this joint inspection reflects the Congress government's proactive commitment to resolving inter-state water issues through cooperation and constructive dialogue, securing Telangana's fair share of water without political disputes. ented approach to dairy farm management can enhance profitability. Professor Dr. K. Padmaja created awareness among farmers regarding animal health care and the prevention and control of various livestock diseases.

Despite its rarity and global recognition, the sector remains significantly under-monetised. Mission Senehjori seeks to bridge this value gap by creating a premium, traceable and export-oriented Muga silk economy.

The Mission adopts a cluster-based approach covering major Muga silk producing districts including Jorhat, Sivasagar, Lakhimpur, Dhemaji, Dibrugarh, Tinsukia, Majuli and Suaikuchi. The initiative envisages strengthening host plant ecology, establishing modern reeling infrastructure, promoting Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs), creating Common Facility Centres (CFCs), enforcing GI authentication and building global market access under the unified brand identity "Senehjori".

Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, Union Minister, MDoNER, stated that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Government is committed to ensuring that the unique strengths and products of the North Eastern Region receive global recognition and generate sustainable livelihoods for local communities. He noted that Assam's Muga silk is not merely a textile product but a cultural and civilisational heritage asset of India.

The Minister highlighted that Mission Senehjori has been conceptualised on the principle of not just "whole-of-government", but with the "whole-of-government" approach, with convergence across Central Ministries, the Government of Assam, technical institutions and private-sector partners. The Mission, with an estimated investment of ₹396–411 crore over a three-year period, including ₹136–151 crore from MDoNER, the Mission aims to create a globally recognised luxury Muga silk ecosystem, enhance value realisation for producers and position Assam as a leading destination for silk-based cultural and experiential tourism.

He further observed that the Mission's success would be reflected when authentic Assam Muga silk secures premium shelf space in domestic and international luxury markets while ensuring significantly higher incomes for rearer and weaver households across the State. He reaffirmed the Government's commitment towards strengthening the entire Muga silk value chain through infrastructure development, branding, quality assurance and export facilitation.

Addressing the gathering, Scindia described today as a historic day for Assam and for the North Eastern Region. He recalled the deep emotional bond that first inspired this Mission, noting that it was at an Ashtalakshmi Mahotsav stall showcasing Assam's Muga silk – not merely the fabric but finished garments – that the idea for Mission Senehjori truly took shape. He underlined that Assam accounts for 90 percent of the world's Muga silk production, and that the sector's unique character – its natural golden colour, exceptional durability and GI-backed traceability – places it in a league of its own among luxury textiles globally. He noted that despite the extraordinary effort of farmers and entrepreneurs, producers today earn only ₹18,000–21,000 per year from Muga silk, and that Mission Senehjori is designed to decisively transform this reality. The Minister emphasised the Prime Minister's vision of a whole-of-government, whole-of-India approach as the guiding principle behind the Mission, with the ultimate objective that the full premium value of Muga silk travels from farm gate to foreign shores – and most importantly, reaches the weavers and rearers of Assam.

According to the local residents and police, solar panel company manager Sharath resides in Vasundhara Nagar with his family. Consequently, the refrigerator and the gas cylinder exploded one after another with a deafening sound.

Upon receiving information, the fire brigade and police personnel rushed to the spot. Firefighters responded swiftly and brought the flames under control, preventing the fire from spreading to adjacent houses.

As a precautionary measure, electricity department personnel disconnected the power supply in the area by removing the fuse carriers. It has been preliminarily estimated that property worth lakhs of rupees was destroyed, and the house was completely damaged in the incident. Police have registered a case and started an investigation.

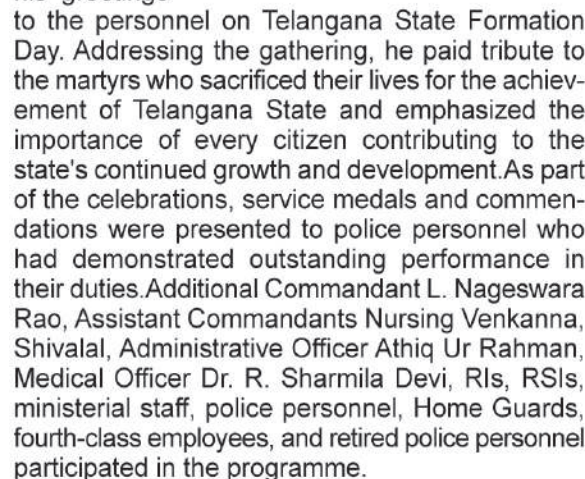

NALLABELLI SARPANCHES SEEK GREATER ROLE

Warangal, June 02 : Sarpanches of Nallabelli Mandal have urged the District Collector to ensure that beneficiaries for welfare schemes, including Indiramma Housing, are selected only through Gram Sabhas conducted under the chairmanship of elected village sarpanches, in accordance with G.O. Ms. No. 33 dated October 11, 2024, issued under the Panchayat Raj Act. The sarpanches stated that village development activities, implementation of welfare schemes, and beneficiary selection should be carried out through Gram Sabhas headed by elected local bodies. They pointed out that although the government and concerned ministers have repeatedly emphasized the role of Gram Sabhas in implementing welfare programmes, the system is not being effectively followed at the grassroots level. They expressed concern that Indiramma Committees, formed during the period when panchayat elections had not been conducted, continue to play a dominant role in beneficiary selection. The delegation argued that continuing with such committees diminishes the authority and responsibilities of elected panchayat bodies and leaves sarpanches with only a nominal role in governance. They requested



the district administration and Panchayat Raj officials to recognize the statutory powers of elected local bodies and ensure that Gram Sabhas chaired by sarpanches are given due importance in village development, welfare implementation, and beneficiary identification. VASUDEVA RAO FIRES BACK AT CPI

Khammam Bureau, June 02 : BJP State Treasurer Devaki Vasudeva Rao strongly criticized CPI MLA Kunamneni Sambasiva Rao for his remarks against the Bharatiya Janata Party, terming them irresponsible and unbecoming of a senior political leader. Speaking at a meeting held at the BJP district office in Khammam under the leadership of District President Nelluri Koteswara Rao, Vasudeva Rao said it was ironic that leaders of parties unable to secure electoral victories on their own were targeting the BJP, the world's largest democratic political party. ONE-YEAR JAIL TERM IN CHEQUE BOUNCE CASE

Khammam Legal, June 02 : The Court of the II Additional Judicial First Class Magistrate, Khammam, presided over by Judge Apuri Bindupriya, sentenced D.V. Padma of Kalluru Mandal to one year of imprisonment in a cheque bounce case after finding the charges proved during trial. According to the prosecution, the complainant P. Ravi Kumar of Khammam town had lent ₹2 lakh to the accused on January 12, 2021, for family needs. A promissory note was executed on the same day. When the complainant later demanded repayment, the accused issued a cheque dated December 23, 2021, for the said amount. However, when the cheque was presented for encashment, it was dishonoured due to insufficient funds in the accused's bank account. Following the dishonour of the cheque, the complainant issued a legal notice through his counsel and subsequently filed a private complaint before the court. After examining the evidence and hearing the witnesses, Judge Apuri Bindupriya held the accused guilty and awarded a one-year jail sentence.

State Formation Day Celebrations Marked with Tributes to Martyrs, Welfare Commitments, and Development Milestones in Narayanpet

Narayanpet : Telangana State Formation Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm at Narayanpet district headquarters on Tuesday, where State Minister for Sports, Dairy Development, Animal Husbandry, Fisheries and Youth Services, Vakiti Srihari, participated in the official celebrations and addressed a large gathering.

Extending his heartfelt greetings to the people of Telangana on the occasion of the State Formation Day, the Minister paid rich tributes to the martyrs who sacrificed their lives for the achievement of Telangana statehood.

The government's long term development agenda, Srihari said that under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, Telangana is progressing towards becoming a model state in India and on the global stage through the ambitious Telangana Rising 2047 Vision Document. He noted that the vision focuses on economic growth, social progress, transparent governance, world-class infrastructure, and inclusive welfare policies.

The Minister stated that the government has already formulated key policies, including the Welfare and Social Justice Policy, Green Energy Policy, Infrastructure and Industrial Policy, and Tourism Policy, to ensure comprehensive development across all sectors.

Empowering Women Through Welfare and Economic Opportunities: Srihari emphasized that women's empowerment remains a cornerstone of the government's agenda. Several initiatives have been introduced to uplift women, including free travel in RTC buses, LPG cylinders at ₹500, free electricity up to 200 units, and Indiramma Housing.

The government is also promoting women's economic par-



ticipation by enabling self-help groups to operate petrol pumps, manage Mahila Shakti canteens, and run commercial stalls at Shilparamam. Additionally, women's groups have been encouraged to purchase buses and lease them to RTC, with 150 buses already handed over.

Historic Farm Loan Waiver and Support for Farmers: The Minister described the government's farm loan waiver programme as a landmark achievement in the country's agricultural history. Within eight months of assuming office, the government waived crop loans worth ₹20,617 crore, benefiting over 25.35 lakh farmers.

Under the Rythu Bharosa scheme, farmers are receiving ₹12,000 per acre as financial assistance. The government is also procuring every grain produced by farmers and ensuring payments are credited to their bank accounts within 24 hours. A bonus of ₹500 per quintal is being provided for fine varieties of paddy.

Welfare Measures for the Poor: Srihari said the government is implementing Indiramma Housing and fine rice distribution schemes to improve the quality of life of economically weaker sections. He also highlighted Telangana's efforts in social justice, including caste census initiatives and the decision to provide 42 percent

reservations for Backward Classes.

Employment and Educational Opportunities for Youth: Calling the youth the true architects of the people's government, the Minister said employment generation and skill development remain top priorities. Financial assistance is being extended to Civil Services aspirants through the Rajiv Abhaya Hastham scheme, while 58 Young India Integrated Model Schools are being established across the state.

Massive Housing Push Under Indiramma Scheme: The government has launched an ambitious programme to construct 4.5 lakh Indiramma houses across Telangana, with 3,500 houses allocated to each constituency. Financial assistance is being released in phases based on construction progress. Special focus has also been given to tribal communities, with 10,000 houses sanctioned for Chenchu families.

Narayanpet District Registers Significant Development: Presenting district specific achievements, Srihari said nearly two lakh farmers in Narayanpet district received financial assistance worth ₹421 crore under Rythu Bharosa during 2025-26.

A total of 6,526 Indiramma houses have been sanctioned in the district, of which 1,151

have already been completed and occupied.

In Kishtapur village of Dhanwada mandal, 50 beneficiaries received support under the SC Corporation for irrigation facilities, while 35 Dalit women were provided tailoring training and sewing machines worth ₹7 lakh.

Narayanpet became the first district in the state where a petrol pump is being successfully operated by a women's federation. During the current financial year, loans worth ₹237 crore have been sanctioned to 2,438 self-help groups.

Development works worth ₹58.54 crore are underway in Makthal, Narayanpet, Kosgi and Maddur municipalities. As part of the Haritha Haram programme, over 25.82 lakh saplings have been planted across forest and non-forest areas.

Irrigation, Infrastructure and Agriculture: The Telangana government has accorded administrative approval for the Makthal Narayanpet Kodangal Lift Irrigation Scheme with an estimated cost of ₹4,725 crore to provide irrigation to one lakh acres. Farmers who lost land for the project have been compensated at the rate of ₹20 lakh per acre.

The district has also witnessed major progress in agriculture, fisheries and rural infrastructure. Five warehouses

with a combined storage capacity of 22,500 metric tonnes have been established with NABARD support, while large fish fingerlings have been released into reservoirs and tanks.

Strengthening Health, Education and Public Services: The Minister noted that Narayanpet district achieved a pass percentage of 97.82 percent in the recent SSC examinations, securing the 14th rank in the state. Breakfast facilities will be introduced in government schools from June 12, while students continue to receive nutritious food, including ragi malt and eggs.

Mission Bhagiratha is ensuring safe drinking water supply to every household, while nearly 30,000 new ration cards have been sanctioned in the district.

Healthcare services have also improved significantly, with an increase in institutional deliveries and the enhancement of Aarogyasri health coverage from ₹5 lakh to ₹10 lakh.

Commitment to Law and Order and Future Growth: The Minister announced that a new Bharosa Centre for women and child protection has been established in the district headquarters. New traffic signals have been installed to improve road safety, and ₹38 crore has been sanctioned for the construction of the District Police Office complex on seven acres of land.

Congratulating the district police for maintaining peace and order, Srihari called upon citizens to actively participate in the district's development journey and contribute towards building a prosperous Telangana.

Concluding his address, the Minister reiterated the government's commitment to inclusive growth, social justice, welfare and sustainable development, and extended Telangana State Formation Day greetings to all citizens.
