Collector appointed inquiry committee on death of student

Jogulamba Gadwala : District Collector Rizwan Basha Sheikh said in a statement on

Sunday that an independent inquiry committee has been appointed into the incident of the student's death at Gadwala Government Hospital on Saturday.

Indu (17), a student from Erravalli mandal center, was admitted to the Gadwala government hospital on Friday as her family members were suffering from stomach pain. The doctors there examined her as appendicitis and took her to the room for operation on Saturday, alleging

that she died due to the negligence of the doctors.

In the wake of her family's concerns and



complaints to the higher authorities, the collector appointed a six-member independent inquiry committee to find out the truth.

The collector members were ordered to examine the case sheet, treatment notes,

laboratory reports, etc. of the deceased and conduct a thorough investigation.

Hospital supervisors and concerned medical officers should provide full cooperation to the committee members for the investigation. He warned that serious action will be taken against the concerned officials as per the rules if they do not cooperate with the committee members.

On this occasion, the District Collector said that appropriate action will be taken based on the report received after the investigation of the committee.

Ward Members, Deputy Sarpanches Seek Monthly Honorarium

Kodad : Demanding greater recognition and financial security for grassroots public representatives, Mr. Dosapati Ravi, Deputy Sarpanch of Kagitha Ramachandrapuram (K.R. Puram) village in Nadigudem mandal, has appealed to Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy to provide a minimum monthly honorarium to all Gram Panchayat Ward Members and Deputy Sarpanches across Telangana.

In a representation submitted to the Chief Minister, Mr. Ravi stated that Ward Members and Deputy Sarpanches play a vital role in implementing government welfare schemes, addressing local issues and contributing to vil-

lage development.

Despite their significant responsibilities, many grassroots representatives continue to face financial hardships due to the absence of any fixed remuneration, he said.

Mr. Ravi noted that several elected representatives dedicate considerable time and effort to public service, often at the cost of their own livelihoods. Extending financial support through a monthly honorarium would strengthen local governance and improve the effectiveness of Panchayati Raj institutions, he added.

Among the key demands placed before the government are the introduction of a minimum monthly honorar-

ium for all Ward Members, a higher honorarium for Deputy Sarpanches considering their additional responsibilities, special allowances for official duties, travel and communication expenses, and the extension of welfare measures such as health insurance and pension benefits.

"Village-level leadership is the backbone of the nation. Strengthening them means strengthening democracy itself," Mr. Ravi said, urging the state government to take positive steps to empower local representatives and reinforce the Panchayati Raj system, which forms the foundation of rural development and grassroots governance.

Three Friends Saved, Young Man Loses Life in Toledo Bend Reservoir, Funeral in Kavadipalli

Shaligouraram/Tungathurthi : The mortal remains of Koduri Anuroop Reddy, a native of Shaligouraram in Nalgonda

district, who sacrificed his life while saving three friends in the United States, have arrived in India.

Anuroop Reddy, who had completed his graduation in the US just a few weeks ago, went swimming with friends at the Toledo Bend Reservoir on May 29. When three of his friends were caught in a strong water current, Anuroop, an experienced swimmer, rescued them one by one and brought them safely to shore. However, while returning, his legs became entangled in a fishing wire beneath the water, and he was swept away by the strong current, losing his life.

His parents, Koduri Rajender Reddy and Durga Bhavani, reside in Kavadipalli village of Abdullapurmet mandal, on the outskirts of Hyderabad. His



final rites will be conducted in Kavadipalli.

State Honors on June 9:

The government is arranging official honors for Anuroop Reddy in accordance with protocol. Bhongir MP Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy played a key role in facilitating the transportation of the mortal re-

mains from the United States.

Under the supervision and coordination of government officials, the funeral will be held on June 9 at 11:00 AM in Kavadipalli.

The news of Anuroop Reddy's death has left the residents of Shaligouraram and Kavadipalli in deep grief.

Family's Appeal:

Family representative Nookala Padma Reddy stated that all arrangements are being made under official protocol and government supervision, with the support of MP Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy.

Expressing deep sorrow, Reddy community leader Chada Lokender Reddy said that Anuroop Reddy's untimely death is an irreparable loss to his family and the community.



Police Save Man's Life After Suicide Attempt in Zaheerabad

Traffic Restrictions Likely Around Miyapur on June 8 Due to CM's Public Meeting

Cyberabad : Commuters travelling through Miyapur and adjoining areas have been advised to plan their journeys in advance as heavy traffic congestion is expected on Monday, June 8, owing to the Telangana Chief Minister's public meeting and the Miyapur Flyover Foundation Programme.

The event is scheduled to be held near Shivalayam, Miyapur Bus Stop, and is expected to draw large crowds and increased vehicular movement between 4:30 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.

According to Cyberabad Commissioner of Police Dr. M. Ramesh, National Highway-65 (NH-65) and surrounding roads in the Miyapur area are likely to witness significant traffic congestion during the programme. Special traffic arrangements will be in place to regulate vehicle movement and ensure public safety.

Motorists have been requested to avoid the affected routes during the specified hours and make use of alternative roads wherever possible to minimize inconvenience.

The Cyberabad Traffic Police appealed to the public to co-operate with traffic personnel and follow traffic advisories to facilitate smooth movement of vehicles and effective traffic management during the Chief Minister's programme.

DCP Ritiraj Leads Surprise Raid at KPHB Pub; 9 Staff Taken Into Custody

Cyberabad : In a late-night surprise inspection, the Deputy Commissioner of Police (Kukatpally Zone), Ritiraj, along with Additional DCP Shameer, DI K. S. Ravi, and police personnel, conducted a raid at Kings and Queens (Club Masti) Pub within the limits of KPHB Police Station during the intervening night of June 6 and 7.

During the inspection, police allegedly found several violations by the pub management, including facilitating solicitation and prostitution, failing to prevent the entry of minors into premises where liquor was being served, operating beyond permitted timings, serving liquor and food in violation of government regulations, and functioning without a valid police No Ob-



jection Certificate (NOC).

Police officials noted that multiple cases had previously been registered against the establishment. Based on the findings of the raid, nine staff members, including four women and five men, were taken into custody and shifted to the police station for further legal action.

According to police, prima facie evidence suggests that the pub owner was allegedly using women

to attract male customers and generate inflated bills for wrongful financial gain, besides facilitating immoral activities and procuring women for customers.

A case has been registered under Crime No. 716/2026 under Sections 223, 292, 318(4) read with 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and Sections 5 and 8 of the Prevention of Immoral Trafficking (PIT) Act. Police said further investigation is underway.

Anna Hazare Helped Unseat a Government. Could the 'Cockroach Party' Give the Opposition a Boost?

Narayanpet : In 2011, social activist Anna Hazare launched a nationwide movement demanding the implementation of the Lokpal Bill. The campaign attracted the support of various social activists, public figures, and political personalities. What began as an anti-corruption movement soon evolved into a broader public awakening, encouraging citizens to question the policies and performance of the government.

As the movement gained momentum, millions of people expressed their dissatisfaction with the ruling establishment. Political analysts believe that this growing public sentiment played a significant role in shaping the outcome of the 2014 General Elections, where voters opted for change and a new government came to power.

In 2014, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), along

with its National Democratic Alliance (NDA) partners, formed the government at the Centre. Since then, the BJP has remained the dominant political force in Indian politics.

Over the years, however, sections of the public have voiced concerns and criticism regarding various government policies and decisions. Against this backdrop, a recent and unexpected social media phenomenon has attracted considerable attention.

A humorous reference involving the word "cockroach," reportedly made by a Supreme Court judge, quickly went viral among young people. What initially appeared to be an internet trend soon transformed into a symbol of political expression and activism.

Inspired by this momentum, a group of young people launched a social media plat-

form called the "Cockroach Janata Party." According to supporters, the platform attracted more than 20 million followers within a month, making it one of the most talked-about grassroots movements on social media.

On June 6, the founders and members of the Cock-

roach Janata Party organized a protest at Jantar Mantar, raising their voices on a range of public issues and concerns. The demonstration sparked debate about whether the movement is merely a social media trend or the beginning of a larger political force.

History has shown that when young people unite around a common cause, their influence can extend beyond social media and into electoral politics. Anna Hazare's movement, too, was initially viewed as a public protest against corruption, yet its political impact was felt across the country in the years that followed.

This raises an important question: Could the Cockroach Janata Party emerge as a factor in the upcoming elections? Could it help channel public dissatisfaction and indirectly benefit opposition parties? And perhaps the

biggest question of all: just as India witnessed a political shift in 2014, could another significant change take place in 2029?

At present, there are no definitive answers. Elections are shaped by multiple factors, including leadership, governance, economic conditions, public sentiment, and voter turnout. Nevertheless, the rise of the Cockroach Janata Party highlights the continuing power of youth engagement and social media in shaping political discourse.

Whether this movement remains an online phenomenon or develops into a broader political force will depend on its ability to sustain public interest, build grassroots support, and translate digital popularity into real-world influence. Until then, it remains one of the most intriguing political developments to watch in the run-up to 2029.



Illegal Farmland and Venture Advertisement Boards Removed

Editorial “From Recommendation to Merit: Governance Reforms Reshaped Public Aspirations”

Twelve years of the Narendra Modi government have transformed India into an aspirational nation driven by opportunity, innovation and self-belief, Union Minister Dr. Jitendra Singh said on Sunday while talking to media, asserting that governance reforms, technological democratisation and citizen-centric policies have fundamentally changed the way Indians perceive their prospects. The Minister also outlined the next phase of growth, stating that India's space economy, currently close to \$9 billion, is expected to expand to about \$45 billion over the next seven to eight years as the country advances towards the goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047.

Reflecting on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 4,399 days in office as a continuously serving elected Prime Minister, Dr. Jitendra Singh highlighted a range of measurable outcomes over the past decade. He said India's space startup ecosystem had grown from a single-digit number of startups a few years ago to around 400 today, with one startup recently attaining unicorn status. India's space economy is now valued at nearly \$9 billion and is projected to reach \$45 billion by the end of the next seven to eight years. The Minister said the country's startup ecosystem had expanded from about 350-400 startups in 2014 to more than 2.3 lakh at present, generating nearly 24-25 lakh jobs. Nearly half of these startups are located in Tier-II and Tier-III cities, while 35-39 per cent are women-led. He also noted that a recent space launch witnessed the participation of around 1,500 media personnel and nearly 10,000 spectators, reflecting growing public engagement with science and technology.

Dr. Jitendra Singh said some of the government's earliest reforms symbolised a shift towards a citizen-centric governance model. He cited the decision to end the requirement of gazetted-officer attestation of documents and permit self-attestation as a landmark step that signalled trust in citizens, particularly the youth. The Minister also referred to the abolition of interviews in several categories of government recruitment, saying the move reduced opportunities for nepotism, discretion and malpractice while strengthening merit-based selection. These reforms helped create confidence that success could be achieved through ability and hard work rather than influence or recommendation, the Minister added.

Arguing that the most profound change of the past 12 years has been psychological, in addition to procedural, Dr Jitendra Singh said India had witnessed the rise of a new aspirational culture. "The change of mindset that has happened in the last 12 years under Prime Minister Modi is one of the biggest hallmarks," he said. "The kind of aspirational surge that has happened — 'I can also do it' — was not there earlier." The Minister said this shift was visible in the growing number of civil services toppers emerging from small towns and non-metropolitan backgrounds, reflecting the democratisation of opportunity through technology, transparency and fair competition.

The Minister also linked India's scientific achievements to this broader transformation. Referring to the Chandrayaan missions, he said the government had fostered a culture in which citizens increasingly identify with national scientific achievements and view innovation as a shared national endeavour. He recalled that Prime Minister Modi encouraged scientists after setbacks and celebrated their successes, helping normalise the idea that failure is a part of innovation and progress. Dr. Jitendra Singh said India's successful landing near the Moon's south pole had strengthened public interest in science, while earlier discoveries by Indian lunar missions had helped identify evidence of water molecules on the Moon.

Highlighting institutional changes, Dr. Jitendra Singh said the Modi government had opened strategic sectors such as space and parts of the nuclear ecosystem to private participation, ending decades of restricted access. He said these sectors had traditionally operated behind closed doors but were now integrated with industry, entrepreneurs and startups. According to the Minister, this policy shift had expanded career opportunities, accelerated innovation and aligned India's scientific ecosystem with global best practices. He also noted that initiatives such as Viksit Bharat reflected a broader emphasis on benchmarking India's progress against international standards rather than domestic comparisons alone.

Telangana Activists Demand Unconditional Apology from Pawan Kalyan, Warn Against Insult to Telangana Self-Respect

Mahabubnagar District Telangana Movement Leaders Pass Unanimous Resolutions; Call for Removal of Andhra Leaders' Statues from Hyderabad

(Capital Information) **MAHABUBNAGAR** : Telangana activists have strongly condemned the recent remarks made by Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan during Telangana Formation Day celebrations, alleging that his speech was aimed at undermining Telangana's identity and insulting the sacrifices made during the Telangana movement. They warned that any attempt to belittle Telangana's self-respect would not be tolerated and demanded that Pawan Kalyan issue an unconditional apology to the people of Telangana.

A meeting of Telangana movement activists from the erstwhile Mahabubnagar district was held on Saturday at Mahboobia Hall under the chairmanship of former ALMEWA State President Sheikh Farooq Hussain. During the meeting, speakers unanimously adopted several resolutions and strongly criticized what they described as misleading and baseless statements made by Pawan Kalyan. The speakers alleged that Pawan Kalyan's comments regarding revolutionary balladeer Gaddar were historically inaccurate. They stated that the attack on Gaddar took place during the tenure of then Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu and rejected Pawan Kalyan's claim that he had personally attended to Gaddar in the hospital.

The activists pointed out that Pawan Kalyan was not active in politics during that period and termed his remarks as completely false. The leaders also recalled the Telangana statehood movement, emphasizing that more than 1,200 students and youth sacrificed their lives for the cause of Telangana. They stated that the formation of Telangana became possible due to these sacrifices and the decision taken by Congress leader Sonia Gandhi to create the separate state.

Referring to past political developments, the speakers said that former Rajya Sabha member and Union Minister Chiranjeevi had once advocated making Hyderabad a Union Territory. They recalled that AIMIM leader Asaduddin Owaisi had strongly opposed the proposal and firmly supported a united Telangana with Hyderabad as its capital. The activists suggested that Pawan Kalyan should revisit these historical facts before making public statements on Telangana's history.

The meeting further resolved that leaders from Andhra Pradesh should not seek a share in Telangana's political authority. Activists demanded the removal of statues of Andhra leaders from Hyderabad and warned that if the government failed to act, Telangana activists would continue their agitation until such statues were removed.

The speakers asserted that Telangana's existence, identity, and self-respect must be protected at all costs. They accused certain Andhra political leaders of attempting to distort the history of the Telangana movement and vowed to resist such efforts collectively.

Medal Analysis of Recent Olympics

(Capital Information) **Hyderabad** : The last two Olympic editions have been definitive turning points for Indian sports, showcasing a visible shift from "participation" to "podium finishes."

A) 2020 Tokyo Olympics (Held in 2021) – The Historic High

Tokyo 2020 was India's most successful Olympic Games at the time, with a record haul of 7 medals (1 Gold, 2 Silvers, 4 Bronzes). Neeraj Chopra created history by winning the Gold medal in the Men's Javelin Throw. This was India's first-ever Olympic medal in track and field. The Indian Men's Hockey Team won a Bronze medal, breaking a painful 41-year-old Olympic medal drought and reviving the national game. Mirabai Chanu (Weightlifting - Silver), Lovlina Borgohain (Boxing - Bronze), and PV Sindhu (Badminton - Bronze) proved India's growing dominance in women's sports. PV Sindhu became the first Indian woman to win two individual Olympic medals. Ravi Kumar Dahiya (Silver) and Bajrang Punia (Bronze) maintained India's streak of podium finishes in wrestling.

B) 2024 Paris Olympics – Consistency & Heartbreaks

India finished its Paris 2024 campaign with 6 medals (1 Silver, 5 Bronzes). While the total count was one less than Tokyo, the Games highlighted incredible individual depth, especially in shooting. Manu Bhaker became the first athlete of independent India to win two medals in a single Olympic edition (Bronze in Women's 10m Air Pistol and Bronze in 10m Air Pistol Mixed Team with Sarabjot Singh). Swapnil Kusale added another Bronze in the 50m Rifle 3 Positions. Neeraj Chopra secured a Silver medal in Javelin Throw, becoming the first Indian track-and-field athlete to win back-to-back Olympic medals. The Men's Hockey Team showcased phenomenal grit to secure consecutive Bronze medals at the Olympics.

The "Fourth-Place" Heartbreak: Paris 2024 saw as many as six Indian athletes/crews finishing in the agonizing 4th position (including Lakshya Sen in Badminton and Arjun Babuta in Shooting), missing out on medals by the narrowest of margins.

2. Analytical Insights into India's Progress

A deeper dive into the recent performances reveals crucial trends shaping Indian sports:

- India is no longer a one-sport country at the Olympics. Medals are now flowing from diverse fields like Athletics, Shooting, Badminton, Weightlifting, Boxing, and Hockey.
- Class physical and technical standards, there is an urgent need to invest more heavily in sports psychology to handle high-pressure Olympic moments.
- 3. Future Olympic Roadmaps & Targets**

With lessons from Tokyo and Paris, India's sports administration has set a structured trajectory for the upcoming cycles.

A) 2028 Los Angeles Olympics (LA28) Goals

Breaking the Double-Digit Barrier:

The immediate target for LA28 is to secure 10+ medals. High-potential athletes who finished 4th or 5th in Paris are being given dedicated pathways to convert those placements into medals. Cricket (T20 format) is making its official return at the LA28 Games. Given India's global dominance in cricket, both the Men's and Women's national teams will enter as heavy medal favorites, significantly boosting the country's prospects. Young prodigies discovered through the Khelo India Youth Games who are currently aged 16–20 are being fast-tracked into elite training camps specifically tailored for LA28.

B) 2032 Brisbane Olympics & Beyond

Aiming for the Top 20: India aims to comfortably break into the Top 20 nations in the overall medal tally. To achieve this, resources are being diverted to sports that offer a high volume of medals with relatively lower global participation density, such as Archery, Rowing, and Fencing.

4. The Grand Dream: 2036 Olympic Games Host Bid

India's ultimate sports ambition extends beyond the podium; the country has formally submitted a bid to host the 2036 Olympic and Paralympic Games, with the mega-city of Ahmedabad, Gujarat, envisioned as the primary hub. If selected by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), this move will completely revolutionize India's sports infrastructure, mirroring the transformation seen in nations like China after Beijing 2008. Hosting the games would exponentially increase India's talent pool and yield a massive surge in medals due to automatic qualification slots and local crowd support.

Conclusion:

India's Olympic journey has firmly transitioned from an era of solitary, sporadic victories to a structured culture of consistent, multi-medal performances. The blueprint currently in motion points toward an unprecedented performance at the 2028 Los Angeles Games.

Huge Quantity of Banned Amber Gutka Packets Seized in Bhupalpally District

SCHOLAR AND EDUCATIONIST DR. KANDALA RAMAIAH URGES TELANGANA GOVERNMENT TO INTRODUCE 'TELANGANA STUDENT MERIT AWARD'

Mulugu, June 07 : Renowned educationist, psychologist, and National Secretary of the National Best Teachers Forum, Dr. Kandala Ramaiah, has appealed to the Telangana Government to introduce a unique merit-based scholarship scheme titled "Telangana Student Merit Award" for outstanding students studying in government schools and junior colleges across the state. In a statement issued here, Dr. Ramaiah said that a majority of students studying in government educational institutions come from economically weaker sections of society, particularly from rural and urban poor families. Despite securing excellent results in SSC and Intermediate Public Examinations, many talented students face financial hurdles in pursuing higher education. District-Based Scientific Selection Process Proposed To address this challenge, Dr. Ramaiah proposed that each district be treated as a separate unit and that the most meritorious students in SSC and Intermediate Public Exam-

inations be selected annually through a transparent and scientific evaluation process. Under the proposed scheme: SSC toppers would receive an annual scholarship of ₹10,000. Intermediate toppers would receive an annual scholarship of ₹15,000. The scholarships should be continued for a period of five years, enabling students to pursue higher studies without financial constraints. 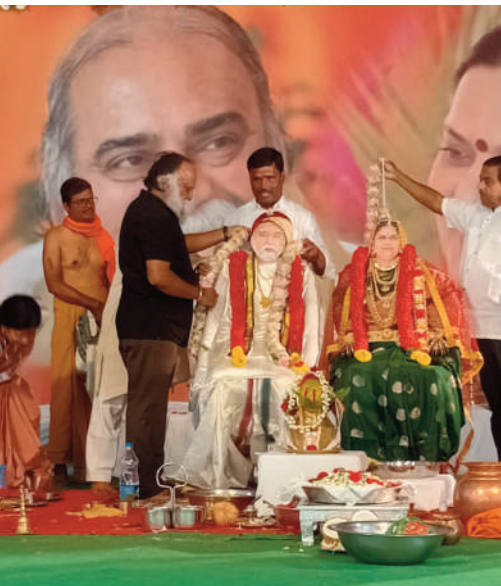

* Congress has utterly betrayed the farming community, alleges BRS leader * Confident of BRS securing over 100 seats in the next assembly elections

Peddapalli Bureau : Senior Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leader and former minister Thanniru Harish Rao launched a scathing attack on the ruling Congress government on Sunday, accusing it of completely failing both the farming community and the student demographic in Telangana. Speaking at a high-level party meeting, Rao asserted that public resentment against the current administration is rapidly peaking and expressed absolute confidence that the BRS would storm back to power by securing over 100 seats in the next assembly elections.

The extensive meeting of key party workers was presided over by former Peddapalli MLA Dasari Manohar Reddy, with Harish Rao attending as the chief guest.

Congress Defaulted on Cru-

cial Public Welfare Schemes

Addressing the massive gathering of party loyalists, Harish Rao pointed out that indispensable public welfare initiatives—such as the Fee Reimbursement program for students, along with the flagship Rythu Bandhu (farmer investment support) and Rythu Beema (farmer insurance) schemes—have ground to a complete standstill under the Congress regime.

He reminded the audience that the previous BRS government had prioritized agrarian welfare by successfully disbursing an unprecedented ₹73,000 crore across 11 consecutive phases directly into the bank accounts of farmers. Conversely, he mocked the Congress administration for completely ditching the Rythu Bandhu scheme and leaving the state's Annadatas (farm-



ers) entirely in the lurch.

"During the elections, the Congress party claimed that ₹35,000 crore was required to execute a complete farm loan waiver. Yet, once in power, they allocated a meager ₹20,000 crore in the budget, essentially leaving the farmers completely deceived," Thanniru Harish Rao, Former

Minister & BRS Senior Leader **Fertilizer Crisis and Procurement Failures**

Reflecting on the BRS party's ten-year governance, Harish Rao highlighted that the state never witnessed a shortage of fertilizers, ensuring that agricultural operations proceeded seamlessly year after year. Today, how-

ever, farmers are being forced onto the streets, running from pillar to post just to procure basic fertilizers under the Revanth Reddy-led government. He further alleged that the crucial Rythu Beema scheme, which once stood as a financial bedrock for grieving agricultural families, has been systematically dismantled.

Adding to the farmers' woes, the former minister brought up the absolute failure of the state mechanism in purchasing maize. He stated that farmers have been pushed to the extreme of buying their own gunny bags to store and safeguard their yield, while massive heaps of harvested paddy continue to rot at procurement centers (Kallalu) due to absolute government apathy.

People Regret Voting for Congress :

Koppula EshwarEchoing similar sentiments, former minister Koppula Eshwar stated that while Telangana witnessed stellar, comprehensive progress under the BRS regime, the Congress administration has managed to push the state back by several years within a short span. "In every village, citizens are regretting their choice, openly

wondering why on earth they voted for the Congress. The return of KCR's visionary leadership is the need of the hour," Eshwar stated.
