

QUALITY INFRASTRUCTURE KEY TO RURAL PROGRESS : MINISTER THUMMALA

Khammam Bureau : State Minister for Agriculture, Marketing, Handlooms and Textiles, Thummal Nageswara Rao, inaugurated a newly constructed Veterinary Hospital building built at a cost of ₹30 lakh and laid the foundation stone for CC roads and drainage works worth ₹97 lakh under SUDA funds in V.V. Palem village of Raghunatha palem mandal on Monday. He was accompanied by Addl Collector (Local Bodies) Dr. P. Srija.

Speaking on the occasion, the Minister said that all village development works should be executed with high quality standards so that they benefit future generations. He recalled his long association with V.V. Palem and stated that successive governments have contributed to the village's growth. He also stressed the importance of maintaining cleanliness in villages and directed officials to identify land for housing sites for the poorest families.



Addl Collector Dr. P. Srija said that the establishment of a Veterinary Hospital at the sub-centre level reflects the importance of the region. She emphasized the need for farmers to explore alternative crops and noted that livestock serves as a crucial source of income for rural families. The new facility, she said, would enhance veterinary healthcare services for farmers and livestock owners.

CM Inaugurates Bachupally Flyover, Launches Infrastructure Projects Worth Over ₹321 Crore

Hyderabad : In a major boost to Hyderabad's transportation infrastructure, the Telangana Government on Monday inaugurated the Bachupally Flyover and launched two key road development projects aimed at improving connectivity, easing traffic congestion, and enhancing road safety in the city's rapidly expanding western corridor.

The projects were inaugurated and launched by the Hon'ble Chief Minister as part of the Government's ongoing efforts to strengthen urban infrastructure and support Hyderabad's growth as a leading economic and technology hub.

The newly completed Bachupally Flyover, constructed by the Hyderabad Metropolitan Development Authority (HMDA), was inaugurated at the busy Bachupally Cross Roads junction. The 1.30-kilometre-long flyover has been designed to facilitate seamless traffic movement between Miyapur Cross



Roads and Gandimaisamma, one of the city's rapidly developing residential and commercial stretches.

Built at a cost of ₹65.53 crore, the four-lane flyover features a 17.5-metre-wide carriageway supported by 19 piers and abutments. The project also includes two additional two-lane slip roads extending 1.30 kilometres. Officials said the flyover would significantly reduce traffic congestion, improve travel efficiency, enhance road safety, and provide faster connectivity for

commuters.

On the occasion, the Chief Minister also laid the foundation stone for the construction of major bridges across the Musi River near ORR Exit No. 18A, a major infrastructure project being undertaken by Hyderabad Growth Corridor Limited (HGCL).

Estimated at ₹229 crore, the project includes construction of bridges on service roads along both sides of the Outer Ring Road and development of a new service road connecting ORR

Exit No. 18A Interchange with Narsingi Ring Road. The proposed works also cover raising of approach roads, drainage improvements, protection works, and installation of traffic safety infrastructure.

Officials said the project would eliminate disruptions caused by flooding at existing low-level causeways, ease traffic congestion near Nandi Circle, and provide uninterrupted all-weather connectivity to key growth centres such as Narsingi, Kokapet, and the Financial District. Administrative approval has already been granted, and tenders are expected to be invited shortly.

Another major initiative launched on the occasion was the expansion of the Left Main Carriageway (MCW) of the Outer Ring Road from Nanakramguda to Gachibowli, aimed at addressing increasing traffic volumes in the Gachibowli and Financial District region.

AP Govt's Tailoring Skill Development Initiative Trains Over 60,000 Women; Targets 2 Lakh Beneficiaries in Three Years

Amaravati : The Government of Andhra Pradesh has successfully trained more than 60,000 women from Backward Classes (BC) and Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) under its large-scale tailoring skill development initiative aimed at promoting self-employment and economic empowerment.

Implemented through the Andhra Pradesh BC Financial Corporation in coordination with various EWS Corporations, the program is designed to equip



women with industry-relevant tailoring and garment-making skills, enabling them to pursue sustainable livelihood opportunities.

The initiative follows a structured 360-hour training curriculum covering tailoring techniques, garment construction, machine operations, and entrepreneurship development. Participants who complete the program and meet attendance requirements undergo assessment based on National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) standards and receive

DGP C.V. Anand Revives Staff Officers Meetings to Strengthen Coordination in Telangana Police

Hyderabad : Director General of Police C.V. Anand, IPS, has revived the long-discontinued "Staff Officers Meeting", an important institutional mechanism aimed at enhancing coordination among senior officers and streamlining policing initiatives across Telangana.

The first meeting under the revived system was held at the Telangana Police Headquarters in Hyderabad, bringing together senior officers working in the DGP's office and Heads of Departments (HoDs) from various wings of the police department.

Chairing the meeting, the DGP emphasized the need for regular interaction and directed that such meetings be conducted once every fortnight to ensure better coordination, faster decision-making, and effective implementation of departmental policies and reforms.

Key Decisions and Discussions

One of the major decisions taken during the meeting was the creation of a structured database of domestic workers, including those from Nepal and other countries, to strengthen monitoring and security mechanisms.

The meeting also reviewed the implementation of CCTNS 2.0, expansion of core policing applications, and greater integration of emerging technologies such as Artificial Intelligence (AI), drones, and data intelligence systems to improve policing efficiency and service delivery.

Minister Vivek Venkata Swamy Completes One Year in Office; Highlights Labour Welfare and Governance Reforms

Hyderabad : Telangana Labour and Employment Minister Vivek Venkata Swamy on Monday completed one year in office and highlighted the key achievements of his tenure, emphasizing labour welfare, skill development, employment generation, and transparency in governance.



Expressing gratitude to Congress national leadership, AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge, Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi, Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, fellow ministers, and government officials, the Minister said he had been working with dedication inspired by the ideals and values of his father.

Landmark Gig Workers Act

Describing the introduction of the Gig Workers Act as one of the most satisfying achievements of his tenure, Vivek Venkata Swamy said the legislation would benefit nearly four lakh gig workers across Telangana. He announced that detailed rules and regulations for the implementation of the Act would be notified shortly.

Focus on Labour Welfare

The Minister stated that the Congress government has accorded priority to labour welfare after years of neglect. He noted that wage revision measures implemented by the government have brought significant relief and improved the livelihood of workers across various sectors.

Major Push for Skill Development

Highlighting efforts to improve employability among youth, the Minister said the government has undertaken the modernization of Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) by upgrading them into Advanced Training Centres (ATCs) with an investment of ₹2,500 crore.

He said additional ATCs would be established across the state and that specialised overseas employment training programmes are being conducted through TOMCOM to equip youth with skills required for international job markets. The government also plans to

introduce a new agriculture-related skill development course in the near future.

Improving ESI Healthcare Services

The Minister said the government is strengthening facilities in ESI hospitals to provide better healthcare services to workers and their families. Several infrastructure and service improvements are currently being implemented.

Action Against Sand Mafia

Vivek Venkata Swamy said the government has taken strong measures to curb illegal activities in the sand sector. Following the directions of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, several reforms have been introduced, including:

- * Installation of CCTV surveillance at all sand reaches and centres.
- * Introduction of online registration systems.

MINISTER PONGULETI ENSURES ROOFS OVER THE HEADS OF THE POOR

Khammam Bureau : Telangana Revenue, Housing and Information Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy reaffirmed the State Government's commitment to ensuring that every eligible poor family owns a permanent house. Participating in Indiramma housewarming ceremonies at Rajupeta and Gattu Singaram villages in Kusumanchi mandal on Monday, the Minister said the flagship housing programme is transforming the lives of thousands of underprivileged families across the state.

Accompanied by District Collector Diwakara T.S., Ponguleti interacted with beneficiaries and reviewed the progress of houses sanctioned under the scheme. He stated that the government is implementing the programme transparently and without political bias, ensuring that only eligible families receive the benefit. To facilitate timely completion of houses, bills are being released every Monday based on construction progress.

The Minister noted that several beneficiaries in both villages have already completed construction and moved into their new homes, while others are at various stages of completion. He emphasized that the government's objective is not merely to sanction houses but to ensure that beneficiaries successfully complete construction and enjoy the dignity and security of homeownership.

Ponguleti further announced that the second phase of the Indiramma Housing Scheme is underway, with plans to sanction an additional 2,000 houses in every Assembly constituency. He assured that the programme would continue in phases until every deserving homeless family is provided a permanent dwelling. TGEAPCET-2026 Counselling to Begin from June 19; First Phase Seat Allotment by July 10

Hyderabad : The Telangana Engineering, Agriculture and Pharmacy Common Entrance Test (TGEAPCET)-2026 admission counselling process will commence on June 19, with the Telangana Council of Higher Education (TGCHE) announcing a detailed multi-phase schedule for admissions into professional courses across the State.

The schedule was finalized at a meeting of the TGEAPCET-2026 Admission Committee held on Monday under the chairmanship of Prof. V. Balakista Reddy, Chairman of the Telangana Council of Higher Education, at the council's conference hall in Hyderabad. The meeting was attended by Smt. A. Sridevasena, I.A.S., Commissioner of Technical Education and Convenor of TGEAPCET-2026 Admissions, along with other committee

members.

According to the schedule, the First Phase of counselling will begin with online filing of basic information, payment of processing fee, and slot booking for certificate verification from June 19 to June 28. Certificate verification for candidates who have booked slots will be conducted from June 22 to June 29.

Candidates can exercise web options from June 25 to July 1, with option freezing scheduled for July 1. A mock seat allotment will be displayed on or before July 4, enabling students to assess their chances and revise preferences. Modification of options will be permitted from July 5 to July 7, after which the final freezing of options will take place on July 7.

The First Phase seat allotment results will be announced on or before July 10, and candidates must complete tuition fee payment and self-reporting through the counselling portal between July 10 and July 14.

The Second Phase of counselling, intended exclusively for candidates who did not participate in the first phase, will be conducted from July 17 to July



dates must complete tuition fee payment and self-reporting through the counselling portal between July 10 and July 14.

The Second Phase of counselling, intended exclusively for candidates who did not participate in the first phase, will be conducted from July 17 to July

24. Authorities clarified that candidates participating in the second phase must exercise fresh options, as options exercised during the first phase will not be carried forward.

Seat allotment for the second phase will be released on or before July 22, followed by fee pay-

ment and self-reporting until July 24. Candidates allotted seats in this phase must physically report to their respective colleges between July 25 and July 28.

The Admission Committee emphasized that physical reporting after second-phase allotment is mandatory. Candidates must submit photocopies of required certificates along with the original Transfer Certificate (TC) and obtain an acknowledgement from the institution. Students failing to report after securing a seat in the second phase will not be permitted to participate in the final phase of counselling.

The Final Phase of coun-

selling is scheduled from July 31 to August 7 for candidates who did not attend either the first or second phase. Fresh option entry will be mandatory, irrespective of previous counselling participation. Final phase allotments will be announced on or before August 5, followed by fee payment, self-reporting, and reporting to colleges in case of branch or college changes.

The committee also announced a Centralized Internal Sliding process for students seeking a change of branch within the same institution. The option entry for internal sliding will be conducted on August 12 and 13, with allotments to be released on or before August 15. Eligible candidates can report to their newly allotted branches between August 16 and August 17.

Officials clarified that vacancies arising after internal sliding

cannot be filled through spot admissions but may subsequently be filled through second-year lateral entry admissions under ECET.

The committee further stated that spot admissions for university, constituent, and private unaided engineering colleges will be conducted as per guidelines to be published on the counselling website on August 16.

Meanwhile, academic classes for the 2026-27 academic year will commence from August 1, in accordance with the AICTE academic calendar. Category-A and Category-B admissions will be conducted simultaneously.

Students and parents have been advised to regularly monitor the official counselling portal for updates, notifications, and detailed guidelines.

Dharmapuri Municipal Chairperson Inspects Government Hospital, Reviews Civic Issues at Ward Sabha

Pragathi Nagar Residents Face Hardship as Municipal Water Supply Remains Disrupted for Weeks

Medchal - Malkajgiri : Residents of Pragathi Nagar's Jagan Studio area are facing severe difficulties due to the absence of municipal water supply for the past several weeks. With no regular water supply, many households are being forced to rely on private water tankers and alternative sources to meet their daily needs.

Locals have expressed concern over the prolonged disruption and have urged the concerned authorities to address the issue on a priority basis. Residents are demanding the immediate restoration of municipal water supply and a permanent solution to prevent such recurring problems in the future.



The ongoing shortage has disrupted daily household activities and increased the financial burden on families, as many are spending additional money on private water supply. Residents allege that officials have been making repeated visits to the area but have yet to provide a permanent solution to the water crisis.

Adding to their frustration, residents point out that Pragathi Nagar traditionally faces groundwater shortages during the summer months. They question why major pipeline repairs and maintenance works are being undertaken during this critical period when dependence on municipal water is at its highest.

Residents are now calling for urgent intervention from the civic administration to restore regular water supply and ensure better planning of maintenance works to avoid such hardships in the future.

Relatives Eye Property of Childless Elderly Woman; Complaint Lodged with Collector Peddapalli Collector orders municipal officials to conduct immediate inquiry

Peddapalli Bureau : An elderly childless widow, Avunuri Madhunamma from Bandarikunta town, has lodged a complaint with the District Collector alleging that her relatives illegally registered her residential property. She expressed deep anguish that her relatives took advantage of her helpless situation and claimed that local public representatives are supporting them.



According to Madhunamma, her husband passed away in 2021 due to COVID-19, and she has since been working in a hotel to survive. She explained that the six-gunta property originally belonged to her father-in-law. However, following the demise of a family member, her relatives Mallamma and Padma secretly executed a fraudulent gift deed, registering the land and her current residence under Saliganti Padma's name last year.

Madhunamma further alleged that the 19th ward councilor, instead of helping her, is actively supporting the perpetrators and assisting them in constructing a compound wall around her house. Suffering from severe mental agony over losing her home, she approached the weekly Prajavani grievance program on Monday to seek justice. Responding to the petition, the Collector immediately directed municipal officials to conduct a thorough inquiry into the property dispute.

Sangareddy : District Superintendent of Police (SP) Paritosh Pankaj has urged the public to make use of the National Lok Adalat scheduled to be held on June 20. In a statement, the SP said that Lok Adalat provides an excellent opportunity for people to correct mistakes made in moments of anger and to resolve disputes amicably.

He advised citizens to stay away from unnecessary conflicts and avoid situations that could create difficulties in their lives. The SP noted that Lok Adalat plays a significant role in helping parties reach mutually agreeable settlements in long-pending cases where compromise is legally permissible. To ensure the success of the National Lok Adalat, the SP instructed police personnel at all levels—from officers to constables—to act responsibly and conduct counseling sessions for parties involved in compromise-eligible cases. He emphasized the need to maximize the number of settlements through coordinated efforts.

The SP further stated that Lok Adalat offers a speedy, simple, and amicable mechanism for dispute resolution and called upon officials to create greater public awareness about its benefits.

Indian Railways Sanctions Upgradation of Electric Traction System on Mahbubnagar-Secunderabad-Medchal Section

New Delhi (PIB) : Indian Railways has sanctioned a significant project to enhance rail operations on the Mahbubnagar-Secunderabad-Medchal section of South Central Railway. Under the project, the existing 1x25 kV electric traction system will be upgraded to a modern 2x25 kV electric traction system. The work will be undertaken over this approximately 141 route kilometre rail section at a cost of ₹285.01 crore.

The project is part of Indian Railways' ongoing efforts to enhance capacity on busy rail corridors across the country. The introduction of the 2x25 kV system will provide a more stable and efficient power supply for train operations, making rail services smoother, safer and more reliable.

Woman Arrested with Ganja Worth Rs. 2 Lakh Near Peddapalli Railway Station

Patrolling police team apprehends Maharashtra-based beautician smuggling 4.05 kg of contraband (Capital Information)

Peddapalli Bureau : The local police apprehended a woman smuggling a large quantity of contraband near the Peddapalli railway station premises. Announcing the arrest at a press conference on Monday, Peddapalli ACP G. Krishna stated that police seized 4.05 kg of dry ganja, valued at approximately ₹2 lakh, along with a mobile phone from her possession.

The accused was identified as Are Bhagyavathi, alias Bhagya, a beautician from the Chandrapur district of Maharashtra. Driven by greed for easy money over the last six months, Bhagyavathi had been purchasing ganja at lower prices near the Nagpur railway station and selling it at inflated rates in and around Godavarihkhani, where her estranged husband resides.

On June 7, after purchasing the contraband from an unidentified source in Nagpur, she arrived at Peddapalli station by train. Upon spotting a police patrolling team, she panicked and tried to flee. Suspecting her behavior, the alert police team chased and caught her, discovering the dry ganja inside her bag.

While the supplier remains at large, higher officials commended and rewarded SIs J. Laxman Rao and J. Naresh, along with their team, for their swift action.

Editorial BHAVYA Scheme to Promote Competitive Development of Industrial Parks Across States

In a significant step towards the operationalisation of the Bharat Audyogik Vikas Yojana (BHAVYA), Union Minister of Commerce & Industry, Piyush Goyal, launched the BHAVYA Portal today in New Delhi.

Addressing the gathering, Piyush Goyal said that the BHAVYA Scheme will adopt a competitive model under which States will be encouraged to submit detailed project proposals highlighting their industrial strengths, availability of land, investor interest and sectoral potential. He said the Government will work closely with industry to identify the most suitable sectors and infrastructure requirements for each location, whether for chemicals, manufacturing, data centres or other industries. He added that investors would be able to access detailed information on industrial parks through digital platforms, including land availability, connectivity and surrounding infrastructure, enabling them to make informed investment decisions. The scheme will seek to ensure that industrial parks are designed according to the specific needs of different sectors and investors, making them more attractive destinations for domestic and global investments.

The Minister said that over the past decade, the Government has focused on creating an enabling environment for economic development and social welfare through investments in roads, highways, railways, metros, airports, ports, power infrastructure, water availability and digital connectivity. He highlighted reforms such as GST, the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, labour reforms, expansion of 5G connectivity, promotion of startups, support for investments, and free trade agreements with complementary economies to promote trade, investment and technology transfer.

Goyal said that India is increasingly being viewed as a trusted partner and an attractive investment destination because of its scale, growing demand, young talent and youthful energy. He added that the Government remains committed to creating opportunities for businesses, industry, farmers, fishermen, startups and women entrepreneurs.

Announcing the BHAVYA Scheme, the Minister said that it aims to develop 100 industrial parks across the country to promote large-scale job creation through greater investments. He said the parks will be developed in different sizes, ranging from 25 acres in hilly regions, smaller Union Territories and Northeastern States, to between 100 and 500 acres in mid-sized States and regions, and up to 1,000 acres in locations closer to cities and towns, depending on need assessment and the commitment of States.

He informed that land for the parks will be provided by the State Governments, while the Government of India will support infrastructure creation through the National Industrial Corridor Development Corporation (NICDC), which will partner with States under a 51:49 model. He said the objective is to create plug-and-play industrial parks focused on industries best suited to specific locations.

The Minister said that the parks will provide infrastructure including assured water and power supply, road and rail connectivity, land titles, digital single-window clearances and, where feasible, air connectivity. He added that the Government will also explore earmarking areas for startups, deep-tech enterprises, technology-oriented businesses, research and development activities, and innovation-led enterprises.

Goyal said that efforts will be made to establish modern testing facilities in partnership with institutions such as BIS, Export Inspection Agency and FSSAI so that investors have access to advanced testing infrastructure within the parks.

He stated that the scheme is intended to help investors commence operations more quickly by reducing the time spent on land acquisition and approvals. He added that environmental clearances and industry-specific requirements would be planned in consultation with relevant authorities and based on the suitability of each location.

The Minister said that the Government is also open to developing dedicated areas for Global Capability Centres (GCCs), worker housing and social infrastructure within the parks. He further said that the possibility of creating dedicated international enclaves in partnership with countries such as Japan, Singapore, the Republic of Korea and Switzerland could be explored to facilitate investment and provide a familiar environment for expatriate professionals working in India.

Accountability is the Need of the Hour for 'Prajavani'

Hyderabad : Be it a prolonged land dispute, a case of elderly parents abandoned by their children, or the delayed allotment of land for a village power sub-station—"Prajavani" is often the final court of hope for the common citizen. In a democracy, while governments create multiple avenues for swift grievance redressal, public platforms often end up as mere "petition-collection centers" due to bureaucratic apathy at the grass-roots level. In this context, Nalgonda District Collector B. Chandrashekar's hands-on participation at the Devarakonda Prajavani, coupled with his swift action in issuing show-cause notices to seven defaulting division-level officers, is a welcome wake-up call for the administrative machinery.

Conventionally, public grievance day is confined to district headquarters. However, forcing marginalized citizens from remote corners like Chandampet or Neredugomu to lose their daily wages and spend hard-earned money on travel just to hand over a single sheet of paper is deeply unfair. Recognizing these hardships, the State Government's introduction of G.O. No. 3 on April 30 to decentralize Prajavani to the divisional level was a commendable step. But decentralization is only as good as its implementation, and the Collector's surprise presence in Devarakonda highlights the critical need for constant top-down supervision.

The breakdown, evidently, lies not in policy design but in field-level execution. When the head of the district administration travels all the way to a division center to listen to the public, the blatant absence of key officers from Excise, Fisheries, Forest, Civil Supplies, Transport, and Agriculture reveals a deeply rooted apathy. Failing to comply with a clear 10:15 AM timeline reflects a casual disregard for public welfare. The decision to penalize this absenteeism with show-cause notices should serve as a stark reminder that public office comes with non-negotiable accountability.

The Collector's assertion that "no petitioner should have to return twice for the same grievance, and files must be settled within a week" targets the core inefficiency of the system. Far too often, an application is digitized, routed to an official ID, and forgotten in a digital limbo. Mandating that officers formally notify applicants when a problem is resolved—or explain why it is pending at higher administrative levels—introduces a necessary layer of transparency.

Furthermore, by utilizing the platform to issue on-the-spot directives regarding lake FTL boundaries, crop diversification, and power infrastructure disputes, the Collector demonstrated how grievance cells can be leveraged for broader regional development. Prajavani must evolve beyond a weekly ritual of filing paperwork into an active, problem-solving forum.

Governments can pass mandates and issue executive orders, but it is the field bureaucracy that breathes life into them. 'Prajavani' cannot be treated as a mundane Monday chore; it is a fundamental right of the citizen and a statutory obligation of the official. The strict standard set at the Devarakonda RDO office needs to be replicated uniformly across every division and district. Only when every department functions with a sense of urgency and empathy will Prajavani truly live up to its name as a voice for the people.

urement of 51 lakh metric tonnes of grain this Yasangi season, the people's government has successfully procured over 70 lakh metric tonnes so far. Furthermore, despite the Centre refusing permission to purchase maize, the state government allocated a special budget of around ₹3,500 crore to procure the crop and directly credited the amounts to the

farmers' bank accounts.

"Chief Minister Revanth Reddy is a pro-farmer leader," Vijayaramana Rao asserted, adding that unlike the BRS regime—which inflicted losses on farmers by cutting up to 10 kg of grain per quintal—the Congress government is purchasing crops without any cuts and clearing payments within two days.

Responding to Harish Rao's allegations that no minister has visited procurement centers, the Government Whip dismissed them as ridiculous. He noted that Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, District Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu, along with Ministers Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy and Adluri Laxman Kumar, had recently inspected the Peddakaluva procurement center in Peddapalli constituency and held a high-level review meeting.

The Government Whip launched a scathing attack on the BRS top brass over irrigation projects, stating that KCR acted as the chief engineer and Harish Rao as the assistant engineer to waste ₹1 lakh crore of public money on the Kaleshwaram

project, which has now earned the moniker 'Kooleshwaram' (collapsed structure). On the other hand, Congress-built projects like Yellampalli, Jurala, and Kadem remain strong and intact, standing as a testament to the party's commitment.

He advised KCR and his family members to shed their deceptive politics and instead offer constructive suggestions to the government as responsible opposition leaders.

Strengthen Road Safety Measures at Accident-Prone Black Spots; Preventive Action Key to Saving Lives: Collector Hemant Keshav Patil and SP Dr. Sangram Singh G. Patil

Nagarkurnool : Collector and SP Direct Immediate Safety Measures at Road Accident Black Spots Across Nagarkurnool District. District Collector Hemant Keshav Patil has directed officials of all concerned departments to take immediate corrective measures at identified road accident black spots to prevent accidents and safeguard public lives across the district.

The instructions were issued during a Road Safety Review Meeting held on Monday at the District Police Office conference hall, where the Collector, along with Superintendent of Police Dr. Sangram Singh G. Patil, reviewed road safety measures and issued several key directions to officials.

Addressing the meeting, Collector Hemant Keshav Patil stated that accident-prone locations on national highways, state highways, and major district roads have already been identified and notified as black spots. He emphasized that the severity, frequency, and causes of accidents at these locations must be thoroughly analyzed and that all necessary safety and infrastructure improvements should be implemented on a priority basis.

The Collector instructed officials to take special precautions at dangerous curves, road intersections, bridge approaches, and narrow road stretches. He directed the installation of cautionary signboards, reflective signage, and directional boards to provide advance warnings to

road users.

Noting that over-speeding remains one of the primary causes of road accidents, he instructed officials to install speed breakers and rumble strips at vulnerable locations. He also called for the placement of reflective warning markers at hazardous bends and accident-prone zones.

To reduce night-time accidents, the Collector directed the Roads and Buildings Department and National Highways authorities to improve road lighting infrastructure and immediately repair non-functional streetlights. He also instructed officials to establish zebra crossings, protective



barriers, and warning boards near schools, colleges, market areas, and villages to ensure pedestrian safety.

The Collector stressed that preventing accidents before they occur is far more important than taking action after tragedies happen. He

noted that road safety is not the responsibility of a single department and called for co-ordinated efforts among the Transport Department, Roads and Buildings Department, Panchayat Raj Department, Police Department, Revenue Department, and other con-

cerned agencies.

He further instructed officials to undertake extensive awareness campaigns on road safety. The Collector emphasized the importance of encouraging two-wheeler riders to wear helmets and four-wheeler drivers to use seat belts. He also called for campaigns against drunk driving and speeding and suggested conducting special awareness programmes for youth, students, and commercial vehicle drivers.

Speaking on the occasion, SP Dr. Sangram Singh G. Patil stated that the Police Department is working closely with all departments to significantly reduce road accidents in the district. He directed officials to urgently complete pending safety works at identified accident-prone locations

on major routes, including the Kalwakurthy-Hyderabad Road, Hyderabad-Srisailem Highway, Mahabubnagar-Bijnapally Road, and Thimmapet Road.

The SP said that reducing fatalities and injuries caused by road accidents remains a top priority of the government. He urged officials to implement infrastructure improvements, safety measures, and public awareness programmes at every identified black spot on a mission mode.

POCSO Convict Sentenced to 20 Years Rigorous Imprisonment; Victim Awarded ₹5 Lakh Compensation

Special Court Delivers Strict Punishment in Mahabubnagar Case; SP Janaki Commends Investigation and Prosecution Teams

MAHABUBNAGAR : In a significant judgment in a POCSO case registered under the limits of Nawabpet Police Station in Mahabubnagar district, the Special Court for POCSO and Rape Cases at Mahabubnagar convicted the accused, Paspula Nandu (29), a resident of Mothighanpur village in Balanagar Mandal.

Following the completion of the trial, the court found the accused guilty of the offence and sentenced him to 20 years of rigorous imprisonment along with a fine of ₹20,000. The court also directed that the victim be paid

₹5 lakh as victim compensation. The judgment was delivered by Judge Smt. Taman Rajarajeswari, who emphasized the seriousness of offences committed against children and the need for stringent punishment under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.

The successful conviction was made possible through the diligent efforts of Special Public Prosecutor M. John, Mahabubnagar Rural Circle Inspector Gandhi Naik, former Nawabpet Sub-Inspector Vikram, Court Liaison Officers Balakrishna (ASI), Krishnaiah (PC),



Shankar (PC), Rahim (PC), and CDO Vijay Kumar (PC), who played a crucial role in collecting strong evidence and effectively presenting the case before the court. Mahabubnagar District Superintendent of Police, D.

Janaki, IPS, congratulated the investigation and prosecution teams for their dedication and professionalism in securing justice for the victim.

Speaking on the occasion, the SP stated that the district police remain firmly committed to protecting women and children and ensuring justice for victims through scientific and thorough investigations. She warned that strict legal action would be taken against anyone involved in crimes against women and children and reiterated that offences under the POCSO Act would be dealt with severely.

* Coolies left empty-handed as NREGS Mandal Officers turns a blind eye to their plight

Nalgonda : The poorest of the poor, who depend entirely on daily wages for their survival, are facing severe injustice in the Devarakonda constituency. The Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGA), which is meant to provide a safety net for rural laborers, is now pushing them into distress due to absolute official apathy. Without any prior notice, the names of numerous workers have been abruptly deleted from their job cards, leaving them without work or food.

Endless Visits to Offices, Yet No Action

Confused and devastated by the sudden deletion of their names, the affected laborers have been making endless rounds of mandal offices for

the past three months. Despite repeatedly pleading their case to the NREGS Mandal Officers to restore their names on the job cards, the official response has been one of total indifference.

"Our feet are aching from running around government offices, but the officials don't even bother to give us a proper answer," the grief-stricken coolies lamented.

Constituency-Wide Crisis; Tatikole Worst Hit

This burning issue is not restricted to just one village or mandal. The crisis spans across the entire Devarakonda constituency, where hundreds of poor laborers are suffering.

The situation is particularly grim in Tatikole village, which has registered the high-

est number of deleted names. Because their names are missing from the system, local field officials are refusing to allocate any work to them. With no work available locally, several families are on the brink of starvation.

Insurance Motivated Murder Cracked: Three Arrested by Makthal Police

Victim Allegedly Killed for Rs. 50 lakh life Insurance Claim; accused attempted to pass off murder as road accident, Says DSP

Narayanpet : The Makthal Police in Narayanpet district have successfully solved a sensational murder case and arrested three accused persons involved in the crime, Narayanpet Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Nallapu Lingaiah announced during a press conference on Monday.

According to the DSP, the victim, Bodi Raju (44), a resident of Marikal mandal, was lured away by the accused Allem Nagaraju (33), Sirigiri Bhanu Prakash (26), and Anampalli Bhaskar (30) on the evening of June 3, 2026, as part of a premeditated conspiracy.

During the investigation, police discovered that the accused had plotted the murder to obtain a life insurance policy worth approximately ₹50 lakh registered in the victim's name. As per their plan, they allegedly made the victim



consume excessive alcohol and took him to a secluded area on the outskirts of Samanpalli village. There, they attacked him with wooden logs and stones, resulting in his death.

In an attempt to disguise the murder as a road accident, the accused transported the injured victim in a Kia Sonet car belonging to Bhanu Prakash to Osmania General Hospital in Hyderabad. Doctors at the hospital

declared him dead on arrival.

The accused later informed the victim's family members over the phone that he had met with a road accident near Dandu Crossroads and had succumbed to his injuries while undergoing treatment. Based on this information, the family initially lodged a complaint at Makthal Police Station on June 4, 2026, treating the case as an accidental death.

However, during the

course of the investigation, Makthal Sub Inspector Raju detained and questioned vehicle owner Sirigiri Bhanu Prakash. Police found that no road accident had occurred at the location mentioned by the accused. Further interrogation revealed inconsistencies, ultimately exposing the murder conspiracy.

During sustained questioning, Bhanu Prakash confessed to the crime, leading investigators to uncover the involvement of the other accused.

Police seized the following material evidence from the accused:

- A Kia Sonet car (TS 08 HG 5543)
- The stone and wooden log allegedly used in the commission of the murder
- Details of the Accused
- Allem Nagaraju (A1), 33, businessman/mobile technician, resident of Jaklair village, Makthal

mandal.

- Sirigiri Bhanu Prakash (A2), 26, businessman and house-wiring technician, resident of Gudigandla village, Makthal mandal.
- Anampalli Bhaskar (A3), 30, car driver, resident of Makthal town. Victim
- Bodi Raju, 44, farmer and businessman, resident of Marikal mandal, Narayanpet district.
- The DSP stated that all three accused have been arrested and are being produced before the court.

He also commended Makthal Circle Inspector Ram Lal, Sub Inspector Raju, Assistant Sub Inspector Shankarayya, and police personnel Ashok, Nares, Srikanth, along with the entire investigation team, for their swift and effective efforts in solving the case and bringing the culprits to justice.

- VARUN TRILOK HONOURED WITH JUO RANK

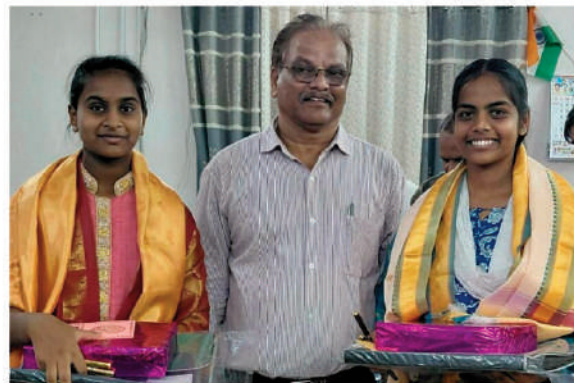

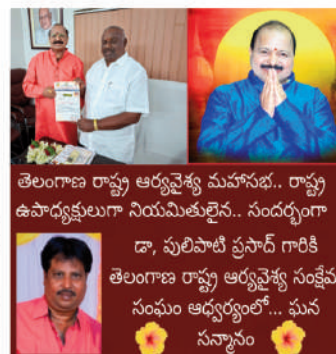

Alexander Zverev Wins First Grand Slam Title with Historic Roland-Garros Triumph

Paris : Germany's Alexander Zverev achieved a career-defining milestone by winning his maiden Grand Slam title at the prestigious Roland-Garros, defeating Italy's Flavio Cobolli in a thrilling five-set men's singles final.

The second-seeded German overcame a spirited challenge from Cobolli to register a 6-1, 4-6, 6-4, 6-7(5), 6-1 victory in a contest that lasted more than four hours on Court Philippe-Chatrier.

The triumph ended years of frustration for Zverev, who had previously reached three Grand Slam finals without lifting a major trophy. His victory marks one of the most significant achievements of his professional career and finally places him among the sport's Grand Slam champions.

Dramatic Final

Zverev began strongly, dominating the opening set with aggressive baseline play and powerful serving. However, Cobolli, appearing in his first Grand Slam final,



responded impressively and fought his way back into the match.

The Italian won the second set and later forced a deciding fifth set after edging a tense fourth-set tiebreak. With the championship hanging in the balance, Zverev produced his best tennis of the match, breaking Cobolli's serve three times in the final

set and sealing the title with a commanding 6-1 finish.

The emotional victory sparked jubilant celebrations as Zverev fell to the clay in disbelief before sharing the moment with his family and support team.

Historic Achievement

The title makes Zverev the first German man in the modern era to win the

French Open and ends a long wait for Grand Slam success. The 29-year-old's achievement is particularly inspiring given his lifelong battle with Type 1 diabetes, a condition he has managed since childhood while competing at the highest level of world tennis.

The victory also removes the long-standing tag of being one of the best players never to win a Grand Slam title.

Praise for Cobolli

Despite the defeat, Flavio Cobolli earned widespread admiration for his remarkable run to his first Grand Slam final. The young Italian displayed resilience and composure throughout the tournament and is expected to be a major force in international tennis in the coming years.

Memorable Roland-Garros 2026

Zverev's breakthrough victory provided a fitting conclusion to an exciting edition of Roland-Garros, adding his name to the list of champions at one of tennis's most prestigious tournaments.
